

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DMM, POM Revision

Cancellations—Temporary Philatelic Stations

DOMESTIC MAIL MANUAL (DMM) 164.92 and POSTAL OPERATIONS MANUAL (POM) 244.92 are revised to establish that cancellations at temporary philatelic stations may be approved for events sponsored by or involving specific types of organizations, providing Postal Service endorsement is not suggested. The revised DMM 164.92 and POM 244.92, both read as follows:

the name of the exhibition or event, followed by the word Station or Sta., the city, state, and ZIP Code, and the month, day, and year. Pictorial cancellations that endorse the ideals, policies, programs, products, campaigns, or candidates of religious, anti-religious, commercial, political, fraternal, trade, labor, public interest, or special interest organizations will not be approved. However, cancellations may be approved that recognize events such as meetings or conventions sponsored by or involving such organizations, providing their designs do not include words, symbols, or illustrations referring to ideals, policies, programs, products, campaigns, or candidates. Overall dimensions must not exceed 4 inches horizontally and 2 inches vertically.

These changes will be included in future issues of the DMM and POM.—Customer Services Dept., 7-16-81.

POM Revision

Use of Form 1617

Effective immediately, Postal Operations Manual sections 431.533a—e are rescinded. Destinating offices are no longer required to report on Form 1617, Missent Mail Notice, packages, trays, or loose packs which contain 10 or more errors. POM sections 431.533a—e are deleted and 431.533f and 431.533g are renumbered 431.533 and 431.534, respectively.

This change will be included in a future issue of the POM.—Mail Processing Dept., 7-16-81.

Requests for Review—Postmasters

The moratorium on requests for review of associate office postmasters EAS-22 and above is no longer in effect. The current Job Evaluation System and procedures in Chapter 2 of the Employee & Labor Relations Manual continue to apply to these offices.—

ZIP+4 Firm Notification

By now all ZIP+4 prenotification pieces should have been delivered to firms and government agencies with unique ZIP+4 codes, to post office lockbox customers and to Business Reply Mail permit holders. This is a reminder that all undeliverable pieces and excess pieces must be returned to the MSC ZIP+4 File Maintenance Coordinator following instructions contained in Attachment I of the ZIP+4 Notification Instructions contained in SAPMG Jellison's memorandum to MSC Managers dated June 19, 1981.

Phase II of the notification process will take place the week of July 27. All MSC Managers are solely responsible for the notification effort as stated in SAPMG Jellison's memorandum. Managers must ensure that each firm on their listing receives a notification piece containing their ZIP+4 code. Blank notification pieces will be manually prepared for any firm with a unique ZIP+4 code not receiving a specifically addressed notification piece.—Operations Group, 7-16-81.

Acceptance of 8.4, 9, and 13-Cent Precanceled Stamps

Precanceled 8.4-cent, 9-cent, and 13-cent stamps may continue to be used on third-class bulk mailings and presort first-class mailings until October 1, 1981, provided additional postage is paid at the time of mailing.

The difference between the value of the stamps and the amount of postage required under the current rate schedule must be paid before the mailing is accepted. The postage difference may be paid by postage meter stamps on the individual mailing pieces, or by affixing to Form 3601-PC, Statement of Mailing, Bulk Rates, adhesive postage stamps or postage meter stamps for the amount of the postage difference, rounded to the nearest full cent. Weigh room personnel must verify the computations on Form 3602-PC to assure proper additional postage is affixed and that all adhesive stamps used are canceled.—Rates & Classification Dept., 7-16-81.

Merchandise Return Service

Postmasters should assure that window clerks and other acceptance personnel are familiar with merchandise return service in Domestic Mail Manual (DMM) 919. When zone-rated mail is returned under the merchandise return service, using the 2-part label described in DMM 919.5, window clerks or other acceptance personnel in post offices must enter the amount of postage due on both parts of the label. If the amount of postage to be charged is not entered on the part to be returned to the office where the permit is held, revenue may be lost.—Rates & Classification Dept., 7-16-81.

Form 50 for Rural Carriers

Effective immediately, the instructions in Chapter 6 of the P-11, Personnel Operations Handbook, for coding Form 50 worksheets for regular rural carriers (designation 71) and substitute rural carriers serving vacant routes (designation 72) are changed as follows:

1. Of the Rural Carrier Data elements (49-50 and 72-78) on the Form 50 worksheet, only elements 72 (Route Number) and 77 (Commitment Code) are to

be completed.

2. Elements 56 (Employing Office Finance Number), 65 (Designation/Activity Code) and 96 (Level/Step) are to be completed on all Form 50 worksheets for Rural Carriers, in addition to other elements remained for the action being processed.

