1981 STAMPS AND STATIONERY

The Postal Service has announced the subjects for the 1981 commemorative stamp and stationery program. The listing below provides information for Postal Service personnel to use in responding to inquiries.

Stamps

Everett M. Dirksen—A single stamp to be issued January 4 at Pekin, Illinois.

Whitney Moore Young—A single stamp to be issued January 30 in New York City.

American Red Cross—A single stamp to be issued in Washington, D.C., on a date in April to be announced later.

Space Achievement—A block of eight stamps to be issued at Kennedy Space Center, Cape Canaveral, Florida, on a date in April to be announced later.

Savings and Loan Associations—A single stamp to be issued May 8 in Chicago.

Architecture—A block of four stamps in the American Architecture Series to be issued in June on a date to be announced later.

Professional Management—A single stamp to be issued June 18 at Philadelphia.

Edna St. Vincent Millay—A single stamp to be issued July 10 at Austerlitz, New York.

Preservation of Wildlife Habitats—A block of four stamps to be issued at Reno, Nevada, on a date to be announced. The stamps will urge preservation of wildlife habitats in the nation's wetlands, grasslands, woodlands and mountains.

Bobby Jones and Babe Zaharias—Two single stamps on separate panes to be issued together on September 10 at Pinehurst, North Carolina.

Christmas—Two single stamps to be issued October 9 at places to be announced later.

Battle of Yorktown/Battle of Virginia Capes—A pair of stamps to be issued October 16 at Yorktown, Virginia.

Cacti—A block of four stamps to be issued in October on a date to be announced later. The stamps will depict the barrel cactus, beavertail cactus, agave and saguaro cactus.

International Year of the Disabled Persons—A single stamp to be issued in Washington, DC, on a date to be announced.

Stationery

Battle of Cowpens—An American Revolution Series postal card will be issued at Cowpens, South Carolina, on January 17 commemorating the 200th anniversary of the battle.

Blinded Veterans Association—An embossed stamped envelope will be issued August 18 in Washington, DC.

Old Washington, DC, Post Office—A Historical Preservation Series postal card will be issued in Washington, DC, on an August date to be announced later.

Battle of Eutaw Springs—An American Revolution Series postal card will be issued at Eutaw Springs, South Carolina, on September 8 commemorating the 200th anniversary of the battle.

Lewis and Clark Expedition—A postal card will be issued at St. Louis on September 23 to commemorate the 175th anniversary of the expedition's successful completion.—*Customer Services Dept., 11-20-80.*

Workroom Posters

All postal facilities with four or more employees will receive a kit containing four workroom posters to be mailed in December. These posters are for display at conspicuous locations in post office areas used only by employees. The kit will include one on revenue protection, Poster 57 *Verify All Bulk Mailings for Classification, Postage and Presort*. This poster should be prominently displayed in the workroom at all bulk mail acceptance and weigh units.

Poster 60, *Treat this Mailgram as First-Class Mail*, should be posted in mail distribution areas and letter carrier workroom areas.

Poster 171, *Put the finger on misdeliveries*, and Poster 172, *Miscased mail leads to misdelivery*, remind all employees of the need for accurate delivery of mail to street addresses, as well as post office lockboxes. These posters emphasize accurate casing

and fingering of mail as a part of the program to reduce misdeliveries. In cases where it is felt that the effectiveness of the posters can be enhanced, the poster on fingering mail may be placed *inside* relay or storage boxes.

Supply centers will not stock these items as there will be an automatic issuance.—*Public & Employee Communications Dept., 11-20-80.*

INTERNATIONAL POSTAGE STAMPS AND POSTAL STATIONERY

The information contained below pertains to the availability of stamps and postal stationery to be used in connection with proposed international postage rates, which will become effective January 1, 1981. Shipment of these items will be made as fast as production and distribution facilities permit.

19-Cent Regular Stamp

Description. The 19-cent Sequoyah regular stamp will be issued on December 27, 1980, at Tahlequah, OK 74464. This stamp honors the Cherokee Indian who brought literacy to his people by devising a written alphabet for the tribe.

