Domestic Mail Manual (DMM) Revisions

Enclosures With Special Fourth-Class Matter

Postal regulations now permit mailers to enclose loose third-class printed materials with matter mailed at special fourth-class rates. When this change was announced in *POSTAL BULLETIN* 21285 (2-19-81, p. 3), Section 724.34 of the DMM should have been deleted, but was inadvertently printed in that article. Therefore, effective immediately, Section 724.34 of the DMM is deleted.

Permit Imprint Mail Postage Computation

This is a reprint of the above-titled article in last week's *POSTAL BULLETIN*, which failed to state the text being revised.

Total postage is to be rounded to the nearest cent when calculations result in a fraction of a cent. Effective immediately, DMM 145.66 is revised as follows:

.66 Prepayment of Postage Required. The mailer must pay for each mailing when it is presented at the post office, or make an advance deposit sufficient to cover more than one mailing. Payments for postage or deposits must be made at points designated by the postmaster. These payments will not be accepted by employees handling the mail. Advance deposits may be made by mail. When the deposit becomes less than enough to pay for an entire mailing, an additional amount must be deposited before any mailings are made. Credit for postage is not allowed. Postage may not be paid partly in money and partly by postage stamps. Whenever the computation of postage results in a fraction of a cent in the total, computation shall be rounded to the nearest cent.

These changes will be included in a future issue of the DMM.—*Rates & Classification Dept., 5-14-81.*

Supply: All post offices under the automatic distribution system will receive a supply of this stamp. However, some post offices will receive less than the normal distribution quantities automatically furnished on a 50-subject commemorative. Since the total quantity of this stamp is being distributed automatically, no supplemental bulk requisitions will be honored at the Bureau of Engraving and Printing for item 498.

Post offices requiring additional stamps in less than bulk quantities should immediately requisition on a separate Form 17, *Stamp Requisition*, from their stamp distribution office.—*Customer Services Dept., 5-14-81.*

stamps at their local post offices and affix them to their envelopes. All envelopes must be addressed. Peelable address labels are recommended and a filler card of postal card thickness should be inserted in each cover.

Orders must be postmarked by July 5, 1981, and addressed to: Customer-Affixed Envelopes, Postmaster, Kennedy Space Center, Florida 32815.

Postal Service Affixing Stamps. The Postal Service will only affix the entire block of eight stamps to envelopes submitted by customers. No individual stamps will be affixed, and orders requesting individual stamps will be returned unserved. Customers must submit envelopes of a sufficiently large size to accommodate the eight stamps (overall block of 8—4.90 x 2.56 inches). Address orders to Postmaster, Kennedy Space Center, Florida 32815. Request must be postmarked no later than July 5, 1981. Remittance is required for the face value of each stamp.—*Customer Services Dept., 5-14-81.*

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DOMESTIC FIRST FLIGHT CACHETS

Official cachet and philatelic treatment for the first flight services described in A, B, and C, are authorized in 244.63, POSTAL OPERATIONS MANUAL.

To prepare and send covers for official philatelic treatment for these services, observe the following procedures:

1. Address all covers.
2. Applicable rate of postage per cover is 18 cents for the first ounce; 17 cents for each additional ounce up to 12 ounces.
3. Allow a clear space, 2½ by 2½ inches, on the lower portion of the envelope and to the left of the address, for the cachet.
4. Provide an additional clear space of 1½ inches to the left of the innermost stamp to permit a clear postmark.
5. Include in each envelope a uniform enclosure of the approximate thickness of a postal card to assure a good impression.
6. Enclose the prepared covers in another envelope and indicate segment desired by pencil notation in the upper right hand corners of the covers.
7. Mail the covers to reach the office applying the cachet no later than three days before the scheduled date of the flight.

Professional Management Commemorative Stamp

An 18-cent commemorative stamp honoring professional management will be issued June 18 at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. The stamp marks the centennial of the beginning of professional management education in the United States.

Postmaster General William F. Bolger unveiled the stamp during the 1980 Postal Forum XIV. Mr. Bolger noted the 1981 issuance date coincided with the 100th anniversary of the establishment of the Wharton School of Business, "where the principles of business education were founded for the entire nation."

The stamp also honors Joseph Wharton, founder of the Wharton School in 1881. Mr. Wharton, an American manufacturer and industrialist, anticipated the need for formal business education 20 years before the idea was implemented by any other institution.

Procedures for ordering first day cancellations are as follows:

Customers are urged to buy stamps and affix them to their own covers. All covers

must be addressed on the right side of envelopes at least $\frac{5}{8}$ of an inch up from the bottom. Insert a filler in each envelope and mail them to "Customer Affixed Envelopes, Postmaster, Philadelphia, PA 19104." Because of the timing of the announcement, the deadline for ordering first day cancellations will be extended for 45 days beyond the first day of issue date. Orders must be post-marked no later than August 1. There is no charge.

