



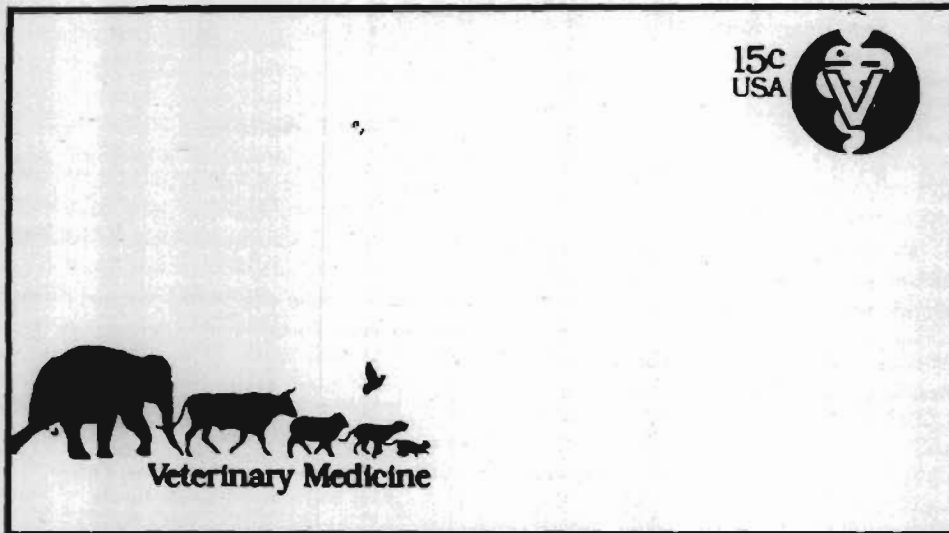

## 15-Cent Veterinary Medicine Embossed Stamped Envelope

**Description.** The 15-cent Veterinary Medicine commemorative stamped envelope will be first placed on sale at Seattle, WA 98109 on July 24, 1979. The design features the staff of Aesculapius, the traditional seal of the veterinarian, which is superimposed on a circular gray background. To the left of the indicium, in brown, is "15¢ USA."

This envelope will be available in sizes 6¾ and 10 regular and window and can be ordered through post offices with printed return addresses in minimum lots of 500 at the same prices currently charged for printed stamped envelopes.

**Collectors.** Request first day cancellations from: Veterinary Medicine Envelopes, Postmaster, Seattle, WA 98109. To eliminate the requirement for Postal Service personnel to apply return addresses, customers are requested to send self-addressed envelopes of an appropriate size or return address labels with their orders. Both sizes of regular envelopes will only be serviced, but unless size 10 is stipulated, the cancellation will be on size 6¾. Requests must be postmarked no later than August 8, 1979 with the remittance to cover the cost of 18 cents per envelope.

For the benefit of collectors, the 15-cent Veterinary Medicine com-

memorative stamped envelope will be available at the Philatelic Sales Branch, Washington, DC 20265, beginning July 25, 1979 at 18 cents each or minimum box lots of 500 plus postage and a handling charge of 50 cents. In addition to handling charge, there is also a \$5 minimum purchase in effect at the Philatelic Sales Branch. The box lot prices for 500 15-cent Veterinary Medicine embossed stamped envelopes are as follows:

## International Mail—Iraq

Effective immediately, restricted delivery service is available for registered postal union mail items addressed to Iraq. We have been notified by the postal administration of Iraq that it will provide restricted delivery service for registered items addressed to that country.

Restricted delivery items to Iraq must be endorsed "A remettre in main propre."

In Publication 42, *International Mail*, make the following changes:

Section 462c., add Iraq to the country list and indicate the required endorsement.

Appendix B, Country Information for Iraq, in the *Special Services—Postal Union Mail* table, change the restricted delivery entry to read: Available: YES; Applicable Fee Table, Appendix A: Table 6-5; References: 460.

Add a footnote to the *Special Services* table to specify that restricted delivery is available for registered articles accompanied by a return receipt.

A revision to Publication 42 will incorporate this information.—*Rates & Classification Dept.*, 6-21-79.

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## DOMESTIC FIRST FLIGHT CACHET

Official cachets and philatelic treatment for the first flight services described in A, B, and C are authorized as outlined in 244.63, *POSTAL OPERATIONS MANUAL (POM)*.