Collectors. First-day cover cancellations may be obtained by one of the following methods:

a. Customers Affixing Stamps. Customers are encouraged to purchase stamps at local post offices and affix them to envelopes. All envelopes must be addressed. Peelable address labels are recommended and a filler card of postal card thickness should be inserted in each cover. Orders must be postmarked by January 12, 1981, and should be addressed to: First Day Cancellations, Postmaster, Washington, DC 20013. No remittance is required.

b. Postal Service Affixing Stamps. Request first-day cancellations from: Sequoyah Stamp, Postmaster, Tahlequah, OK 74464 (see POM 244.53). Requests must be postmarked not later than January 12, 1981. Remittance is required for the face value of each stamp.

Selected United States mint stamps will be available at the Philatelic Sales Division, Washington, DC 20265, beginning December 29, 1980.

Supply. An automatic distribution will be made to post offices with philatelic centers.

Bulk Quantities. Post offices with 950 or more revenue units requiring more than 7,000 stamps should immediately order from the Bureau of Engraving and Printing, on Form 3356, *Stamp Requisition—Bulk Quantities*, in the following manner: 10,000; 20,000; 30,000; 40,000; 50,000; 100,000; 150,000; 200,000; 250,000 and multiples of 250,000 to a maximum of 2,500,000, using item number 019.

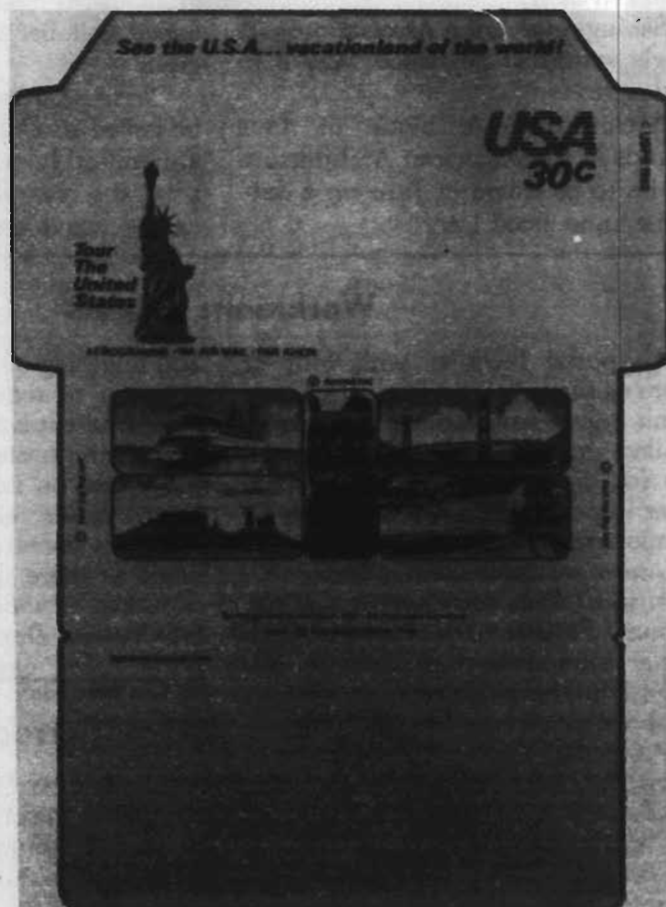
Less-than-Bulk-Quantities. Post offices with over 950 revenue units and all other post offices requiring 7,000 stamps or less may submit a separate requisition (Form 17, *Stamp Requisition*) to their designated stamp distribution office. Requisitions should be submitted immediately.

30-Cent Aerogramme

Description. The 30-cent aerogramme will be first placed on sale at San Francisco, CA 94101 on December 29, 1980. Travel and tourism is the design theme for the new aerogramme.

Collector. Address orders for first-day cancellations to Aerogramme, Postmaster, San Francisco, CA 94101. The cost is 30 cents per aerogramme, and orders must be post-marked by December 29, 1980. To eliminate the requirement for Postal Service personnel to apply return addresses, customers are requested to send either self-addressed envelopes of an appropriate size or return address labels with their orders. Aerogrammes will be available at the Philatelic Sales Division, Washington, DC 20265 beginning December 30, 1980.

