## 15-Cent Christmas Postage Stamps

**Description.** The 15-cent Santa Claus Christmas stamp will be placed on sale at North Pole, AK 99705, on October 18, 1979, and the 15-cent Gerard David Christmas stamp will also be placed on sale October 18, 1979, at Washington, DC 20013.

**Do Not Sell Before Oct. 19, 1979.**



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Sizes: .75 x .87 inches—Santa Claus.  
.71 x .87 inches—Gerard David.

Issued: In sheets of 100.

Colors: Santa Claus—yellow, green, light tan, red, dark brown and black.  
Gerard David—yellow, flesh, magenta, cyan, black tone, and black line.

Marginal markings: Six plate numbers © United States Postal Service 1979. Use correct ZIP Code, and Mr. ZIP ®.

Designer: Eskil Ohlsson (Santa Claus); Bradbury Thompson (Gerard David).

**Collectors.** First-day-cover cancellations may be obtained by one of these methods:

a. *Customers Affixing Stamps.* Customers are encouraged to purchase the stamps at their local post offices and affix them to their own envelopes. All envelopes must be addressed. Prelable address labels are recommended and a filler card of postal card thickness should be inserted in each cover. Orders must be postmarked by November 2, 1979, and addressed to First-Day Cancellations, Postmaster, North Pole, AK 99705 (or Washington, DC 20013 for the Gerard David stamp). No remittance is required. Covers sent to either first-day city for cancellation must bear the stamp issued in that city. They may also bear the Christmas stamp issued in the other city, or any other previously issued mint stamp. Covers sent to either city bearing only the stamp issued in the other city will be returned unserviced.

b. *Postal Service Affixing Stamps.* Request first day cancellations from:

Santa Claus Stamp, Postmaster, North Pole, AK 99705.  
Gerard David Stamp, Postmaster, Washington, DC 20013.

(See POM 224.53) Requests must be postmarked not later than November 2, 1979. The Postal Service will affix only the stamp being issued in the first

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## Undeliverable As Addressed Mail

Effective immediately, letter carriers must bundle all Undeliverable As Addressed mail in the following separate categories. Secure each bundle with a rubber band before placing it in the proper separation in throwback cases. These bundles are in addition to mail placed in the A-Z separations:

- Moved, Left No Address
- Attempted, Not Known
- No Such Number
- No Obvious Value

Place a facing slip on top of each bundle. Delivering employees indicate on this facing slip the category of Undeliverable As Addressed mail, the date, their initials and route number (where applicable). For purposes of mail counts and route inspection, time for this function is allowed at the rate of one minute for every four carrier markups, on line 11 of Form 1838, *Carrier's Count of Mail*.

Delivery unit managers are responsible for verifying the contents of the bundles, following established quality control procedures.

These instructions will be incorporated into the methods handbooks M-41, *City Delivery Carrier Duties and Responsibilities*, and M-37, *Rural Carrier's Instructions*.—*Delivery Services Dept., 9-13-79.*

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day city to which the orders are addressed. Remittance is required for the face value of each stamp. Selected United States mint stamps will be available at the Philatelic Sales Branch, Washington, DC 20265, beginning October 18, 1979, for the Gerard David stamp and October 19, 1979, for Santa Claus.

**Supply.** All post offices under the automatic distribution system will receive an initial supply of the stamps. The quantity to be automatically supplied each post office will be approximately 10 times the amount (five times for Santa Claus, item 525 and five times Gerard David, item 526) that is being furnished on the automatic distribution of a 50-subject commemorative postage stamp for straight stock, excluding 4-position stock.

In order to assure the availability of stock at all post offices by October 18, the initial shipments of items 525 and 526 will be approximately the same number of sheets, rounded to the appropriate packaging quantity, as furnished on a regular commemorative issue. The subsequent shipments will equal approximately four times the initial shipment of each stamp. The printouts, associated labels and invoices received by the SDO's for the subsequent shipments will be dated for November 13, 1979. It will not be necessary for each SDO to fill in the date at the time of shipment.

Post offices with 950 or more revenue units requiring additional bulk quantities of Christmas stamps, items 525 and 526, should immediately requisition on Form 3356, Stamp Requisition-Bulk Quantities, from the Bureau of Engraving and Printing. Any requisitions for special issue Christmas stamps received after October 18, 1979, will be filled only if stock is available. Requisitions must be for quantities of 10,000; 20,000; 30,000; 40,000; 50,000; 100,000; 150,000; 200,000; 250,000 and multiples of 250,000 stamps to the maximum of 5,000,000. The filling of requisitions for additional bulk quantities of Christmas stamps will be withheld until completion of the automatic distribution.

All post offices requiring additional stamps in less than bulk quantities requisition on separate Form 17, *Stamp Requisition*, from their designated stamp distribution office on next scheduled requisitioning date.

**Panels.** A limited number of 8½ by 11¼-inch commemorative series stamp panels will be available only through mail order from the Philatelic Sales Branch, Washington, D.C. 20265. The panels are printed on heavy art paper suitable for mounting.—Customer Services Dept., 9-13-79.

