BANGKOK Souvenir Card

Do Not Sell Before August 5, 1983

A souvenir card is being issued to honor BANGKOK '83, an international philatelic exhibition in Bangkok, Thailand, August 4, through August 13, 1983. The design of the card features reproductions of Thailand's first postage stamp, the 1883 King Chulalongkorn and the United States 1883 2-cent *Bank Note* postage stamp issued 100 years ago in honor of President George Washington. This card also bears a message signed by the Postmaster General.

Collectors. Customers may purchase the uncanceled version of this card for \$2.00 at authorized philatelic centers or by mail order from the Philatelic Sales Division in both canceled and uncanceled form. The canceled cards are \$2.20 each. A 20-cent George Washington stamp will be affixed to the card and canceled with the circular U.S. cancellation to be used at BANGKOK. Orders should be addressed to *BANGKOK Card*, Philatelic Sales Division 20265-9997.

Supply. Only post offices with authorized philatelic centers will receive an automatic distribution. Post offices with philatelic centers requiring additional stock of this card, Item 504, are to order from their regional accountable paper depository on a Form 17, *Stamp Requisition*, in multiples of 100.—*Customer Services Dept.*, 7-21-83.

Uniform Allowance Program

The Postal Uniform Quality Control Office, U.S. Army Natick Laboratories, has issued to the uniform industry specifications *USPSUQC-4* for revised Security Force emblem; *USPSUQC-82* for windbreaker; *USPSUQC-47B and 56B* for male and female short sleeve blue shirt.

Postal Police Officers are authorized to purchase the revised emblem immediately. The short sleeve blue shirt is authorized for purchase beginning October 1, 1983; however, it may not be worn prior to January 1984. Specific implementation dates will be announced by each Inspection Service division. The windbreaker may be purchased beginning September 1, 1983.

Orders may be placed for all items prior to the effective dates; however, no deliveries can be made nor reimbursement claimed until the authorized beginning purchase date for each item.—*Labor Relations Dept.*, 7-21-83.

FY 1984 Supervisor's Guide, Merit Performance Evaluation

A supply of the FY 1984 Supervisor's Guide for Merit Performance Evaluation (Handbooks EL-402, *Regular Process*, and EL-403, *Step Process*) will be mailed in August directly to managers of MSC's, BMC's, District Offices, USPS Headquarters Personnel, USPS Headquarters Supply Room, and General Managers of Regional Compensation offices. The distribution to MSC's will provide sufficient handbooks for associate offices. All other postal facilities and USPS Headquarters-related units must order the Supervisor's Guide from their appropriate area supply center on Form 7380, *Supply Center Requisition*. Handbook EL-402 dated August 1982 is obsolete.

(RES) PAY CHANGES— BARGAINING UNITS

Salary schedules shown on pages 9 through 22.

Note: The instructions and pay schedules in this BULLETIN apply **only** to employees covered by the below-cited collective bargaining agreements who were eligible for and elected the COLA Roll-In Option (see agreements and BULLETIN 21315 (9-10-81), for eligibility and option details).

A. Application. These instructions apply to employees covered by:

1. 1981-1984 USPS-APWU/NALC National Agreement;
2. 1981-1984 USPS-NRLCA National Agreement;
3. 1981-1984 USPS—Mail Handlers' National Agreement; and to employees subject to the provisions of collective bargaining agreements covering:
4. Mailbag depositories, repair centers, and supply centers.
5. Mail equipment shop employees represented by the American Postal Workers' Union/Mail Handlers Union.
6. Postal Police Officers (PPOs) represented by the National Association of Postal Police Officers (NAPPO).
7. Postal Police Officers (PPOs) represented by the Federation of Postal Police Officers (USPS-FPSP Agreement).

B. Provisions

In accordance with the COLA Roll-In Option provision and the general increase provision specified in each of the respective bargaining agreements cited above, the respective basic pay schedules have been increased by the applicable amounts. These increases are effective and will be paid to eligible employees starting July 23, 1983 (pp16-83).

