18-Cent U.S. Desert Plants Commemorative Stamps

A block of four 18-cent U.S. Desert Plants commemorative stamps will be first placed on sale October 23, 1981, at Tucson, Arizona 85726.

Do Not Sell Before October 24, 1981



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Issued in sheets of 40. Collector information will be found on page 3.

Supply. All post offices under the automatic distribution will receive an initial supply of this stamp.

Post offices with 950 or more revenue units requiring additional bulk quantities (*item 406*) should immediately requisition on Form 3356, *Stamp Requisition-Bulk Quantities*, from the Bureau of Engraving and Printing.

All post offices requiring additional stamps in less-than-bulk quantities should immediately requisition on a separate Form 17, *Stamp Requisition*, from their stamp distribution office.

Before requisitioning additional stock, consider that the stock should be depleted prior to December 23, 1981, at all post office outlets, except designated philatelic windows.—*Customer Services Dept., 9-17-81.*

POM Issue 3 Published

Issue 3 of the *POSTAL OPERATIONS MANUAL (POM)* has been printed and is currently being distributed. It incorporates revisions to the POM that have appeared in the *POSTAL BULLETIN* from the publication of POM Issue 2 through April 30, 1981.

Express Mail Labels

Complaints are being received that Express Mail address labels are sometimes illegible. This is caused by not pressing firmly with a ballpoint pen so that all copies can be read. In some cases the labels bear incomplete information.

Acceptance employees are reminded to ensure all copies of domestic and international Express Mail labels are legible and bear complete information.

1. Customers and acceptance employees should bear down firmly on ballpoint pen to assure all copies are legible.

2. Double check the label for correct address of destination pickup.

3. Enter the date and exact time received.

4. Assure that destination is in the Express Mail network.

5. Make certain all appropriate spaces are filled in.

6. Verify that correct postage has been affixed or is charged.—*Delivery Services Dept., 9-17-81.*

Services Rendered by DOD

Under Chapter VI of the USPS/DOD Agreement, signed on February 22, 1980, the Postal Service agreed to reimburse the Department of Defense for utilities and telephone service provided at our post offices located at military installations. The agreement also provides that serving postmasters may, if they so elect, furnish their own janitorial service rather than purchase those services from the military. Therefore, beginning October 1, 1981, serving postmasters on military installations will be charged for those services supplied by the military installation. Payment for these charges will be handled in accordance with Part 436, *Fiscal Handbook F-1, Financial Handbook for Post Offices.*—*Mail Processing Dept., 9-17-81.*

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*All Post Offices***ANNUAL OWNERSHIP, MANAGEMENT, AND CIRCULATION STATEMENT**

Publishers of second-class publications must file Form 3526, *Statement of Ownership, Management, and Circulation*, at post offices of original entry on or before October 1, 1981. Publishers authorized to mail under the provisions of DOMESTIC MAIL MANUAL (DMM) 422.2 and 422.6 must also publish such statements as required by DMM 448.31. Specific instructions are given on the reverse side of Form 3526.

Publishers authorized to mail publications at the postage rates in DMM 411.32 (regular rate publications) are no longer required to submit a written request for authority to mail matter at the phased rates of postage according to 39 USC 3626. Consequently, item 12 of the August 1978 edition of the form may be disregarded.

Responsibility of Postmasters

Postmasters at original entry offices must.

1. Assure that all publishers file *properly completed* statements on or before October 1, 1981. Only 1978 or subsequent editions of Form 3526 are to be used. Other editions of Form 3526 will be returned.

2. Promptly report discontinued publications to the Office of Mail Classification, Rates & Classification Department, U.S. Postal Service, Washington, DC 20260, under separate cover with copies of publishers' letters of abandonment.

3. Determine whether there are unauthorized changes in frequency of issue and title, or any other changes in the original qualifications under which authorization to mail at the second-class rates was issued. Title and frequency information on Form 3526 must be in agreement with file copies of authorizations for second-class publications received from Headquarters. If there are unauthorized changes, have publishers obtain authorization through prescribed procedures.

4. Record the 8-digit ISSN in the space provided (item 1A) on the form. If an ISSN has not been assigned a publication, then the USPS number must be shown starting in the first position of item 1A on Form 3526.

