**Collectors.** First-day cover cancellations may be obtained by one of the following methods:

**a. Customers Affixing Stamps.** Customers are encouraged to purchase their stamps at their local post offices and affix them to their envelopes. All envelopes must be addressed. Peelable address labels are recommended and a filler card of postal card thickness should be inserted in each cover. Orders must be postmarked by August 31, 1979, and should be addressed to: First Day Cancellations, Postmaster, Brockport, NY 14420. No remittance is required.

**b. Postal Service Affixing Stamps.** Request first-day cancellations from: Special Olympics Stamp, Postmaster, Brockport, NY 14420 (see PSM 257.2). Requests must be postmarked

## APO/FPO Mail Service

The military services report several problems with mail addressed to APO and FPO addresses. These are:

1. Special delivery service is not provided at overseas military posts. Postal employees should inform customers that special delivery service will not be provided on mail addressed to APO or FPO addresses.

2. COD service is not available for articles addressed to APO or FPO destinations, including official shipments and shipments to Armed Forces agencies.

3. Mail to APO or FPO addresses is subject to domestic postage rates. International postage rates do not apply on mail to APO and FPO addresses.—*Rates & Classification Dept., 7-19-79.*

Selected United States mint stamps will be available at the Philatelic Sales Branch, Washington, DC 20265 beginning August 10, 1979.

**Supply.** All post offices under the automatic distribution system will receive an initial supply of this stamp. Before requisitioning additional stamps (item 471), consider that the stock should be depleted prior to October 9, 1979, at all post office outlets—except designated philatelic windows and postal stores.

Post offices with 950 or more revenue units requiring additional bulk quantities: immediately requisition on Form 3356, *Stamp Requisition—Bulk Quantities*, from the Bureau of Engraving and Printing.

All post offices requiring additional stamps in less than bulk quantities: requisition on separate Form 17, *Stamp Requisition*, from stamp distribution office.

**Panels.** A limited number of 8½ by 11¼-inch commemorative series stamp panels will only be available through mail order from the Philatelic Sales Branch, Washington, DC 20265. The panels are printed on heavy art paper suitable for mounting.—*Customer Services Dept., 7-19-79.*

## Stamps Removed From Sale

The 13-cent Quilts stamps will be withdrawn from sale at the Philatelic Sales Branch at the close of business August 31, 1979.

Any stock remaining on hand after August 31, 1979, must immediately be withdrawn from all philatelic outlets and handled in accordance with Section 553 of F-1, Financial Handbook for Post Offices.

The Inspection Service will give attention in this area during audit review.—*Customer Services Dept., 7-19-79.*

## Injury Compensation

Sub-chapter 540, Injury Compensation Program, in *EMPLOYEE AND LABOR RELATIONS MANUAL (ELM)* is rescinded.

**Collectors.** Collectors are reminded that regular postage stamps, particularly those of higher denominations, do not receive the same automatic distribution as commemorative stamps and thus will not be as widely available as commemoratives. However, all post offices are encouraged to requisition sufficient quantities to meet local philatelic demand.

First-day cover cancellations may be obtained by one of the following methods:

*a. Customer Affixing Stamps.* Customers may purchase the stamps at their local post offices and affix them to their own envelopes. All envelopes must be addressed. Peelable address labels are recommended and a filler card of postal card thickness should be inserted in each cover. Orders must be postmarked by September 7, 1979, and should be addressed to First Day Cancellations, Postmaster, Boston, MA 02109. No remittance is required.

*b. Postal Service Affixing Stamps.* Request first-day cancellations from: \$5.00 Stamp, Postmaster, Boston, MA 02109, (see POM 244.53). Requests must be postmarked not later than September 7, 1979. Remittance is

## Form 50 Worksheet Submission

Form 50, *Request for Personnel Action* (worksheets, Form 50-A or B), are processed by the servicing E&LR Information Center (ELRIC). Associate offices must submit worksheets to their MSC for review, logging, and forwarding to the ELRIC. Chapter 6 of Handbook P-11, *Personnel Operations*, describes the preparation and submission of these forms. Any instructions which call for direct submission of worksheets to the postal data center are superseded by this notice.