Supply. There will be an automatic distribution of 500 aerogrammes to post offices with philatelic centers. Post offices with over 950 revenue units requiring this aerogramme in lots of 500/1,000/2,000/5,000 and multiples of 5,000 to maximum of 1,000,000 should immediately submit Form 3356, *Stamp Requisition—Bulk Quantities*, using *item No. 231*, to the Bureau of Engraving and Printing. Post offices with over 950 revenue units and all other post offices requiring 300 aerogrammes or less may order this aerogramme from their designated stamp distribution center using a separate Form 17, *Stamp Requisition*.

28-Cent and 35-Cent Airmail Stamps

Description. The 28-cent Blanche Stuart Scott and 35-cent Glenn Curtiss International Airmail stamps will be issued at Hammondsport, NY 14840 on December 30, 1980. Two single stamps on separate panes to be issued simultaneously. Miss Scott was one of the first women to pilot an airplane. Curtiss was an early aircraft designer and manufacturer.

a. Customers Affixing Stamps. Customers are encouraged to purchase stamps at local post offices and affix them to envelopes. All envelopes must be addressed. Peelable address labels are recommended and a filler card of postal card thickness should be inserted in each cover. Orders must be postmarked by January 14, 1981, and should be addressed to: First Day Cancellations, Postmaster, Hammondsport, NY 14840. No remittance is required.

b. Postal Service Affixing Stamps. Request first-day cancellations from: Blanche Stuart Scott Stamp/Glenn Curtiss Stamp, Postmaster, Hammondsport, NY 14840 (see POM 244.53). Requests must be postmarked not later than January 14, 1981. Remittance is required for the face value of each stamp.

Selected United States mint stamps will be available at the Philatelic Sales Division, Washington, DC 20265, beginning December 31, 1980.

Supply. An automatic distribution will be made to post offices with philatelic centers.

Bulk Quantities. Post offices with 950 or more revenue units requiring more than 3,000 stamps of both issues should *immediately* order from the Bureau of Engraving and Printing, on Form 3356, *Stamp Requisition—Bulk Quantities*, in the following manner: 5,000; 10,000; 15,000; 20,000; 25,000; 50,000; 75,000; 100,000; 125,000 and multiples of 125,000 to a maximum of 1,000,000. Use *item No. 178* for the 28-cent *Blanche Stuart Scott* and *item No. 183* for the 35-cent *Glenn Curtiss*.

Less-than-Bulk-Quantities. Post offices with over 950 revenue units and all other post offices requiring 3,000 stamps or less may submit a separate requisition (Form 17, *Stamp Requisition*) listing both items to their designated stamp distribution office. Requisitions should be submitted immediately.

28-Cent Airmail Postal Card

Description. The 28-cent International Airmail postal card will be issued January 2, 1981 at Wenatchee, WA 98801. This card calls attention to the first transpacific flight made in 1931 by Clyde Pangborn and Hugh Herndon from Sabishiro Beach, Japan, to Wenatchee, WA.

Collectors. Request first day cancellations from: First Transpacific Flight Card, Postmaster, Wenatchee, WA 98801. To eliminate the requirement for Postal Service personnel to apply return addresses, customers are requested to send self-addressed envelopes of an appropriate size or return address labels with their orders. Requests must be postmarked no later than January 2, 1981. Remittance is required for the face value of each card.

This card will be available at the Philatelic Sales Division, Washington, DC 20265, beginning January 3, 1981.

Supply. An automatic distribution will be made only to post offices with philatelic centers. All post offices requiring this card in quantities of 500, 1,000, 2,000, 5,000 and multiples of 5,000 to maximum of 50,000 should immediately submit a Form 3216, Requisition for Postal Cards—Bulk Quantities, to the Government Printing Office, Washington, DC 20401, using *item No. 228*. Requisitions for quantities of less than 500 may only be submitted to stamp distribution offices.—*Customer Services Dept., 11-20-80.*

1980 IRS TAX PACKAGES

Mailings of 1980 Internal Revenue Service tax packages began on November 17, 1980, at Green Bay, WI; Mt. Morris, IL; Milwaukee, WI; Cambridge, MD; Neena, WI; Racine, WI; Poughkeepsie, NY.; and St. Paul, MN. The mailings will be at the "all other" third-class bulk rate and bear a permit imprint with the Internal Revenue Service permit number G48. These mailings will be accepted from the IRS contractors/mailers who must furnish the local postmaster with a completed Form 3602, *Statement of Mailing with Permit Imprint*, prior to acceptance of the mailing. The weight of a single piece must be verified at the time of acceptance of the mail; however, it is not necessary to verify quantities at the post office. Verification of total volumes will be done using records maintained at IRS Headquarters, Washington, DC.

