22-Cent Republic of Texas Commemorative Stamp

The 22-Cent Republic of Texas commemorative postage stamp will be placed on sale March 2, 1986, in San Antonio, TX, and at Washington, TX. This stamp issue commemorates the 150th anniversary of Texas' declaration of independence from Mexico.

This is the 17th stamp to be printed by a private firm under the terms of a contract awarded by the Postal Service on September 8, 1983, and the 24th printed by that firm since 1979.

Supply. All post offices will receive their standard automatic distribution quantities for a 50-subject commemorative stamp. *Supplemental requisitions will not be honored at the Bureau of Engraving and Printing for item 403.*

Stamp distribution offices requiring additional stamps may order them from their Regional Accountable Paper Depositories using separate Forms 17A, *Accountable Items Requisition from Stamp Distribution Office*. Limited quantities of this stamp will be shipped to Regional Accountable Paper Depositories for filling supplemental orders. All other post offices requiring additional stamps should immediately requisition them from their stamp distribution offices on separate Forms 17A.

Before requisitioning additional stock, consider that the stock should be depleted prior to May 2, 1986, at all post office outlets except authorized philatelic centers.

Dual Civil Service Retirement/Social Security Coverage for Former Employees Reemployed After Receiving OWCP Benefits

This article supplements information contained on page 3 of POSTAL BULLETIN 21481 dated 10-18-84, *Dual Civil Service Retirement/Social Security Coverage For New Employees*. Information provided in this notice and in the above referenced bulletin should be retained until further notice.

Paragraph 1B2c of the 10-18-84 POSTAL BULLETIN notice states that persons reemployed under the Rehabilitation Program who retain Civil Service Retirement (CSR) annuitant status are excluded from full Social Security coverage. The following revises this paragraph to read:

a. Former employees receiving compensation from the Office of Workers' Compensation (OWCP) who are reemployed to career positions will be covered by the same retirement system they were under at time of transfer to OWCP rolls. In these situations, continuous receipt of compensation from OWCP is not considered a separation from postal employment, but rather a leave of absence.

DMM Revision

Second-Class Publications of Institutions and Societies

Recent customer inquiries have shown the need for clarification of DOMESTIC MAIL MANUAL (DMM) 422.32 concerning those publications issued by institutions and societies which carry general advertising, the circulation of which is limited mainly to members who pay for their subscriptions through membership dues.

The present language in DMM 422.32c is being interpreted by some as requiring members of an organization to pay not less than 50 percent of the price paid by nonmembers for their subscriptions. The actual intent of this regulation is that organization members will pay not less than 50 percent of the regular subscription price. It is not unusual for publications issued by institutions and societies to have more than one subscription price. For example, there may be a regular subscription price established for members and a different price (generally higher) for nonmembers. The subscription prices established by the publisher for members and nonmembers are not required to be within 50 percent of each other.

Effective immediately, DMM 422.32 is revised as follows:

c. The circulation must be limited to copies mailed to members who pay either as a part of their dues or assessments, or otherwise, not less than 50 percent of the subscription price regularly charged to other members; to other actual subscribers; to exchanges; and to 10 percent of such circulation as sample copies.

d. When members pay for their subscriptions as a part of their dues or assessments, individual subscriptions or receipts are not required.

These changes will be incorporated into a future revision of the DMM.

ZIP + 4 Mailings

A proposed rule, which was published in the January 23, 1986, issue of the *Federal Register*, provides for optional preparation procedures for combined ZIP + 4 Presort First-Class Mail. The proposed rule may be of interest to many First-Class Presort mailers and is expected to be the subject of questions posed to customer service representatives, postmasters and other postal employees. Generally, the proposal calls for elimination of the 5-digit presortation level for combined Presort mailings meeting three basic requirements beyond those applicable to combined Presort mailings today. First, eligible mailings would consist exclusively of mail destined for addresses served by postal automation (defined by 3-digit ZIP Code prefixes). Second, mailings would have to meet or exceed a minimum ZIP + 4 addressing level of 85 percent. Third, all pieces in eligible mailings would have to meet machinability and OCR-readability requirements currently applicable only to ZIP + 4 discount-eligible pieces.

