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25-Cent Carousel Animals Commemorative Stamps

A block of four 25-cent Carousel Animals commemorative stamps go on sale October 1 in Sandusky, Ohio. The four designs depict hand-carved carousels that feature the most sought after carousel animal, the lead or king horse, in addition to a long-horned goat, a bejeweled camel, and a graceful deer.

Do Not Place On Sale Before October 2, 1988



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Issued in panes of 50.

Collector information is on page 9.

Supply: All post offices will receive a double-the-standard automatic distribution quantity based on a 50-subject commemorative stamp.

Bulk Quantities: Since the total quantity of this stamp will be distributed automatically, the Bureau of Engraving and Printing will not honor supplemental requisitions for Item 450.

Limited quantities of this stamp will be shipped to Regional Accountable Paper Depositories (RAPDs) for filling supplemental orders. Stamp distribution offices requiring additional stamps may order them from their RAPDs using separate Forms 17-A, *Accountable Items Requisition From Stamp Distribution Office*. All other post offices requiring additional stamps should immediately requisition them from their stamp distribution offices on a separate Form 17-A.

Before requisitioning additional stock, post offices should consider that they must deplete the stock before December 2, 1988, except authorized philatelic centers.

Emergency Supply Requests

The area supply centers (now materiel distribution centers) are receiving an increasing number of emergency telephone orders for supplies. An in-depth review of these orders indicates that many installations could have routinely requisitioned them on Form 7380, *Supply Center Requisition*.

Due to the high cost of filling emergency phone orders, the supply centers request all installations to ensure that they only place orders needed in a true emergency by telephone.

Field Legal Divisions

Effective July 11, 1988, the Law Department adjusted the organization of its field legal offices to create one law division at each of the five regional headquarters locations, headed administratively by one attorney with the new title of Chief Field Counsel. The titles formerly used in the field—Regional Counsel or Regional Labor Counsel—to denote the supervisors of the separate field law divisions have been discontinued.

Accordingly, in postal regulations, manuals, handbooks, circulars, instructions, etc., where reference is made to Regional Counsel or Regional Labor Counsel, the title Chief Field Counsel should be substituted.—Law Dept., 8-25-88.

1988/1989 Leave Years

The 1988 leave year ends January 13, 1989. The 1989 leave year begins on January 14, 1989, and ends on January 12, 1990. The maximum amount of annual leave that employees may carry over from the 1988 leave year into the 1989 leave year by pay schedule follows.

Installations should publicize the information immediately to give employees the opportunity to use their annual leave between now and the end of the leave year (January 13, 1989). Employees will forfeit annual leave in excess of applicable carry-over maximums.

Pursuant to Public Law 102, employees with larger amounts of accumulated annual leave to their credit than indicated above on January 1, 1953, and who have maintained such larger amounts, may carry up to the larger amounts from the 1988 leave year into the 1989 leave year.

Retirement Application Processing

The Office of Personnel Management (OPM) is responsible for final processing of applications for retirement benefits and authorizing and issuing checks to retired employees. Inaccurate or incomplete retirement records from employing agencies extend the time it takes OPM to process a retirement claim.

The Postal Service recognizes that when an employee retires, any delay in receiving the regular annuity check could result in inconvenience or personal hardship to the employee. Consequently, every effort must be made to process correct, completely documented retirement records to OPM as quickly as possible.

A retiring employee can greatly assist in this effort by filing the retirement application at least 6 weeks before the effective retirement date.

Installation heads must post the notice on page 16 on all bulletin boards on a permanent basis. Individuals involved in retirement counseling and retirement processing should encourage employees considering retirement to file their retirement applications early.—*Employee Relations Dept., 8-25-88.*

Special Cancellations

Postmasters who have any of the special cancellation die hubs listed below are authorized to use them for the periods designated. At the end of the period, they should withdraw the die hubs from use and store them. Postmasters who do not have these special die hubs must not request them without application by the sponsors.

DMM Notice

Postage Due Mail: Retention

Effective with DOMESTIC MAIL MANUAL (DMM) Issue 29, 12-18-88, section 159.326(f) is revised to clarify the regulations concerning postage due mail. The post office retains postage due mail for 10 days, and, if no one claims it within that time-frame, it returns the mail to the sender. This same retention and return policy applies to postage due mail addressed to a post office box.

To clarify this policy, DOMESTIC MAIL MANUAL (DMM) 159.326(f) is revised to include postage due mail in the list of exceptions to the regulation that mail addressed and deliverable to a post office box will not be returned until the box is declared vacant.—*Rates and Classification Dept., 8-25-88.*

Clarification

Rural Carrier Route Numbers

The article, Rural Carrier Route Numbers, in POSTAL BULLETIN 21685, 8-11-88 (page 12), needs the following clarification.