Timeliness in the submission of worksheets which affect pay or benefits is critical. Originating offices and MSCs must coordinate their processing of these documents to prevent delays. If any district or regional office has established procedures for review of certain types of worksheets, these procedures must be reviewed and modified, if necessary, to prevent delays in the arrival of worksheets at the ELRIC.—*Employee Relations Dept.*, 7-19-79.

Selected United States mint stamps will be available at the Philatelic Sales Branch, Washington, DC 20265, beginning August 24, 1979.

**Supply.** There will be an automatic distribution made only to philatelic centers. Philatelic centers automatic distribution will be the same quantity as received for the \$1.00 stamp. Post offices with over 950 revenue units requiring the \$5.00 regular stamp in lots of 10,000; 20,000; 30,000; 40,000; 50,000; 100,000; 150,000; 200,000; 250,000, and multiples of 250,000 to maximum of 2,500,000 should immediately submit a requisition, Form 3356, *Stamp Requisition-Bulk Quantities*, using item 095, to the Bureau of Engraving and Printing.

**Post offices:** Be sure to order sufficient quantities of this stamp to meet anticipated local philatelic demand. Post offices with over 950 revenue units and all other post offices requiring 7,000 or fewer \$5.00 regular stamps may requisition the stamps from their designated stamp distribution center using a separate Form 17, *Stamp Requisition*.—*Customer Services Dept.*, 7-19-79.

## All Installations with Rural Delivery Service Responsibilities

### Count of Mail

Effective with the September 1979 annual count of mail on rural routes, only newly revised (April 1979) editions of Forms 4239, *Count of Mail (Rural Route)*, and 4241, *Rural Delivery Statistics Report*, may be used. Use of Forms 4239 and 4241 bearing an earlier edition date will result in an incorrect evaluation of the rural routes.

This year a new form, 4239-A, *Rural Route Count of Boxholder Mail*, must be used in conjunction with rural mail counts to accommodate the four-week boxholder count as mandated by the 1978 *National Agreement* between the USPS and the National Rural Letter Carriers' Association. Procedures regarding the use of Form 4239-A will appear in the POSTAL BULLETIN which contains the instructions for the September 1979 annual count of mail on rural routes.

Management Sectional Centers should not order Forms 4239, 4239-A, or 4241 from their area supply centers. The required quantities of these forms will be shipped directly from district offices to Management Sectional Centers for issuance to postal facilities with rural routes. It is expected that the forms will be at the district offices about August 1, 1979.—*Delivery Services Dept.*, 7-19-79.

## Pay Changes— Bargaining Units

Salary Schedules shown on pages 7-16.

**A. Application.** These instructions apply to employees covered by the 1978-1981 National Agreement or the USPS-NRLCA (National Rural Letter Carriers' Agreement), and to employees subject to collective bargaining agreements covering:

1. Mailbag depositories, repair centers, and supply centers.
2. Postal Data Centers.
3. Automatic Data Processing Centers.
4. Security Policy Officers who are represented by the Federation of Postal Security Police.

5. Mail Equipment Shop employees represented by the American Postal Workers Union/Mailhandlers Union, and the International Association of Machinists.

**B. Provisions.** Effective July 21, 1979 (PP 16-79), employees listed in A, above, will receive a pay increase in an amount determined by the collective bargaining agreement covering the position to which assigned.

**C. Salary Schedules.** 1. Postal Service (PS). According to the provisions of the arbitrated settlement of the 1978-1981 National Agreement, the basic annual PS salary schedule, with proportional application to hourly rate schedules, for all grades and steps, will be increased 3% per annum above the basic annual salary schedule in effect as of July 20, 1979.

2. Automatic Data Processing Center (ADPC). The basic annual salary schedule for ADPC employees, for all grades and steps, will be increased 3% per annum above the basic annual salary schedule in effect as of July 20, 1979.