The change would be effected through changes in the DOMESTIC MAIL MANUAL (DMM). Specifically, a new section 366 would be added and titled "Preparation Requirements for Optional Combined ZIP + 4 Presort and Presort First-Class Mailings (Destinating at Automated Sites)." A list of the authorized 3-digit destinations would be included in the DMM as Exhibit 122.63m, and only pieces mailed to those destinations could qualify for mailing under the provisions of 366. At least 85 percent of the pieces in the mailing would have to bear a correct ZIP + 4 code, with a minimum of 500 ZIP + 4 pieces per mailing. Pieces which are part of a group of at least 50 pieces for the same 3-digit area that are physically separated could qualify for the Presort rate. The mailings would have to meet the requirements of 324.3, 324.4, 324.5, 324.61, 365.33, and 365.34, and only 3-digit, SCF and ADC trays would be permitted for the presorted portion of the mailings. Mailings which are presented under the provisions of DMM 365 would not be affected by the 85 percent ZIP + 4 coding requirements and would continue to be presorted to 5-digit and 3-digit separations.

NEW CHANGE OF ADDRESS KITS

Effective February 8, 1986, the Postal Service will be changing its Change of Address program. A new distribution system and change of address kit will be utilized and a test of prepaid change of address cards will be made.

Customers are requested to advise their local post office when they are moving by filing Form 3575, *Change of Address Order*. Notice 8A (February 1984), *Change of Address Kit*, was available at any post office or from any letter carrier to notify the customer's correspondents of the change of address. Almost all customers who received Notice 8A (February 1984) used it. However, a very small portion of customers who moved actually received Notice 8A.

In order to provide better service by ensuring that virtually all customers who move receive Notice 8A, realize the savings of not forwarding mail, the Postal Service has developed a new change of address distribution system and a new change of address kit, Notice 8A (May 1985). Effective February 8, 1985, the new change of address distribution system and Notice 8A (May 1985) will be utilized at all Computerized Forwarding System (CFS) sites. Any remaining stock of the current change of address kit, Notice 8A (February 1984) must *not* be used after February 8, 1986.

The procedures to be followed for the new change of address distribution system are:

1. Forwarding Instructions. The customer must complete Form 3575, *Change of Address Order*, and send it to his local postmaster. Delivery personnel must process Form 3575 or other order or telegram immediately upon receipt and send it to their CFS site.

2. Distribution of Notice 8A (May 1985), Change of Address Kit. Upon receipt of Form 3575 or other order or telegram by the CFS site, Notice 8A will be mailed from the CFS site:

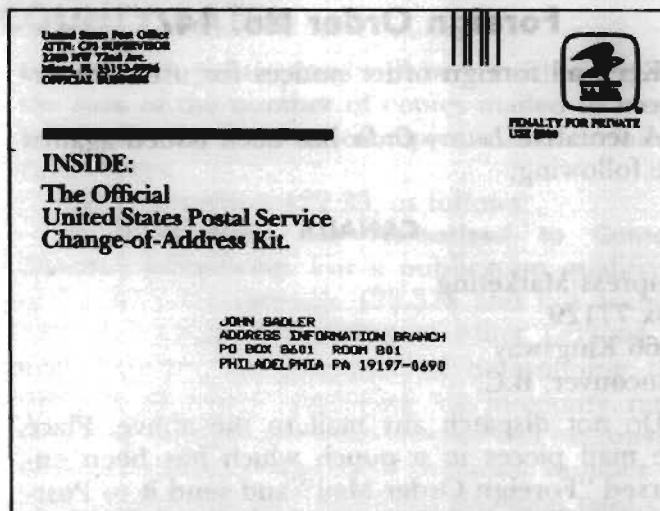
a. to the customer's old address, if the effective date of the change of address is six days or more after receipt; or

b. to the customer's new address, if the effective date of the change of address is five or less days after receipt.

Notice 8A (May 1985) will be mailed in a penalty envelope, addressed with a yellow forwarding label as shown.

The penalty envelope containing Notice 8A (May 1985) must be delivered to the addressee, unless there is no such address. If there is no such address, return the penalty envelope to the originating CFS site. If the address is the customer's new address, hold that penalty envelope until delivery can be made.

3. Contents of Notice 8A (May 1985), Change of Address Kit. Notice 8A (May 1985) contains a brochure which explains to mailers the importance of notifying correspondents of their change of address. The brochure also explains what hap-



pens to mail that is forwarded and what classes of mail require additional postage for forwarding.

Notice 8A (May 1985) also contains nine *Change of Address Cards*, Form 3576, for mailers to directly notify their correspondents of their change of address. Except at five test CFS sites, the customer must apply First-Class postage to Form 3576, *Change of Address Cards*, contained in Notice 8A (May 1985). At the following test CFS sites, Notice 8A (May 1985) will contain nine *Change of Address Cards*. Form 3576, imprinted with the official United States Postal Service change of address indicia:

San Antonio, Texas; Santa Ana, California; Columbus, Ohio; Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania; and Flushing, New York.