1. The Postal Service (PS) Schedule has been increased by an additional \$300 (14 cents per hour), applied to all grades and steps.
2. The Mail Handlers' basic schedule has been increased by \$375 (18 cents per hour), applied to all grades and steps.
3. The Rural Carrier schedules have been increased as follows:

The basic schedules have been increased by an additional \$300 (14 cents per hour), with proportional adjustment to the evaluated and substitute schedules.

Note: There is no provision for movement, and an employee may not move, between the Retiree Eligible Schedule (RES) version of a salary schedule and the "standard" (or non-RES) version of that schedule.—*Employee Relations Dept., 7-21-83.*

1-CENT OMNIBUS COIL STAMP

The 1-cent Omnibus coil stamp will be placed on sale August 19, 1983, in Arlington, VA.

Issued in coils of 500 and 3,000. Collector information will be found on page 25.

Supply. An automatic distribution of the coils of 500 will only be made to post offices with authorized philatelic centers. The quantity of coils to be furnished will be based on the Bureau of Engraving and Printing's four-position automatic distribution schedule for a 50-subject commemorative stamp. The number of coils to be furnished are as follows:

Offices receiving four-position stock in these quantities	Will receive coils in these quantities
25,000 to 50,000	50
75,000 to 100,000	100
125,000 to 375,000	400
500,000 to 750,000	800

All other post offices should order sufficient quantities of this coil to meet anticipated local philatelic demand.

Bulk-Quantities. Post offices with 950 or more revenue units requiring this stamp or additional stock in bulk quantities should immediately submit Form 3356, *Stamp Requisition-Bulk Quantities*, to the Bureau of Engraving and Printing. Orders must be submitted in the following quantities: coils of 500 (*Item No. 704*) 200, 400 and multiples of 400 to maximum of 2,000; coils of 3,000 (*Item No. 705*) 32, 64, and multiples of 64 to maximum of 320.

Less-than-bulk-Quantities. All post offices requiring less than the above bulk quantities should

immediately submit a separate Form 17, *Stamp Requisition*, to their designated Stamp Distribution Offices.—*Customer Services Dept., 7-21-83.*

Rural Routes—Special Equipment Maintenance Allowance Schedule

Under the provisions of Article 30.1.H.3. of the 1981 USPS-NRLCA National Agreement, effective July 23, 1983 (PP 16-83), rural carriers will be granted an additional ½¢ per mile increase in the equipment maintenance allowance (EMA) and a 20¢ increase in the minimum EMA rate.

In accordance with the above negotiated increase, the rural carrier EMA will be increased from 31¢ per mile, or major fraction of a mile, scheduled per day, or \$12.40, whichever is greater; to 31.5¢ per mile, or major fraction of a mile, schedule per day, or \$12.60, whichever is greater.

Rural Carrier Relief (Des. 75) employees, when providing auxiliary assistance or serving an auxiliary route, and Auxiliary Rural carriers (Des. 77), will be paid an EMA of 31.5¢ per mile or \$3.75 per hour, whichever is greater, but not to exceed the amount provided for in the special chart for the route stops and miles.

