## All Post Offices

### Business Reply Mail

In order to distribute and receive Business Reply Mail in calendar year 1982, current business reply mail permit holders must complete Form 3615, *Business Reply Mail—Annual Fee Notice*, and pay the annual \$40 fee.

### Responsibility of Postmasters

To accomplish the distribution of Form 3615 to Business Reply Mail permit holders and to inform these customers of the current regulations concerning Business Reply Mail, Publication 115 must be furnished to all current Business Reply Mail permit holders. This publication contains Form 3615 and the postal regulations governing Business Reply Mail (DOMESTIC MAIL MANUAL 917).

### Supplies of Publication 115

Initial distribution of Publication 115 was made directly to the Mail Classification Centers. All other offices should requisition the publication from the supply centers, using Form 7380, *Requisition for Supplies*, during regular requisitioning cycles. Do not order any other item on this requisition. These publications are only required at post offices that serve customers having Business Reply Mail permits. Please do not requisition Publication 115 unless it is required.—*Rates & Classification Dept.*, 11-12-81.

## All Post Offices with Rural Delivery

### Annual Inspection of Rural Routes

POSTAL BULLETIN 21312 (8/20/81) called management's attention to the fact that all routes must be inspected once each calendar year. Special emphasis was placed on inspecting those routes subject to the Special Count of Mail during September 1981.

Managers must be sure that all rural routes, whether or not counted during September, have been inspected this year. Inspections must be completed no later than December 4. When making the required route inspections, use existing Form 4248, *Rural Route—Annual Inspection Report*, augmenting information required by that form with the additional information required by POSTAL BULLETIN 21312.

Post Offices will be notified when revised Form 4248 is available from the supply centers. Instructions regarding use of the revised form will be issued at that time.—*Delivery Services Dept.*, 11-12-81.

### Americana Mint Set

The Americana Mint Set will go on sale November 23, 1981 at philatelic centers and other selected locations, and will be available by mail order from the Philatelic Sales Division. The new philatelic product, Item #834, is a hard cover, case bound, limited edition, 52 page album featuring photographs and background on the 27 Americana series definitive postage stamps. It will sell for \$14.00 and contain 24 of the 27 stamps profiled in the album.

The stamp packets and albums will be shipped by two different contractors. Although the shipping schedules are identical, these two items may not arrive simultaneously. Each post office must verify receipt of equal quantities of both stamp packets and albums. Notify the regional Retail Branch of any discrepancies. Shipments are scheduled to begin November 13, 1981.

Promotional material consisting of a stand up counter card will be shipped to each location selling the Americana Mint Set.—*Customer Services Dept.*, 11-12-81.

## COLA Increases—Bargaining Units

Salary schedules are shown on pages 5 through 17.

**Note:** The instructions and pay schedules covering employees in Application Items 1 through 6, below, apply only to those employees who either are not eligible for or, if eligible, did not elect to exercise their COLA Roll-In Option, as described in POSTAL BULLETIN 21315, dated September 10, 1981. Instructions and pay schedules (to be titled "Retiree Eligible Schedules") for employees who were eligible for and elected the COLA Roll-In Option will be published in a later BULLETIN.

**Application.** These instructions apply to employees covered by:

1. The 1981-1984 USPS-APWU/NALC National Agreements;
2. The 1981-1984 USPS-NRLCA National Agreement; and to employees subject to the provisions of collective bargaining agreements covering:
3. Mailbag depositories, repair centers, and supply centers.
4. Mail equipment shop employees represented by the American Postal Workers' Union/Mail Handlers Union.
5. Postal Police Officers (PPOs) represented by the National Association of Postal Police Officers (NAPPO).
6. Security Police Officers (SPOs) represented by the Federation of Postal Security Police (FPSP).
7. Nurses represented by the National Postal Professional Nurses (NPPN).
8. Data Automation Division, Western Area Supply Center, Topeka, Kansas.

**Provisions.** In accordance with the cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) formula specified in each of the respective bargaining agreements cited above, the respective base pay schedules have been increased by the appropriate COLA amount. These COLA increases are effective and will be paid to eligible employees starting November 14, 1981 (PP 25-81).

1. The Postal Service (PS) base schedule (RSC-P) has been increased by an additional \$395 (19 cents per hour), to a total of \$4,014 (\$1.93 per hour), applied to all grades and steps.
2. The National Postal Professional Nurses' (NPPN) base schedule has been increased by an additional \$728 (35 cents per hour), to a total of \$3,224 (\$1.55 per hour), applied to all steps.
3. The Data Automation Division (DAD) base schedule has been increased by an additional \$707 (34 cents per hour), to a total of \$2,538 (\$1.22 per hour), applied to all grades and steps.
4. Employees subject to the provisions of the USPS-NRLCA 1981 National Agreement will receive an additional COLA increase of \$395 (19 cents per hour), to a total of \$1,914 (92 cents per hour) with proportional adjustment to the evaluated and substitute schedules.

**Note:** There is no provision for movement, and an employee may not move between the Retiree Eligible Schedule (RES) version of a salary schedule and the "standard" (or non-RES) version of that schedule.