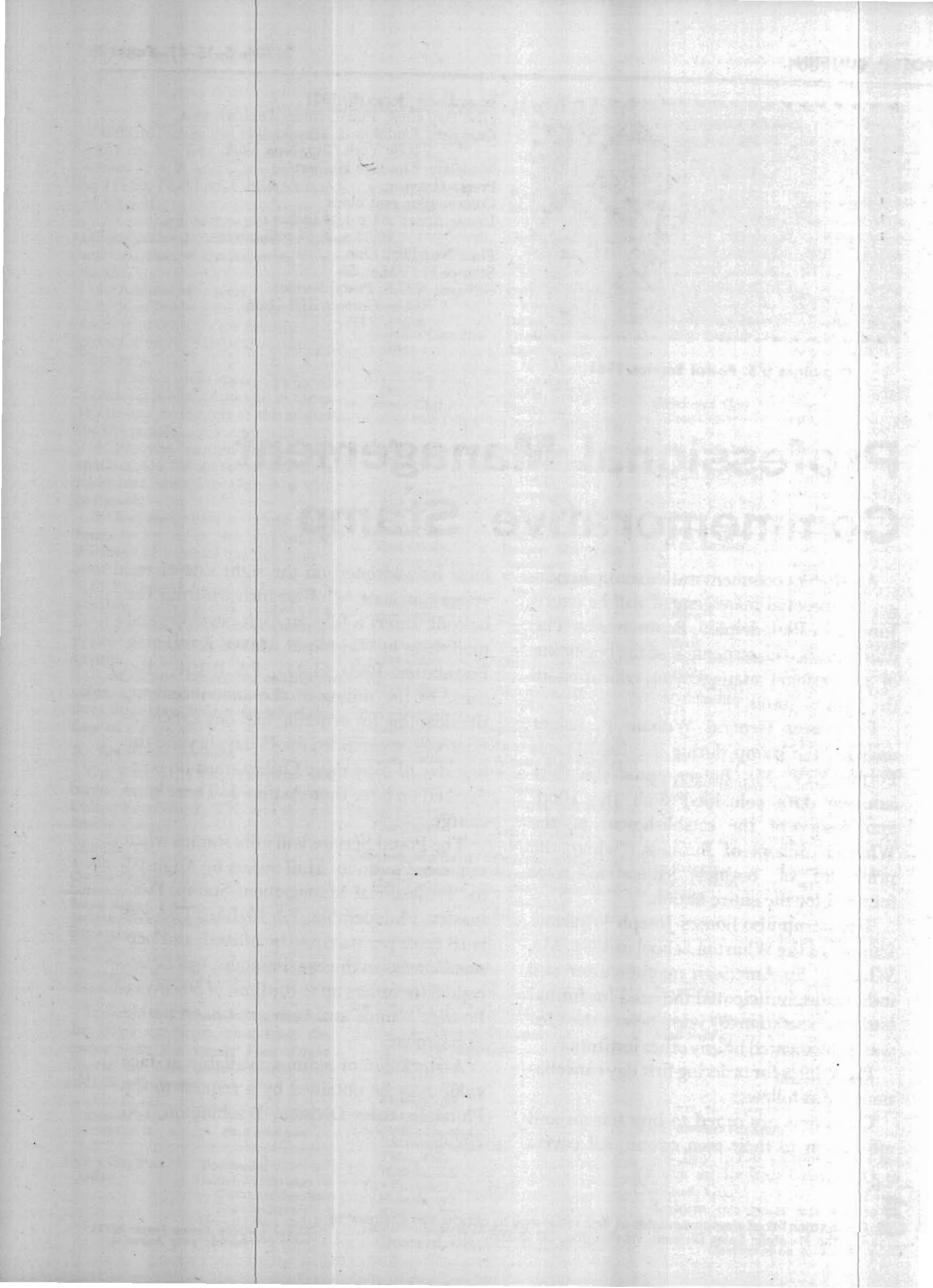
The Postal Service will affix stamps when requested to do so. Mail orders by August 1 to "Professional Management Stamp, Postmaster, Philadelphia, PA 19104." The cost is 18 cents per stamp to be affixed, and personal checks in the exact amount will be accepted for orders up to the limit of 50 covers. Postage stamps and cash are unacceptable as payment.

Priority Mail Stickers

Label 106, a sticker containing the Postal Service logo, in blue, and the words Priority Mail, in red, is currently being printed and distributed to all CAG A through G offices. The stickers, which measure 2 3/4" x 1", have been designed as a customer convenience and to identify and promote the use of Priority Mail.

