7.4-CENT BABY BUGGY COIL POSTAGE STAMP

The 7.4-cent Baby Buggy regular coil stamp will be placed on sale April 7, 1984, in San Diego, CA. This stamp meets the new basic third-class rate for carrier route presort bulk mailings which became effective May 22, 1983.

Supply. An automatic distribution of nonprecanceled coils of 500 stamps will be made to post offices with authorized philatelic centers. The

automatic distribution is based on the Bureau of Engraving and Printing's schedule for a 50-subject commemorative stamp. Accordingly, the quantities of coils to be furnished are as follows:

Precanceled Bulk Quantities. Post offices with 950 or more revenue units requiring this stamp in precanceled form should immediately submit Form 3356, *Stamp Requisition—Bulk Quantities*, to the Bureau of Engraving and Printing. Orders must be submitted in the following quantities: coils of 500 stamps (*item number 774*) 200, 400, and multiples of 400 coils to a maximum of 2,000 coils per requisition; coils of 3,000 stamps (*item number 775*) 32, 64, and multiples of 64 coils to a maximum of 768 coils per requisition. See Section 523.13d, *F-1 Handbook, Financial Handbook for Post Offices*, for proper procedures when ordering precanceled stamps. The memorandum described in that section must accompany Form 3356.

Precanceled Less-Than-Bulk Quantities. All other post offices requiring this stamp should immediately submit separate Form 17, *Stamp Requisition*, to their designated Stamp Distribution Offices.

Postmasters: Outside Sales

Effective in FY 1980, the requirement for the reporting of outside sales in offices with less than 190 revenue units (CAG K and L) was canceled. PS Form 1568, *Outside Sales Report*, is no longer required.

While the formal requirement for all CAG K and L offices to report outside sales was canceled, Title 18, Section 1721, of the *U.S. Code* provides penalty for Postal Service employees who knowingly and willfully engage in outside sales for the purpose of increasing their compensation.

In order to comply with this provision of the law, it is necessary for offices to maintain internal records of all outside sales, in the event a change in the assigned grade level may occur due to an increase or decrease in revenue units.

All Postal Installations

Post offices have been receiving form letters from R. L. Polk & Company, publishers, asking for employees' home addresses and/or the names of their spouses in order to update their City Directory Listings.

The firm has, on several occasions, been notified that the Postal Service's policy and the Privacy Act prohibits the release of the information being requested. In spite of this, however, requests continue to be received. Therefore, upon receipt of a request of this nature, the following action is authorized:

1. Discard the request letter and any other materials that do not contain information about employees.
2. Destroy by burning or shredding lists furnished by Polk that contain employee information (i.e., home address or marital status).

If contact is made by telephone concerning unfilled requests, explain that the Postal Service is prohibited from furnishing the information by the Privacy Act. Any questions or problems may be referred to the Records Officer (202-245-4142).

Timekeeping Procedures

Timekeeping Procedures, POSTAL BULLETIN 21447 (3-1-84) page 3, incorrectly specified the number of boxes allocated to Week 1 in Section B of Form 1377, *Request for Payment of Leave Replacement/or Postmaster Overtime at CAG L Office*. Change paragraph C.2 to read as follows:

* * * * *

2. RSC "E" or "F" Postmaster (D/A 08-0) or Officer-in-Charge (OIC) (D/A 88-0). When these employees take leave, they must complete Form 1377 at the top and in Section B as shown in Exhibit 1. In Section B, note that the first 6 boxes are for Week 1 and the second 6 boxes are for Week 2, as the Form 1377 must be submitted each week for that week's activity. An alpha letter is entered for the type of leave used each day. If one-half day of leave is taken, also enter ½ in the box. The Code "OL" is used for meeting time, Free Saturday, etc. Enter an explanation of "OL" in the space provided. The Free Saturday entry can only be used when the employee was on leave the prior Friday or the following Monday. Check off the box at the bottom if leave was taken on the prior Friday.

