All Postal Supervisors and Dock Area Employees:

Identification Cards

Instances have been reported where contractors, subcontractors or their employees have been granted access to mail and postal facilities before submitting required screening forms and without displaying a valid identification card, Form 5139 or 5140 (19-125.4 Publication 41, Postal Contracting Manual). Individuals not meeting these requirements should be denied access and the incident should be reported to the appropriate Transportation Management Office (TMO).—Mail Processing Dept., 5-10-79.

International Postal Money Order Service

Effective immediately, international postal money order service to the following countries is temporarily suspended:

Nigeria Sierra Leone Malawi Uganda Tanzania Gambia Cyprus Gibraltar

This temporary suspension of international postal money order service is a result of notification by the postal administration of Great Britain and Northern Ireland that it will no longer act as the intermediary for the exchange of international postal money orders between the United States Postal Service and the postal administrations of the countries named above.

Do not accept Form 6701, Application for International Money order, when it indicates payment of funds in these countries. Advise customers who desire to transfer funds to the cited countries that postal money order service will be resumed as soon as the United States concludes agreements with these countries for the direct exchange of international postal money orders.—Rates & Classification Dept. 5-10-79.

Customs Declarations— International Parcel Post

This notice is to remind employees of the proper customs declarations to be used on international parcel post items.

All international parcel post must bear Form 2966-A, Parcel Post Customs Declaration. In addition, some countries require that packages bear either Form 2966, Customs Declaration (tie-on-tag), or Form 2972, Dispatch Note, or both. Specific requirements are contained in the Individual Country Information Section, Appendix B, of Publication 42, International Mail.

It is necessary to use the proper customs forms and to complete appropriate portions of such forms correctly. Failure to use forms appropriate for the class of mail to which they are attached may cause delays in the dispatch and delivery of mail.—Rates & Classification Dept., 5-10-79.

Form Discontinued

Effective immediately, Form 5930, Examination Center Operations and Cost Report, is discontinued. Dispose of present supplies of this form.—Employee Relations Dept., 5-10-79.

Conflict of Interest— Private Delivery Service Employment

Note the provisions of the Code of Conduct regarding outside employment with private carriers of mailable matter. Section 661.42(g) of the Employee and Labor Relations Manual (ELM) states:

No employee will engage in or work in any capacity for a person engaged in a private business of delivering any type of mailable matter, including parcels and advertising circulars.—Employee Relations Dept., 5-10-79.

International Mail Endorsements

The following endorsements identifying certain classes of international mail may appear immediately adjacent to postage meter stamps in the slug area:

Printed Matter, or Small Packet

The words must be in bold capital letters and must be legible at a distance of two feet.

This authorization is an extension of that announced in Postal Bulletin 21118, 7-14-77, which allowed placement of the printed matter and small packet endorsements in the ad plate area.

Authorization of printed matter and small packet endorsements in postage meter stamp slug areas will be reflected in a future revision to Publication 42, International Mail.—Rates & Classification Dept., 5—10-79.

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15-Cent Endangered Flora Business Reply Format Commemorative Stamps

Description. The 15-cent Endangered Flora commemorative stamps will be first placed on sale at Milwaukee, WI 53201, on June 7, 1979. The block of stamps portrays four of the more than 1,700 seriously threatened plant species in the United States.

Collectors. First-day cover cancellations may be obtained by one of the following methods:

a. Customers Affixing Stamps. Customers are encouraged to purchase their stamps at their local post offices and affix them to their envelopes. All envelopes must be addressed. Peelable address labels are recommended and a filler card of postal card thickness should be inserted in each cover. Orders must be postmarked by June 22, 1979, and should be addressed to: First Day Cancellations, Postmaster, Milwaukee, WI 53201. No remittance is required.

b. Postal Service Affixing Stamps. Request first-day cancellations from:

Requirements

New requirements for preparing business reply cards, envelopes and labels became effective May 1, 1979. Because of the way in which business reply mailing pieces are prepared and distributed, there will be a period during which mailing pieces prepared under former requirements will continue to appear in the system. Enforcement of the new requirements must be conducted in a reasonable, courteous, and understanding manner.

Please contact your Mail Classification Center for assistance in resolving questions involving nonconforming Business Reply Mail which may arise during this transition period which can be expected to last over the next several months.-Rates & Classification Dept., 5-10-79.

