The 22-Cent Public Hospitals commemorative postage stamp will be placed on sale April 11, 1986, in New York, NY. The dedication ceremony will be held at the Bellevue Hospital Center, which is celebrating its 250th anniversary.

This is the 18th stamp to be printed by a private firm under the terms of a contract awarded by the Postal Service on September 8, 1983, and the 25th printed by that firm since 1979.

Stamp distribution offices requiring additional stamps may order them from their Regional Accountable Paper Depositories using separate Forms 17A, Accountable Items Requisition from Stamp Distribution Office. Limited quantities of this stamp will be shipped to Regional Accountable Paper Depositories for filling supplemental orders. All other post offices requiring additional stamps should immediately requisition them from their stamp distribution offices on separate Forms 17A.

Before requisitioning additional stock, consider that the stock should be depleted prior to June 11, 1986, at all post office outlets except authorized philatelic centers.

Offices requiring postmarking dies and engraved station die hubs must complete Form 4636, Requisition for Postmarking Dies and Engraved Station Die Hubs, and forward, along with a properly endorsed Form 7381, Requisition for Supplies Services or Equipment, and a preaddressed, postage-free mailing label to the appropriate Procurement Services Office. Do not order from the area supply centers.

The Eastern Area Supply Center has awarded an indefinite quantity type contract (337100-86-V-Z605) to International Peripheral Systems for engraved ring dies for Model M, HD-2, and Flyer Model F cancelling machines.

A contract has also been awarded for engraved ring dies for Mark II and M-36 facer/cancellers.

He became most famous for his oratorical ability during a two-year campaign to garner support for free coinage of silver and gain control of the Democratic Convention of 1896.

Supply. An automatic distribution will be made to post offices with authorized philatelic centers only. Refer to Postal Bulletin dated February 27, 1986, for automatic quantities being shipped. Those post offices should requisition additional stamps for their regular window transactions. All other post offices are encouraged to order sufficient quantities to meet philatelic demand. Unfilled orders currently at the Bureau of Engraving and Printing for item 092 will be filled with the \$2.00 Bryan stamp.

Bulk Quantities. Post offices with 950 or more revenue units requiring 50,000 or more stamps should immediately submit Form 3356, Stamp Requisition—Bulk Quantities, to the Bureau of Engraving and Printing, using item number 093. Requisitions must be submitted in the standard ordering quantities for a 100-subject stamp to the maximum of 2.5 million stamps per requisition.

Less-Than-Bulk Quantities. All other post offices requiring these stamps should requisition them immediately from their designated stamp distribution offices on separate Forms 17A, Accountable Items Requisition from Stamp Distribution Office.

PURCHASE OF ITEMS BEARING POSTAL SERVICE LOGOS

Questions are being asked about the need for a Postal Service license when a supplier is providing articles bearing the official USPS logo only to the Postal Service for official use, such as in a safety or incentive award program. See Postal Bulletin 21477, 9-20-84, on Purchase of Items Bearing USPS Logo.

The following should clarify the policy and procedures applicable to the purchase of any item bearing the Postal Service logo, as well as any other Postal Service trademarks or service marks.

When the Postal Service itself initiates the purchase of any item that will have the official logo or any other Postal Service trademark or service mark imprinted on it, and the item is not being offered for sale by the prospective contractor, the prospective contractor is not required to obtain a license. Authorization for such use must be provided on the USPS purchase order Form 7334, Order Invoice Voucher, or contract Form 7333, Solicitation, Offer, and Award, used to purchase the articles. The purchase order or contract should also contain a cautionary provision advising the contractor that the logo or other USPS trademark or service mark may not be used or reproduced for any purpose other than that stated in the contract, except by an express license from the Postal Service.

On the other hand, if a person or a company is soliciting orders from the Postal Service or the general public for products containing our official logo or other Postal Service trademarks or service marks, they must have a license from the Postal Service. This procedure ensures that the seller will be offering a product upon which the Postal

Service deems it appropriate to have its marks appear and that the particular trademark or service mark will be accurately reproduced. All requests for license agreements are considered by the Intellectual Property Rights Board, Washington, DC 20260-6234.

Reproduction of the USPS logo shall not be authorized on articles of clothing other than those which are part of the USPS official uniform.

Postal personnel must ensure that the logo is used correctly. There are now two versions of the logo which are commonly used. One is the Postal Service seal, in which the eagle atop the double bars enclosing the words "U.S. Mail," is surrounded by the name "United States Postal Service" and nine stars. The alternate version has the eagle and double bars surrounded by a solid border of one or two lines. Neither the logo nor any portion of it (such as the eagle alone or in association with the double bars) should be altered or integrated into other designs. Further, use of either version of the logo should always be accompanied by the registration symbol, the encircled R (which shows that the mark is registered with the United States Patent and Trademark Office).

Information regarding licensing or licensees may be obtained from Charles Crim at the Head-quarters Office of Procurement (PEN 268-4151). Specific questions concerning the proper use of the logo and our other trademarks should be addressed to the USPS Patent Counsel, Office of Contracts and Property Law, Washington, DC 20260-1120 (PEN 268-3018).

TRAINING AND FLSA COMPLIANCE

The purpose of this article is to emphasize postal policy to assure compliance with the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) in the area of jobrelated training, especially as such policy relates to scheme study.

Compliance with FLSA requires the following:

- 1. All scheme training materials are to be controlled by the PEDC Manager.
- 2. Trainees may not remove any scheme training materials from postal premises under any conditions.
- 3. All copies of the reference schemes used or maintained on the workroom floor must bear the following notice: "This scheme is furnished as an aid in distributing mail and is not to be used by postal employees off-the-clock for any purpose, including home study."
- 4. All scheme training must be accomplished on postal premises.