To prepare and send covers for official philatelic treatment for the listed services, observe the following procedures:

1. All covers must be self-addressed.

2. Applicable rate of postage per cover is 15 cents for the first ounce; 13 cents for each additional ounce up to 12 ounces.

3. A clear space, 2½ by 2½ inches, on the lower portion of the envelope and to the left of the address, must be allowed for the cachet.

4. An additional clear space of 1½ inches to the left of the innermost stamp must be provided to permit a clear postmark.

5. Include in each envelope a uniform enclosure of the approximate weight of a postal card to assure a good impression.

6. Endorse the lower left corner of the outer envelope containing the reach the office applying the cachet no later than three days prior to the scheduled date of the flight.

## INITIAL LEVEL SUPERVISORY POSITIONS

Following are changes to the material in SPECIAL POSTAL BULLETIN 21136, 2-2-78, and POSTAL BULLETIN 21170, 12-28-78. Revised lists of initial level supervisor positions (Appendix I and Appendix II of the SPECIAL POSTAL BULLETIN) are also printed below. All material will be reflected in the next revision of Handbook P-11, *Personnel Operations*.

### Add to Section 531.1:

Deviations from initial level selection procedures may be appropriate in rare instances. An installation head may submit a request for an exception, in writing, through channels to the APMG, Employee Relations at Headquarters. The request must describe the need for the exception, and propose an alternative procedure.

### Add to Section 532.41:

When there are not at least five candidates from the *excellent* demon-

stration of ability category from the candidate lists of all installations within commuting distance, then candidates from the *good* demonstration of ability category from other installations within commuting distance must be considered.

### Change Section 534.325 to read:

As associate office, SC facility, or BMC can reopen the PASS procedures with approval from the next higher level of management. It is the option of the next higher level of management to either permit the reopening of the PASS procedures or direct the canvassing of the candidate lists from offices within commuting distance within the MSC.

### Change Section 536.25 to read:

Candidate lists from reopened PASS announcements are merged

with the existing list for a particular family of jobs. At the time of a reopening, employees on the candidate list who do not want to recompute but do want to provide current job related information may update their PASS records by submitting a new Form 5940 *Biographical Data Summary*, to their MSC. In such cases, the individual's rating is not changed.

Employees on a candidate list for a particular family of jobs who reapply for that family will be given the most current rating.

### Change 536.262 to read:

.262 When an announcement is reopened (at least once every two years), the new candidate list and notice of rating cards are merged with the previous candidate list.

During calendar year 1978, the USPS won 70% of the appeal determinations rendered by state employment security agencies involving the

1st, 2nd, and state court levels of the state appeal process. Through the effort of our USPS state coordinators in this area, it has been estimated that the USPS realized a cost-savings of approximately \$3.8 million.

**Registered Mail Receipts, Form 3806**

A revised Form 3806, *Receipt for Registered Mail*, has been developed and will be issued from the supply centers when the current supply of the old style form is exhausted. The new forms are printed as individual sets, consisting of an original for the customer mailing the registered article, and a copy for the post office accepting the article.

Post offices that have a large volume of registered mail should have blank forms available for customers so they may complete the portion of the new form marked for "customer completion", before going to the window and presenting the article for registration. This will expedite the acceptance of registered mail.

Customers who regularly mail registered mail articles, but not in quantities that merit the use of firm mailing books (Form 3877), should be given blank sets of the new forms so they may complete their portion of the form before going to the post office.

Postal Service employees will not apply the registered number to the form until the article is accepted.—*Rates & Classification Dept., 6-21-79.*

**International Mail—Papua New Guinea**

Effective immediately, recall or change of address service is available for all postal union mail items and parcel post packages addressed to Papua New Guinea.

Papua New Guinea now allows the withdrawal of or change of address on mail which has been dispatched from the United States but not yet delivered to the addressee in Papua New Guinea.

In Publication 42, *International Mail*, Appendix B, country information for Papua New Guinea, in the *Special Services—Postal Union Mail* and *Parcel Post* tables, change the recall or change of address entry to read: Available: YES; Applicable Fee Table, Appendix A: Table 6-9; References: 492.

**International Money Order Service—Mauritania**

Effective June 30, 1979, international postal money order service to Mauritania is terminated.

This termination of service is a result of notification from France that it will no longer act as the intermediary for the exchange of international postal money orders between the United States Postal Service and Mauritania.

