The 20-cent Francis of Assisi commemorative stamp will be first placed on sale October 7, 1982, in San Francisco, California. He is being honored for his great humanitarian efforts. This is the first stamp of three to be printed privately under the terms of a contract awarded by the Postal Service in April 1982.

Supply. All post offices under the automatic distribution system will receive an initial supply of this stamp.

Post offices with 950 or more revenue units requiring additional bulk quantities (item 425) should immediately submit Form 17, Stamp Requisition, to their regional accountable paper depository. Do not submit Form 3356, Stamp Requisition—Bulk Quantities, to the Bureau of Engraving and Printing.

All post offices requiring additional stamps in lessthan-bulk quantities should immediately requisition them on a separate Form 17 from their Stamp Distribution Office.

Before requisitioning additional stock, consider that the stock should be depleted prior to December 7, 1982, at all post office outlets except designated philatelic windows.—Customer Services Dept., 8-26-82.

Service Award Certificates

Stock Item No. 0-1100-L, Service Award Certificates (Retirement) PMG signature block, and Item No. 0-1100-M, Service Award Certificate (Posthumous) PMG signature block are being removed from stock in the area supply centers and will be stocked at USPS Headquarters supply room 2P-610.—Employee Relations Dept., 8-26-82.

Notice 123, Stamp Selection—Who and Why

Notice 123, Stamp Selection—Who and Why, is currently available only from the Eastern Area Supply Center (EASC). However, a revised edition is scheduled for printing this fall and stocking at both area supply centers.—Customer Services Dept., 8-26-82.

Retirement Law Amendments

Congress has approved and sent to the President legislation which will have an impact on Civil Service Retirement laws affecting postal employees. The following is a summary of the major changes of interest to prospective retirees:

A. Cost-of-Living (COL) Adjustments:

1. Annual cost-of-living adjustments will be delayed 1 month in each of the next 3 calendar years. At present, COL adjustments are payable April 1 of each year. The new legislation would make such adjustments payable May 1, 1983, June 1, 1984, and July 1, 1985;

2. Civil Service retirees who are under age 62 at the time of a COL adjustment will receive only one-half of such adjustment during the next 3 calendar years, except in certain contingencies.

B. Civil Service Retirement Annuities will be rounded to the next lowest dollar instead of to the nearest dollar.

C. Annuities for retiring employees will commence on the first day of the month after separation from the service instead of the day following separation.

While this legislation had not yet received the President's signature as this Bulletin went to press, the above information is intended to keep employees aware of proposed changes that may affect their retirement benefits. Complete information concerning final legislation will be published as soon as possible.—Employee Relations Dept., 8-26-82.

POLITICAL MAILINGS

To emphasize the subject, the following article is reprinted from Postal Bulletin 21361 (7-22-82).

A. Mailing Period. Between now and the general election on November 2, 1982, the Postal Service will be called upon to accept and deliver numerous large political mailings. These mailings will be made by individual candidates, as well as by local, state, and national campaign organizations.

B. Informing Mailers.

- 1. Postmasters should be aware of potential campaign mailing activities in their areas, and meet as necessary with candidates and committees to discuss their mailing plans. Postmasters should inform them of how their bulk mailings must be prepared and what actions will be taken if, in verifying the mail, we find it to be improperly prepared. An offer of on-site assistance by postal personnel may be made to observe mailings being prepared, especially by volunteer help, and to identify problems in mail preparation and sack labeling BEFORE mailings are submitted at the post office.
- 2. When dealing with potential mailers of political campaign material, Postal Service personnel should stress that mail must be deposited as early as possible before election day to ensure delivery before the election.
- 3. Experience shows that if all mailers are informed fully of postal requirements—and assured of equal and proper handling of their mailings—there will be no cause for criticism. In view of the current emphasis of the Bulk Mall Verification Program, it is especially important that political candidates and committees be fully informed about requirements for bulk mail preparation. Information on contacting political organizations will be furnished in the next few weeks through your Regional office.

C. Mail Processing.

1. All political campaign mailings must be processed promptly and delivered with equal care and attention.

2. Give immediate attention to any reported delay in the processing of such mail and document all such complaints and action taken.

D. Required Records. Detailed records provide the basis for a documented explanation of any complaints alleging improper handling of this mail. Thus, post-masters should make a record of each contact made with potential mailers of political campaign material and a general summary of the information provided to these mailers. In addition, postmasters must keep documented records of any political campaign mailings either deposited at their offices or received for delivery which were too late for delivery. At a minimum, each documented record should include:

1. Name of mailer.

Date and time received for dispatch.
 Date and time received for delivery.

