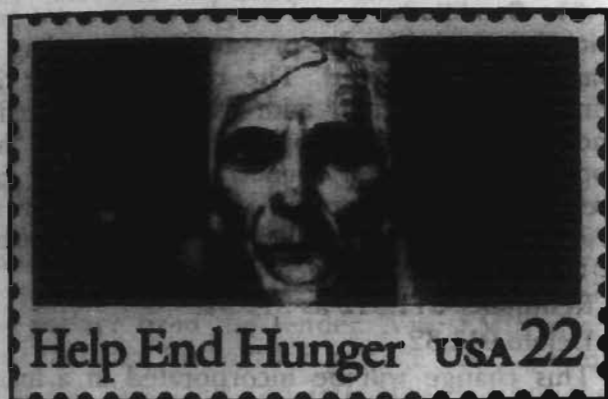
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22-Cent Help End Hunger Commemorative Stamp

The 22-Cent Help End Hunger commemorative postage stamp will be placed on sale October 15, 1985, in Washington, DC. This is the fourteenth stamp to be printed by a private firm under the terms of a contract awarded by the Postal Service on September 8, 1983, and the 21st printed by that firm since 1979.

Supply. All post offices will receive their standard automatic distribution quantities for a 50-subject commemorative stamp. *Supplemental requisitions will not be honored at the Bureau of Engraving and Printing for item 400.*

Stamp distribution offices requiring additional stamps may order them from their Regional Accountable Paper Depositories using separate Forms 17A, *Accountable Items Requisition from Stamp Distribution Office*. Limited quantities of this stamp will be shipped to Regional Accountable Paper Depositories for filling supplemental orders. All other post offices requiring additional stamps should immediately requisition them from their Stamp Distribution Office on separate Forms 17A.—*Customer Services Dept., 9-12-85.*

New Form 7380—Supply Center Requisition

The December 1984 edition of Form 7380, *Supply Center Requisition*, was designed to serve as a self-mailer for each area supply center (7380E for the Eastern Area Supply Center and 7380W for the Western Area Supply Center). However, the physical characteristics of the forms will not allow processing on high speed facer/canceler or distribution equipment. Accordingly, it must be folded and placed in a standard 4 by 9½ inch envelope properly addressed to the appropriate area supply center.

Express Mail Corporate Account Customer Chargeback Option

Effective immediately, Express Mail Corporate Account (EMCA) customers may add a 3-digit sub-account number (within the range 001-999) to their assigned EMCA number for internal control purposes. This new option is designed to provide our customers the means to charge Express Mail expenses back to individual departments within their firm. Use of a sub-account number is at the discretion of EMCA customers. If the mailers choose to use sub-account numbers on Labels 11-A, B, or C shipments, they are to enter a hyphen and a 3-digit number immediately after their 6-digit EMCA number in the "Customer Number" area on the label (for example: 432114-001).

Acceptance employees must be made aware of the new three-digit add on to Corporate Account numbers on Labels 11-A, B and C. Follow current verification procedures, i.e., check only the first six numbers against the invalid number listing.

The employee entering Express Mail volume/revenue data into the Electronic Marketing Reporting System (EMRS) will report the 3-digit number (when used) to record the EMCA customer number. Detailed instructions will appear on the EMRS.

When customers choose to designate a sub-account number for a Custom Designed leg, they must notify their Express Mail Manager or Customer Service Representative. That individual will then revise the Form 5637, *Express Mail Service Leg*, by entering the sub-account number in Item 16 under the name and address of the office at which the corporate account is held. The customer should not enter the sub-account number on the Form 5625, *Custom Designed Mailing Receipt*. A worksheet indicating the Custom Designed agreement number and the new 3-digit chargeback number must be provided to the finance office of the management sectional center at which the corporate account is held. The finance office will enter this information into the EMRS.

The EMCA Drawdown Report and Mailing Activity Statement will separate customer shipments according to the chargeback number that is used.

DMM Revision

Elimination of Padded Envelopes in Registered Mail

POSTAL BULLETIN 21473 (8-30-84) permitted manufacturers to submit padded envelopes to be tested for approval for registered mail use. Manufacturers have expressed virtually no interest in this program. Therefore, the Postal Service has decided to rescind the provisions specified in that announcement. Padded envelopes may not be used to send domestic registered mail. The previous conditions governing the preparation of registered mail are reinstated.

Effective immediately, DOMESTIC MAIL MANUAL (DMM) 911.32 is revised as follows:

911.3 Preparation for Mailing

.31 Conditions. Postal employees are not permitted to assist in the preparation or sealing of mail to be registered. The mail must bear the complete names and addresses of both sender and addressee. Envelopes and packages that appear to have been opened or resealed, or that are otherwise improperly prepared, will not be registered. Padded envelopes are not acceptable in the domestic registered mail service.

Requisitioning of Supplies From the Eastern Area Supply Center

POSTAL BULLETIN 21520, 6-27-85, informed of a 6-month test beginning July 6, 1985, for ordering supplies from the Eastern Area Supply Center.