M-9 Revision

Travel—Approval

POSTAL BULLETIN 21430 (11-3-83) page 13, did not identify PCES executives in charge of MSCs and BMCs as officials who may be delegated the authority to approve travel advances up to \$750 for employees in a training status when lodging is provided by USPS (not payable by the trainee). Handbook M-9, *Travel Methods Handbook*, is revised as follows:

§ 13.11 (c) Field Service. All PCES executives in Postal Data Centers, Automatic Data Processing Centers, Area Supply Centers, District Offices, and Inspectors-in-Charge.

Regional Postmasters General may redelegate this authority to PCES executives in charge of Management Sectional Centers, Bulk Mail Centers, and Managers in charge of Transportation Management Offices, Procurement Services Offices, Area Overhaul Centers, and Building Management Engineering Offices; and Branch Managers reporting directly to Regional Directors. Copies of any delegations of authority must be furnished to the Accounts Payable Branch Manager of the servicing Postal Data Center.

Form 3577—Justification of Use

Postmasters are reminded that when a customer's address is changed due to a Postal Service adjustment, customers should be furnished Form 3576, *Change of Address, Notice to Correspondents, Businesses and Publishers*. Postmasters should also complete Form 3577, *Correction of Error in Address Because of Postal Service Adjustments*, for those mailers that regularly send publications and volume mailings into the area. This will ensure more efficient processing of the mail. (Refer to DMM 159.132, DMM 491.1 POM 636.3, M-38, 824.43.)—Delivery Services Dept., 3-8-84.

Express Mail International Service—Malaysia

We have been advised by the postal administration of Malaysia that Express Mail International Service now is available to all addresses in Penang, as well as Kuala Lumpur. Items addressed to Penang City and received in the morning will be delivered the same day. Items arriving after noon will be delivered the following working day. Items addressed to other addresses in Penang will be delivered the following working day. Items addressed to Kuala Lumpur arriving in the morning will be delivered the same day, while items arriving after noon will be delivered the following day. Items containing merchandise will require additional processing time. There is no Express Mail delivery on Sundays and holidays.

DMM Revision

Physical Characteristics of Pallets for Fourth-Class Mail

Regulations governing preparing pallets of fourth-class mail have been revised to give mailers the option of using corrugated cardboard to enclose mail on pallets. DOMESTIC MAIL MANUAL (DMM) 767.535 is revised to read as follows:

767.53 Pallet Preparation

* * * * *

.535 Physical Characteristics. Pallets must be constructed of high quality material, designed to handle loads equal to a gross weight of 2,000 pounds with volumes up to 65 cubic feet. The dimensions must be 48 inches by 40 inches. The pallets must be designed for four way entry by fork trucks and two way entry for pallet jacks. Pallet mailings must be wrapped with shrinkable or stretchable wrap or be enclosed in corrugated cardboard which will retain integrity throughout transportation and handling. Wooden top caps the same size as the pallet are required on pallets with gross weights of less than 1,000 pounds. Top caps must be affixed to the pallet with nylon strapping.

This change will be incorporated into a future revision of the DMM.

Baby Buggy Regular Stamp

A 7.4-cent regular coil stamp featuring an 1880's Baby Buggy will be issued April 7 in San Diego, California, during the SANDICAL-EXPO '84 stamp show. No first day of issue ceremony is planned.

The Baby Buggy stamp is the 14th in the Transportation Series, which features early modes of transportation. The series was initiated in 1981 with the release of the 18-cent Surrey stamp.

The stamp features a pen and ink rendering of a baby buggy offered by the St. Nicholas Toy Company of Chicago, Illinois, in its spring 1887 mail order catalog.

The 7.4-cent denomination meets the new basic third-class rate for carrier route presort bulk mailings, which took effect last May.

Procedures for ordering first day cancellations are as follow:

Customers are urged to purchase stamps at their post offices and affix them to their envelopes. Covers bearing customer-affixed stamps will be given preferential service.