5. Review Forms 3526 for completeness and accuracy to assure these points are covered:

a. The known office of publication (item 4) as defined in DMM 421.3 is located at the office where the publication has original entry.

b. Complete circulation data must be shown in item 10 for all publications.

c. Make sure item 10B2 is in substantial agreement with the copies declared on Form 3541, *Statement of Mailing Second-Class Publications*, if the publication has no additional entry office. If the publication does have additional entries, compare item 10B2s with the findings of publisher's records (DMM 447.2). Determine the reasons for any significant differences.

d. Publications authorized entry under DMM 422.2 must meet the circulation requirements of 422.221; i.e., have a paid subscription list and not be designed primarily for free circulation. It is required that over one-half of the total copies circulated of these publications be distributed to persons who have paid for the copies at a rate above nominal.

e. Publications authorized under DMM 422.3 that are authorized to carry general advertising must also be circulated primarily to people who paid for the copies at a rate above nominal. See DMM 422.321. For these publications, item 10C of Form 3526 must be at least 90% of item 10E. If item 10C is less than 90%, a verification of the publication's circulation should be made. See DMM 447.2.

f. The first column of item 10 is to be based on all mailings. For example, if a publication is published daily (including Sunday), data in column 10 of item 10 must represent the average of all issues published during the preceding 12-month period.

6. After Forms 3526 are reviewed, postmasters are to submit them to the Office of Mail Classification according to instructions on the form. If there are any deficiencies in the forms submitted by the publishers, a memo explaining the actions being taken to have them corrected should be attached. Envelopes containing only Forms 3526 without deficiencies must be endorsed: 1981 Forms 3526 enclosed. Envelopes submitted to the Office of Mail Classification containing Forms 3526, which also contain memos, Forms 3548, *Review and Verification of Circulation*, or reentry applications must not bear the endorsement.

Supplies of Form 3526

Forms may be ordered in the normal ordering cycle from supply centers, using Form 7380, *Requisition for Supplies*. Do not order any other form or item on this requisition. These forms are only required at post offices that serve customers having publications for which original entry second-class mailing privileges are authorized as of October 1. Please do not requisition the forms unless they are required.—*Rates & Classification Dept., 9-17-81.*

U.S. Desert Plants Commemorative Stamps

A block of four commemorative stamps featuring desert plants which grow in the American West will be issued October 23 at Tucson, Arizona. All of the plants depicted are found in the State of Arizona.

Three of the plants depicted, the barrel cactus, the beavertail cactus and the saguaro, are in the cactus family. The fourth plant featured, the agave, is assigned to the amaryllis family by most botanists.

Procedures for ordering first day cancellations are as follows:

Customers are urged to buy stamps and affix them to their own covers. All covers must be

addressed on the right side of envelopes at least 5/8 of an inch up from the bottom. Insert a filler in each envelope and mail them to: "Customer Affixed Envelopes, Postmaster, Tucson, AZ 85726-9991 by November 7. There is no charge.

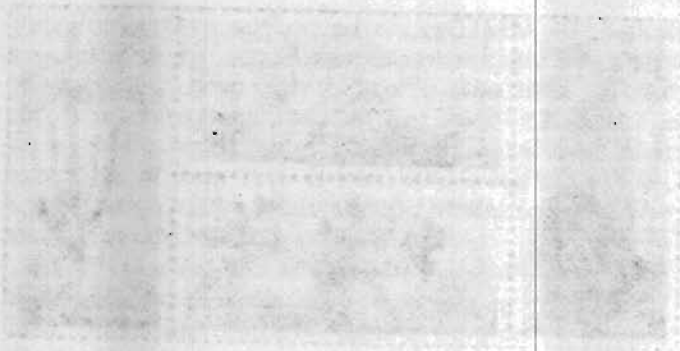
The Postal Service will affix stamps when requested to do so. Mail orders by November 7 to: "U.S. Desert Plants, Postmaster, Tucson, AZ 85726-9992." The cost is 18 cents per stamp to be affixed, and personal checks in the exact amount will be accepted for orders up to the limit of 50 covers. Postage stamps and cash are unacceptable as payment.