The test Form 3576 does not require the customer to apply any postage before mailing. The purpose of the test is to determine if more customers will use Form 3576 if they do not have to apply postage.

Notice 8A (May 1985) also includes a *New Address Verification Card*, Form 3575-A for customers to notify their former post office and CFS site forwarding address is inaccurate. Upon receipt of Form 3575-A, the carrier must amend Form 3982 and submit Form 3575-A to his CFS site. The CFS site will modify the data base as indicated by the customer.

4. Use of Form 3576, Change of Address Card with official United States Postal Service change of address indicia. Form 3576, *Change of Address Card*, can be used only for notification of a change of address. All other uses are prohibited.

5. Supply of Notice 8A (May 1985). Supplies of Notice 8A (May 1985) are available *only* at the CFS sites. Supplies of Notice 8A (May 1985) will *not* be available at post offices or from the carrier.

6. Processing and Delivery of Form 3576, Change of Address Card. Form 3576, *Change of Address Card*, must be processed and delivered in accordance with the service objectives of post and postal cards.—*Delivery Services Dept., 2-6-86.*

T-1 Revision

Philatelic Mail

Effective February 1, 1986, Handbook T-1, *International Airmail Exchange Office Procedures*, Section 283.4, is revised by eliminating the "no accounting" endorsement, to provide that air carriers will be properly reimbursed for transporting U.S. origin first flight covers. The T-1 is revised as follows:

280 Philatelic Mail

* * * * *

283.4 The C-12, AV-7, and tags used in preparing the dispatches are to be distinctly endorsed "philatelic mail" to provide easy identification.

This change will be incorporated into a future revision of Handbook T-1.

Insured Rubber Stamps

Rubber stamp numbered R 104 (*Insured No.*) has been replaced by Form 3813-P, *Receipt for Insured Mail Domestic-International*. Double oval rubber stamp number 0681, which was previously used for canceling registered mail is outdated and has been replaced by the Rubber All-Purpose Dating Stamp, item number 570 in the Supply Catalog.

The Eastern and Western Area Supply Centers have been notified to stop issuing these two stamps.—*Rates & Classification Dept., 2-6-86.*

F-1 Revision

Cashing of Treasury Checks

In order to clarify the identification requirements for the cashing of Treasury checks, Part 335 of Handbook F-1, *Financial Handbook for Post Offices*, is revised as follows:

335 U.S. Treasury Checks

335.1 Cashing

.11 Treasury checks, including USPS salary checks, may be cashed provided sufficient funds are available. Postmasters are not authorized to withhold, for the purpose of cashing Treasury checks, funds that should be deposited.

.12 Treasury checks must not be cashed for anyone but the payee named on the face of the check. Checks must be endorsed by the payee in the presence of the employee cashing the check.

.13 Do not cash Treasury checks payable to two persons jointly unless both are known or present proper identification. Both persons must endorse the check in the presence of the postmaster or employee cashing the check.

335.2 Identification

.21 When the payee is known, by name, to a postal employee on duty in the unit, the employee making the identification should so note on the back of the check and sign.

.22 If the payee is unknown, two forms of identification as described in 332.622 must be presented.

.23 Compare the signatures on the check and the identification. If the signatures do not match, do not cash the check. On the back of the check write (1) serial number and full description of each identification, (2) street address including the city, state, and ZIP Code, and (3) telephone number.

This revision will be included in a future update of F-1.—*Dept. of the Controller, 2-6-86.*

If the address on your mailing label of *Postal Life* or *Postal Leader* is incorrect, complete Form 1216, *Employee's Current Mailing Address*. This form is available from your Personnel Office. Return the completed form to your Personnel Office for processing. No other form can be used for this purpose.

DMM Revision

SECOND-CLASS IN-COUNTY RATES

Effective February 16, 1986, copies of second-class publications must meet new criteria to qualify for mailing at the in-county rates. Those criteria were published in POSTAL BULLETIN 21549, 1-16-86. Additional regulation changes are necessary for DOMESTIC MAIL MANUAL (DMM) 422.3 and 422.4 to ensure that certain publications which do not maintain a list of paid subscribers may continue to qualify for the in-county rates if they comply with the new criteria. The DMM is revised as follows:

Chapter 4—Second-Class Mail

411.3 Preferred Rates

.32 In-County Rates

* * * * *

.321 General Application

Add the following to the end of this section.

Note.—Publications authorized second-class mailing privileges under the provisions of 422.3 and 422.4 must comply with the circulation requirements of this section. See 422.32c, 422.33 and 422.4c.