The change in rural route number coding from a two- to a three-digit field is for pay administrative purposes only. No plan currently exists to alter the carrier route identification field in the Carrier Route Information System (CRIS) and the ZIP + 4 information provided to the mailers.

INTERNATIONAL TRANSIT TIME STUDY

The Declaration of Hamburg, adopted by the Hamburg Congress of the Universal Postal Union (UPU), includes a U.S.-sponsored resolution intended to improve mail service between members of the UPU. This resolution has led to a series of periodic international mail transit time surveys between selected countries. The United States, Mexico, Brazil, Argentina, and Ireland will conduct a survey from August 29 to September 10, 1988.

Each day of the survey, the opening unit at Kennedy International Airport Air Mail Facility (AMF), Miami General Mail Facility (GMF), and Los Angeles International AMF will randomly select six pieces of air LC (letters), six pieces of AO (flats), and six pieces of air CP (parcels) from these countries. The unit will complete the exchange office portion of a transit time card (see Exhibit 1 below)

and attach it to each piece of mail, mark the front of each piece with a large X, and return all pieces to the mail stream.

When a delivery unit receives one of these mailpieces, it must:


1. Remove the transit time card and complete two blocks in the delivery portion: date of arrival of the item and date of presentation for delivery or advice to the addressee for collection (see Exhibit 1). Do not complete date of arrival of the dispatch note (CP-2).
2. Mail the card, which is preaddressed to the UPU. It requires no postage because it is official USPS mail (see Exhibit 2 below).

EXPRESS MAIL MILITARY SERVICE

Analysis of both inbound and outbound Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) dispatches indicates that a serious problem exists in meeting expected performance standards because of inconsistent tagging and labeling practices of both the acceptance and dispatching offices. To correct these deficiencies, the following labeling and tagging guidelines are provided. All supervisors responsible for the acceptance and dispatch of EMMS items must review these procedures and ensure that all employees are thoroughly familiar with the procedures when processing EMMS items.

Domestic Label for Massing EMMS

If the USPS acceptance office does not make five-digit direct EMMS sacks or a Collector Sack for an APO/FPO, the pouch label should be prepared as follows:

DIS MASSING POINT (State Abbreviation—ZIP Code)

EMMS—MIXED

ORIGIN OFFICE AND ZIP CODE

The EMMS sack going to a domestic massing point must have a EMMS Tag 1 attached to the domestic Express Mail service sack to ensure that the dispatching offices handle the EMMS separately from domestic Express Mail service shipments (see page 5).

EMMS Direct Sacks

As a minimum, sectional center facilities (SCF) must make up individual five-digit direct sacks to each APO/FPO before dispatching to the air mail facility (AMF)/EMMS gateway exchange office. They must enclose all sackable mail in an Express Mail pouch, even if only one article will fit in a pouch or sack because of its size. They must keep outside pieces to the barest minimum. (In some cases, outside pieces are not authorized for entry to certain countries. Consult DOMESTIC MAIL MANUAL (DMM) 125.2 for particulars.)

Those USPS offices making a five-digit direct EMMS sack for an APO/FPO, should prepare the pouch label as follows:

APO SHAPE BE 09055

EMMS—DIRECTS BRU (Overseas air stop code)

ORIGIN OFFICE AND ZIP CODE (Weight of pouch in kilograms)

Also, the dispatching office must attach a Tag 176-B, *Express Mail—Military Service*, to the EMMS sack showing the overseas gateway three-letter alpha air stop code (see page 5).

Note: The air mail facility (AMF)/EMMS gateway exchange office must include the intra/interline routing in the VIA section of Tag 176-B prior to dispatching the EMMS sack.

EMMS Collector Sacks

When time permits, installations should combine individual five-digit direct EMMS pouches in Collector Sacks as shown in the APO/FPO makeup and labeling list on page 21, to minimize airline handling of small skin pouches and to reduce transportation costs. The dispatching office must also attach Tag 176-B to the EMMS sack showing the overseas gateway three-letter alpha air stop code (see page 26).

Note: The air mail facility (AMF)/EMMS gateway exchange office must include the inter/intraline routing in the VIA section of Tag 176-B prior to dispatching the EMMS collector sack. The sack label should be formatted as follows:

AMT ATHENS GR 09253

EMMS—COLLECTOR SACK ATH (Overseas air stop code)

ORIGIN OFFICE AND ZIP CODE (Weight of sack in kilograms)

The labeling instructions on page 26 also lists the individual mailing restriction codes for each APO/FPO. An explanation of these mailing restrictions is in DMM 125.2 and published semiannually in the POSTAL BULLETIN (PB) (see PB21686, 8-18-88, pages 16-22). Page 26 includes a numerical listing of all APO/FPOs currently on the EMMS directory.