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U.S. Desert Plants Commemorative Stamps

A block of four commemorative stamps featuring desert plants which are in the United States will be issued October 25, 1982. All of the plants depicted are found in the state of Arizona.

Three of the plants depicted the barrel cactus, cholla cholla and the saguaro are in the cactus family. The fourth plant featured is the yucca, in its own family.

Two stamps for Arizona are available for purchase from the United States Postal Service. All covers must be addressed to their own country.

Customers are urged to buy stamps and air mail covers early. All covers must be addressed to their own country.

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1981 ZIP Code and Post Office Directory

Removal from Sale. Effective immediately, postmasters/MSO managers must discontinue sale and acceptance of customer orders (retail and mail order) for Pub. 65, *1981 ZIP Code and Post Office Directory*. Offices should also remove all promotional material relating to the ZIP Code Directory from the lobby. Retail managers and employees should advise customers that the 1982 directory will be available for sale at post offices in January 1982.

Disposal. Use the procedures below to account for the disposal of unsold copies of Publication 65.

1. By C.O.B. September 27, 1981 offices that still have the books on hand should remove the front (top) covers. Send the covers to the accountable paper custodian at the MSC. The remaining portion of these directories (without front covers) are unusable and disposed of as waste at the selling office.

2. At the MSC receiving point a tally sheet will be maintained showing number of covers received from each selling office. After all covers are presumed to have been received, take a final count, record the count, and tear the covers into at least four approximately equal pieces and dispose of as waste.

3. Treat reserve stock of directories at the MSC the same way, including cover removal, final count recording, and cover tearing. Exception: when large quantities of full cartons exist at the MSC, arrangements may be made to have these removed for pulping, burning, or shredding. When this is done, the cartons need not be opened and the recorded final count will reflect the presumption that each carton contained 8 books.

4. Create a memorandum for the record, to be signed by two postal employees, indicating the total number of covers destroyed (both torn and by the "exception" method). This total should agree with the "On Hand at End of Period" figure entered on line 20 of the MSC consolidated product inventory report (Form 1079) for Quarter IV.

ELM and P-11 Revision

Computing Annual Leave Category

EMPLOYEE & LABOR RELATIONS MANUAL (ELM) 512.212 is being revised to comply with current agreements.

512 Annual Leave

* * * * *

.212 Service Counted. The following Federal civilian service is used in computing annual leave category:

a. Service performed while an employee of the U.S. Postal Service or Post Office Department. This shall include casual or temporary service if performed before January 1, 1977.

b. Service with the Federal Government (excluding temporary appointments) or the District of Columbia (excluding temporary appointments) regardless of breaks in such service.

c. Time on USPS rolls during which an employee served as a substitute rural carrier (not just the dates on which actual service was performed) if the time is creditable for civil service retirement purposes.

The "note" in Exhibit 611.329a of the Handbook P-11, *Personnel Operations*, is also changed to read as follows:

NOTE: If an individual was employed as a casual or temporary with the U.S. Postal Service or the Post Office Department before January 1, 1977, that time is creditable toward assessment of the leave computation date. Time worked as a casual or temporary employee since January 1, 1977 is not creditable toward the leave computation date. However, it is creditable for retirement purposes.

These revisions to the ELM and Handbook P-11 will be incorporated in future transmittal letters.

Any leave computation date and/or leave category changes will be processed by completion of Form 50-B, Nature of Action Code 882, *Change in Service Dates*.

If appropriate, include a statement in the *Remarks* section that an adjustment to leave balances is necessary as a result of this action.—*Employee Relations Dept., 9-17-81.*

Lobby Display Fee

The FY 1981 monthly display charged for *scheduled* non-postal displays has been set at \$4.49 per facility. Only non-postal, scheduled displays (such as those for the Gold Medallion Program) are subject to this charge. Postmasters must not individually bill government agencies for displays. Instead, requests for posting of materials apparently subject to this display charge should be forwarded through channels to the regional Customer Services Department for action in accordance with **POSTAL OPERATIONS MANUAL (POM) 221.54.**

Requests to individual facility managers for space-available displays on public bulletin boards should be handled at the local level and evaluated under the provisions of POM 221.525; no charge should be made for requests of this type. Military recruiting posters fall in this category.—*Delivery Services Dept., 9-17-81.*

All SSPC Offices

Rate Change Panel for SSPC

Automatic distribution of rate change material reflecting the March 1981 rate increase has been completed for Self-Service Postal Center customer information panels except for new zone charts. Availability of new zone charts will be announced in a future POSTAL BULLETIN notice.