With this data, the postal data centers will select from the rural route master file the hours and miles, determine the FLSA code, establish any guaranteed salary, print a red circle code (if eligible), and establish route type. This data will be printed on the completed Form 50.

When processing accessions for regular rural carriers or substitute rural carriers serving vacant routes (designations 71 and 72), or when processing any action which changes the designation of an employee to 71 or 72, only the following nature of action (NOA) codes will be used:

NOA codes for promotion, change to lower level, or conversion to full time should never be used for placement of employees into Designation 71 or 72.

None of the changes in this article affect the processing of Form 50 worksheets for rural designations 73, 74, 77, or 78.—Employee Relations Dept., 7-16-81.

Veterans Administration Mailing

The Veterans Administration intends to send letters addressed to postal employees at their work addresses during the latter part of July and early August. These letters will be annotated Personal-Official—To Be Opened By Addressee Only, and are to be delivered to the employees unopened.

Any letters received for individuals no longer employed by the installation should be returned to the Veterans Administration at the address shown on the envelope. The individual's current address, if known, should be noted on the envelope.—Employee Relations Dept., 7-16-81.

International Mail—Embargo of Mail to Canada

Mail service to Canada is suspended due to a postal strike in that country. No class of mail for Canada

should be accepted at any post office.

All Registered, First Class and Priority Mail items already deposited must be endorsed "Mail Service Temporarily Suspended" and returned to the sender. Postage and fees may be refunded on mail returned due to suspension of mail service. Customers must file an Application for Refund in accordance with Section 147.2. Domestic Mail Manual.

Until further notice the operation of the Private Express Statutes, 39 U.S.C. § 601(A) (1) through (6) and 39 C.F.R. 310.2(B) (1) through (6), will be suspended for mail addressed for delivery in Canada.—

Rates & Classification Dept., 7-16-81.

Conversion of Race and National Origin Codes

MSC Managers, Postmasters, and heads of other installations and units will ensure: (1) that all employees receive the information in the Notice to Employees, printed on page 4, and have the opportunity to make inquiries and changes as set forth in the notice, and (2) that personnel offices begin using the new codes as set forth in the following instructions.

Instructions for Personnel Offices

The Postal Data Centers have converted all current Minority Category Codes (previously called Minority Group Designators) to the new alphabetic codes. Effective immediately, enter the new alphabetical race and national origin codes on Forms 50-A and 50-B, Notification Personnel Action—processing copy. Codes are to be entered on all Forms 50-B (accessions) and on Forms 50-A when it is necessary to change an incorrect code or to enter a code when the element is blank.

If employees request notification of their race or national origin category, complete Elements 1 (enter Effective Date), 2 (enter Social Security Number) and 79-80 (enter NOA 912, Master File Record Review) of Form 50-A and send it to your E&LR Information Center. A printed Form 50 will be returned to you with the employee's Race and National Origin Code printed in Element 36 on the employee's copy.

If an employee requests a change of race or national origin category, complete Form 50A, NOA 012, Minority Code Change, and send it to your E&LR Information Center. This is a new Nature of Action

code.

Provide each new employee with the table of race and national origin categories shown on page 4 of this BULLETIN and ask the employee to select the code that best indicates his or her race or national origin. Enter the code selected in Element 36 of the Form 50-B effecting employment.

These instructions will be incorporated in Chapter 6 of Handbook P-11.—Employee Relations Dept., 7-

16-81.

NOTICE TO EMPLOYEES OF USPS

Since 1974, data on the race and national origin of all Postal and other Federal employees have been collected under the provisions of the Federal Personnel Manual (Chapter 713). This has been done through visual observation by your agency's personnel officer, Equal Employment Opportunity Officer, your supervisor, or other designated official. These data are then reported to the Office of Personnel Management as input to the Central Personnal Data File and are used for reports to Congress (required by law) on the status of minorities in the Federal Civilian Work Force and for special surveys to evaluate the effectiveness of Equal Employment Opportunity Programs.

Other federal agencies have adopted alphabetic minority codes prescribed by the Department of Commerce. To facilitate planning and reporting, the Postal Service has converted the previous minority categories to the new categories shown below.

New categories are to be used for Federal civilian employees. Please note that, for the first time, employees who have origins in the Indian subcontinent will be coded as "Asian or Pacific Islander." Since such employees were not previously identified specifically, their group may be changed to some category other than "Asian or Pacific Islander" in the conversion process. If your origins are in the Indian subcontinent, you are urged to identify yourself to your agency as being "Asian or Pacific Islander" or the new designation with which you most closely identify yourself.

As a Federal employee, you have the right to know the race or national origin category under which you are coded. If you want to know how you are identified,



Alcoholism Special Stamp

A special issue postage stamp with the theme "Alcoholism—You can beat it!" will be issued August 19 in Washington, D.C.