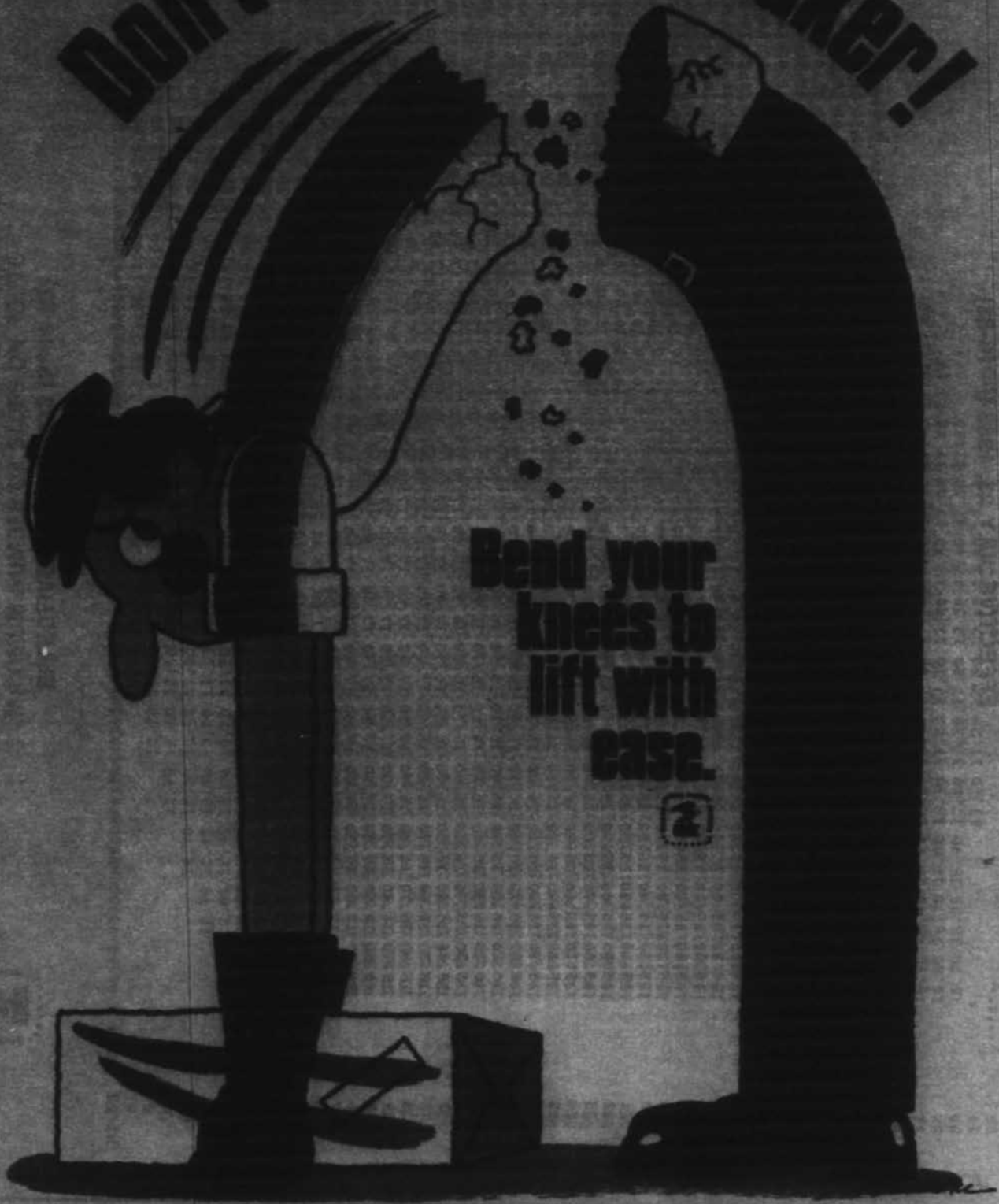

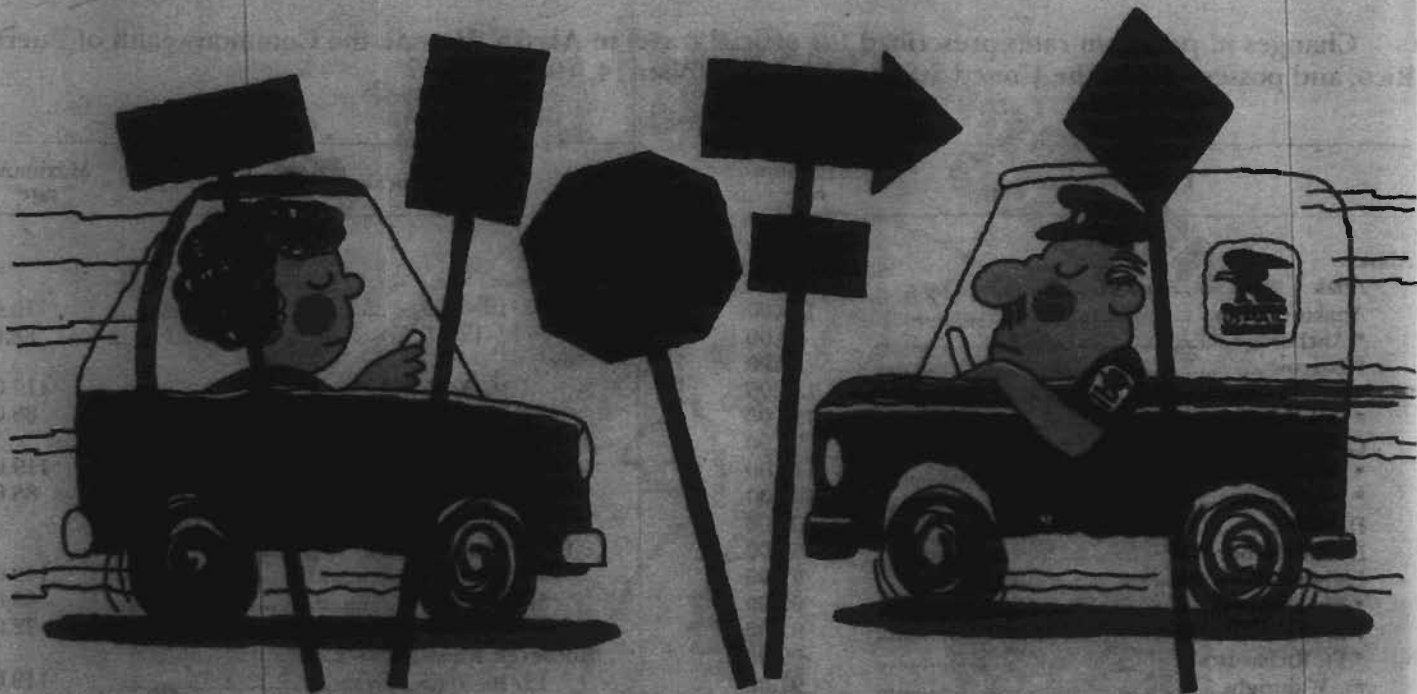

DELIVERY SERVICES QUALITY ASSURANCE AUDIT

The following audit is the *fourth* in a series of Quality Assurance Reviews that every delivery unit supervisor must complete and retain in the unit. (Refer to POSTAL BULLETIN 21400 (4-21-83), page 27).

These reviews are a part of an ongoing Quality Assurance Program which cannot be successful without the support of all delivery supervisors. These reviews are to be used as part of the daily quality control activities to identify and correct conditions that may hamper delivery units from doing a quality job.

SUPERVISOR REVIEW #4

MAIL ADDRESSED TO APARTMENT BUILDINGS

The absence of an apartment number from a mailing address is not in itself sufficient reason for returning such mail as undeliverable. Delivery employees should make every reasonable attempt to deliver all classes of mail, using apartment directories when required. Before mail can be returned for *Insufficient Address*, the delivery employee must compare customer names on the apartment directory or mailboxes with the name of the customer shown on the mail.

For mail addressed to *Occupant, Postal Customer*, etc., with no apartment number, delivery should begin at the lowest numbered mail receptacle and continue upward until all mail is delivered. If there are more mail pieces than mail receptacles, the procedure should be repeated. (Some customers may receive duplicates.) This procedure does not apply to simplified address mail (box holders) received for delivery on a rural route. In those cases, refer to M-37, *Rural Delivery Carrier Duties and Responsibilities*, 322.1.

Managers must review mail in the *Insufficient Address* category to assure that mail lacking an apartment number is *taken out* and that the comparison of names is made before the mail is endorsed *Insufficient Address* and returned to the sender.