The following items are included in the customer information panel rate change set:

1. Notice 100A, Postal Rates & Fees Panel.
2. Notice 100B, How To Mail a Parcel.
3. Notice 100C, Special Services Panel.
4. Notice 100D, Information Arrow.

If any office has not received necessary rate change material or has not received a sufficient quantity of these items, the required items must be requisitioned on Form 7380, *Requisition for Supplies*, sent to Retail Operations Division, Room 7407, Delivery Services Department, Washington, D.C. 20260.

In completing Form 7380, enter POSTAL BULLETIN 21316 on form above the signature block. Include your finance number and FEDSTRIP address code. Explain your need for this material on the form. Requisitions will be checked against shipping records and, if approved, forwarded to the supply center for shipment.—*Delivery Services Dept., 9-17-81.*

Any stock remaining on hand after September 30, 1981, must immediately be withdrawn from all philatelic outlets and handled in accordance with Section 553, F-1, Financial Handbook for Post Offices.

The Inspection Service will give attention in this area during audit review.—*Customer Services Dept., 9-17-81.*

Canal Zone

This is to remind employees that effective October 1, 1981, the following procedures will apply to items mailed to areas comprising the former Canal Zone:

Mail showing a Canal Zone address will *not* be accepted.

Domestic postal rates will apply only to items with an address of APO or FPO Miami, Florida.

International postal rates, fees, and available special services specified in Publication 42, *International Mail*, apply to mail having a Republic of Panama address.—*Rates & Classification Dept., 9-17-81.*

Notices 21 and 28, 13-Period Year Calendar

A revised Notice 28 (September 1981) is available in the area supply centers for requisition by offices needing the 13-Period Year Calendar for preparation of manpower estimates. Notice 28 is a wallet-sized card showing only the beginning and ending dates of each accounting period and postal quarters for Postal Fiscal Years 1981 through 1984.

Notice 28 may be ordered from the appropriate area supply center on Form 7380, *Requisition for Supplies*.

Headquarters employees may requisition Notice 28 from Headquarters Supply. Previous fiscal year editions of Notice 28 should be disposed of as waste when the revised PFY 1981-1984 edition is received.

Revised Notice 21, *13-Period Year Calendar—1982* is available in the supply centers and may be ordered on Form 7380, *Requisition for Supplies*. Previous fiscal year editions of Notice 21 should be disposed of as waste when the PFY 1982-1983 edition is received.

A 13-Period Year Calendar for Postal Fiscal Years 1982 and 1983, is shown on page 19 of this POSTAL BULLETIN. Detach for office use. National holidays are shown on the calendar for planning purposes. Postmasters and heads of other installations should identify on the calendar other special days that have significant effect on mail volume in their respective offices. These days include Easter, Mother's Day, St. Valentine's Day, and Father's Day, as well as state and local holidays.—*Finance Dept., 9-17-81.*

Intermediate Travel Home

Employees who are on an extended assignment away from home may be given the opportunity during the assignment to return home for personal convenience. See 717.12 EMPLOYEE AND LABOR RELATIONS MANUAL (ELM). Although the cost of the round trip is a reimbursable travel expense, the travel time involved is not compensable when it falls outside of the scheduled service week given to the employee during the temporary assignment (see ELM 438.-134c). These hours are not to be included in the employee's time reported to the PDC for payroll purposes.—*Employee Relations Dept., 9-17-81.*

Correction

Security Clearance

The notice which appeared in POSTAL BULLETIN 21311 (8-13-81) concerning the use of PS Form 85 omitted the instruction for the preparing office to include the name and address of the submitting post office in the space following "Section A—Request." This must be included to enable the Regional Employee Relations Office to return the completed second portion of the form to the requesting office. The form will be revised to include appropriate space for this information upon the first reprinting.—*Inspection Service, 9-17-81.*

PAY CHANGES—BARGAINING UNITS

Salary schedules are shown on pages 8 through 17.