5. Lists of scheme changes are not to be furnished to individual employees, nor are employees to be directed, encouraged, suffered or permitted to study scheme change items off-the-clock.

6. Employees will not be permitted access to scheme training materials off-the-clock. The only exceptions are senior bidders voluntarily bidding for a preferred duty assignment and PTF clerks exercising a preference.

7. Under no circumstance are employees allowed supplemental training for any sorting machine or

manual scheme training programs.

While the above listed items address scheme and machine training specifically, all job-related training for FLSA non-exempt employees falls within these restrictions.

Management personnel must assure that all employees conducting training programs are knowledgeable of and comply with FLSA policies.—Employee Relations Dept., 3-6-86.

MIGRATORY BIRD STAMP DISPOSITION

Postmasters are reminded that all unsold bird stamps should be recalled to the main stock as specified in Handbook F-1, Financial Handbook for Post Offices, Part 557. The amount recorded in AIC 806, Ending Inventory—Bird Stamps, on the statement of account submitted as of the close of the second quarter (A/P 06) Fiscal Year 1986, must accurately reflect the value of bird stamps on hand in the post office. Except for post offices having established philatelic outlets, the only bird stamps that should be on hand in post offices are the current 1985–1986 series which sell for \$7.50.

Unsold migratory bird stamps are destroyed

during the third quarter as instructed in Part 553 of Handbook F-1. Management sectional centers must establish a schedule for returning properly certified Forms 3238, Destruction Certificate, to post offices for inclusion with the statements of account for the period ending June 6, 1986.

Those offices designated as philatelic outlets are the only offices which should have an entry in AIC 806 on the statement of account for the period ending June 6, 1986. These bird stamps will be listed by year of issue and face value in the remarks section of the statement of account.

William Jennings Bryan Regular Stamp

A \$2.00 Great Americans Series stamp depicting famed orator and legislator William Jennings Bryan will be issued on March 19 in his birthplace, Salem, Illinois.

The stamp, featuring a portrait of Bryan, will not be available at all post offices, but may be purchased at all authorized philatelic centers and by mail from the Philatelic Sales Division beginning March 20.

William Jennings Bryan was one of America's most popular orators, with a remarkable ability to articulate the hopes and aspirations of his constituents. Mary Baird Bryan, whom he married in 1894, wrote, "Each year when he returned from his tours he had not only spoken to, but had listened to, the mind of America."

He began his career by practicing law after graduating from Illinois College in 1881. Bryan moved to Lincoln, Nebraska, where in 1890 he was elected to two terms in the House of Representatives. In 1894, he was defeated in his bid for a seat in the U.S. Senate.

Noted for his stance against the influence of wealth in politics, Bryan favored a silver monetary standard supported by agrarian interests, contrary to the gold standard fostered by the well-to-do industrialists. His famous "Cross of Gold" speech, made at the 1896 Democratic Convention, won him the Democratic presidential nomination. Bryan declared that "toilers everywhere will answer the demand for a gold standard by saying: You shall not press down upon the

brow of labor this crown of thorns, you shall not crucify mankind upon a cross of gold."

Bryan lost the presidential race to Republican candidates William McKinley in 1896 and 1900, and William Howard Taft in 1908. However, he remained a major influence in the Democratic Party, helping Woodrow Wilson win the Party's presidential nomination in 1912. Bryan served as Secretary of State under Wilson from March 4, 1913, to June 9, 1915, using his political clout to help pass the "New Freedom" reforms through Congress.

Bryan died on July 26, 1925, in Dayton, Tennessee.

The Postal Service will affix stamps when requested to do so. Mail orders by April 18 to William Jennings Bryan Stamp, Postmaster, Salem, IL 62881-9992. The cost is \$2.00 for each envelope submitted. Personal checks in the exact amount will be accepted for orders up to the limit of 50 covers. Do not send cash. Postage

stamps are unacceptable as payment.

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Requisitioning of Supplies From the **Western Area Supply Center**

With the view toward improving supply support, the present cyclic ordering procedure for obtaining supplies is waived.

Beginning March 3, 1986, all postal installations served by the Western Area Supply Center are authorized to order their supplies on an asneeded basis and disregard the cyclic requisitioning schedule.

A like ordering procedure was initiated at the Eastern Area Supply Center in July 1985. The procedure is to continue.

The need for offices to maintain a large inventory of supplies will no longer be necessary with this new ordering procedure. The turnaround time from supply center receipt of orders to delivery is about 15 days. Accordingly, offices should maintain no more than a 1-month level of supplies.

A survey form will be shipped with each supply order. Postal installations are to complete and return the form promptly.

1. Item 0814A, with tensioning lever, used on lead/cord seals, Item 0815. Cost: \$32.25 each.


2. Item 0814B, plier type, used on tin band seals, Items 0816A and B. Cost: \$22.50 each.

meter seals. Cost: \$21.75 each.

Offices authorized to use these items may forward requests through their Procurement Services Offices on Form 7381, Requisition for Supplies, Services or Equipment. A preaddressed Permit Label 41V must be attached securely to each requisition. Lettering instructions for up to 14 characters, figures, and letters (7 on top die and 7 on bottom die) should be specified for Items 0814A and B (e.g., US MAIL/AMF LACA). Item 0814C lettering is limited to four letters, figures, or characters on the bottom die only. The top die is always engraved "USPS."