Note: APO/FPO offices not listed are not authorized to receive EMMS items.

Military-Prepared EMMS Sacks

When APO/FPOs prepare EMMS dispatches to the United States, they must use the following labeling format:

AMF KENNEDY NY 003

EMMS—(Domestic ZIP Code Span) JFK (Air stop code)

FPO YOKOHAMA JA 98760 (Weight of sack in kilograms)

Also, the military dispatching office must attach a Tag 176-B to each EMMS sack showing the three-letter alpha air stop code. Additionally, the military dispatching office/military mail terminal must show the specific inter/intraline routing in the VIA portion of the tag if mail is not dispatched on a direct flight to its destination.

EXPRESS MAIL MILITARY SERVICE—Continued

EMMS Coordinators

Each region has an international civil and military mail coordinator designated as the regional coordinator for the EMMS program. Any questions regarding transportation, labeling, tagging, and routing of EMMS items should be directed to this coordinator. The coordinators are assigned to the following transportation management service centers (TMSCs):

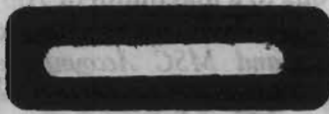

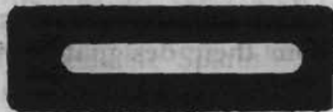

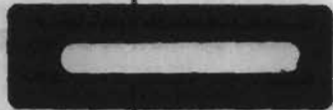

20.5-CENT FIRE ENGINE COIL STAMP

The 20.5-cent Fire Engine precanceled coil stamp goes on sale September 28 in San Angelo, Texas. This denomination meets the single-piece rate for First-Class mailings presorted by the ZIP + 4 Code that became effective April 3, 1988. All other post offices must place this stamp issue on sale September 29.

Do Not Place On Sale Before September 29



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A future issue will include collector information.

Supply: Post offices with authorized philatelic centers will receive an automatic distribution of the precanceled coils of 500. The automatic distribution is based on the Bureau of Engraving and Printing's four-position schedule for a 50-subject commemorative stamp. Accordingly, the quantities of coils to be furnished are in next column.

Bulk Quantities: CAG A-G post offices requiring this precanceled stamp should immediately submit Form 3356, *Stamp Requisition—Bulk Quantities*, to the Bureau of Engraving and Printing. They must

submit orders in the following quantities: coils of 500 (*Item 968*): 200 coils, 400 coils, and multiples of 400 coils to a maximum of 2,000 coils; coils of 3,000 (*Item 969*): 32 coils, 64 coils, and multiples of 64 coils to a maximum of 768 coils.

See section 243, Handbook F-48, *Bulk Requisitioning and MSC Accountable Paper Functions*, for proper procedures when ordering precanceled stamps. The memorandum described in that section must accompany Form 3356.

Note: The 20.5-cent precanceled coil replaces the precanceled 17.5-cent Racing Car coil. Stamp distribution offices (SDOs) must review their AINV Order Quantity Review Report of the precanceled 17.5-cent coils of 500 and 3,000 prior to ordering. SDOs requiring fewer than the above ordering quantities must submit a separate Form 17-A, *Accountable Items Requisition From Stamp Distribution Office*, to their regional accountable paper depository.

Less-Than-Bulk Quantities: All other post offices requiring fewer than the above bulk quantities of this precanceled stamp should requisition them immediately from their designated stamp distribution office on a separate Form 17-A.

Carrier Label Strips

Installations may only requisition PSIN 028, Carrier Label Strips, from area supply centers (now materiel distribution centers) on Form 7380, *Supply Center Requisition*. Since PSIN 028 is a continuous form, effective immediately, the supply centers will only issue this item to management sectional centers (MSCs). Associate offices, in turn, may obtain them from their supporting MSC.

Treasury Department Checks

Offices should deliver Social Security annuity checks on Friday, September 2. The Birmingham, Chicago, Kansas City, Philadelphia, and San Francisco Regional Finance Centers will release the checks to the Postal Service. The envelopes will bear the legend:

Postmaster: Requested delivery date is the 2nd day of the month.

USPS Rainwear Uniforms

The Postal Service has completely redesigned rainwear for uniformed employees. It has improved construction, design, and safety features and added reflective materials to the jacket and pants. Employees may identify the items by looking for the USPS UQC No. 96 tag inside the garment.