Omnibus Regular Stamp

A one-cent regular coil stamp depicting the omnibus, one of the earliest forms of mass transportation, will be issued August 19 in Arlington, Virginia. The first day of issue ceremony will be held at the Stouffer's National Center Hotel in conjunction with the opening of the American First Day Cover Society Convention.

The Omnibus stamp is the 11th issue in the Transportation Series, initiated in 1981 to feature early modes of transportation. The stamps in this series are issued in coil form only.

The omnibus was a forerunner of the bus. Basically able to accommodate at least 12 passengers, the seats on the omnibus were arranged along the long walls of the vehicle with the door in the rear. The driver frequently sat on the roof. The omnibus was first used in Paris around 1820. They were placed into operation in New York City during the 1830s. By the turn of the century, the horse-drawn omnibus system was used throughout the United States.

Procedures for ordering first day of issue cancellations are as follows:

Customers are urged to buy stamps and affix them to their own covers. All covers must be addressed on the right side of envelopes at least $\frac{5}{8}$ of an inch up from the bottom. Customers are reminded they must add at least 19 cents additional postage to their envelopes (12 cents additional postage if stamps are affixed to postal cards) to meet the minimum First-Class rate. Only uncanceled stamps issued prior to August 19 may be affixed for this purpose. Insert a filler in each envelope and mail covers by September 18 to: Customer-Affixed Envelopes, Postmaster, Arlington, VA 22210-9991. No remittance is required.

The Postal Service will affix stamps when requested to do so. Mail orders by September 18 to: Omnibus Stamp, Postmaster, Arlington, VA 22210-9992. The cost is 20 cents per cancellation (the 18-cent Surry stamp plus two one-cent Omnibus stamps will be affixed to covers to meet the minimum First-Class rate). Personal checks in the exact amount will be accepted for orders up to the limit of 50 covers. Do not send cash. Postage stamps are unacceptable as payment.