 Approximate number of any pieces not delivered before primary or general election day, and the reasons why.

- E. Disclosure of Information. Answer requests for information from Postal Service records concerning political mailings as provided in regulations implementing the Freedom of Information Act. For example, it is permissible to disclose third-class special rate mail volumes as shown on Form 3602, Statement of Mailing Matter with Permit Imprints, or the names of holders of particular permit imprint or postage meter permits. However, it is not permissible to disclose amounts in trust fund accounts or meter settings. Information which is not regularly compiled for Postal Service use should not be compiled in response to requests. In the event of uncertainty as to the disclosure of information concerning political mailings, regional counsel should be consulted.

DMM Revision

Acceptance of Checks for Mailing List Corrections

Current regulations provide that the correction of mailing lists must be paid for by cash or money order. Effective immediately, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM) 945.152 is amended to allow payment by check.

945 Mailing List Services

.152 Except for authorized users of official mail, payment must be made in advance by cash, check, or money order. Lists will not be returned to commercial mailers until charges and postage fees have been collected.

Checks will be accepted in accordance with instructions in F-1, Financial Handbook for Post Offices, 330.

This change will be included in a future issue of the DMM.—Rates & Classification Dept., 8-26-82.

Acceptance of Form 1093

Managers and accepting clerks are reminded that Form 1093, Application for Post Office Box or Caller Number, must be filled out in its entirety before a box may be rented or a caller number issued. DMM 951.131 includes the following statements:

1. "An applicant must complete all spaces on the form which require customer provided information * * *."

"Furnishing false information on the application or refusal to furnish required information may be sufficient reason for denial of the application or discontinuance of service."

Many incomplete applications, lacking required information such as street addresses, have been improperly accepted. All new applications must be completed in their entirety. If the applicant refuses to comply, the Postmaster must follow the procedure in 951.131c (2).—Delivery Services Dept., 8-26-82.

THIRD-CLASS MAIL

Recent surveys by private concerns have suggested that third-class mail does not always receive

proper handling, even though it is correctly addressed.

All employees should realize that third-class mail is a major contributor to the Postal Service's total income and thus is responsible for a large part of every postal worker's wages. Each of us has a vital stake in seeing that it is properly handled.

In Fiscal Year 1981, this class of mail accounted for approximately 30 percent of the total mail volume and produced \$3.1 billion in revenue. Its growth rate over the past 12 years has been more

than double that of total mail volume.


Consider, too, its impact on other classes of mail. One person responding to a piece of thirdclass advertising mail can, over a 12-month to 16-month period, produce:

12 to 24 pieces of First-Class Mail

13 to 23 pieces of third-class mail

8 to 14 pieces of fourth-class mail.

One postal customer responding to a credit card advertisement can produce 24 pieces of First-Class Mail a year—12 billing statements to the customer and 12 pieces back with payments.




Clearly, postal employees and third-class mailers share a common responsibility to see that this class of mail receives the attention it deserves.

Efforts are being made nationwide to ensure that correct bulk mail make-up procedures are being followed by mailers. The aim is to make sure the customer gets the service he or she pays for.

Similarly, postal employees bear the responsibility of adhering to prescribed procedures for the proper handling and delivery of all third-class mail that is correctly addressed, and for complying with regulations in the handling of such mail that is undeliverable as addressed.

It is vital that we engage in an all-out, continuing effort to identify and correct any problems that exist with the processing of third-class mail. It's everybody's business and to everybody's advantage.

REDEMPTION OF INTERNATIONAL REPLY COUPONS

Under the provisions of Section 221.333b, International Mail Manual, foreign issued international reply coupons may be exchanged at all United States post offices for postage stamps, metered postage, and embossed envelopes (including aerogrammes) at the rate of 30 cents per coupon.

When foreign issued coupons are redeemed, the date and place of exchange must be stamped on the lower right front of the coupon with a rubber all-purpose dating stamp. Failure to stamp the coupon often results in processing delays and reconciliation problems when the coupons are remitted by the Postal Service to the International Bureau of the Universal Postal Union in Bern, Switzerland.





THE POSTAL SERVICE GUIDE TO U.S. STAMPS



The Postal Service Guide to U.S. Stamps, formerly entitled Stamps & Stories, will be placed on advance sale September 1, 1982, at selected Philatelic Centers and by mail order from the Philatelic Sales Division,

Washington, DC. The book will go on sale nationwide at all Stamp Collecting Centers on October 1, 1982, to coincide with the beginning of National Stamp Collecting Month.

