Collectors. First-day cover cancellations may be obtained by one of the following methods:

a. Customers Affixing Stamps. Customers are encouraged to purchase their stamps at their local post offices and affix them to their envelopes. All envelopes must be addressed. Peelable address labels are recommended and a filler card of postal card thickness should be inserted in each cover. Orders must be postmarked by March 19, 1979, and should be addressed to: First Day Cancellations, Postmaster, Princeton, NJ 08540. No remittance is required.

Management Instruction Correction

Management Instruction EL 412-78-10, December 30, 1978, inadvertently included an obsolete PMS Salary Schedule. PMS Salary Schedule, effective July 15, 1978, as published in *POSTAL BULLETIN* 21150, 7-13-78, should be substituted for the one in this Management Instruction.—*Office of Compensation, 2-8-79.*

b. Postal Service Affixing Stamps. Request first-day cancellations from: Einstein Stamp, Postmaster, Princeton, NJ 08540 (see PSM 257.2). Requests must be postmarked no later than March 19, 1979. Remittance is required for the face value of each stamp.

Selected United States mint stamps will be available at the Philatelic Sales Branch, Washington, DC 20265 beginning March 5, 1979.

Supply. All post offices under the automatic distribution system will receive an initial supply of this stamp. Before requisitioning additional stamps (**item 466**), consider that the stock should be depleted prior to May 4, 1979, at all post office outlets—except designated philatelic windows and postal stores.

Post offices with 950 or more revenue units requiring additional bulk quantities: immediately requisition on Form 3356, *Stamp Requisition—Bulk Quantities*, from the Bureau of Engraving and Printing.

All post offices requiring additional stamps in less than bulk quantities: requisition on separate Form 17, *Stamp Requisition*, from stamp distribution office.

Panels. A limited number of 8½ by 11¼-inch commemorative series stamp panels will only be available through mail order from the Philatelic Sales Branch, Washington, DC 20265. The panels are printed on heavy art paper suitable for mounting.—*Customer Services Dept., 2-8-79.*

International Mail—Iran

POSTAL BULLETIN 21173, 1-18-79, announced the suspension of civilian airmail service to Iran. Due to transportation problems, the suspension of service now includes *all* civilian mail to Iran.

Do not accept any mail (surface or airmail) addressed to Iran. Items addressed to Iran which have already been deposited should be endorsed, *Mail Service Temporarily Suspended*, and returned to the sender. Send articles (other than post cards) addressed to Iran which do not indicate a return address to the dead letter or dead parcel post office as appropriate. Post cards addressed to Iran without a return address are disposed of at the post office where they are observed. Items sent to dead letter and dead parcel post offices will be handled in accordance with *POSTAL SERVICE MANUAL* 159.7.

Dead Mail—Books and Sound Recordings

Effective immediately, facilities returning books and sound recordings to publishers and distributors under section 159.814 of the *POSTAL SERVICE MANUAL*, may use sacks for this purpose in addition to packages and hampers or other containers. To implement this change, PSM 159.814h will be revised as follows:

h. For books and sound recordings, to be released at another location under 159.814a(5), dead parcel branches will make up individual shipments in packages, sacks, hampers, or other types of containers. Packages will be as large as possible, subject to the weight and size limitations for fourth-class mail in 135.3. Each package will be prepared to comply with 135.24 and sent under a penalty label. Sacks are subject to the weight limitations in 334.24a. Hampers or other containers may be used if adequate security against pilferage can be maintained. Where hampers or other containers are used, postmasters at dead parcel branches and postmasters at delivery offices will coordinate suitable arrangements for containment, labeling, movement, and security through their respective transportation management officers. (See 159.44a for treatment of postage.)—*Rates & Classification Dept.*, 2-8-79.

Money Orders—\$2 Limitation Plates

Effective immediately, the \$2 limitation plate is not to be used. The \$5 limitation plate will serve in its place. Postmasters will insure that all \$2 limitation plates are destroyed.

The \$2 limitation plate is being eliminated to make the raising of \$1 or \$2 money orders to higher amounts more difficult.—*Rates & Classification Dept.*, 2-8-79.

In PSM 147.221c, postage refunds are authorized on mail which is returned to the sender due to this suspension of service. Customers must file an application for a postage refund in accordance with PSM 147.24.

Military mail destined for Iran is not affected by this notice.—*Rates & Classification Dept.*, 2-8-79.

Undeliverable-As-Addressed Third-Class Mail

Third-class matter which would be eligible for a fourth-class rate, except for weight, may be mailed at the appropriate fourth-class rate under the provisions of 134.112, *POSTAL SERVICE MANUAL*. Mailers may take advantage of this provision when mail is forwarded or returned if the mail is properly endorsed. The PSM is being changed to reflect this as follows:

158.32d Third-Class Mail is subject to collection of additional postage for forwarding at the applicable single piece rate of postage. Mail which qualifies for a single piece fourth-class rate under the provisions of 134.112 will be returned at that rate if the mailer's address correction service endorsement includes the name of the fourth-class rate. For example, if a third-class piece qualifies for mailing at the special fourth-class rate for books, the endorsement would be:

*Special Fourth-Class Book Rate
Forwarding and Return Postage
Guaranteed*

159.24 THIRD-CLASS MAIL

.241 Return of Mail

Third-class mail which is undeliverable-as-addressed and bears the words *Return Postage Guaranteed* will be returned to the sender postage due at the appropriate single piece rate. The piece will be marked *Undeliverable-As-Addressed*. The reason the piece is undeliverable-as-addressed, or the addressee's new address, will not be endorsed on the piece. Mail which qualifies for a single piece fourth-class rate under 134.112 will be returned at that rate if the mailer's address correction service endorsement includes the name of the fourth-class rate. For example, if a third-class piece qualifies for mailing at the special fourth-class rate for books, the endorsement would be:

*Special Fourth-Class Book Rate
Return Postage Guaranteed*

Undeliverable third-class mail bearing the words *Forwarding and Return Postage Guaranteed* will be forwarded when the new address is

Sample Copies of Second-Class Publications

Effective immediately, the marking requirement of section 132.461c, *POSTAL SERVICE MANUAL*, is rescinded. At the request of second-class publishers, the Postal Service has decided to eliminate the requirement that the words *Sample Copy* be shown on the address side of the envelopes or wrappers or the outside cover of unwrapped copies of mailed sample copies of second-class publications. Sample copies will no longer be required to bear the endorsement *Sample Copy* when mailed. This change does not affect the marking requirements contained in section 132.461g. Sample copies addressed in the simplified manner as provided for in section 132.461g, must still be marked *Sample Copy*. In addition, this change does not affect the requirement that second-class publishers record the number of sample copies of the issue being mailed on the Form 3541, *Statement of Mailing—Second Class Publications*.

The PSM will be amended to reflect this change.—*Rates & Classification Dept.*, 2-8-79.

known. Postage at the appropriate single piece rate will be collected from the addressee. If the addressee refuses to pay the forwarding postage, the piece will be returned to the sender who must pay postage for its forwarding and return. If the piece cannot be forwarded because the new address is not known, it will be given the *Return Postage Guaranteed* service.

159.243c. When a piece weighing more than 2 ounces and bearing the words *Address Correction Requested Return Postage Guaranteed* or *Address Correction Requested Forwarding and Return Postage Guaranteed* must be returned to the sender by the post office of original address because the piece cannot be forwarded, Form 3579 or central-markup label will be affixed to the piece, and it will be returned to the sender for a fee of 25 cents for the address correction notice, plus postage at the appropriate single piece rate.—*Rates & Classification Dept.*, 2-8-79.

Destruction of Stamp Stock

Transmittal Letter 6 of Handbook F-1, *Financial Handbook for Post Offices*, January 25, 1979, has been issued. Effective with receipt of this revision, all stamp stock destruction committees are terminated. Management sectional center managers will appoint members to a single stamp stock destruction committee at their stamp distribution office. Those appointed must become thoroughly

familiar with instructions contained in part 550 of the revised handbook.

MSCs will establish a schedule for all associate post offices to ship redeemed and nonsaleable stock to their stamp distribution office for destruction. This schedule will be sent to associate offices as soon as possible.

Associate post offices will comply with section 552.3 in revised Handbook F-1.—Finance Dept., 2-8-79.

Parcels to MPOs in Turkey

As announced in POSTAL BULLETIN 21165, 11-23-78, both air and surface parcels addressed to military post offices in Turkey are now acceptable. The prohibition against APO parcel service was removed by the Government of Turkey on October 13, 1978.

Money Orders— Splitting Packages

Packages of 100 money order forms may be split within an office where all imprinters have the same 6-digit office identification plate number. The Money Order Division, however, has requested that money order packages not be split among offices with different identification plate numbers. Splitting complicates the reconciliation of an out of balance account at the Money Order Division because each money order package is assigned a single imprinter identification plate number. When splitting occurs, all imprinter totals have to be checked instead of only the one with the out of balance condition.—Rates & Classification Dept., 2-8-79.

Second-Class Numbering of Packages

In large mailings of second-class publications to a single addressee, packages sometimes arrive over a period of several days. Therefore, the addressee often cannot verify that an entire mailing has been received without opening each package and checking the number of copies against his order. In order to avoid this problem, mailers are allowed to include a package identification notice such as *1 of 4*, *2 of 4*, etc., on the package wrapper, provided such endorsement does not interfere with the clarity of the address.—Rates & Classification Dept., 2-8-79.

Second-Class Publications—Novelty Pages and Ads

The requirement contained in section 132.473e, f, and g, **POSTAL SERVICE MANUAL**, that printed coupon(s) or printed application or order form(s) included as novelty pages in second-class publications bear the name of the publication, is deleted effective immediately. The requirement in **PSM 132.473e** that such pages be included in the pagination of the publication is also deleted. These changes are intended to relieve mailers of burdensome technical requirements. However, these changes do not affect the requirement in **PSM**

132.473, that novelty pages be prepared specifically for and intended as integral pages of newspapers or other periodical publications, nor the requirement in 132.471, that the only enclosures permissible in second-class publications are receipts and orders for subscriptions. The **POSTAL SERVICE MANUAL** will be amended to reflect this change.

It should also be noted that **PSM 132.48** does not require that advertisements in second-class publications be numbered or allowed for in the pagination. This regulation merely
