Collectors. First-day cover cancellations may be obtained by one of the

following methods:

a. Customers Affixing Stamps. Customers are encouraged to purchase stamps and affix them to their envelopes. All envelopes must be addressed. Peelable address labels are recommended and a filler card of postal card thickness should be inserted in each cover. Orders must be postmarked by February 14, 1981, and should be addressed to: Customer Affixed Envelopes, Postmaster, New York, NY 10001. No remittance is required.

b. Postal Service Affixing Stamps. Request first-day cancellations from: Whitney Moore Young, Jr. Stamp, Postmaster, New York, NY 10001 (see POM 244.53). Requests must be postmarked no later than February 14, 1981. Remittance is required for the face value of each stamp.

Selected United States mint stamps will be available at the Philatelic Sales Division, Washington, DC 20265 beginning January 31, 1981.

Supply. All post offices under the automatic distribution system will receive an initial supply of this stamp. Before requisitioning additional stamps (Item 493), consider that the stock should be depleted prior to March 30, 1981, at all post office outlets—except designated philatelic windows and postal stores.

Post offices with 950 or more revenue units requiring additional bulk quantities: immediately requisition on Form 3356, Stamp Requisition—Bulk Quantities, from the Bureau of Engraving and Printing

Engraving and Printing.

All post offices requiring additional stamps in less than bulk quantities: requisition on separate Form 17, Stamp Requisition, from stamp distribution office.

Panels. A limited number of 8½ by 11¼-inch commemorative series stamp panels will be available at a later date only through mail order from the Philatelic Sales Division, Washington, DC 20265. The panels are printed on heavy art paper suitable for mounting.—Customer Services Dept., 12-25-80.

ELM Revision

Injury Compensation Program

The following change to Subchapter 540 of the Employee and Labor Relations Manual is being made for clarification, and will be included in Issue 5:

546.212 Reemployment

A former employee will be offered reemployment in a residual vacancy (a vacancy which has been posted for bid or application and there are no successful bidders or applicants), or may work as an unassigned regular or as a part-time flexible. The former employee must be able to satisfy any written examination and/or proficiency requirement.—Employee Relations Dept., 12-25-80.

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Post-Retirement Basic Life Insurance Coverage

Under the Federal Employees' Group Life Insurance Act of 1980, employees retiring on or after December 9, 1980, may elect a lesser reduction of post-retirement insurance protection. Eligible employees retiring on or after that date will have the right to make one of three elections. They are as follows:

1. continue their present FEGLI coverage for basic insurance (regular insurance) into retirement at no cost, with the coverage to be reduced when the annuitant reaches age 65, at the rate of 2% per month until it reaches 25% of the basic insurance amount at

retirement,

2. take a 50% reduction or,

3. take no reduction, provided they pay the full cost of this additional protection. Rates per \$1,000 of coverage are shown on page 4 of this BULLETIN.

OPM Form 1452 must be completed by the employee at the time of retirement or, in the case of an individual receiving injury compensation from the Office of Workers' Compensation (OWCP), at the time basic insurance would otherwise terminate. Form 1452 should be attached to the Standard Form 56, Agency Certification of Insurance Status, and sent to the PDC. For the present, OPM will contact any retirees who do not complete Form 1452 when OPM processes their retirement applications. However, OPM will establish a date sometime in the future after which a failure on the part of the employing office to obtain a written election will result in a delay in OPM's or OWCP's finalizing the employee's application for benefits. Failure on the employee's part to execute the election form on a timely basis will bar the individual from electing increased post-age 65 coverage.

Until such time as OPM provides our area supply centers with the applicable forms, OPM Form 1452 shown on pages 3 and 4 of this BULLETIN must be reproduced and used.

Employing offices should obtain written elections from employees who have applied for disability retirement or benefits from OWCP and are no longer in a duty status. The written election should be attached to the Standard Form 56 and sent to the

PDC for transmittal to OPM along with the final Standard Form 2806, Individual Retirement Record, provided the date of separation is December 9, 1980, or later. Employees whose last day of pay was before December 9, 1980, may be entitled to annuity or compensation benefits beginning the day after pay ceased. However, entitlement to the post-65 basic insurance coverage election is based upon the date basic insurance coverage would otherwise have terminated, i.e., the date of separation for retirement or, in the case of a compensationer, separation from the Postal Service rolls or completion of 12 months of leave without pay.

Further information and instructions for implementing the provisions of the Federal Employees' Group Life Insurance Act of 1980 will be published when available from OPM.-Employee Relations Dept., 12-25-80.