Approximately 30 percent of the total mailing will be endorsed "Carrier Route Presort" on the address label, however, the pieces will not necessarily be in carrier route sequence and none will receive the carrier route presort discount.

Mailings will be palletized to five-digit or unique three-digit ZIP Code offices wherever possible. Avoid, if

possible, the use of railroad trailers as storage facilities at destination post offices.

Pallets of IRS cartons received at a bulk mail center addressed to a five- or unique three-digit ZIP Code office are to be dispatched intact to destination. Pallets addressed to BMCs are to be worked as nonmachinable outsides. Tax packages should be delivered to post offices as addressed and kept at those points until scheduled release dates. Empty pallets should be returned according to existing instructions.

Particular attention should be paid to improper make-up and to erroneous ZIP Codes. Also, any other irregularities noted at time of delivery should be reported on Form 3749, *Irregularities in the Preparation of Mail Matter*. Form 3749 should be sent to Government Revenue and Examination Branch, Room 8446, USPS, Washington, DC 20260, to be certain that any additional revenue due is collected. Do not report failure to properly make-up pieces to carrier route.

Delivery should be completed as soon as possible for the class of service requested. **Under no circumstances** should postmasters, super-

visors, or postal employees deliver or permit delivery of any tax package prior to December 26, 1980, with the exception of those packages which bear the bold blue endorsement: *Postmaster deliver immediately*. This endorsement will appear above the address label, and means that this mail will be delivered as third-class mail without regard to the December 26 date.

The Postal Service is committed to delivering the tax packages as early as possible, subject to the December 26 limitation above, however, delivery should be without the use of overtime or auxiliary assistance.

If the addressee has moved and a change of address order is on file, the package should be forwarded and delivered without collecting postage due from the addressee. IRS pays forwarding costs under a special agreement with the Postal Service. If this forwarding address is to a foreign country, or is otherwise undeliverable, the package is to be destroyed. Do not return undeliverable copies to IRS. Under no circumstances should undeliverable copies of any tax package be left in a post office lobby.—*Customer Services Dept., 11-20-80.*

INTERNATIONAL SURFACE AIR LIFT

POSTAL BULLETINS 21252 (7-3-80) and 21261 (9-4-80) introduced the International Surface Air Lift program. This notice gives more detailed information on the new service. Questions are expected at the local level because of program growth. The service is available for any second-class or controlled circulation publication, as well as books, advertising, and any other printed matter.

We are currently offering service between New York and Amsterdam, Rome, Rio de Janeiro, London, Frankfurt, Sydney, Tokyo, and Paris. Routes also operate from Chicago to London, Paris, Frankfurt, Sydney, and Tokyo as well as Houston to Frankfurt, Rome, and London. Additional U.S. entry points and foreign destinations will be established based on customer demand.

At present the control of International Surface Air Lift shipments (traffic control) is coordinated through the Regular Mail Services Division in Headquarters. The customer notifies the Regular Mail Services Division (202-245-4456) four

days before shipment date. The Regular Mail Services Division verifies airline space availability and confirms (with the mailer) the date and time the shipment must reach the respective air cargo terminal. On the scheduled day, the customer transports the shipment to the airline cargo terminal where a postal clerk coordinates the acceptance of the shipment with the airline. On arrival in the destination city, the foreign postal administration takes charge of the shipment for delivery anywhere in that country.

Only permit mail or mail bearing the legend, *Postage Has Been Paid*, normally applied to second class mail, will be accepted for shipment. Mailers must obtain an International Surface Air Lift permit. If a customer already holds a second class, third class, or controlled circulation permit, there will be no charge for the International Surface Air Lift permit and no annual fee. Before a customer forwards shipment to an air cargo terminal the postmaster (or designee) where the permit is assigned must verify that sufficient postage is avail-

able to cover the cost of the shipment by signing Form 3650, *Mailing/Revenue Statement*. This form is available only from Headquarters Regular Mail Services Division.

International Surface Air Lift rates between U.S. cities and foreign destinations will vary with the distance and weight of each shipment. In addition to a per pound rate, there is a handling charge of one dollar per sack.