Endangered Flora Stamps, Postmaster, Milwaukee, WI 53201 (see PSM 257.2). Requests must be postmarked no later than June 22, 1979. Remittance is required for the face value of each stamp.

Selected United States mint stamps will be available at the Philatelic Sales Branch, Washington, DC 20265 beginning June 8, 1979.

Supply. All post offices under the automatic distribution system will receive an initial supply of this stamp. Before requisitioning additional stamps (item 469), consider that the stock should be depleted prior to August 7, 1979, at all post office outlets-except designated philatelic windows and postal stores.

Post offices with 950 or more revenue units requiring additional bulk quantities: immediately requisition on Form 3356, Stamp Requisition— Bulk Quantities, from the Bureau of Engraving and Printing.

All post offices requiring additional stamps in less than bulk quantities requisition on separate Form 17, Stamp Requisition, from stamp distribution office.

Panels. A limited number of 81/2 by 111/4-inch commemorative series stamp panels will only be available through mail order from the Philatelic Sales Branch, Washington, DC 20265. The panels are printed on heavy art paper suitable for mounting.—Customer Services Dept., 5-10-79.

Delivery/Unit Operations Analysis System

POSTAL BULLETIN 21157, 9-28-78 introduced the Delivery/Unit Operations Analysis System. In that announcement, all reporting units that prepare and submit Form 3997-C, Delivery/Unit Operations Analysis, were instructed to record certain data in the Required Information column of Items 38-46.

Effective immediately the transition period for Form 3997-C is ended. SPLY information previously entered on the form is no longer required. Items 38-46 on the form must now be used to record data in the Required Information column as follows:

Item 38—Enter 0
Item 39—Business Places Receiving Multi Trip Service

Item 40—Enter 0

Item 41-Total USPS Vehicle Hours Used

Item 42-Total USPS Vehicle Cost

Item 43-Enter 0 Item 44—Enter 0

Item 45-MOD 2 Main Office Mail Processing Work Hours (This item will only be used by MOD 2 reporting offices)

Item 46—Enter 0

The line items 38-46 on Form 3997-C must be used according to these instructions. Deviations will result in improper data processing input and erroneous reports.

Instructions for incorrect input adjustments will be announced in a future Postal Bulletin .- Delivery Services Dept., 5-10-79

Consumer's Guide

A blanket distribution of Publication 201, A Consumer's Guide to Postal Services and Products, has been made to all management sectional centers.

MSCs will send adequate quantities of the publications to post offices under their jurisdiction. Additional copies may be ordered from the area supply centers.

These publications should be placed on writing tables, or in general display units, for public distribution.-Customer Services Dept., 5-10-79.

MIGRATORY-BIRD HUNTING AND CONSERVATION STAMP, SERIES 1979-80

Postmasters at all offices with 190 or more revenue units and at offices with 189 or fewer revenue units with a demand for the \$7.50 Migratory-Bird Hunting and Conservation Stamp must immediately consider their requirements for the 1979–80 series stamp. These stamps may be placed on sale on July 1.

Associate Offices

No later than June 1, 1979, post-masters submit a separate requisition on Form 17, Stamp Requisition, to their stamp distribution office for a quantity of \$7.50 Migratory-Bird Hunting and Conservation Stamps sufficient to last until June 30, 1980. Order the new series stamp in sheets of 30, except that those offices requiring a lesser quantity may order 15 stamps. Also indicate on Form 17, the number of Posters 3-115, Water-

fowler—Attention, needed for the main office and classified units. Requisition additional stocks of bird stamps from the stamp distribution office if the initial supply is not adequate to last until June 30, 1080.

Stamp Distribution Offices

Postmasters at stamp distribution offices requiring the \$7.50 Migratory-Bird Hunting and Conservation Stamp in minimum lots of 3,000 stamps, requisition the stamps on Form 3356, Stamp Requisition—Bulk Quantities (using item 319) direct from the Bureau of Engraving and Printing. Order in quantities of 3,000, 6,000, 9,000, 12,000, 15,000, 30,000, 45,000, 60,000, 75,000, and multiples of 75,000 stamps.

Postmasters at stamp distribution offices requiring less than 3,000 bird stamps must immediately submit a

Form 17 to their accountable paper depositories. Each stamp distribution office will be automatically furnished an initial supply of 150 Waterfowlers—Attention posters. Additional posters, if needed, may be ordered from the Area Supply Center, using Form 4750, Special Requisition for Supplies.

