Accountbooks and Statements of Account for PFY 1987

Field divisions and management sectional centers (MSCs) will be responsible for ordering PFY 1987 Accountbooks and Statements of Account for their associate offices. Each field division/ MSC is to order enough forms from their area supply center to meet the needs of their associate offices.

An Accountbook consists of either Forms 1551 A-E (CAG A-I) or Forms 1552 A-F (CAG K&L) banded or shrink wrapped as a set. Forms 1553, Statement of Account (CAG K&L), and Forms 1554, Statement of Account (CAG H&J), are banded or shrink wrapped in sets of 20 forms. Forms 1555, Statement of Account (CAG A-G), are in sets of 60 forms.

Field divisions/MSCs are to order these forms from their area supply center as follows:

1. All orders must be received by the supply

centers no later than August 8, 1986;

2. Complete a Form 7380, Supply Center Requisition, for your forms requirements only. Do not include any other orders on this requisition;

3. Order form quantities by number of sets, not

by total number of individual forms;

- 4. Total the number of offices in CAGs A-J and order one set of Forms 1551 A-E for each office:
- 5. Total the number of offices in CAGs K&L and order one set of Forms 1552 A-F for each
- 6. Total the number of offices in CAGs K&L and order one set (20 forms) of Forms 1553 for each office;
- 7. Total the number of offices in CAGs H&I and order one set (20 forms) of Forms 1554 for each office:
- 8. Total the number of offices in CAGs A-G and order one set (60 forms) of Forms 1555 for each office; and

9. Mark on the outside of the order envelope "Special Distribution of Accounting Forms".

Do not order more forms than needed. Supply centers will round quantities to the next full carton. This should provide a safe cushion of extra forms.

If you have extra forms, provide the region with the number of extra forms in case other offices are in short supply. If you are short of forms, request additional quantities through your region.—Dept. of the Controller, 7-31-86.

For Adak, Alaska—when Government quarters are not utilized, and quarters are obtained at the Simone Construction, Inc. camp, a daily travel per diem allowance of \$71.50 is prescribed to cover the cost of lodging, meals and expenses at this facility.

Make a pen and ink revision in your current DOMESTIC MAIL MANUAL (DMM) 123.563 changing Postal Inspector-in-Charge to Regional Chief Inspector as shown below.

Effective immediately, the DMM is revised as follows:

123 Nonmailable Matter—Written, Printed and Graphic

123.5 Sexually Oriented Advertisements

.563 A person who wishes to report that he has received an unsolicited sexually oriented advertisement after his name and address have been on the List for more than 30 days should submit the entire mail piece, including the envelope or other wrapper, to any postmaster. The mail piece must have been opened by the addressee. When submitting the mail piece, the addressee must endorse the envelope or other wrapper and also the contents thereof in substance as follows: "I received this mail piece on (date)", and sign the statement. He should also state the identifying number appearing on his application if it is known to him (see 123,521). The postmaster of the installation to which the mail piece is submitted shall send it without delay to the Regional Chief Inspector who has geographical jurisdiction over the address of the mailer.

This change will be included in a future issue of the DMM.—Inspection Service, 7-31-86.

Dog Sled Regular Stamp

An Alaskan dog sled will be the subject of a 17-cent coil stamp to be issued August 20 in Anchorage, Alaska. The denomination represents the rate for the second ounce of First-Class Mail, and the stamp will replace the 17-cent Electric Auto coil stamp issued in 1982.

Initially, the Dog Sled stamp will be produced only in coils of 100, since adequate supplies of the Electric Auto stamp remain in coils of 500 and 3,000. When those supplies are depleted, the Dog Sled stamp will be issued in coils of 500 and 3,000 as well. There will be no precanceled version.

The stamp's design was prepared in pen and ink and features a frontal view of a sled shown without reins or traces. It is probable that the earliest types of sleds were used in the Middle East to haul materials over bare ground. Today, they are still found in many parts of the world where snow-covered terrain limits other forms of transportation.

In North America, they were first used by the Eskimos, who fashioned wood, bone and rawhide into sleds that were both lightweight and durable. Because of their loyalty and strength, dogs are most often used to haul sleds over snow. Pulled by a team of Alaskan huskies, dog sleds can transport up to 1,000 pounds across hundreds of miles of glacial terrain.

Over the years, dog sleds have been put to a large number of uses, including mail delivery. And as a sport, dog sledding continues to grow in popularity, as events like the 1,049-mile Iditarod Sled Dog Trail Race provide drivers with a

unique opportunity to test their skills and the endurance of their teams in fierce competition with both opponents and environment.

Procedures for ordering first day cancellations are as follows:

Customers affixing stamps: Customers are encouraged to purchase the Dog Sled stamps and affix them to their envelopes. Covers bearing customer-affixed stamps will be given preferential service. The Dog Sled stamp may be purchased at all authorized philatelic centers. However, it may not be available at many post offices without dedicated philatelic outlets.

At least five cents additional postage must be affixed to meet the First-Class letter rate. Uncanceled stamps issued prior to August 25 may be used for that purpose. Envelopes should be addressed on the right side at least % of an inch from the bottom, and stamps should be affixed in the upper right corner approximately ¼ inch from the top and right edges. Requests must be postmarked by September 19 and addressed to CUSTOMER-AFFIXED ENVELOPES, DOG SLED STAMP, POSTMASTER, ANCHORAGE, AK 99502-9991. No remittance is required.

Postal Service affixing stamps: Except for affixing stamps and addressing orders, follow the procedures above. The Postal Service will use one Dog Sled stamp with one five-cent Motorcycle stamp to meet the First-Class rate. Personal checks in the exact amount will be accepted up to the limit of 50 covers. Orders should be postmarked by September 19 and addressed to DOG SLED STAMP, POSTMASTER, ANCHORAGE, AK 99502-9992.

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FOURTH-CLASS MAIL ENDORSED "ADDRESS CORRECTION REQUESTED"

Large mailers have informed the Postal Service that fourth-class catalogs endorsed "Address Correction Requested" are sometimes mishandled when they are undeliverable as addressed. Mail forwarding and delivery employees should be familiar with the fourth-class forwarding regulations in DOMESTIC MAIL MANUAL Exhibit 159.151f, as revised in Postal Bulletin 21549, p. 10, January 16, 1986. That exhibit is reprinted below.