The customer is responsible for the preparation of the mail in accordance with Publication 42, *International Mail*, as well as the transportation of the mail to the proper airline cargo terminal. The Postal Service will verify that there is sufficient postage on hand for the shipment and verify the number of pouches per shipment.

The Customer Programs Division in each region has an International Surface Air Lift Coordinator who is available to answer more detailed questions. Additional information will be supplied as the service expands.—*Customer Services Dept., 11-20-80.*

International Mail Claims and Inquiries

Window unit personnel and others who accept international mail claims and inquiries are requested to review POSTAL BULLETIN 21251 (6-26-80). Some offices are submitting incorrectly prepared Forms 542, *Inquiry About a Registered Article or an Insured Parcel or an Ordinary Parcel*. This causes delays and extra work since improperly prepared forms are returned to the origin post offices for correction.

The most common errors and the corrective actions required are:

1. Failure to include the fee.

An inquiry must have \$0.35 in postage attached to the inquiry form. *Exceptions:* No fee is required (a) for International Express Mail inquiries or (b) if a return receipt purchased at the time of mailing has not been received. In the latter case, attach a completed Form 2865, *Return Receipt for International Insured and Registered Mail*, to the Form 542 and mark the return receipt *Duplicate*.

2. Filing too soon.

Do not accept inquiries for lost or delayed United States origin mail

until at least 90 days for surface mail or 60 days for airmail have elapsed after the *date of mailing*.

3. Using old or incorrect forms.

The only acceptable inquiry form is the November 1979 edition of Form 542. Earlier editions of the form are not accepted and will be returned to the origin post offices. Form 2855, *Claim for Indemnity—International Registered and Insured Mail*, may not be used to make a claim for loss until the Form 542 process is completed and loss is established.

4. Removing copies.

Do not remove copies from the Form 542. The completed form with all copies should be sent to the office shown in Table 4 on pages 13-14 of Postal Bulletin 21251 (6-26-80).

5. Unreadable or incomplete forms.

Check the form to assure that (a) all required information is included; (b) all copies are readable (print or type); and (c) the name and address of the sender and the addressee are complete (including ZIP Code) and placed in the proper location.—*Rates & Classification Dept., 11-20-80.*

Plant Quarantine Inspections

No postal employee may detain or open any mail, or permit state or federal plant quarantine inspectors to examine, open, or detain any mail, solely on the basis of a suspicion or belief that the mail contains plants or plant products. Any examination, detention, or opening of mail for purposes of enforcing state or federal plant quarantines must be conducted strictly in accordance with applicable postal regulations (see DOMESTIC MAIL MANUAL (DMM) 115.31a, 115.6, 115.92 a, b, or c, and Publication 14, *Plant Quarantines*).

If you need guidance, ask the Postal Inspection Service. Requests from plant quarantine inspectors for access to mail should be treated strictly in accordance with DMM 115.7. Comply with the request only if you are sure that compliance is authorized by postal regulations. Otherwise, refer the request to the Postal Inspection Service.—*Rates & Classification Dept., 11-20-80.*

COP FOR SUBSTITUTE RURAL CARRIERS

A procedure has been developed for reporting and paying Continuation of Pay (COP) hours when the employee is either a Substitute Rural Carrier (Designation 73) or an Emergency Substitute Rural Carrier (Designation 74). This procedure will eliminate the preparing and processing of Form 50s for the purpose of paying COP to substitute rural carriers when they have suffered a traumatic injury while working in the rural craft.

1. Prepare an unpunched Form 1314 with:
Name
Finance Number

Social Security Number
Designation (always 78)
FLSA Code (always P)
Pay Period
Year

2. Record the number of COP hours to be paid in the COP block on the 1314 (See exhibit).

3. Do not record any other type of leave or workhours, only COP hours. If other types of hours are recorded, no payment will be made.

This procedure does not apply if the substitute rural carrier is a mixed service employee, Substitute Rural Carrier (Des. 73) and an Auxiliary

Rural Carrier (Des. 77). Or, if they are established via a Form 50 as a Substitute Rural Carrier (Des. 73) and a Rural Auxiliary Assistant (Des. 78) and are receiving a Form 1314, *Statement of Service Performed on Rural Route*.

If the employee is on rolls as a Designation 77 or 78, use the prepunched card.