In Publication 42, *International Mail*, Appendix B, Country Information for Mauritania, in the *Special Services—Postal Union Mail* table, change the Money Order entry to read: Available: NO. Line through reference to Form 6701 and Postal Service Manual 171.2.

### Form 3232 in Stock

Form 3232, *Self-Service Postal Center Cost Report*, has been revised and is available from the Eastern and Western Area Supply Centers. The forms may be requested from your area supply center on Form 7380, *Requisition for Supplies*, during regular requisitioning cycles. The revision contains only minor modifications, and offices with stocks of the August 1978 edition should continue to use them.

All offices with SSPCs are reminded that they must continue to complete two versions of the Form 3232 (one edition of June 1977 or earlier; one edition of August 1978 or March 1979) through Accounting Period 13. Beginning with A/P 1 of FY 80, only a single edition of either August 1978 or March 1979 will be required.—*Delivery Services Dept.*, 6-21-79.

### International Mail—Chile

Effective immediately, the maximum weight limit for small packets to Chile is 2 pounds. This weight limit increase is a result of notification from the postal administration of Chile that it will now accept small packets weighing up to 2 pounds.

Small packets must be endorsed as prescribed in Table 3-13, Appendix A, Publication 42, *International Mail*.

In Publication 42, Appendix A, in Table 3-12, Column C, and in Table 3-13, Section A—*Weight Limits*, delete Chile from the list of countries to which the weight limit for small packets is 1 pound.

### Stamp To Be Removed From Sale

The 15-cent Viking Missions stamp will be removed from sale at the Philatelic Sales Branch at the close of business June 30, 1979.