Those locations selected for advance sale will receive a special shipment of the book the final week of August. All other Stamp Distribution Offices will receive their stock during the first two weeks of September. All Associate Offices requiring this philatelic product should submit a Form 17, Stamp Stock Requisition, to their Stamp Distribution Office so as to have the book available for the October 1 on-sale date.

The new title and cover design (pictured above) were developed as a result of extensive customer research which determined the old title did not appeal to our philatelic customers. Point of sale promotional material will consist of a lobby poster and replacement books to be used in the ring and chain plastic lobby displays. Trapezoids for the three-tier philatelic merchandiser will not be produced this year. The new book will also be included in the National Stamp Collecting Month promotional material and in the pre-Christmas print advertising campaign in national publications such as Good Housekeeping, McCall's, and Reader's Digest.

The Postal Service Guide to U.S. Stamps will retail for \$3.50 and is identified as Item #927. All sales of this product are to be reported in AIC 092, Philatelic Product Sales, on the daily 1412A as completed by retail sales locations. It will also be included on the quarterly 1079 Philatelic Product Inventory Report as required.—Customer Services Dept., 8-26-82.

DMM Revision

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS MARKING

Effective immediately, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM) and Publication 52, Acceptance of Hazardous, Restricted or Perishable Matter, are revised to remove the Department of Transportation's "Other Regulated Material" (ORM) marking requirements for domestic surface mail.

DMM 124 is revised as follows:

124 Nonmailable Matter—Articles and Substances; Special Mailing Rules

124.331, fourth sentence, delete "and the words Consumer Commodity immediately above the designation ORM-D, which identifies it as a consumer commodity material of limited hazard during transportation because of its form, quantity and packaging".

124.333 and 124.334, third sentences, delete "and the designation Consumer Commodity immediately above the designation ORM-D".

124.341, third sentence, delete "and the words Consumer Commodity immediately above the designation ORM-D".

124.354, first sentence, delete "and the words Consumer Commodity immediately above the ORM-D designation".

124.363c, first sentence, delete "and the words Consumer Commodity—Class B Poison immediately above the designation ORM—D".

124.392, second sentence, delete "above the designation ORM-A".

Pub. 52 is revised as follows:

221, first sentence, change "(ORM) designation as appropriate" to "(ORM) designation when appropriate".

Exhibit 221, change "[ORM-D]" to "[ORM-D AIR]".

223, seventh sentence, change "The presence of an ORM-D Consumer Commodity" to "the presence of an ORM-D AIR Consumer Commodity", and in the ninth sentence insert the word "air" between "avoid" and "carrier".

225, second sentence, add "or from the nearest DOT office".

262e(4), change to "(b) ORM-AIR designation, when appropriate", and "(c) Identification number, when appropriate for air shipment".


331.22, first sentence, delete "immediately next to the designation ORM-D".

332.212f, delete "immediately above the designation ORM-D", and in g, add "along with the designation ORM-D AIR".

342.11 and 342.2, delete "and marking".

362.2c, delete "appearing immediately above the Consumer Commodity ORM-D designation".

Francis of Assisi Commemorative Stamp

A 20-cent commemorative stamp honoring the 800th anniversary year of the birth of Francis of Assisi will be issued October 7 in San Francisco, California, the city named in his honor. The first day of issue ceremony will be held at the M. H. de Young Memorial Museum.

Francis of Assisi is being honored for his great humanitarian services. His teachings stressed humility, work, and kindliness toward all living creatures. His world-wide fame stems from the founding of the Franciscan religious order in 1209.

The Francis of Assisi stamp is the fifth stamp to be printed by a private company (American Bank Note Company and J. W. Fergusson and Sons) in recent years. The plate numbering system, as with each stamp produced by a private company beginning with the 1979 John Paul Jones issue, features the

letter "A" before the plate number or group of numbers.


Procedures for ordering first day cancellations are as follows:

Customers are urged to buy stamps and affix them to their own covers. All covers must be addressed on the right side at least 5/8 of an inch up from the bottom. Insert a filler in each envelope and mail them to: Customer-Affixed Envelopes, Postmaster, San Francisco, CA 94101-9991 by November 6. There is no charge.

The Postal Service will affix stamps when requested to do so. Mail orders by November 6 to: Francis of Assisi Stamp, Postmaster, San Francisco, CA 94101-9992. The cost is 20 cents per stamp to be affixed and personal checks in the exact amount will be accepted for orders up to the limit of 50 covers. Do not send cash. Postage stamps are unacceptable as payment.
