## 3.5-Cent Regular Postage Stamp—Coil

**Description.** The 3.5-cent coil stamp will be first placed on sale at Williamsburg, PA 16693 on June 23, 1980. The design features two images of a Weaver violin manufactured in Washington, D.C., in the mid-1800's. This issue is primarily for use by authorized nonprofit organizations that hold permits for special bulk mailing.

**Collectors.** Request first-day cancellations from: 3.5¢ Nonprofit Stamp, Postmaster, Williamsburg, PA 16693. (See POM, section 244.43.) Enclose 16 cents for each cover. The Postal Service will affix a 3.5-cent coil stamp and a 12-cent Henry Ford stamp to cover the first class mailing rate. Orders must be postmarked by July 8, 1980. Nonpre-canceled stamps will be available at the Philatelic Sales Branch, Washington, D.C. 20265, beginning June 24, 1980.

**Supply.** Post offices with 950 or more revenue units requiring this stamp in precanceled form should immediately submit requisitions Form 3356, Stamp Requisition-Bulk Quantities, to the Bureau of Engraving and Printing in accordance with Part 143, Domestic Mail Manual. Use

## Parcels to Military Post Offices in Turkey

Many customers report that post offices are refusing to accept parcels addressed to military post offices in Turkey. POSTAL BULLETIN 21165 (11-23-78), announced that these parcels were acceptable. Pending a revision in the DOMESTIC MAIL MANUAL (DMM), the following instructions apply:

## Transfer Reimbursement

The Comptroller General has ruled that federal agencies that hire Postal Service employees are not authorized to pay relocation expenses for such employees. For relocation purposes Postal Service transferees are treated as new employees.

The Comptroller General's ruling does not affect the reimbursement of Postal Service employees for expenses incurred in connection with transfers from one postal installation to another, or the reimbursement of new employees hired by the Postal Service.—*Law Dept., 5-29-80.*

## Treasury Department Checks

The Treasury Department has advised that June supplemental security income and VA compensation and pension checks are to be delivered on Friday, May 30. The envelopes for both of these payments will bear the following endorsement:

POSTMASTER: Requested Delivery Day is the 30th Day of the Month

Treasury has also advised that June Civil Service annuity, public debt interest and Railroad Retirement checks are to be delivered on June 2. These check envelopes will be endorsed as follows:

POSTMASTER: Requested Delivery Date is the 1st Day of the Month or the First Delivery Date thereafter

Postmasters and supervisors are asked to complete delivery of these checks on the dates specified above.—*Mail Processing Dept., 5-29-80.*

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*ELM Revision***Special Review Panel—Job Levels**

Current procedures allow an employee to request a special review of the grade level of the position to which the employee is assigned (Special Review Panel). This policy is now broadened in Section 226 of the EMPLOYEE & LABOR RELATIONS MANUAL (ELM) to permit managers to request a review by the Special Review Panel if the manager believes that substantive information was overlooked in the initial review process. This will be incorporated in a future ELM revision.

**226.1 Background Information**

.11 A Special Review Panel at Headquarters reviews each case in which an employee in the EAS pay schedule or in which management requests a review due to a belief that substantive information was overlooked in the initial review process. The Special Review Panel is composed of at least three officials with the rank of department or office head (or equivalent), plus an executive secretary. No official may participate on a Panel hearing a case from the functional area to which the official is assigned.

.12 The Executive Secretary, a non-voting member of the Panel (a) processes the requests for Panel review, (b) sets up the Panel, (c) schedules the meetings, (d) compiles information necessary for decision-making, (e) maintains necessary liaison with the management associations and concerned Postal Service departments and offices, and (f) develops review responses to be sent to the employees.

**226.2 Initiating Requests**

.21 A request for Panel review must be filed within 60 calendar days after the date of mailing of the initial review decision by Compensation.

.24 Any employee wishing to be represented by a postal management association should so designate on the Panel review request and send a copy of the request to the designated association. The designated association will furnish the Panel with a position paper as soon as possible after receipt

of the copy of the employee's review request.

.25 The Special Review Panel meets as frequently as possible to review the pending requests. All decisions made by the Special Review Panel are final.

.26 The Office of Personnel Management does not process position classification (job evaluation) appeals for Postal Service employees.—Employee Relations Dept., 5-29-80.



### 3.5-Cent Precanceled Embossed Stamped Envelope

**Description.** The 3.5-cent precanceled embossed stamped envelope will be first placed on sale at Williamsburg, PA 16693, on June 23, 1980. The indicium repeats the violin images of the stamp design. The 3.5-cent denomination meets the new rate for nonprofit organization mailings which becomes effective July 6, 1980.

This envelope will be available in sizes 6¾ and 10 regular and window and can be ordered through post offices with printed return addresses in minimum lots of 500.

