\$1.00 Regular Stamp

Description. The \$1.00 regular stamp in sheet form will be released July 2, 1979 nationwide. The official first day issue city is San Francisco, CA 94101. San Francisco is the only place where the official first day issue cancellations will be applied. The vignette of the stamp features a combination rush lamp and candleholder lighting device similar to the design of the \$2.00 stamp.

Collectors. This stamp will be available to the public on the same day that distribution of the new \$1.00 Susan B. Anthony coin is expected to begin. Collectors who purchase the stamps at their own post offices may receive the standard local cancellation on a hand-back basis. Hand-cancellation service is also authorized for the \$1.00 stamps when affixed to or adjacent to currency or other memorabilia that cannot be inserted in the mailstream without cover. Such cancellations may be obtained on a hand-back basis only and are not available by mail order. The number of cancellations on currency is limited to 100 per customer.

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Third-Class Carrier Route Presort

Preparation. Effective immediately the interim implementing instructions for third-class carrier route presort mail are amended to provide an alternative to the current requirement to place facing slips on top of each carrier route package.

Option 1. Use Facing Slips

A facing slip which includes the carrier route number and is prepared in accordance with the instructions in POSTAL BULLETIN 21174, 1-25-79, must be placed on the top of each carrier route package. However, a facing slip is no longer required on carrier route packages when all the contents of a sack are for delivery on the same carrier route.

Option 2. Without Facing Slips

Packages made up to individual carrier routes may be prepared without facing slips when the following conditions are met:

1. The carrier route information consisting of a descriptive prefix (or its abbreviation) plus a two-digit route number or four-digit numeric code must be on the top line of the address, either alone (the preferred format) or with other information (addressee, account data, etc.).

2. The descriptive prefix "carrier route," "rural route," "star route," or "lockbox section" must either be spelled out (the preferred format) or abbreviated as follows:

Carrier Route-----	CR.
Rural Route-----	RR.
Star Route-----	SR.
Lockbox Section-----	LS.

3. The descriptive prefix must be followed by a two-digit route number when the ZIP Code is included in the address. If the ZIP Code is omitted from the address, the descriptive prefix must be followed by a four-digit numeric route code. This four-digit route code must consist of the last two digits of the ZIP Code followed by the two-digit carrier route number.

4. The carrier route information must be right justified.

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those of higher denominations, do not receive the same automatic distribution as commemorative stamps and thus will not be as widely available as commemoratives. However, all post offices are encouraged to requisition sufficient quantities to meet local philatelic demand.

First-day cover cancellations may be obtained by one of the following methods:

a. Customer Affixing Stamps. Customers may purchase the stamps at their local post offices and affix them to their own envelopes. All envelopes must be addressed. Peelable address labels are recommended and a filler card of postal card thickness should be inserted in each cover. Orders must be postmarked by July 17, 1979, and should be addressed to First Day Cancellations, Postmaster, San Francisco, CA 94101. No remittance is required.

b. Postal Service Affixing Stamps. Request first-day cancellations from: \$1.00 Stamp, Postmaster, San Francisco, CA 94101, (see PSM 257.2). Requests must be postmarked not later than July 17, 1979. Remittance is required for the face value of each stamp.

Selected United States mint stamps will be available at the Philatelic Sales Branch, Washington, DC 20265, beginning July 2, 1979.

Supply. There will be an automatic distribution made only to philatelic centers. Philatelic centers automatic distribution will be the same quantity as received for the \$2.00 stamp. Post offices with over 950 revenue units requiring the \$1.00 regular stamp in lots of 10,000; 20,000; 30,000; 40,000; 50,000; 100,000; 150,000; 200,000; 250,000, and multiples of 250,000 to maximum of 2,500,000 should immediately submit a requisition, Form 3356, *Stamp Requisition-Bulk Quantities*, using item 087, to the Bureau of Engraving and Printing.

Post offices: Be sure to order sufficient quantities of this stamp to meet anticipated local philatelic demand. Post offices with over 950 revenue units and all other post offices requiring 7,000 or fewer \$1.00 regular stamps may requisition the stamps from their designated stamp distribution center using a separate Form 17, *Stamp Requisition*.—*Customer Services Dept.*, 6-7-79.