The current-style rainsuit (USPS UQC No. 31b) will not be manufactured after August 1 but will continue to be reimbursable until supplies are exhausted.—*Labor Relations Dept., 8-25-88.*

15-Cent Hearst Castle Postal Card

The Postal Service will issue a new 15-cent Historic Preservation Series postal card, featuring a picturesque view of the legendary Hearst Castle, on September 20 in San Simeon, California. The dedication ceremony will be at the visitors center of the Hearst San Simeon State Historical Monument.

The design, by Robert Reynold, features a wide-angle view of the Hearst Castle estate surrounded by lush greenery. A golden sunset provides a backdrop against a pale blue sky.

The Hearst Castle was the celebrated home of American publishing magnate William Randolph Hearst. Designed in eclectic Spanish styling by architect Julia Morgan, the castle is constructed of reinforced concrete with limestone facing.

The location of the estate was a treeless eminence rising 2,000 feet above the Pacific Ocean. Hearst renamed the land La Cuesta Encantada—The Enchanted Hill—and erected four Spanish and Italian edifices containing treasures from all over the world. This lavish estate is surrounded by a paradise of horticulture, elaborate landscaping, a private zoo, and an outdoor pool complete with Roman colonnades.

Procedures for ordering first-day cancellations follow.

Customers Providing Postal Cards: The Postal Service encourages customers to purchase the Hearst Castle postal card. Although the postal card is not available at some post offices, the Postal Service recommends that customers purchase it from philatelic centers or by mail order from the Philatelic Sales Division, referencing item 0217. Customers who supply their own postal cards receive preferential service. They should address cards at least 5/8 inch from the bottom. Customers also may affix uncanceled stamps issued before September 20. The Postal Service will return unserviced cards bearing stamps issued after that date. Requests for cancellations must be postmarked by October 20 and addressed: Customer-Provided Postal Cards, Postmaster, San Simeon, CA 93452-9991.

Postal Service Providing Postal Cards: Customers should provide a peelable return label for each postal card. The price is 15 cents per card, and the Postal Service accepts personal checks in the exact amount up to the limit of 50 items. Customers should not send cash or stamps. Orders must be postmarked by October 20 and addressed: Hearst Castle Postal Card, San Simeon, CA 93452-9992.

25-Cent Carousel Animals Commemorative Stamps

The Postal Service will issue a block of four 25-cent Carousel Animals commemorative stamps on October 1 in Sandusky, Ohio. These newest members of the Folk Art Series will kick off National Stamp Collection Month. The block of four stamps consists of the most sought-after carousel animal, the lead or king horse, and a long-horned goat, a bejeweled camel, and a graceful deer.

The dedication ceremony will be at Cedar Point Amusement Park, home to four hand-carved carousels and the one-of-a-kind king horse featured in the block.

The carousel traces its roots to 500 A.D., when Byzantine "riders" held on to ropes bound to a central pole and were spun around by centrifugal force. This sport became a popular form of entertainment for rich and poor alike.

Since its inception, talented American artists have raised carousel craftsmanship to an extraordinary level. Using animation, realism, and ornate decorations, they transformed mere seats on a revolving ride into exotic creatures that spring to life each time the music starts.

From the early 1970s, appreciation for hand-carved carousels has grown tremendously. In the face of fiberglass and aluminum imitations, amuse-

ment parks and carousel collectors have championed preservation efforts for the wooden originals. Today more than 200 handcrafted carousels are in operation across the country.

Customers Affixing Stamps: The Postal Service encourages customers to purchase the Carousel Animals stamps and affix them to their envelopes. Covers bearing stamps will receive preferential service. Customers must address envelopes on the right side at least 5/8 inch from the bottom and affix stamps approximately 1/4 inch from the top and right edges. Requests must be postmarked by October 31, 1988, and addressed: Customer-Affixed Envelopes, Carousel Animals Stamps, Postmaster, Sandusky, OH 44870-9991. No remittance is required.

Postal Service Affixing Stamps: Except for affixing stamps and addressing orders, follow the procedures above. The price is \$1 for each block of four stamps and 25 cents per single stamp. The Postal Service will select single stamps randomly and will not honor requests for specific designs. It accepts personal checks in the exact amount up to the limit of 50 envelopes, customers should not send cash or postage stamps. Orders must be postmarked by October 31 and addressed: Carousel Animals Stamps, Postmaster, Sandusky, OH 44870-9992.