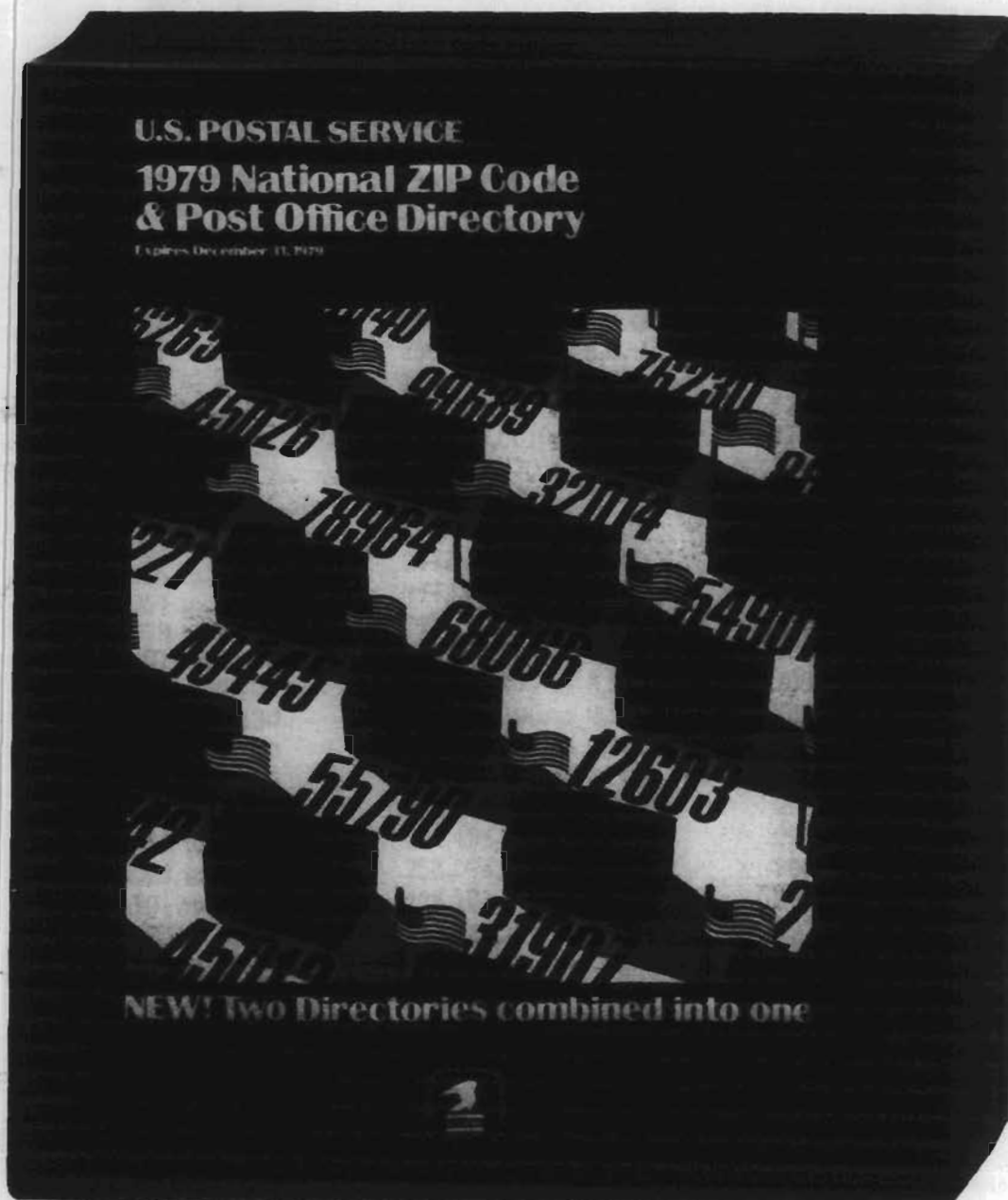