3. Rural Carrier Schedules. In accordance with the provisions of the 1978-1981 USPS-NRLCA National Agreement, the basic annual salary schedules will be increased an additional 3% above the base annual salary schedules (including COLA) in effect as of July 20, 1978, with proportional adjustment to the heavy duty and hourly rate schedules. ## Rural Routes—Special Equipment Maintenance Allowance Schedule

Under the provisions of Article 30.1.G.3, of the 1978 USPS-NRLCA 1978 National Agreement, rural carriers will be granted an additional 1¢ per mile increases in the equipment maintenance allowance (EMA) and a 40¢ increase in the minimum EMA rate.

In accordance with the above negotiated increase, the rural carrier EMA will be increased from 21¢ per mile, or major fraction of a mile, scheduled per day, or \$8.40, whichever is greater, to 22¢ per mile, or major fraction of a mile, scheduled per day, or \$8.80, whichever is greater.

Auxiliary Rural Assistants (Des. 78) and Auxiliary Rural Carriers (Des. 77) will be paid an EMA of 22¢ per mile or \$2.80 per hour, whichever is greater, but not to exceed the amount provided for in the special chart for the route stops and miles.

The EMA Schedule on pages 4-5 of this POSTAL BULLETIN supersedes all previously published EMA schedules, including the schedule on pages 3-4 of last week's BULLETIN. The aforementioned changes in the EMA are effective July 21, 1979 (PP16-79).—*Office of Compensation, 7-19-79.*

Substitute schedules will be published in a forthcoming BULLETIN.

**D. Postal Data Center (PDC).** In accordance with the provisions of the USPS-APWU agreement covering employees at the PDCs, the PDC Salary Schedule will be increased 2% per annum above the basic salary schedule in effect as of July 20, 1979.

**E. Casual Employees.** Casual employees are non-bargaining employees and will therefore be excluded from receiving the pay increases discussed in these instructions.

**F. Effective Date.** All salary schedules shown in this BULLETIN are effective July 21, 1979 (PP 16-79). These pay increases will be reflected in checks distributed on August 3, 1979. An appropriate message, identifying the increase to affected employees, will be printed on the earnings statement.—*Office of Compensation, 7-19-79.*

## Supply Item Discontinued

The Index and Price List for the GSA Supply Catalog, Office Products, June 1979, indicates that rubber band, NSN 7510-00-550-8449, which is POIN 0385D, has been deleted and replaced by NSN 7510-00-243-3435, POIN 0385E.

Since the replacement item is already an item of supply in the Postal Service system, FEDSTRIP ordering offices should take this fact into account to avoid getting into a long supply position on the replacement item.

Effective immediately, Item 0385D, rubber band, NSN 7510-00-550-8449, is discontinued as a Postal Service item of supply. This change will be reflected in the next revision of Publication 24, *Supply Catalog—Procurement & Supply Dept., 7-19-79.*

## Postmaster Vacancies

Effective July 19, 1979, postmasters may be considered for a postmaster vacancy if their permanent position is not more than six grades below the level of the vacancy office or they are serving as postmaster in an office not more than three postmaster levels below the vacancy office.

Part 355.321 of the EMPLOYEE AND LABOR RELATIONS MANUAL (ELM) will be revised to reflect this change.—*Employee & Labor Relations Group, 7-19-79.*

## International Express Mail—Taiwan

Effective immediately, International Express Mail items to Taiwan cannot exceed \$200 in value. This restriction is imposed at the request of the postal service on Taiwan.

Each item to Taiwan containing merchandise or other dutiable articles must bear one Form 2966-A, *Parcel Post Customs Declaration—United States of America*. Merchandise insurance is provided at no additional charge with a maximum indemnity equal to the declared value of the item. The declared value may not exceed the \$200 value restriction stated above.

International Express Mail items from Taiwan may contain merchandise or other dutiable articles with a value of up to \$250.

A future revision to Publication 42, *International Mail*, will reflect this information.—*Rates & Classification Dept., 7-19-79.*

## Temperature Restrictions

The Postal Service has been working with the Department of Energy to provide assistance for notifications required by the emergency building temperature restrictions plan.

The Department of Energy will provide "Building Compliance Information Report" forms to building owners and managers directly by mail through trade associations, state and local government agencies, and state energy offices. A limited number of Post Offices in large cities will also have the form. Specific instructions on the distribution of material through Post Offices will appear in a POSTAL BULLETIN.