After offices deplete local stocks of the item, it is available from all philatelic centers and by mail order from the Philatelic Sales Division for approximately 1 year after the date of issue. A *Philatelic Catalog*, listing all available stamps and other philatelic items, is available here or from the Philatelic Sales Division, Washington, DC 20265-9997.

CODING ACCURACY SUPPORT SYSTEM

The Postal Service offers the Coding Accuracy Support System (CASS) as a means of verifying the accuracy of ZIP + 4 Codes.

The following commercial firms have received Coding Accuracy Support System (CASS) certification for ZIP + 4 Codes conversion software or coding services. The certification applies only to the specific services/software listed for each firm. Division managers, postmasters, managers of marketing and communications, and account representatives should make these names available to mailers who inquire about vendors qualified to provide ZIP + 4 Code conversion services/software for their mailing lists.

POST-1956 MILITARY DEPOSITS—FERS EMPLOYEES

Career employees in retirement plans 8 and 9 who wish to receive retirement credit for their active honorable military service after 1956 must complete a deposit for this time. The deposit is 3 percent of the basic salary earned in the military. No interest is charged if the deposit is completed no later than December 31, 1989, or within 3 years after the initial career appointment, whichever is later.

Completing the Application

Federal Employees' Retirement System (FERS) employees in retirement plans 8 or 9 who wish to make a deposit for most 1956 military service must complete SF 2803, *Application to Make Deposit or Re-deposit*. The deposit application must indicate military service only and must be clearly marked FERS. (FERS employees who wish to make a deposit for civilian service must use SF 3108, *Application To Make Service Credit Payment for Civilian Service*.) They should complete only the face side of the form. In the space below the entry of the military service, the personnel office must type the following:

I wish to pay the deposit necessary to obtain credit for my post-1956 military service. I understand that the entire deposit must be paid to my agency before I retire. I further understand that any monies I deposit may be refunded to me only if I become eligible for the refund of retirement deductions or retire without having completed the deposit.

The original SF 2803 is sent to the Minneapolis Postal Data Center (PDC) by personnel and a copy is filed as a permanent record in the employee's official personnel folder (OPF).

Supporting Documentation

An employee must provide a copy of the Department of Defense Form (DD) 214, *Report of Transfer of Discharge*, or an equivalent record to verify the military service. After the personnel office obtains the necessary information from DD 214, it should return it to the employee. DD 214 is not retained in the employee's OPF.

Documentation of Basic Pay

To determine the amount of deposit due, the employee must provide the personnel office with documentation of military basic pay. This documentation may be actual pay records from the military service. If actual pay records are not available, the employee must request an estimate of earnings from the appropriate military branch of service. They may not use an earnings statement from tax records because they include allowances in addition to basic pay. Social Security earnings statements may not be used because they reflect only

military basic pay up to the Social Security maximum for withholding.

Form 2805, *Military Deposit Worksheet*

The personnel office will determine the deposit due for each period of military service based on either (1) actual records of military pay furnished by the employee, or (2) a statement of estimated earnings obtained by the employee from the military branch of service. Upon receipt of a deposit application (SF 2803) with supporting documentation (DD 214 and pay records), the personnel office will determine the amount of deposit due on Form 2805, *Military Deposit Worksheet*.

Personnel offices may obtain this form through normal supply channels from the appropriate area supply center. Instructions for completing the form are on the reverse side of the form. The personnel office completes items 1-11 and 14-18. The employee completes items 12 and 13, and the PDC certifies receipt of funds in item 19.

Computation of Deposit

The amount of the deposit due is determined by multiplying the amount of earnings by 3 percent. Each period of service should be computed separately. Employees may make deposits for any or all periods of service but not for a portion of one continuous period of service. In calculating the amount of the deposit, do not round off the amount, but report the amount in cents.

Employee Payment Election

The employee may elect to pay the deposit in a lump sum payment, installments of not less than \$50, or through payroll deductions of not less than \$5 each pay period. This election must be indicated in item 12 of Form 2805.

1. *Lump Sum Payment*. If the employee elects to pay the deposit in a lump sum, the amount remitted must match the total amount of the deposit due indicated in item 11 of Form 2805. Employees must make check or money order payable to the U.S. Postal Service and include their Social Security number and the account number 13467 shown. They submit payment with Form 2805.

2. *Installment Payment*. If the employee elects to pay the deposit in installment payments, the amount of each installment payment cannot be less than \$50. An initial minimum payment of \$50 made payable to the U.S. Postal Service must accompany the Form 2805. Employees who elect this option may submit their payment at any time, identifying all such payments by entering the account number 13467 and the employee's Social Security number on the check or money order. The personnel office must send Form 2805 with each installment payment, and the remarks section (item 9) must indi-

cate which installment the payment is, e.g., second, third, etc.