All postal installations served by the Eastern Area Supply Center may order their supply requirements on an as-needed basis during this test period.

A test survey is being shipped with each supply order. Postal installations are to complete and return the questionnaire promptly.

HANDLING OF SHORTPAID EXPRESS MAIL INTERNATIONAL SERVICE ITEMS

Effective immediately, INTERNATIONAL MAIL MANUAL (IMM) 230, Handbook, M-68 *Express Mail Service* 913, Handbook T-1, *International Air-mail Exchange Office Procedures* 213, and POSTAL OPERATIONS MANUAL (POM) Chapter 4 are revised to clarify the handling of shortpaid Express Mail International Service (EMIS) items.

IMM Revision

Chapter 2

230 Treatment of Outgoing Mail

232.2 Shortpaid and Unpaid Postage

.21 General Procedure at Mailing Office

.224 Shortpaid Express Mail International Service (EMIS) shipments must be stamped "Postage Paid" and forwarded without delay to the appropriate exchange office. Collect the deficient postage from the sender. *Note:* EMIS shipments must not be held for postage due payment unless the deficiency can be obtained from the sender without delaying the dispatch of the shipment.

Chapter 2—Dispatching International Mail

213 Shortpaid LC/AO/EMIS

213.4 Shortpaid EMIS

Send copies of Form 2947-A, *Notice—Shortpaid International Mail*, to the mailer and the origin post office, and dispatch the piece.

M-68 Revision (new subsection)

913 INSUFFICIENT PREPAYMENT

913.3 Express Mail International Service (EMIS)

a. For shortpaid EMIS shipments detected at the office of origin, the acceptance clerk must stamp the item "Postage Paid" and forward without delay to the appropriate exchange office. The origin post office will follow the procedures in 913.1 or 913.2 for collection of the deficient postage.

b. For shortpaid EMIS shipments first detected at the exchange office, copies of Form 2947-A, *Notice—Shortpaid International Mail*, will be sent to the mailer and the origin post office. If needed, the origin post office will notify the origin office Express Mail manager to assist in the collection of the deficient postage.

Note: These EMIS shipments must not be held for postage due payment unless the deficiency can be obtained from the sender without delaying the dispatch of the shipment. DO NOT stamp the item "Postage Due".

Appropriate Rates for Nonsubscriber Second-Class Publications

The elimination of the second-class transient rate in the last general rate change has produced a number of questions about the appropriate rate treatment for nonsubscriber (or nonrequester) copies of a second-class publication. The following clarification is based on a review of the rate and classification history of second-class mail since Postal Reorganization.

Nonsubscriber (nonrequester) copies are divided into two groups. The first group includes all copies up to a limit of ten percent of the total weight of copies mailed to subscribers (requesters) during the calendar year. These copies may be mailed in one or more mailings at any time during the calendar year and do not have to be commingled with a mailing of subscriber (requester) copies. The rate paid to mail any of these copies is the second-class rate that would apply to the copy if the addressee is a subscriber (requester).

The second group of nonsubscriber (nonrequester) copies includes all copies that do not qualify for the ten percent allowance. These copies must be commingled and presorted as part of a mailing of subscriber (requester) copies to be eligible for second-class rates. The full, regular rate is charged. No preferred rates apply. Copies in excess of the ten percent allowance that are not commingled and presorted as part of a subscriber (requester) mailing are not eligible for mailing at second-class rates. These former transient rate copies may be mailed as First-Class Mail or at any applicable third- or fourth-class rate.

All Vehicle Post Offices

Gasoline Credit Card Usage

Beginning September 1, 1985, American Petrofina will no longer provide Postal Data Center (PDC) billings with fuel tax computations. Effective immediately, all vehicle post offices are to cease the use of FINA credit cards for the purchase of fuel or services.

For services and fuel formerly provided by FINA, Fleet Managers and Postmasters are to use other credit cards as their first alternative. Local arrangements for tax exempt status and reimbursement must be made if any other method of payment is used.

Vehicle Repair Maintenance Agreements with FINA service stations are not affected by this notice.—*Delivery Services Dept., 9-12-85.*

DMM Revision

ZIP + 4 Presort Mailings

Effective immediately, the current requirement that all non-ZIP + 4 coded pieces of a combined ZIP + 4 Presort and Presorted First-Class mailing meet the ZIP + 4 mailing requirements of DOMESTIC MAIL MANUAL (DMM) 324, except 324.2, is suspended until April 6, 1986. This exception to the requirements of 324 will no longer be available when a permanent minimum ZIP + 4 addressing percentage is established.

To implement this change, DMM 365.32 has been amended to read as follows:

Chapter 3—First-Class Mail

360 Preparation Requirements

365 Combined Presort Mailings

365.3 Requirements for Combined Presort Mailings

.32 All Pieces which do not bear a ZIP + 4 Code must bear a 5-digit ZIP Code. Pieces mailed at the ZIP + 4 rates must meet all the ZIP + 4 mailing requirements of 324. Until April 6, 1986, pieces mailed at rates, other than the ZIP + 4 rates, need not meet the requirements of 324.3 through 324.61.