Collection/Separation of Bundled Meter Mail

Failure to maintain mail separations made by customers has been noted in some post offices. Specifically, bundles of metered mail from collection routes are found in cancellation areas. Collection employees noting bundles of meter mail at pick-up points must cull these bundles and put them in a separate sack, hamper, etc. Containers must be properly labeled, if appropriate. Verification of separation and labeling is performed at platforms regularly. Specific instructions are found in Parts 126 and 132 of Handbook M-39, *Management of Delivery Services*, and in Part 132 and Chapter 5 of Handbook M-41, *City Delivery Carrier's Duties and Responsibilities*.—*Delivery Services Dept.*, 6-7-79.

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5. The carrier route information must be preceded by at least two asterisks (or another distinctive character). The following are examples of address formats in the order of preference:

6. At least 10 spaces must be allowed for carrier route information if it is included with other information on the top line.—*Rates & Classification Dept.*, 6-7-79.

Dating Bulk Mailing Statements

Effective immediately, bulk mail acceptance employees must stamp the date of acceptance on the front of duplicate copies of all bulk mailing statements submitted for return to customers; a rubber all purpose dating stamp ("round dater" or "bullseye", Item #570) should be used. This instruction will be incorporated in the DOMESTIC MAIL MANUAL when it is published this summer.—*Rates and Classification Dept.*, 6-7-79.

Employees' Current Mailing Address

If your address on the label for Postal Life is incorrect, please complete Form 1216, *Employees' Current Mailing Address*. This form is available from your personnel office. Make certain that you include your Social Security Number and the office finance number on the form and return it to your personnel office. Your personnel office will forward it to the proper Postal Data Center for processing. Do not send change of address to Postal Life. However, if you have correctly filed a Form 1216 and 3 months have passed and there is still a problem with your mailing address, write to General Manager, Publications Division, Room 10992, U.S. Postal Service, Washington, DC 20260.—*Public & Employee Communications Dept.*, 6-7-79.

Destruction of \$5.00 Migratory Bird Stamps

The 1979-80 series of migratory bird stamps will sell for \$7.50. Therefore, all postmasters must make sure that any \$5.00 bird stamps, in stamp credits or in unit reserve stocks, are returned to the main stock without delay. Unsold \$5.00 bird stamps consigned to sporting goods outlets must also be returned immediately. Any such stamps must be sent to the MSC for destruction promptly as instructed in section 535.4, Handbook F-1, *Financial Handbook for Post Offices*.

The schedule of minimum quantities (552.32) does not apply to bird stamps.

Only those post offices designated as philatelic outlets maintain an inventory of prior year bird stamps. See section 557.5, Handbook F-1.

If the return of \$5.00 bird stamps creates an out-of-balance condition in bird stamp accountability which cannot be resolved locally, contact your PDC for instructions.—Finance Dept., 6-7-79.

Accountability

Philatelic outlets should maintain a good working level of stamp stock, stationery, and philatelic products, to meet the needs of collectors and encourage philatelic interest. Therefore, postmasters may maintain a postage stock of up to \$125,000 for each philatelic outlet at their office. This stock may be in excess of normal authorized stock limits.

If operating requirements necessitate postage stock in excess of \$125,000, written notification must be submitted to the appropriate Regional Retail Branch requesting special authorization. The Regional Retail Branch, with concurrence of the Regional Chief Postal Inspector, may authorize postage stock up to \$250,000. If approved at the regional level, the request should be forwarded for Headquarters' concurrence to the Philatelic Marketing Division, Office of Consumer Marketing, Customer Services Department.

The total amount of annual sales at the philatelic outlet must be included with any request for authorization to maintain a postage stock in excess of \$125,000 for that outlet. Such requests will be approved only when the total sales justify the increase in stock level.

All clerks working in philatelic outlets are fully accountable for their own stamp credit. It is the responsibility of the postmaster to provide adequate security equipment for secure storage of these credits at all times.

Regulations outlined in this section do not apply to the Philatelic Sales Branch.

This amends the POSTAL OPERATIONS MANUAL (POM), Section 243.535, Stamp Credit (Accountability)—formerly Part 257.3(e)(3)(v) of the POSTAL SERVICE MANUAL.—Customer Services Dept., 6-7-79.

Special Handling

Special handling or special delivery is no longer required for baby poultry or queen honey bees sent priority mail or at the first-class rate. Effective immediately, section 124.293a(11), 124.293c(1) and 167.1 of the POSTAL SERVICE MANUAL are amended to delete this requirement.—Rates & Classification Dept., 6-7-79.