Offices receiving initial supplies of the stickers should make them available to business mailers and the general public. Additional supplies may be ordered from the supply centers in multiples of 500 sheets after May 11, 1981. All offices are reminded that Priority Mail pieces should be identified on all sides through use of rubber stamps, stickers or other appropriate markings.—*Customer Services Dept., 5-14-81.*

International First Flight Cachet

All Offices Accepting Passport Applications

Passports

No Fee Money Orders

When cash is accepted in payment for a passport application, use of a no fee money order is authorized for sending funds to the Passport Agency. Effective immediately managers are instructed to prepare a list of all passport applicants whose fee is included and attach it to the money order. Do not separate the fees paid and the applications. When applicants purchase additional postal services (as Special Delivery or Registered Mail) the amount paid and the service should be noted beside their name.

Vaccination Certificates

Effective immediately, the Postal Service will no longer issue Public Health Service Form 731, *International Certificate of Vaccination*, to persons applying for passports. All versions of the form should be destroyed.

Persons requesting the form should be referred to the Government Printing Office, Washington, D.C. 20402, which will supply the form for the nominal fee of 50 cents.

Passport Photographs

In January, 1981, the Office of Passport Services eliminated the inclusion of more than one person in passport photographs. Passports, new and renewals, are issued only to individuals. The bearer of an old multiple photograph passport may renew it by completing Form DSP-82 (pink) and mailing it with two copies of a new picture and the \$10.00 fee to the Passport Agency. When a DSP-82 is submitted to the window clerk, only the \$10.00 fee is to be charged.—*Delivery Services Dept., 5-14-81.*

International Mail—Lao

The postal service of the Lao People's Democratic Republic has advised that surface mail service for postal union mail and parcel post can be resumed.

Effective immediately, surface mail items addressed to Lao may be accepted. Conditions of mailing specified in the country entry for Lao in Appendix B, Publication 42, *International Mail*, are applicable.

This instruction supersedes the instructions in Postal Bulletin 21269 (10-30-80).—*Rates & Classification Dept., 5-14-81.*

RURAL ROUTES—SPECIAL EQUIPMENT MAINTENANCE ALLOWANCE

The March, 1981, national average price per gallon for no-lead regular gasoline, which was released by the Bureau of Labor Statistics on April 23, 1981, was \$1.417. Therefore, in accordance with the provisions of Article 30.1.G.3, of the *USPS-NRLCA 1978 National Agreement*, the rural letter carrier equipment maintenance allowance is increased from 29¢ to 29.5¢ per mile, or major

fraction of a mile scheduled per day, or \$11.80 per day, whichever is greater.

Auxiliary Rural Assistants (Des. 78) and Auxiliary Rural Carriers (Des. 77) shall be paid an equipment maintenance allowance (EMA) of 29.5¢ per mile or a minimum of \$3.55 per hour, whichever is greater, but not to exceed the amount provided by

the special chart for the route stops and miles.

The EMA Schedule on pages 7 and 8 of this *POSTAL BULLETIN* supersedes all previously published EMA Schedules. The aforementioned changes in the EMA are effective May 16, 1981 (pp. 12-81).—*Office of Organizational Requirements, 5-14-81.*

Application. These instructions apply to employees covered by the 1978-1981 National Agreement, the NRLCA 1978 Agreement, and to employees subject to collective bargaining agreements covering:

1. Mailbag depositories, repair centers, and supply centers.
2. Postal data centers.
3. Automatic data processing centers.
4. Security police officers who are represented by the Federation of Postal Security Police (FPSP), or the National Association of Postal Police Officers (NAPPO).
5. Mail equipment shop employees represented by the American Postal Workers Union/Mailhandlers Union, and the International Association of Machinists.
6. Nurses covered under the provisions of the USPS-NPPN Agreement.
7. Data Automation Division, Western Area Supply Center, Topeka, KS.

Provisions. In accordance with the cost-of-living adjustment (COLA)

formula specified in each of the respective bargaining agreements cited above, the respective base pay schedules have been increased by the appropriate COLA amount. These COLA increases are effective and will be paid to eligible employees starting May 16, 1981 (PP12-81).

1. The Postal Service (PS) base schedule and the Automatic Data Processing Center (ADPC) base schedule have each been increased by an additional \$686 (33 cents per hour), to a total of \$3,619 (\$1.74 per hour), applied to all grades and steps.
2. The Postal Data Center (PDC) base Salary Schedule has had a variable amount of COLA added to each grade and step, in accordance with the COLA formula provided in the Agreement.
3. The National Postal Professional Nurses' (NPPN) base schedule has been increased by an additional \$686 (33 cents per hour), to a total of \$2,496 (\$1.20 cents per hour).
4. The Data Automation Division (DAD) base schedule has been increased by an additional \$707 (34 cents per hour), to a total of \$1,830 (88 cents per hour).

Rural Carriers. Employees subject to the provisions of the USPS-NRLCA 1978 National Agreement will receive an additional COLA increase of \$291 (14 cents per hour), to a total of \$1,518 (73 cents per hour), with proportional adjustment to the evaluated (heavy duty) schedule, effective May 16, 1981 (PP 12-81).