The 18-cent stamp is intended to convey the message that alcoholism is a treatable disease. This is supported by the fact that there are over one million recovered alcoholics in the United States today.

The special issue stamp was designed by John Boyd, who is associated with Anagraphics, Inc., a New York City graphics design firm.

Procedures for ordering first day cancellations are as follows:

Customers are urged to buy stamps and affix them to their own covers. All covers must be addressed on the right side of envelopes at least 5/8 of an inch up from the bottom. Insert a filler in each envelope and mail them to "Customer Affixed Envelopes, Postmaster, Washington, DC 20013" by September 3. There is no charge.

The Postal Service will affix stamps when requested to do so. Mail orders by September 3 to "Alcoholism Stamp, Postmaster, Washington, DC 20013." The cost is 18 cents per stamp to be affixed, and personal checks in the exact amount will be accepted for orders up to the limit of 50 covers. Postage stamps and cash are unacceptable as payment.

ADDRESS CORRECTIONS

The 10 cent fee for address corrections (deletion or addition of an address) in Domestic Mail Man-UAL (DMM) 945.35, was not changed on March 22, 1981. If customers have been charged 13 cents per correction under the provisions of DM 945.35 instead

of 10 cents per correction, postmasters should process Form 3533, Application and Voucher for Refund of Postage and Fees, for the excess amount paid, following the procedures in DMM 147.—Rates & Classification Dept., 7-16-81.

ON-ROLLS AND PAID EMPLOYEE STATISTICS REPORT

At the beginning of fiscal year 1982 (October 3, 1981) a new report known as the "On-Rolls and Paid Employee Statistics (ORPES)," will be implemented. This report will provide counts of numbers of employees on rolls and paid by (1) employee groups and (2) labor distribution codes.

Source data for this system will be the employee master file data via the pay data files maintained by the postal data centers. The system produces two basic reports. Report 1 is organized by employee

group, and Report 2 is organized by LDC.

Both reports will be provided to each CAG A-G Office, Headquarters Offices and Headquartersrelated units on an accounting period cycle. Reports for CAG H-J Offices will be prepared bi-annually during quarters two and four. Reports for CAG K-L Offices will be prepared during quarter four only.

In addition to the office detail reports, summary level reports will be provided to the MSC's, district and regions with a national summary for Headquar-

ters. The summary reports produced are:

All CAG H-L reports will be distributed to their respective MSCs.

A sample office level report in employee group sequence is shown as Figure 1 on page 8. This basic format is used for all report levels. The report is displayed in two sections (1) on the Rolls and (2) paid.

On the Rolls

Counts of employees on the employee master files in an active status are included in this section categorized by employee group as indicated by the line descriptions in Figure 2 below report on page 9. Report columns are as follows:

CURR # EMP—Displays the employee counts as

of the first pay period of the AP.
PR PD # EMP—Displays the employee counts for the previous AP.

CR/PR DIFF-Displays the difference in employee counts current AP minus previous AP.

CR/PR % CHG—Displays the percent change from previous AP.

Current AP—Previous AP ×100

If percent exceeds 99.99, then asterisks are printed.

SPLY # EMP—Displays the employee counts for the same AP of the prior fiscal year.

SPLY DIFF—Displays the difference in employee counts current AP minus same AP of the prior fiscal

SPLY % CHG—Displays the percent change from the same AP of the prior fiscal year.

If percent exceeds 99.99, then asterisks are printed.

Paid

Any employee who is in an active status on the employee master file and has paid hours for the current reporting period will be counted as a paid employee. Also, any employee who is emergency paid by the postal data center for the reporting period will be counted as paid. Employees who receive a payment for a payroll adjustment in a period where they have no current period paid hours will not be counted as paid. Employees who receive their terminal leave in a pay period where they have no current period paid hours will not be counted as paid.

Dual position employees will be counted in their "primary position" using the same count rules out-

lined above.

Safety Alert—Hammers

General Services Administration (GSA) has advised that a recent survey conducted by the Federal Supply Service and recent complaint investigations revealed that the heads and grips of fiberglass handled hammers may loosen or separate from the handles. Reported incidents of cracked or chipped heads have also been encountered on both wood and fiberglass handled hammers. The user can usually detect signs of loosening of the head or grip on the handle prior to complete separation. However, all of these undesirable defects may occur without warning under sustained usage.

All hammers should be examined for defects before use. Those found to be defective should be removed from service and disposed of immediately, using standard USPS disposal procedures. Disposal of hammers purchased from GSA should be reported, on a Standard Form 368 (obtainable from GSA), to the GSA Regional Office servicing your location for full credit. Cite GSA message number P021732Z, July 1981, as your authority for turn-in and on all correspondence to GSA on this subject.