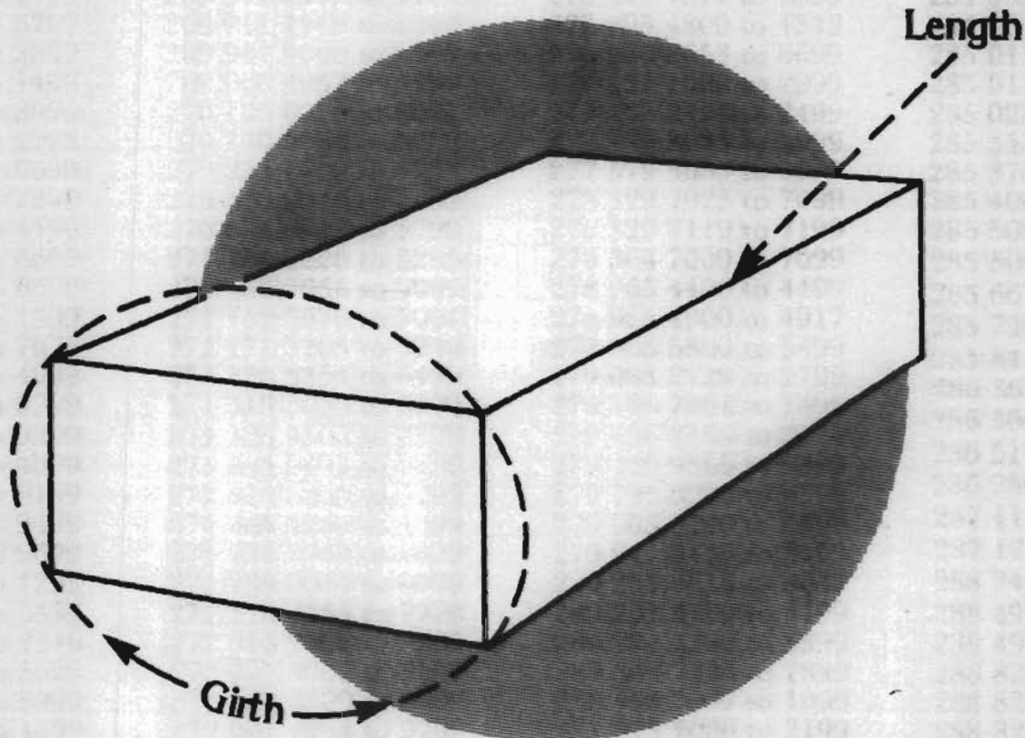

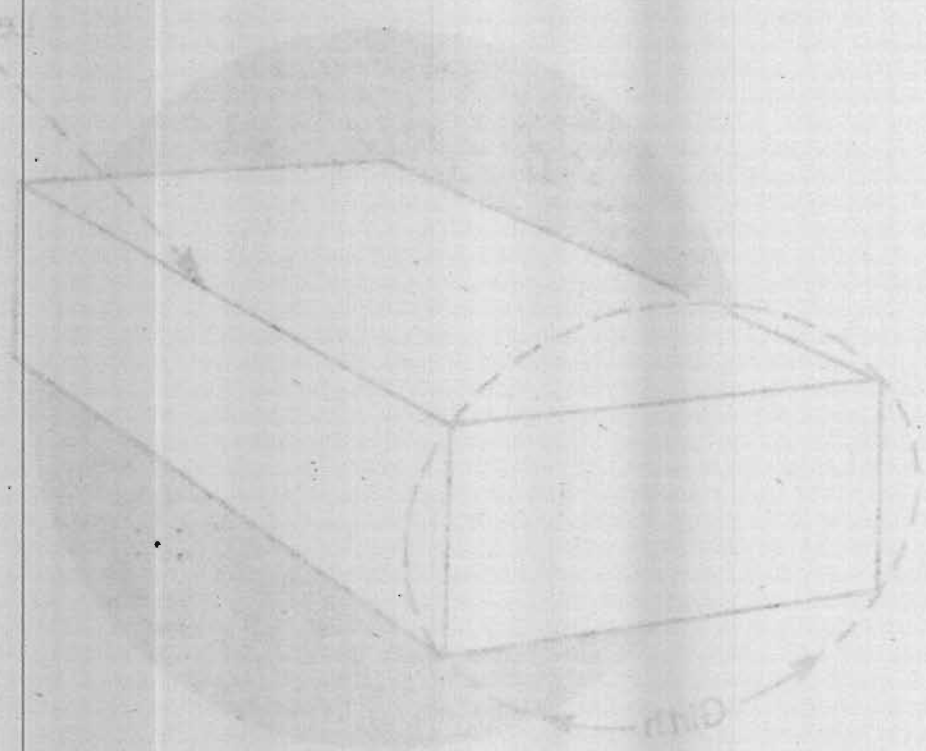

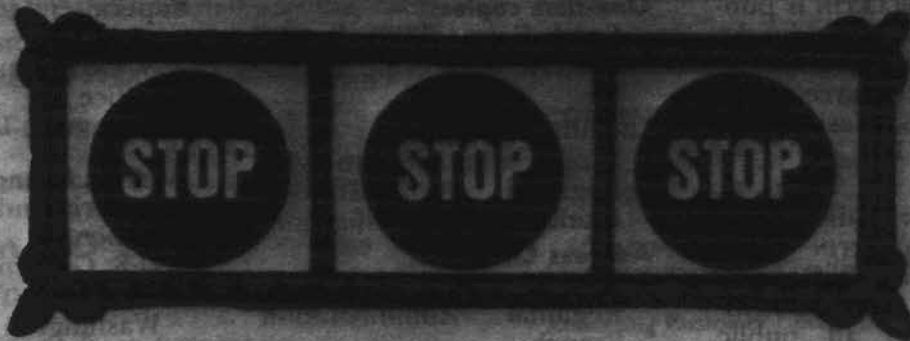