## Form 990, Vacancy Announcements

Form 990, used for posting position vacancies, is now available from the area supply centers and may be requisitioned through normal channels. Standardized format information is available from your Regional General Manager, Employee Relations.—*Employee & Labor Relations Group*, 9-13-79.

## Lockbox/Caller Service Refunds

Effective with the date of this POSTAL BULLETIN, postmasters may refund a part of the unused portion of a lockbox or caller service fee when such service is discontinued after the beginning of a semiannual payment period. With certain exceptions (see existing sections 951.29 and 952.25 of the DOMESTIC MAIL MANUAL (DMM)), no part of the unused portion is presently refundable. This new procedure is applicable only to service discontinued on or after September 1, 1979. Refunds under this new procedure are in addition to the refund which is presently permitted for a semiannual payment period subsequent to that in which the service is discontinued. DMM 147.26,

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951.274, 951.29, 952.234, and 952.25 are revised as follows:

**147.26 Refund Application for Retail Services.** Application for refund of fees collected for retail services must be initiated by the customer on Form 3532, *Refund of Fees for Retail Services*. Applications will be processed as follows:

a. The application and any supporting papers will be reviewed by an authorized postal employee. If a refund is due, the postal employee will complete and witness the approval portion of Form 3532. Form 3532 will be returned to the customer for submission to the window services section for payment.

b. The refund will be issued as follows:

(1) The window services employee will pay the applicant in cash from official funds on hand if practicable to do so and the refund is made in person. The payee must sign the receipt portion of Form 3532 if a cash refund is made.

(2) If requested, or if the refund is to be mailed, payment will be made by Treasury Check; or, if less than \$400, by a no-fee money order. The check or money order number will be recorded on the receipt portion of Form 3532 instead of obtaining the payee's signature. When the amount is less than \$2, the refund will be made by cash payment in accordance with 147.26b(1), (above) unless the payee or his representative is physically unable to come to the post office, in which case, a no-fee money order may be issued.

c. If the application is not approv-

ed, it will be returned to the applicant with the supporting papers and an explanatory statement.

**951.274 Change of Payment Period Date.** Except for customers at facilities which have adopted Option 2 (see 951.271b), boxholders of record may change their payment period by submitting a new application with the month they wish to use as the start of their revised payment period noted thereon. The date selected must be before the end of the current payment period. The unused fee for the period being discontinued may be refunded in accordance with 951.29 (below), and the fee for the new payment period must be fully paid in advance.

**951.29 Refund of Box Rent**

**.291** When a lockbox is closed or surrendered, the unused portion of the fee may be refunded as follows:

a. Refunds will be processed in accordance with 147.26.

b. The entire fee will be refunded for a semiannual payment period subsequent to that in which the service is discontinued.

c. Refunds for the payment period in which service is discontinued will be determined as follows:

(1) For service discontinued any time within the first three months (i.e. on or before the last day of the third month) of the semiannual payment period, the amount refunded will be one-half of the semiannual rental fee for the discontinued box (see 951.26).

(2) No refund will be made when service is discontinued any time after the third month (i.e. on or after the

first day of the fourth month) of the semiannual payment period.

**952.234 Change of Payment Period Date.** Callers of record may change their payment period by submitting a new application with the month they wish to use as the start of their revised payment period noted thereon. The date selected must be before the end of the current payment period. The unused fee for the period being discontinued may be refunded in accordance with 952.25 (below), and the fee for the new payment period must be fully paid in advance.

**952.25 Refund of Caller Service Fees.**

**.251** When a caller service number is discontinued, the unused portion of the fee for that number may be refunded as follows:

a. Refunds will be processed in accordance with 147.26, above.

b. The entire fee will be refunded for a semiannual payment period subsequent to that in which the service is discontinued.

c. Refunds for the payment period in which service is discontinued will be determined as follows:

(1) For service discontinued any time within the first three months (i.e. on or before the last day of the third month) of the semiannual payment period, the amount refunded will be one-half of the semiannual caller service fee specified in 952.222a.

(2) No refund will be made when service is discontinued any time after the third month (i.e. on or after the first day of the fourth month) of the semiannual payment period.—*Rates & Classification Dept., 9-13-79.*

Problems arising from installation or withdrawal of CMRS postage meters will be referred to the Accounting and Revenue Protection Division of the region. Do not contact the Pitney Bowes Data Site.

Problems which may be discovered on the manufacturer supplied Resetting by Post Office report (see POSTAL BULLETIN 21188, 5-3-79, page 6, section 655.22), are:

- Omission of a CMRS postage meter licensed by your office.
- Inclusion of a CMRS postage meter not licensed by your office.
- CMRS postage meter shown with a ZIP Code other than the inspecting unit ZIP Code.

Instances of manufacturer representatives failing to follow instructions contained in DOMESTIC MAIL MANUAL, section 144.38, should also be reported to the regional Accounting and Revenue Protection Division.—Finance Dept., 9-13-79.