This change will be incorporated into a future revision of the DMM.

Determination for Fiscal Year 1986 Merit Salary Increase

Management Instruction EL-370-85-2 issued August 15, 1985, provides instructions for the Fiscal Year 1986 EAS Performance Evaluation Program. After the employee has been evaluated and a performance rating assigned, merit pay increases are determined in accordance with the matrix published herein. Charts 1 and 2 are to be used in applying the matrix for the regular process (EAS-20 and above). For the regular process, lump sums will have to be calculated manually. Chart 3 can be used to determine the appropriate lump sums under the step process.

The dollar amount of any lump sum for either the step or the regular process should be written on the appropriate Form 2451 below line 13, preceded by the words "lump sum." In the step process, if 2 steps are granted by the matrix, they are both effective on the employees anniversary date.—*Employee Relations Dept., 9-12-85.*

To use the chart:

4. Use the designated percentage increase to calculate the merit increase as a percentage of basic salary.
5. All increase percentages are calculated using the employee's basic salary.
6. Basic salary cannot be increased above maximum.

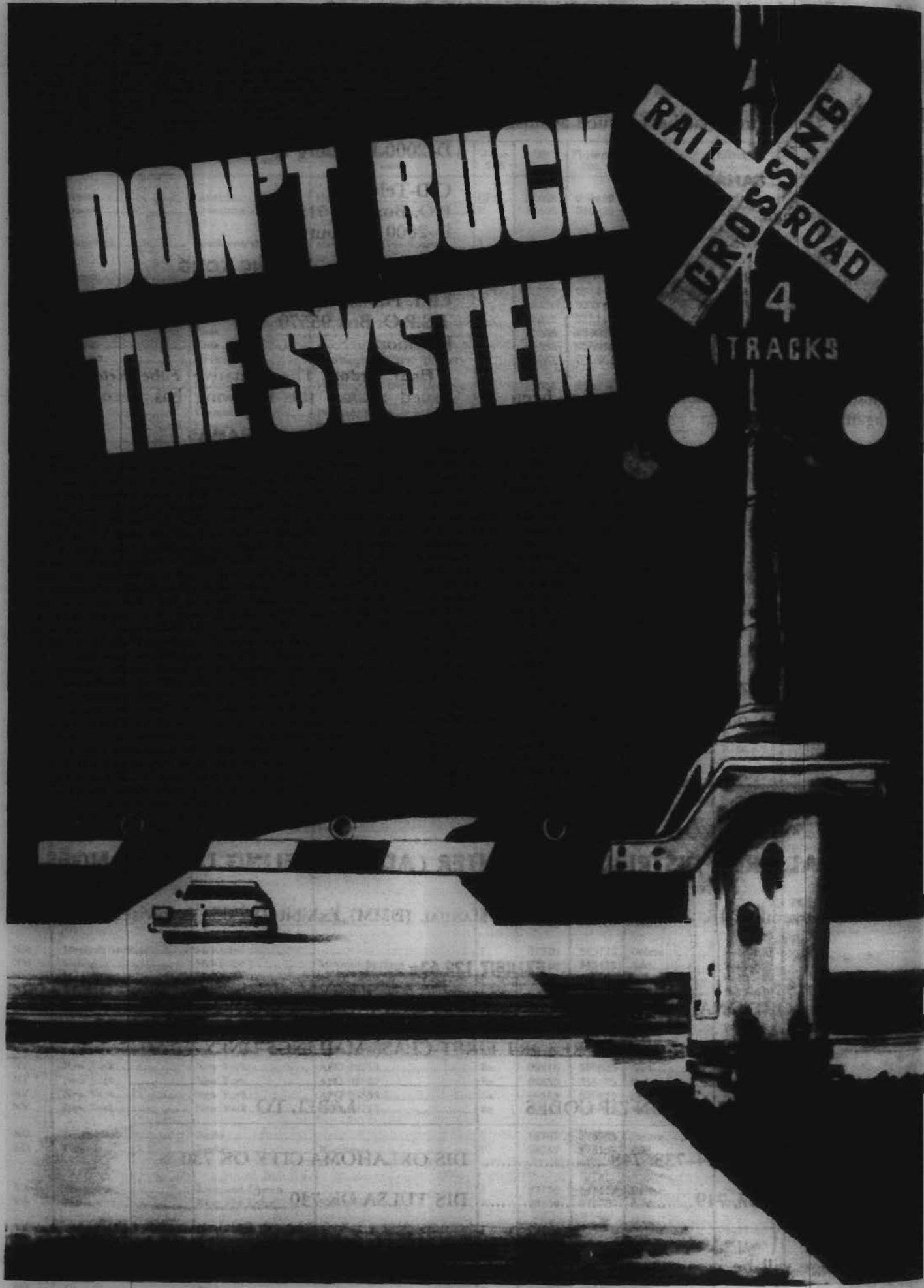