A. Application

These instructions apply to employees covered by the 1981-1984 USPS-APWU/NALC National Agreement, the USPS-NRLCA National Agreement, and to employees subject to the provisions of collective bargaining agreements covering:

1. Mailbag depositories, repair centers, and supply centers.
2. Mail equipment shop employees represented by the American Postal Workers Union/Mailhandlers Union.

B. Provisions

1. *General Increase.* According to the provisions of the above-cited agreements, salary checks issued on Friday, November 20, 1981 (for Pay Period 24-81), will include the \$300 increase in basic salary for eligible employees. Retroactive adjustments for the period from July 25, 1981 (PP 17-81) through October 30, 1981 (PP 23-81) will be reflected in a special payment to be made at a later date. The update in salary rates and retroactive increases will pertain only to employees covered by these instructions.

2. Bonus and Cash Payment Dates

a. Friday, September 18, 1981

(1) \$150 Ratification Bonus—All eligible employees will receive the ratification bonus on this date.

(2) \$350 Cash Payment—Except as noted below, all full-time employees, including regular rural carriers, who received pay in Pay Period 15-81 (ending July 10, 1981) will receive the \$350 cash payment on this date.

Note: All eligible employees must be in a non-probationary status to be entitled to the \$350 cash payment.

b. *Friday, October 2, 1981.* All eligible part-time regular, part-time flexible, and eligible full-time employees who are to be paid the \$350 cash payment based on pay status hours for the previous 26 pay periods (see Article 9 of the agreements), will be paid the pro-rata portion on this date.

C. Exceptions

1. Security Police Officers who are represented by the Federation of Postal Security Police (FPSP), or the National Association of Postal Police Officers (NAPPO). Increases for Security Police Officers will be discussed in a future POSTAL BULLETIN.

2. Employees represented by the National Post Office Mail Handlers', Watchmen, Messengers and Group

Leaders Division of the Laborers' International Union of North America. Negotiations for a collective bargaining agreement with these employees have not resulted in an agreement. These employees, formerly under the APWU/NALC/Mailhandlers National Agreement, will be excluded from receiving any increase until further notice. These employees' salaries will be continued on the former May 16, 1981 (PP12-81) PS Schedule until the bargaining impasse has been resolved.

3. Employees represented by the American Postal Workers Union who are covered by one of the following collective bargaining agreements: Postal Data Centers; Automatic Data Processing Centers; Research & Development Laboratories. Negotiations for collective bargaining agreements for these employees have not resulted in an agreement. These employees' salaries will be continued on the schedules listed below until the bargaining impasse has been resolved:

a. ADPC Schedule of May 16, 1981 (PP12-81)

b. PDC Schedule of May 16, 1981 (PP12-81)

c. R&D Schedule of March 21, 1981 (PP8-81)

4. Employees represented by the International Association of Machinists at the Mail Equipment Shops, Washington, D.C. These employees' salaries will be continued on the May 16, 1981 (PP12-81) Tool & Die Shop Schedule.

5. *Casual Employees.* Casual employees are non-bargaining employees and will therefore be excluded from receiving the pay increases discussed in these instructions. The standard rate for casual employees remains at \$4.76 per hour.

D. Salary Schedules

1. *Postal Service (PS) Schedule.* The PS Schedules for July 25, 1981 (PP17-81) reflect the \$300 general increase in basic salary and continuation of the existing \$3,619 COLA resulting from the 1978-1981 Agreement.

2. *Rural Carrier (RC) Schedules.* In accordance with Article 9, Salaries and Wages, of the USPS-NRLCA National Agreement, the basic annual salary schedules, with proportional application to the evaluated schedules, for all rural categories and steps, will be increased by \$300. The existing \$1,518 COLA, which resulted from the 1978-1981 NRLCA Agreement, will be continued, with proportional application to the evaluated schedules.