Treasury Department Checks

The Treasury Department has advised that January Supplemental Security Income and VA Compensation and Pension checks are to be delivered on Wednesday, December 31. These check envelopes will be endorsed as follows:

Requested Postmaster: Delivery. Date is the 31st Day of the Month

January Social Security checks are to be delivered on Friday, January 2. The envelopes for these payments will bear the following endorsement:

Postmaster: Requested Delivery Day is the 2nd Day of the Month

January Civil Service Annuity, Public Debt Interest and Railroad Retirement checks are to be delivered on Friday, January 2. The envelopes will bear the legend:

Postmaster: Requested Delivery Date is the 1st Day of the Month or the First Delivery Date Thereafter

Postmasters and supervisors are asked to plan to complete delivery of these checks on the dates specified above.—Mail Processing Dept .. 12-25-80.

Hazardous Materials

Explosives, flammable and combustible liquids, flammable solids, oxidizers, corrosive liquids and solids, flammable and nonflammable compressed gases, poisons, disease germs, radio-active materials, irritants and dry ice are frequently offered for mailing at postal facilities. Some hazardous materials, such as explosives, Class A poisons and tear gas, may not be mailed under any circumstances. Others may be acceptable in limited quantities provided they are properly prepared for mailing.

Recent incidents involving improperly marked and packaged parcels containing hazardous materials emphasize a need for increased attention to the requirements under which hazardous materials may be accepted in the mails. Acceptance personnel must be familiar with mailability regulations. Each postal facility must have Publication 52, Acceptance of Hazardous or Perishable Articles, readily available for reference. Questions regarding the acceptance of hazardous materials which cannot be resolved by reference to Publication 52 should be referred to the Mail Classification Center serving the post office where the material is presented for mailing.

DOMESTIC MAIL MANUAL 124 and Publication 52 are now being revised to incorporate, where consistent with postal statutes, Department of Transportation regulations regarding the shipment of hazardous materials. Additional instructions are being developed to assist acceptance clerks and

other employees.

Improper acceptance and handling of hazardous materials, especially when air transportation is involved, poses a serious and unnecessary threat to the safety of postal employees, other mail matter, post office equipment, postal facilities, employees of the air carriers, and their customers. When in doubt concerning mailability, packaging, or labeling, play it safe, always ask your Mail Classification Center.—Rates & Classification Dept., 12-25-80.

PRIVACY ACT STATEMENT

Public law 96-427, Federal Employees' Group Life Insurance Act of 1980, authorizes the solicitation of this information. The data you furnish will be used to determine the amount of life insurance coverage you have after retirement.

This information may be shared with national, state, local, or other charitable or social security administrative agencies to determine and issue benefits under their programs, or when they are investigating a violation or potential violation of civil or criminal law.

Executive Order 9397 (November 22, 1943) authorizes the use of the Social Security Number to distinguish between you and people with similar names. Furnishing your Social Security Number, as well as other data, is voluntary, but failure to do so may result in the inability of your retirement system to provide you the level of insurance protection you want.

Instructions for Completing "Election of Post-Retirement Basic Life Insurance Coverage" (OPM Form 1452)

A recent amendment of the life insurance law permits you to elect a different reduction in the amount of basic (formerly known as "regular") life insurance coverage you will carry after reaching age 65.

Previously, after attaining age 65, the annuitant's or compensationer's amount of basic life insurance began to reduce at the rate of 2% per month until only 25% of the amount of insurance held at retirement was in force. Now you may elect to retain 25% of the insurance coverage you had at retirement (election 1 below) or choose one of the following alternatives: a reduction of 1% per month until your insurance coverage reaches 50% of the coverage you had

at retirement (election 2 below), or no reduction in coverage after age 65 (you retain 100% of the life insurance coverage you had at retirement (election 3 below).

Cost of post-retirement life insurance coverage.—
With the 25% coverage, there will be no cost to you after retirement. However, if you elect the 50% coverage or total coverage, the full cost of the additional protection will be deducted from your annuity or compensation. This deduction begins at retirement and continues for life or until the election is cancelled, or coverage otherwise discontinues. The cost to you is shown below:

Cancellation of election of lesser reduction.—If you elect either the 50% reduction or no reduction, you may cancel that election at any time. If you cancel, the amount of your life insurance will be computed as if you had originally elected the 75% reduction. Deductions will stop, but you will not be entitled to a refund of the premiums already paid.

Effect of electing a lesser reduction on Standard \$10,000 Optional Insurance. —This election has no effect on the Standard \$10,000 Optional Insurance coverage which you may have. Only the basic insurance is affected by this election.

How to complete OPM Form 1452, "Election of Post-Retirement Basic Life Insurance Coverage".—After reading the instructions in section A and filling in section B, carefully follow the instructions in section C:

- If you want the 75% REDUCTION, sign and date in BOX 1
- If you want the 50% REDUCTION, sign and date in BOX 2
- If you want NO REDUCTION, sign and date in BOX 3

Cross out the two boxes you did not sign, then give the completed form to your employing office to forward to your retirement system with your other retirement papers.