**Casual and Temporary Employees.** Casual and temporary employees do not receive COLA.—*Employee Relations Dept., 11-12-81.*

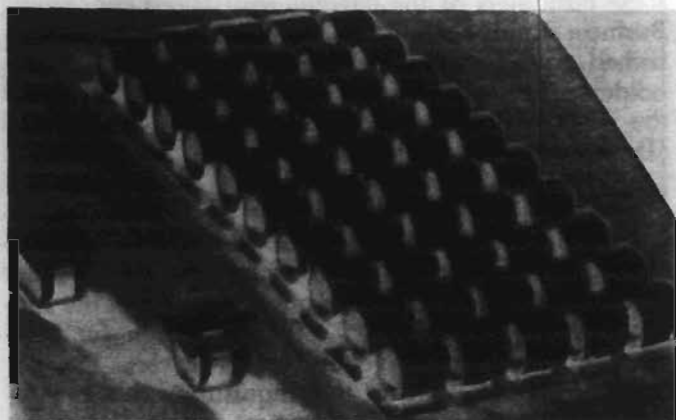
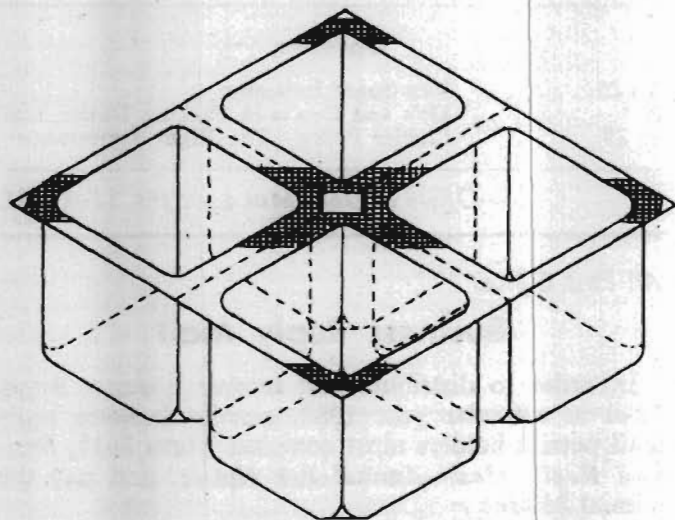
## New Packaging—Coil Stamps

The Bureau of Engraving and Printing has developed a new container to package coils of 100 stamps. These new containers will replace the current chip-board box as inventories of coil stamps already packaged in the boxes are depleted.

Two illustrations of the new transparent plastic trays are shown, one of a full tray and the other of a segment of four coils. Note that the trays will contain 50 coils, in ten rows of five coils each. All rows will be perforated in both directions to allow easy separation of any number of coils from the tray, and the coils will remain a sealed unit after separation.

The bottom of each single coil container will be embossed to show the denomination and value of the enclosed coil. The first coils to be packaged in the new trays will be embossed:

# Flag Over Supreme Court Regular Stamp

A 20-cent regular postage stamp will be issued in sheet, coil and vending machine booklet form on December 17 in Washington, DC.

The stamp design depicts the American Flag flying over the Supreme Court building in Washington, DC. Shown in the foreground is James Earle Fraser's statue, "Contemplation of Justice," which is to the left of the staircase leading to the Supreme Court building.

Procedures for ordering first day cancellations:

Customers are urged to buy stamps and affix them to their own covers. All covers must be addressed on the right side of envelopes at least  $\frac{5}{8}$  of an inch up from the bottom. Insert

a filler in each envelope and mail to: "Customer Affixed Envelopes, Postmaster, Washington, DC 20013-9991" by January 16, 1982. There is no charge.

The Postal Service will affix stamps when requested to do so. Mail orders by January 16, 1982, to: "Flag Over Supreme Court Stamps, Postmaster, Washington, DC 20013-9992." The cost is 20 cents per stamp to be affixed and customers should clearly indicate whether sheet stamps, coil stamps or booklet panes are desired. Only full booklet panes removed from booklets will be affixed and canceled. Personal checks in the exact amount will be accepted for orders up to the limit of 50 covers. Postage stamps and cash are unacceptable as payment.

For the purpose of this supervisory overtime pay policy, the 1981 Christmas period is from Saturday, December 5, 1981, through and including Thursday, December 24, 1981, except in Bulk Mail Centers. At the BMCs, the Christmas period begins on November 21, 1981 and ends on December 24, 1981, since volume increases for parcels begin earlier.—*Employee Relations Dept., 11-12-81.*

The stamp is the third issue in the new Transportation Series which was initiated in 1981 with the Surrey with the Fringe on Top and the Electric Auto stamps. All stamps in this series feature early modes of transportation and are issued in coil form only.

The artist, James Schleyer, based his design on a photograph of the fire pumper, which is owned by Engine Company Four in Alexandria, Virginia.

Procedures for ordering first day cancellations:

Customers are urged to buy stamps and affix them to their own covers. All covers must be addressed on the right side of envelopes at least  $\frac{5}{8}$  of an inch up from the bottom. Insert a filler in each envelope and mail to: "Customer Affixed Envelopes, Postmaster, Alexandria, VA 22313-9991" by January 9, 1982.

The Postal Service will affix stamps when requested to do so. Mail orders by January 9 to: "Fire Pumper Coil Stamp, Postmaster, Alexandria, VA 22313-9992." The cost is 20 cents per stamp to be affixed, and personal checks in the exact amount will be accepted for orders up to the limit of 50 covers. Postage stamps and cash are unacceptable as payment.