Note: The annual rate mileage and evaluated rural schedules appear in this BULLETIN. The substitute schedules will appear in a future BULLETIN.—*Employee Relations Dept., 9-17-81.*

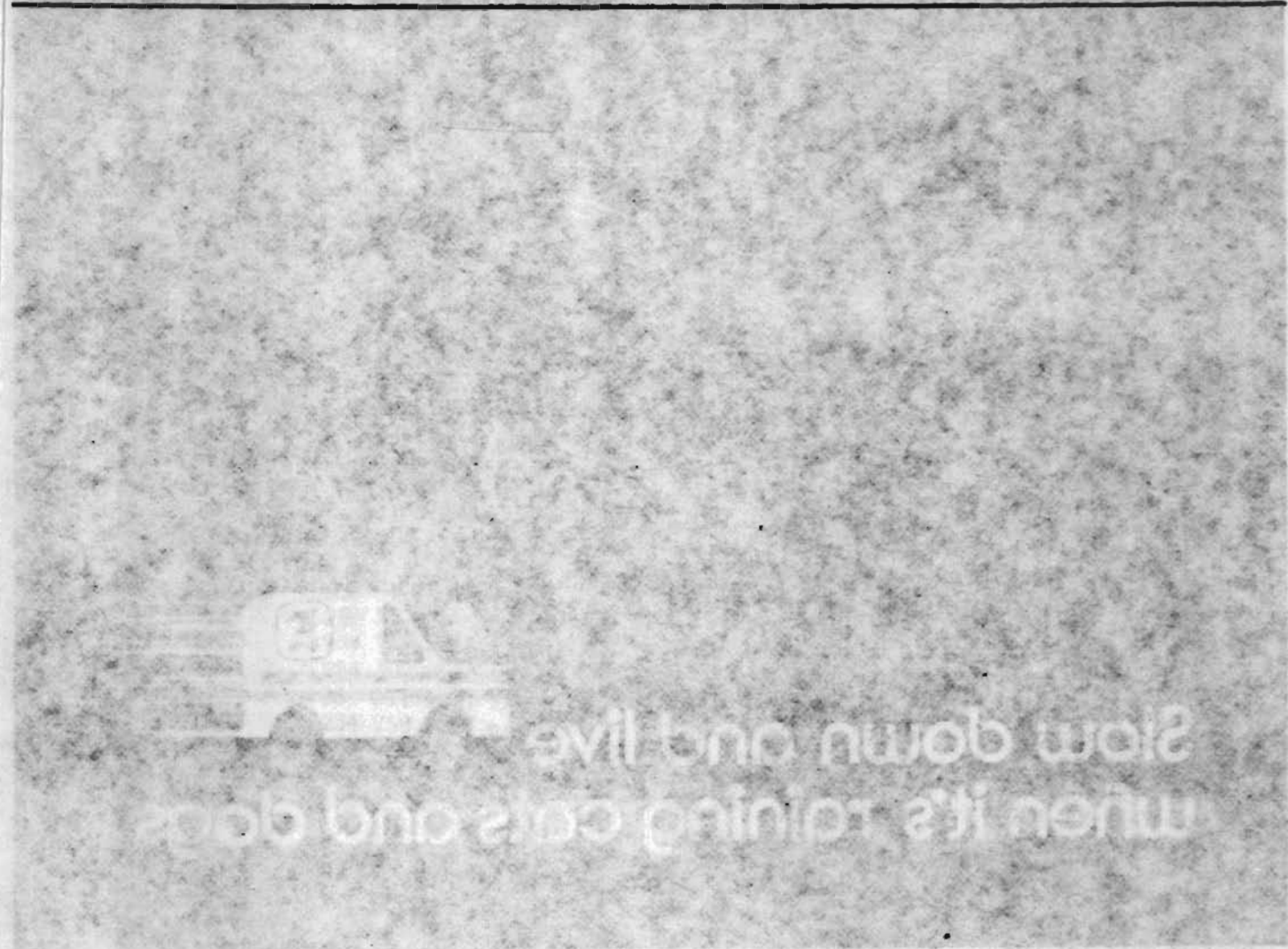