If you do not make an election before your retirement claim is finalized (or your request to continue insurance during receipt of compensation is finalized), the 75% reduction will be applied to your basic life insurance. You will have no later opportunity to choose a lesser reduction.

Increase in the amount of basic life insurance.—On October 1, 1981, the amount of basic life insurance (but not the cost) will increase for retirees and compensationers under age 45. The amount of coverage will be determined by multiplying the basic insurance amount by a factor based on the age of the annuitant or compensationer, as follows:

Release of Information— Annual Report

The Postal Service is required by 39 C.F.R. 265.9 to submit to the U.S. Congress a report concerning the administration of the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) for each calendar year.

Who Must Submit a Report?

A Records Custodian must submit a report if he has declined to release information requested under the Freedom of Information Act.

A Records Custodian is a postmaster, or head of an activity or of a group or department of Headquarters, who is responsible for maintaining official USPS records.

Submission of Reports

Reports are to be submitted to the Records Officer, USPS Head-quarters, 475 L'Enfant Plaza, SW, Washington, DC 20260, on or before January 23, 1981. The report will be clearly marked FOIA Annual Report.

Contents of the Report

- 1. Reason for Denial—Reference a specific section(s) of the regulation in the Administrative Support Manual 352. Only sections 352.42 through 352.47 are to be referenced.
- Give name and title or position of USPS records custodian responsible for denial.
- 3. Give number of determinations not to comply with FOI requests made during Calendar Year 1980.

RETIREMENT LAW AMENDMENTS

Postal Bulletin 21276 (12-18-80), page 13, contains specifics on retirement law amendments in Public Law 96-499, The Omnibus Reconciliation Act of 1980, signed into law December 5, 1980. Among other things, Public Law 96-499 eliminates the "look back" (comparative annuity computations) for annuities commencing after January 19, 1981.

There will probably be some pending disability retirement cases in which the Office of Personnel Management (OPM) will be unable by January 18, 1981, to determine and notify interested parties whether the applicant is totally disabled. If the applicant is carried in a pay status after January 18, 1981, the employee will not be eligible for the 7.7 percent

"look back" comparative annuity computation back to August 31, 1980. To avoid this situation, applicants may request, and installation heads may grant, leave without pay beginning January 19, 1981.

If the disability claim is disallowed, sick or annual leave with pay may be retroactively substituted for leave without pay. If the claim is allowed, the annuity begins January 19, 1981, the day after the last day of pay (January 18, 1981); unused accumulated annual leave is payable in a lump sum; and unused sick leave is included in the annuity computation as in other retirement cases.

When a large amount of sick leave is involved, the employee should carefully consider whether it is more advantageous to remain in a pay status on sick leave and be separated when the sick leave expires or to go on LWOP beginning January 19, 1981, in order to take advantage of the 7.7 percent "look back" computation.

Retiring (separating) postal employees will continue to receive payment for Federal holidays observed by the Postal Service that occur after the postal employee's separation but within the period covered by the employee's lump-sum (terminal) annual leave payment. Public Law 96-499 eliminates this payment for other Federal employees, but this amendment does not apply to the Postal Service and postal regulations have not been changed.—Employee Relations Dept., 12-25-80.

International Express Mail—Argentina

Effective January 1, 1981, the United States Postal Service will exchange International Express Mail items with Argentina. The following regulations and procedures apply:

1. Services Available—Custom Designed and On Demand. See Exhibit A for rates.

2. Areas Served—Buenos Aires, Bahia Blanca, Cordoba, Mar del Plata, Mendoza, Rosario, San Carlos de Bariloche, Tucuman, plus suburban areas of Buenos Aires (refer to Exhibit A, page 8).

3. Acceptable Items and Customs Declaration—Contents restricted to business documents, letters, and commercial papers or items. No customs forms are required. Items must be endorsed "BUSINESS PAPERS" or "COMMERCIAL PAPERS."

4. Weight Limit-33 pounds.

International Express Mail is insured against loss, damage, or rifling at no additional cost. Indemnity will be paid by the USPS as provided in Domestic Mail Manual 294, ex-

cept that International Express Mail items are not insured against delay in delivery and indemnity will not be made in the event of delay.

Acceptance employees:

- Ensure that articles to be mailed are only business documents, letters, and non-dutiable commercial paper or items.
- 2. Ensure that customer marks each item either "Business Papers" or "Commercial Papers,"
- 3. Inform all customers that the money-back deliver guarantee does not apply to the international service,
- 4. Complete appropriate sections of Express Mail labels, and
- 5. Dispatch items to one of the international exchange offices designated to handle outbound International Express Mail to Argentina (MIA, IAH, JFK, SFO).

A future issue of the International Mail Manual will include this information.—Rates & Classification Dept., 12-25-80.