3. *Payroll Deductions.* An employee who elects to pay the deposit through payroll deductions must indicate in item 12 of Form 2805 the amount of deduction authorized, not less than \$5, and the pay period and year payroll deductions will begin.

Certification of Funds Received

Upon receipt of a completed Form 2805 for either a lump sum payment or an installment payment, the personnel office must complete items 14-18. In the case of a lump sum payment, the amount remitted must match the deposit amount in item 11. When the lump sum payment does not match the amount indicated in item 11 or the installment payment is less than \$50 (unless it is the final payment), the office will return the check or money

order and Form 2805 to the employee stating the reasons for the action.

Submission to the PDC

The personnel office: (1) completes Form 2805; (2) certifies that it received the funds, if appropriate; and (3) forwards the original copies of Form 2805 and SF 2803, with any funds remitted, to the PDC for processing. Mail elections involving a lump sum or an installment payment to ATTN: Disbursing Officer, Minneapolis PDC. Mail payroll elections to ATTN: Retirement Branch, Minneapolis PDC. Do not send supporting documentation to the PDC.

Employee Notification

Installations should post the notice on page 18 on all bulletin boards to notify employees in retirement plans 8 and 9 of their option to make a military deposit.—*Employee Relations Dept., 8-25-88.*

FOLK ART & CRAFTS: AN AMERICAN COLLECTION

Folk Art & Crafts: An American Collection, Item 840, a topical mint set, will go on sale in October at all post offices that sell philatelic products, philatelic centers, and by mail order from the Philatelic Sales Division, Washington, DC 20265-9997.

Priced at \$9.95, the mint set contains 32 stamps with a total face value of \$6.24. They represent eight different issues in the Folk Art series. Included are eight blocks of four stamps. The set also includes special mounts for the stamps and a 44-page album with illustrated background information on each stamp subject.

As with previous mint sets, separate contractors will ship the stamp packets (which are accountable) and the albums separately to stamp distribution offices (SDOs) in cartons of 100 (four packets of 25 each). The shipments begin in September. Because existing stocks of the Folk Art series stamps permitted the production of only 100,000 of these topical mint sets, SDOs will receive quantities that are approximately one-sixth to one-fifth the quantities they requested of the *1988 Commemorative Mint Set*.

Each regional accountable paper depository (RAPD) will receive sufficient quantities for them to service SDOs that order additional topical mint sets.

SDOs and RAPDs must verify receipt of equal quantities of the stamp packets and albums. Installations should report any differences between quantities shown on the *Advice of Shipment* and those actually received, as outlined in Handbook F-1, *Post Office Accounting Procedures*, section 426.3.

Post offices should place initial orders for the topical mint sets with SDOs immediately, using Form 17-A, *Accountable Items Requisition From Stamp Distribution Office*. Post offices should keep in mind the limited quantities available and order no more than 15-20 percent of the quantity they ordered of

the *1988 Commemorative Mint Set*. SDOs must plan the initial distribution of the topical mint sets carefully to ensure that all requesting offices receive the mint sets by the on-sale date.

A colorful poster promotes the topical mint set. All CAG A-K offices and their classified stations and branches will receive these displays.

Deluxe Topical Mint Set

In addition to the regular (softbound) edition of *Folk Art & Crafts: An American Collection* just described, the Postal Service will market a deluxe hardbound version. The deluxe version has a hardbound cover and an attractive dust jacket. The deluxe *Folk Art & Crafts: An American Collection*, Item 841, will be available for \$16.50 in mid-October.

Quantities of Item 841 will be limited, and only post offices with authorized philatelic centers and the Philatelic Sales Division (by mail order) will sell it. As with Item 840, the stamp packets and albums for Item 841 will be shipped separately. Shipments will go *directly* to all post offices with authorized philatelic centers. *Only those centers may sell this item.* Offices should place those sets on sale immediately upon receipt and should follow the same procedures for verifying receipt of equal quantities of stamp packets and albums as described above.

All philatelic centers will receive a colorful poster in early October that promotes both versions of the topical mint set.

Sales Reporting

Offices should report all sales of these topical mint sets in AIC 092, *Philatelic Product Sales*, and on the 1412-A, *Daily Financial Report*, and include them on the quarterly Form 1079, *Philatelic Product Physical Inventory Recap*, as required.

THE POSTAL SERVICE GUIDE TO U.S. STAMPS

The *Postal Service Guide to U.S. Stamps*, 15th edition, Item 863, goes on sale upon receipt at all postal facilities normally selling philatelic products, at philatelic centers, and by mail order from the Philatelic Sales Division, Washington, DC 20265-9997. The issuance of the book coincides with the eighth annual National Stamp Collecting Month celebration.