Hunting Regulation Pamphlets

The Interior Department does not automatically distribute pamphlets on hunting regulations because actual regulations vary from state to state. The Waterfowlers—Attention poster directs inquiries concerning hunting regulations to the local wild-life agency or a regional office of the Fish and Wildlife Service. The regional office addresses are listed on the posters.—Customer Services Dept., 5-10-79.

Postmaster Review Moratorium

As a result of the planned implementation of the new expanded postmaster criteria program:

a. There will be no review of NCD

offices during FY-79.

b. A moratorium on Requests for Review of office ranking is effective immediately for associate post offices NCD 1—17 and EAS 18—22.

In June of 1979, each associate office postmaster will be converted to the EAS schedule and will receive:

a. An explanation concerning the

ranking of the office.

b. A detailed listing of the workload data which served as the basis for calculating the workload service credits (WSCs) used.

c. Instructions for initiating a request to correct erroneous October 6,

1978 workload data that was used to calculate the WSCs.

Requests to correct workload data will be accepted until September 1, 1979; however, the data submitted must be valid as of October 6, 1978. Any changes in ranking effected as a result of correcting workload data will be retroactive to the implementation date of the expanded postmaster criteria. The Zone of Tolerance will NOT apply during this period.

Requests for Review (RFRs) of office ranking on the basis of current data will be accepted beginning with FY-80 (October 6, 1979). The Zone of Tolerance will apply in determining office ranking under the expanded criteria.—Office of Compensation, 5-10-79.

Correction:

Accounting Instructions— Computerized Meter Resetting

The article with the above title in Postal Bulletin 21188, 5–3–79 contains two confusing references. Make corrections as follows:

HEALTH BENEFITS OPEN SEASON

The Office of Personnel Management (OPM, formerly the Civil Service Commission), will hold a special limited open season May 15-31, 1979. This limited open season is being held to permit enrolled employees and annuitants to change to one of two comprehensive plans which have been approved for participation in the Federal Employees' Health Benefits (FEHB) program beginning July 1.

New Comprehensive Plans

During the May 15-31, 1979 limited open season, all employees who are currently enrolled in the FEHB Program and who live in the enrollment area of one of the plans listed below must be given the opportunity to change to the plan. The plans and their enrollment areas are:

1. Health Insurance Plan. Cook and Du Page counties in the Chicago, Illinois area, and Fulton, Peoria, Tazewell, and Woodford counties in the Peoria, Illinois area.

2. Michigan HMO Plans, Inc. City of Detroit, Michigan, and surrounding communities of Ecorse, Ferndale, Hamtramck, Harper Woods, Highland Park, Lathrup Village, Lincoln Park, Melvindale, Oak Park, Redford, River Rouge, Royal Oak Township, and Southfield.

Permissible Change

The only change that may be made is a change from the plan in which the employee is already enrolled to one of the newly approved plans. An employee who is not enrolled may not enroll, and an employee who is enrolled for self only may not change to self and family. New enrollments and enrollment changes for reasons other than the limited open season are to be made as usual between May 15 and May 31, 1979. However, these changes must not be mistakenly identified as open season changes. To indicate the event which permits a change made in conjunction with the limited open season, "Limited Open Season" should be written in Part D, item 2 of the Health Benefits Registration Form (Standard Form 2809).

Effective Dates

The effective date of a limited open season change is July 14, 1979. Instructions for handling enrollment changes when it is known that an employee will transfer, retire, or separate before the effective date of the change are provided in Postal Bulletin 21160, 10–19–78, pages 3 and 4.

Timely Registration

The SF 2809 showing the limited open season enrollment change must be received by the employing office no later than May 31, 1979. An employ-

ing office, however, has the authority to accept and process a late enrollment change when caused by events beyond the employee's control.

Distribution of Material

Every employing office must give to each enrolled employee who lives in the enrollment area of one of the new plans the following material:

1. BRI 41-257, Special Limited Open Season;

2. BRI 41-260, Biweekly and monthly premium rates; and

3. the brochure of the new plan to which the employee may change.

Ordering Material

Plan brochures, rate sheets, and instructions must be ordered direct from the new comprehensive plans. Requests for open season supplies should be based on the total number of employees who are currently enrolled under the FEHB Program and who live in the enrollment area of a plan.