Customers are reminded that at least 13 cents additional postage must be affixed to envelopes to meet the minimum First-Class rate. Uncanceled stamps issued prior to April 7 may be affixed for this purpose. Orders containing envelopes to which stamps issued after April 7 are affixed will be returned unserved.

Insert a filler in each envelope and mail covers by May 7 to: Customer-Affixed Envelopes, Postmaster, San Diego, CA 92199-9991. No remittance is required.

The Postal Service will affix stamps when requested to do so. Mail orders by May 7 to: Baby Buggy Stamp, Postmaster, San Diego, CA 92199-9992. The Postal Service will affix the 7.4-cent Baby Buggy coil stamp and a 13-cent Liberty Bell stamp to meet the minimum First-Class mailing rate. The cost is 21 cents for each cover. Personal checks in the exact amount will be accepted for orders up to the limit of 50 covers. Do not send cash. Postage stamps are unacceptable as payment.

DMM Revision

UNDELIVERABLE FOREIGN ORIGINATING DEAD LETTERS

Effective immediately, Section 159.521 of the *Domestic Mail Manual* is revised to change the dispatch routing for dead letters which were originally mailed in Canada. Such letters were formerly sent to a U.S. Postal Service dead letter branch while all other foreign originating dead letters were sent to a U.S. foreign exchange office. With this change, Canadian dead letters are now sent, along with all other foreign dead letters, to an appropriate U.S. Postal Service foreign exchange office. **DO NOT SEND DEAD LETTERS OF ANY FOREIGN ORIGIN TO U.S. DEAD LETTER BRANCHES.**

The revised regulations follow:

f. Foreign Mail

DMM and POM Corrections

ALL SECOND-CLASS MAIL TO BE HANDLED AS SURFACE PREFERENTIAL MAIL

POSTAL BULLETIN 21447 (3-1-84) pages 10 and 11, contains an error regarding acceptance of surface preferential mail. Change the section headed **Acceptance** to read:

Acceptance

Beginning March 1, 1984, and continuing throughout the transition period, any second-class mail may be accepted at GMFs, SCFs, and other facilities designated to accept daily or weekly publications, provided the make up of second-class mail is in accordance with current requirements for newspaper treatment second-class mail. Pink labels must be used for newspaper treatment mail and all other second-class mail in the surface preferential mail network. *Labels for newspaper-treatment second-class mail must have the designation "NEWS" and all other second-class mail must have the designation "2C" on the contents line.* Regions and all field installations must take the necessary steps to ensure that staffing and space are provided to accommodate the increased volumes resulting from this change.

During the transition period, second-class mail currently labeled ORD P and made up according to the former requirements for ordinary second-class will continue to be accepted at BMCs.

References to past deadline dates have been removed from **462.3 Sacking Requirements** and the example given for News Carrier Routes sack labels has also been corrected. The section should read:

* * * * *

462.3 Sacking Requirements

.31 Required Sack Sortation and Labeling. Carrier route packages must be placed in carrier route or carrier routes sacks as follows:

a. *Carrier Route Sacks.* Sacks containing at least one package of six or more pieces for the same

carrier route must be labeled in the following manner:

Line 1: City, state, and 5-digit destination.

Line 2: Contents (2C or NEWS) followed by the type of route (the words CARRIER ROUTE, RURAL ROUTE, POST OFFICE BOX SECTION, HIGHWAY CONTRACT ROUTE, or GENERAL DELIVERY UNIT) and the applicable route, section, or unit number. The words POST OFFICE BOX SECTION, HIGHWAY CONTRACT ROUTE, and GENERAL DELIVERY UNIT may be abbreviated as follows: BOX SECT, HWY CONTR RT, GEN DEL UNIT.

Line 3: City and state of the post office of mailing.

b. *Carrier Routes Sacks.* Sacks containing qualifying carrier packages for more than one carrier route must be labeled in the following manner:

Line 1: City, state, and 5-digit destination.

Line 2: Contents (2C or NEWS) followed by the words CARRIER ROUTES. The words CARRIER ROUTES must not be abbreviated.

Line 3: City and state of the post office of mailing.