Distribution of the book to all stamp distribution offices (SDOs) should be completed during the last week in September. All associate offices requiring this product should submit Form 17-A, *Accountable Items Requisition From Stamp Distribution Office*, to their SDOs so that they will have the book available in October. Extra supplies will be shipped to Regional Accountable Paper Depositories (RAPDs) for back-up orders, as necessary. All CAG A-J post offices, stations, and branches will receive a drilled copy of the book to update the plastic lobby display.

The *Postal Service Guide to U.S. Stamps*, 15th edition, will retail for \$5. Offices should report all sales of the product in AIC 092, Philatelic Product Sales, and on Form 1412-A, *Daily Financial Report*. The quarterly Form 1079, *Philatelic Product Physical Inventory Recap*, will also include the guide as required.

Because offices should sell only the 15th edition of the guide, they must withhold all remaining copies of the 14th edition (Item 862) from sale immediately after receiving the 15th edition (Item 863) and take the following actions:

1. *Retail Outlets.* Collect all copies of the 14th edition of the guide from stamp credits. Immediately return them to the main stock, using Form 17, *Stamp Requisition*.

2. *Post Offices.* Consolidate all remaining copies of the 14th edition of the guide in the main stock.

Hold them for return to the stamp distribution office during the week of October 10-15. List the quantity and value of the returned stock on Form 17, *Stamp Requisition*, record the value in AIC 501, Postage Stock Shipped, and reduce stamp accountability accordingly. The name and finance number of the stamp distribution office, as well as that of the shipping office, must be on the Form 17.

3. *Stamp Distribution Offices.* Record the value of all copies of the 14th edition of the guide received in AIC 005, Postage Stock Received, and increase stamp accountability accordingly.

4. *MSC/Division Benjamin Franklin Stamp Club Coordinators and Project Leaders.* Submit Form 17 for the number of the 14th edition of the guide (Item 862) necessary for the Benjamin Franklin Stamp Club program. (Please note that quantities still available may be limited.) The products to be used in promoting the program must be stamped *Not for Resale*. The person having custody of accountable paper will attest that each item has been so stamped and prepare Form 3238, *Destruction Certificate*, endorsed Philatelic Products Given to Benjamin Franklin Stamp Club. Attach the related Form 17 to the office copy of Form 3238. Project coordinators will acknowledge receipt of Item 862 and are responsible for its control.

5. *Disposition.* Dispose of all remaining copies of the 14th edition (Item 862) in accordance with Handbook F-1, *Post Office Accounting Procedures*, 450.

Because disposition instructions have been issued annually for past issues of *Stamps and Stories* and *The Postal Service Guide to U.S. Stamps*, offices should have only the 15th edition in inventory after completing the above procedures. If previous issues of any of the above publications are on hand, offices should dispose of them immediately, in accordance with Handbook F-1, 450.

POSTAL QUARTER IV PHILATELIC PRODUCT REPORTS

The Postal Quarter (PQ) IV, Fiscal Year (FY) 1988 philatelic inventory survey begins September 24, 1988. Associate offices must submit all PQ IV survey reports on Form 1079, *Philatelic Product Physical Inventory Recap*, printed in this POSTAL BULLETIN (see page 19).

The reverse side of the form has directions for preparing it. Previous forms are obsolete. Please note that the Postal Service has consolidated all the Stamp Collecting Kits selling for \$2.50. Line reference 2 will be used for the total of all \$2.50 Stamp Collecting Kits sold. Also, the Service has added the Classic Cars Maximum Cards (*Items 801 and 802*), the Classic Cars Sale Poster, and the 1988 Love Folder (*Item 803*).

By September 28, all associate offices must forward the completed *Philatelic Product Physical Inven-*

tory Recap to their MSC offices. MSCs will use these forms to prepare a consolidated report using Form 1079-C, *Philatelic Product Inventory and Sales Report*, which the New York Postal Data Center (PDC) will send them the week of September 19. If any MSC does not receive its form by September 30, please contact Mark Greco at (212) 613-8772 or PEN 664-8772.

MILITARY SERVICE CREDIT DEPOSITS FOR POST-1956 SERVICE

FERS employees in retirement plans 8 and 9 who wish to have their active honorable military service performed after 1956 included toward their retirement must make a deposit for their service.