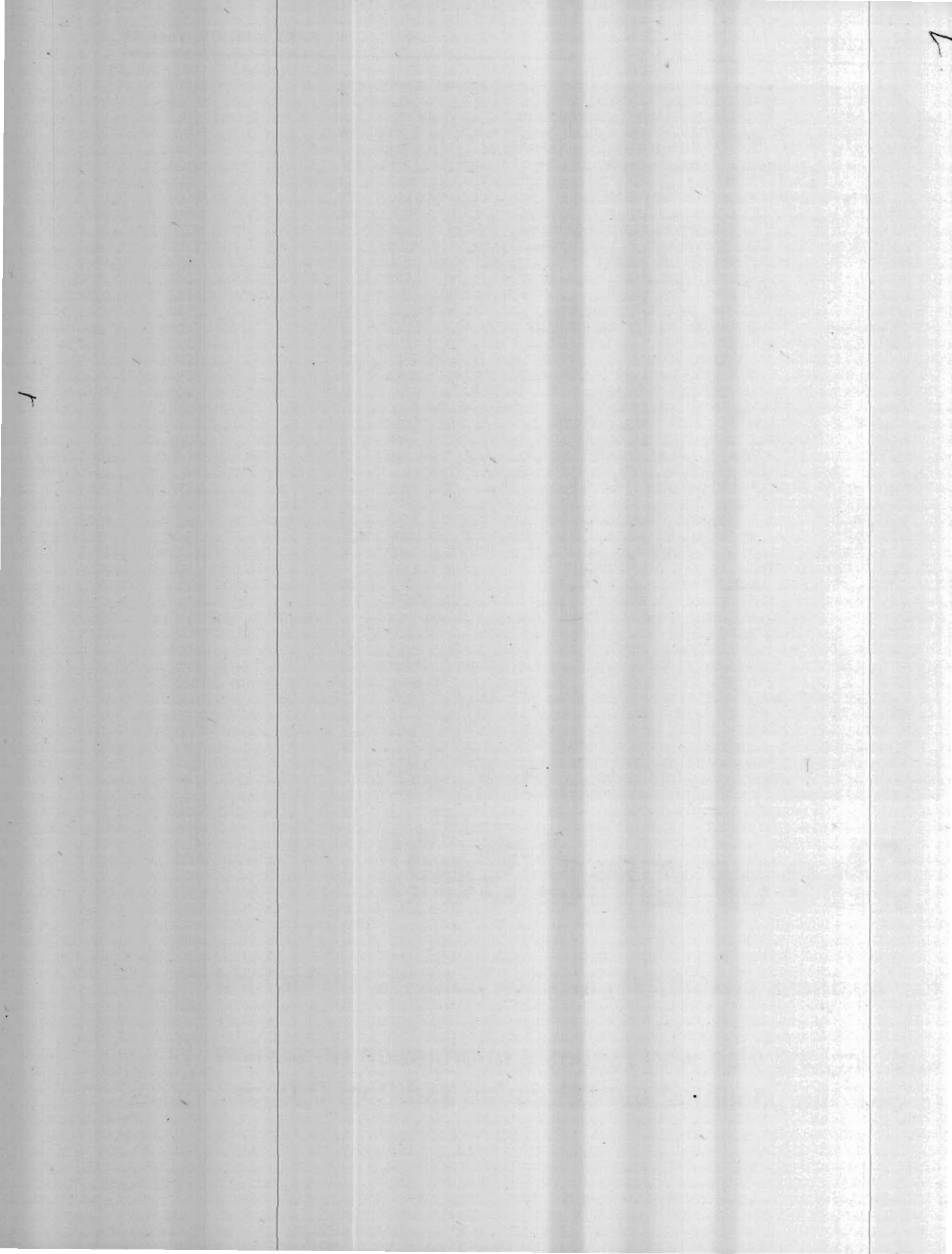

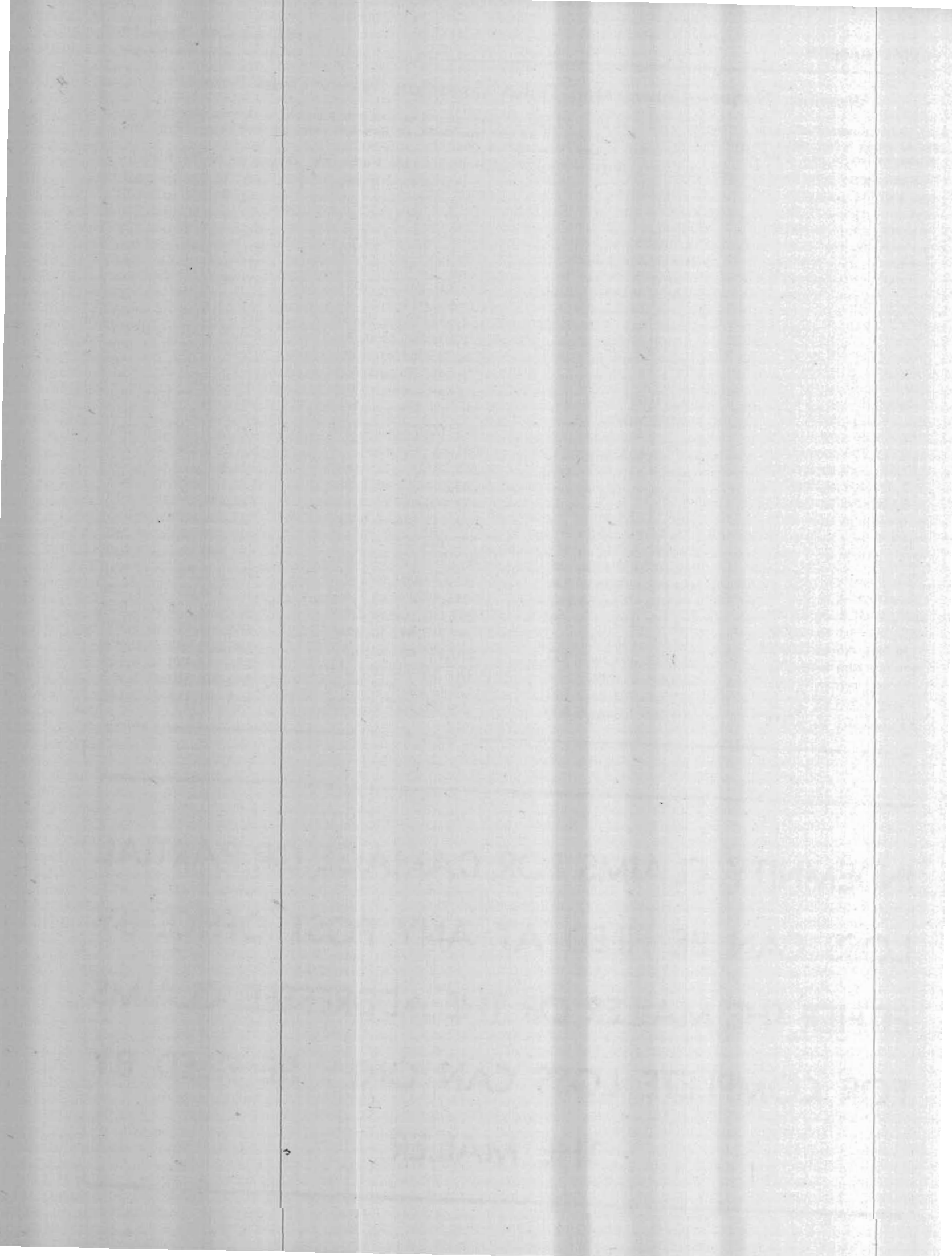