.32 Provisions for General Advertising

At the end of 422.32c, add the following:

For the exclusive purpose of determining the number of copies of an issue qualifying for in-county rates under 411.32, the total paid circula-

tion of such publications will be considered to be the sum of the number of copies mailed to members, plus the number of copies mailed to other subscribers.

Add new section 422.33, as follows:

.33 Publications not Authorized to Contain General Advertising. For a publication qualifying under 422.31a through 422.31k and not authorized to contain advertising of other persons or organizations, for purposes of determining the number of copies qualifying for in-county rates under 411.32, all circulated copies will be considered subscriber copies and the total number of such copies will be considered the total paid circulation.

Add new section 422.4c, as follows:

c. For purposes of determining the number of copies qualifying for in-county rates under 411.32, all circulated copies will be considered subscriber copies and the total number of such copies will be considered the total paid circulation.

POM Revision

Postmarking

Effective immediately, POSTAL OPERATIONS MANUAL (POM) 423.32 is revised to delete the references on postmarking transient rate second-class mail and the address side of registered mail. Delete the following in POM 423.32:

1. The words “(except registered mail),” in the first sentence.

2. The words “and transient rate second-class,” in the second line of the description.

These changes will be incorporated into a future revision of the POM.

Note: The first 6 digits of a 9-digit Custom Designed Service and Next Day Pickup Service Agreement make up the Corporate Account Number.

Republic of Texas Commemorative Stamp

A 22-Cent commemorative stamp honoring the sesquicentennial of the Republic of Texas will be issued both in San Antonio and at Washington-on-the-Brazos State Historical Park on March 2. On that date 150 years ago, Texas declared its independence from Mexico.

The San Antonio dedication ceremony will be held outside the Postal Service's Downtown Station, the city's original Main Post Office. It is just north of the Alamo, the mission-fortress which is the symbol of Texas' historic struggle for freedom in 1836. Washington-on-the-Brazos is the site of the signing of Texas' Declaration of Independence from Mexico.

Don Adair of Richardson, Texas, designed the stamp, which features the central portion of the state flag. The white Lone Star on a blue field is at top left, with the flag's broad red and white bands angled downward to the right. In silver, near the center of the stamp, is a spur believed to have belonged to defeated Mexican General Santa Anna. It was given to Sam Houston, Texas' victorious commander and first president of the Republic.

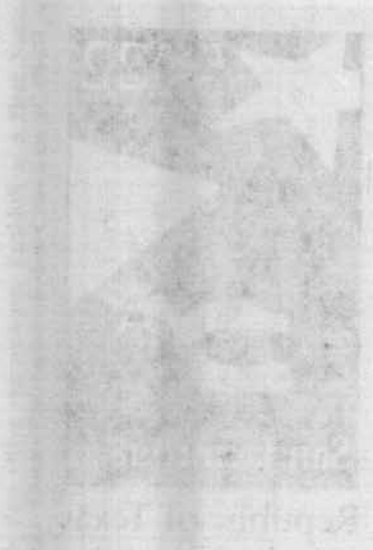

The cost is 25 cents for each stamp requested. Personal checks will be accepted for orders up to the limit of 50 covers. Do not send cash.

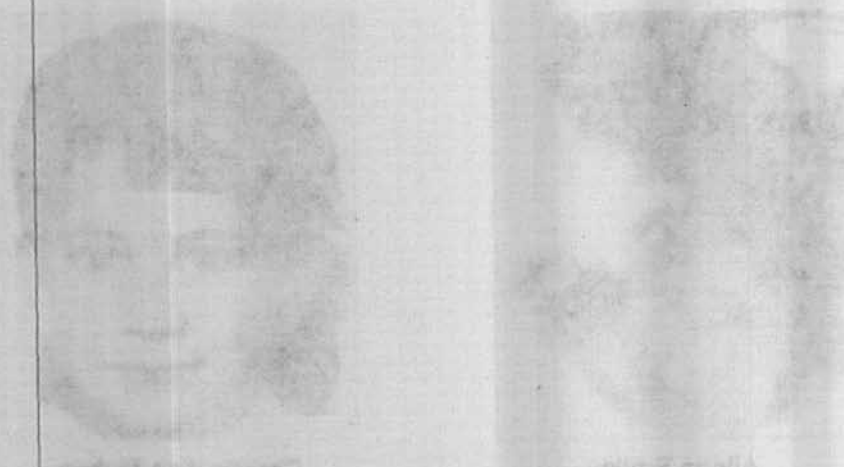