- The deposit is 3 percent of military basic pay.
- The deposit may be made in a lump sum, installment payments, or through payroll deductions.
- The documentation required is a copy of Department of Defense (DD) Form 214, *Report of Transfer or Discharge*, and actual military pay records or an estimate of earnings from the appropriate military branch of service.
- If the deposit is completed no later than December 31, 1989, no interest is charged. After that date interest is charged at a variable rate.

If you are interested in making a military deposit and receiving credit for retirement, you should visit your personnel office.

Note: Once an employee begins a deposit for military service, only the Office of Personnel Management has the authority to refund the deposit.

PROCEDURES AND INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING FORM 1079

I. COPY DISTRIBUTION AND TIMING

AOs—Submit completed form to MSC one week after close of Quarter.

MSCs—Three weeks after close of Quarter submit consolidated report.

Where special regional instructions direct the MSC consolidated report to the Region for review prior to sending to PDC, these instructions should be followed.

II. SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS—FORM 1079

1. With reference to LINE 01 on the form, please include only item 925. Do not include any inventory of older \$2.00 collecting kits such as "U.S. Stamp—1st Edition", "Space", "Animal Kingdom", "World of Sports", "Birds and Butterflies", "Masterworks", "U.S. Stamps—2nd Edition", "50 Countries", "Diamonds", "Travel", "Flags", and "Flower" Collecting Kits. These are Items 930, 907, 909-912, 915-920.
2. Note the consolidation of all of the \$2.50 collecting kits. Please make this consolidation at the associate offices. DO NOT include any items that have been taken off sale.
3. Use *only* the issue of Form 1079 specified in the most recent POSTAL BULLETIN notice or other instructions for the PQ survey. Using earlier issues will adversely impact PDC key punching and other operations.

III. GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS—FORM 1079

1. COLUMN (A) LINE REFERENCE

Self-explanatory.

2. COLUMN (B): Please refer to separate instructions listing the revisions and write-in entries, if any, needed in this column for the current survey.

3. COLUMN (C) ON HAND BEGINNING OF QUARTER

AO—Refer to previous quarter's report for "On Hand at End of Quarter"—Column F. Column C of this report must be the same as Column F of the previous quarter's report.

MSC—On consolidated report Column C must equal "On Hand at End of Quarter" of the previous quarter's report. Note this data comes preprinted on computerized Form 1079-C and should not be modified. Refer to separate instructions for details.

4. COLUMN (D) INCREASE/RECEIPTS AND ADJUSTMENTS

AO—Record totals by product received from MSC/SDO during the quarter.

MSC—Include only totals to those philatelic products received by the MSC/SDO from outside the MSC such as new products sent by contractor, transfers from Regional APD or from another MSC, during the quarter. DO NOT include shipments received from your AOs or stations and branches as returned stock.

5. COLUMN (E) DECREASE/SHIPMENTS AND ADJUSTMENTS

AO—Record totals by product shipped back to the MSC/SDO by the AO during the quarter. If any stock was returned for destruction at MSC/SDO, attach letter stating amount by products to your 1079 when returned to MSC.

MSC—Include only totals to those philatelic products shipped out of the MSC such as shipments to the Regional ADP or to other MSC/SDO. Do Not include shipments to your AOs or stations and branches. Also any products that have been destroyed by Form 3238, *Destruction Certificate*, or items authorized for promotional use as displays are to be included in this column.

6. COLUMN (F) ON HAND AT END OF QUARTER

AO—Record actual item count of AOs' Main Stock and individual clerk stock. If clerk is on leave or otherwise unavailable at report time, count stock prior to departure, if possible.

MSC—Consolidate all AO, station and branch reports and include MSC/SDO Main Stock and Main Office individual clerk stock.

7. COLUMN (G) TOTAL SOLD

AO—Determine total of each product sold during quarter using following formula:

Columns (C + D - E - F) = total items sold.

MSC—Consolidate MSC, station and branch plus AO reports and use same formula as above to determine MSC total sold of each item.

8. COLUMN (H) UNIT SELLING PRICE

Self-explanatory.

9. COLUMN (I) TOTAL COLUMN

Please note it is *not required* for either the AO or the MSC to complete this column (Col G x Col H), since the computer program at the PDC automatically calculates the sales revenue dollars and enters them in the "TOTAL" column. Some AOs and MSC may want to manually calculate total sales dollars for the quarter for their own records and use. Where that is the case, they may optionally fill in the total column.

IV. A REMINDER ON FORMS DISTRIBUTION

AOs keep a copy and send original to MSC. MSC keeps original AO reports, does consolidation, sends original to PDC, sends copies as per instruction at top of page and retains file copy for its records.

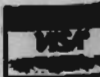
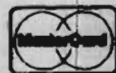