Upon completion of the Form 1314, submit to the appropriate postal data center for processing. Continue to use this procedure until the completion of the 45 days, or the employee's return to duty, whichever comes first.

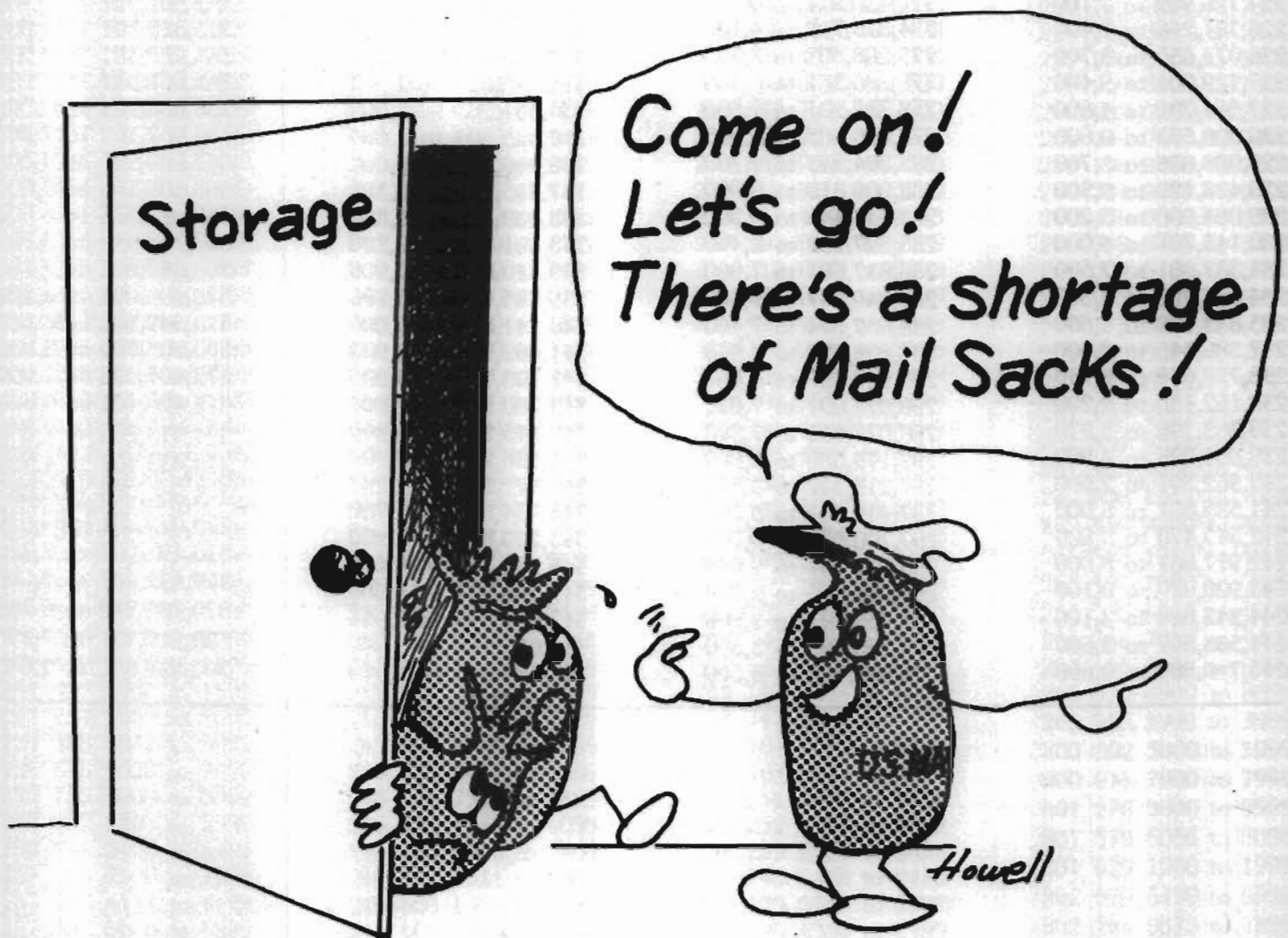
Foreign postal administrations, particularly those of Canada and Mexico, have reported receipt of United States origin mail items containing lottery matter.