**Collectors.** Request first-day cancellations from: 3.5-cent Envelope, Postmaster, Williamsburg, PA 16693. To eliminate the requirement for Postal Service personnel to apply return addresses, customers are requested to send self-addressed envelopes of an appropriate size or return address labels with their orders. Both sizes of return envelopes will be serviced, but unless size 10 is stipulated, the cancellation will be on size 6¾. Requests must be postmarked no later than July 8, 1980 with the remittance to cover the cost of 19 cents per envelope. In order to meet the First Class mailing rate, a 3.5-cent nonprofit coil stamp and an 8.4-cent bulk rate coil stamp will be affixed to the envelope.

### Fueling City Delivery Vehicles

Due to the proliferation of commercial self-service stations and the installation of bulk fuel tanks at non-vehicle maintenance facilities, it will be necessary under certain conditions for delivery personnel to fuel vehicles. Effective immediately, section 841.3 of Handbook M-41, *City Delivery Carriers*, is amended to read:

Have fuel, oil, and water replenished by garage or station attendant as scheduled. However, you may be required to fuel vehicles at postal facilities

having bulk fuel tanks (and no vehicle maintenance personnel on site), or at commercial self-service stations.

In instances where delivery personnel are required to fuel vehicles, full time letter carriers and special delivery messengers will not be required to service the vehicles. Local management must establish a program which will ensure that oil and water are checked at least once a week and replenished if needed.—*Delivery Services Dept., 5-29-80.*

**Requisitions.** All classes of post offices may submit requisitions for the 3.5-cent precanceled embossed stamped envelope to the U.S. Stamped Envelope Agency, Williamsburg, PA 16693. Orders will be filled as fast as production and distribution facilities permit.

**Plain Envelopes.** All post offices requiring the new 3.5-cent plain stamped envelope, regular and window, in minimum lots of 500 may submit Form 3205, *Requisition For*

*Plain Stamped Envelopes*, to the U.S. Stamped Envelope Agency, Williamsburg, PA 16693, in accordance with the instructions in section 526, Fiscal Handbook F-1, *Financial Handbook for Post Offices*. Requisitions should be limited to a 3-accounting period supply.

**Printed Stamped Envelopes.** Postmasters may accept customers' requests for the precanceled stamped envelopes with printed return addresses. Orders must be for minimum lots of 500. Allow four weeks for delivery. No orders will be dispatched before June 23, 1980.

**Selling Prices.** Selling prices and item numbers for the 3.5-cent plain and printed stamped envelopes are shown in Exhibits A and B.—*Customer Services Dept., 5-29-80.*

### HANDICAP CODES

To conform with the reportable code requirements established by the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission, the Postal Service must collect the required data for input into the approved handicap designation code reporting system.

The collection and processing of this data must be handled with the utmost confidentiality. Only those with direct responsibility for gathering, mentoring and processing will have access to the material.

#### Responsible Officials

Officials responsible for the implementation and control of this one-time reporting program are: General Manager, Headquarters Personnel Division; Chief Postal Inspector; Regional General Managers of Employee Relations; Sectional Center Directors of Support or Employee and Labor Relations; Bulk Mail Center Directors of Support.

#### Data Collection

**A. Computerized Reports.** Two copies of computerized printouts generated by pay location and containing the name, social security number, occupation, handicap, sex, and employing facility of each handicapped employee known to be on the Postal Service rolls as of Pay Period 12, FY 1980, will be distributed to the responsible officials by Monday, June 16, 1980. They will then distribute one copy of the printout to the supervisor/manager of each pay location plus a Form 2567, *Identification of Physical/Mental Disability*, for each individual identified on the printout. Responsible officials must retain the second copy of the computerized reports to ensure that all pay locations have responded to the request for information.

#### B. Reporting

1. Supervisors/managers are responsible for the verification and accuracy of the revised handicap designation code reported for each of their handicapped employees. Information regarding handicapped individuals who do not appear on the computer printout will be identified at a later date. Do not add or delete names from the list.

2. The handicap designated on the printout is based on the current handicap identification system. Supervisors/managers must select the new handicap code which most ap-

propriately describes the employee's impairment. If it is known that an individual is improperly coded on the printout, use the new code which is appropriate. If, however, the handicap is not known nor visually perceived, the supervisor must not select a code designation for a handicap. Questions regarding the validity of the handicap code are to be referred to the Medical Unit for verification. If the Medical Unit's review of the employee's medical record does not reveal the existence of a disabling impairment, use the number 01, "Handicap Not Identified", as the applicable code. Do not question employees about their handicap status.

3. Complete the top portion of

Form 2567 with the name, social security number, sex, and employing installation of the handicapped employee. Circle the reportable handicap code and enter the applicable code number where indicated.

4. After completing the Form 2567, and using the computerized printout as a checklist, be sure that all the listed employees are reported, and return all Forms 2567 to the responsible official. Do not copy, duplicate, or retain any of these records in any installation.

#### C. Review

1. The responsible officials must review each returned form for completeness and accuracy, checking the
