REAFFIRMATION OF SUPPORT FOR QWL/EI BETWEEN THE POSTAL SERVICE AND THE NATIONAL RURAL LETTER CARRIERS' ASSOCIATION

The United States Postal Service and the National Rural Letter Carriers' Association have been involved in the Quality of Worklife/Employee Involvement (QWL/EI) process for nearly 8 years. The original Memorandum of Understanding to initiate this process for rural letter carriers and their managers was signed in October 1982. With the knowledge of accomplishments made and with anticipation of future successes, the Memorandum was reaffirmed in February 1985. At that time 20 management sectional centers (MSCs) had initiated the process. Since the reorganization of the Postal Service in 1986, we now have all MSCs involved in the process with rural letter carriers.

Our experience continues to confirm the wisdom of our joint decision to implement a process designed to encourage meaningful employee involvement in identifying and solving workplace problems. Benefits from employee involvement continue to become apparent for all parties involved: the rural letter carriers, the union, the United States Postal Service, and the postal customer.

The National Rural Letter Carriers' Association and the United States Postal Service reaffirm our mutual support for and commitment to the Quality of Worklife/Employee Involvement process.

Packaging Center Display Test

All offices participating in the Packaging Center Display Test must place the displays in prominent locations in their service lobbies. To avoid theft of products, place merchandising displays in full view of window clerks. Record losses due to theft on the Packaging Center Display Test Report under column (E), Decrease Shipments & Adjustments. Provide comments regarding theft in the report.

To ensure the validity of the test results, it is imperative that during the test period, no attempts be made to convert displays from merchandising (with racks) to static (without racks) or vice versa. Restore displays that have been modified to the original design immediately. If the display was modified during any part of the test, describe how it was modified in the report and include the inclusive dates. If for any reason offices cannot meet these requirements, immediately redeploy the display to another location within the division. Contact the division Retail Marketing Specialist for instructions.

Back Pay

Management Instruction (MI), EL-430-90-1, entitled Back Pay, is scheduled for distribution the first week of April. The MI will have a standard distribution, plus one copy each to all post offices CAGs A through J.

In conjunction with the publication of the MI, two new Postal Service (PS) forms have been developed to process back pay awards. These new forms include:

- Form 8038, Employee Statement to Recover Back Pay
- Form 8039, Back Pay Decision/Settlement Worksheet

These forms are available in the materiel distribution centers, offices may requisition them using Form 7380, MDC Supply Requisition. The authority to requisition these forms is restricted to management sectional centers, field divisions, Headquarters, and Headquarters-related units in increments of 10 copies per requisition. Personnel must use these forms when processing all back pay awards that occur on or after April 30, 1990.

Supply. All post offices will receive their standard automatic distribution quantities for a 50-subject commemorative stamp. Because a private contractor (American Bank Note Company) printed this stamp, the Bureau of Engraving and Printing cannot honor supplemental requisitions for Item 4475.

Limited quantities of this stamp will be shipped to regional accountable paper depositories (RAPDs) for filling supplemental orders. Stamp distribution offices (SDOs) requiring additional stamps may order them from their RAPDs using separate Forms 17-A, Accountable Items Requisition From Stamp Distribution Office. All other post offices requiring additional stamps should immediately requisition them from their SDOs on separate Forms 17-A.

Before requisitioning additional stock, all post offices should consider that they must deplete the stock before June 18, 1990, except at authorized philatelic centers.

Supply. All post offices will receive an automatic distribution of 10 booklets for each pane of 50 commemorative stamps furnished on a standard distribution.

The Bureau of Engraving and Printing will not honor supplemental requisitions for *Item 6625*. Limited quantities of this stamp booklet will be shipped to regional accountable paper depositories (RAPDs) for filling supplemental orders. Stamp distribution offices (SDOs) requiring additional booklets may order them from their RAPDs using separate Forms 17–A, *Accountable Items Requisition From Stamp Distribution Offices*. All other post offices requiring additional booklets should immediately requisition them from their SDOs on separate Forms 17–A.

Before requisitioning additional stock, all post offices should consider that they must deplete the stock before June 26, 1990, except at authorized philatelic centers.

PERFORMANCE EVALUATION PROGRAM

The Executive Administrative Schedule (EAS) performance evaluation system is designed to provide a structured method for communicating expectations between managers/supervisors and the EAS employees for whom they are responsible.

While two-way communication between managers and EAS employees should be an ongoing process, formal mid-year performance reviews are required to facilitate this communication. This mid-year review should include a discussion of perform-

ance during the previous 6-month period (no adjective rating is to be given at this discussion) and a discussion of expectations for the next 6-month period.

Managers/supervisors desiring further information about their role as evaluators in this program should contact their postal employee development centers (PEDCs) to arrange to view training course number 11576–02, EAS Performance Evaluation, part II.—Employee Labor Relations Dept., 3–22–90.

\$1 Seaplane Coil Stamp

The \$1 Seaplane coil stamp goes on sale April 20 in Phoenix, Arizona. The stamp features an engraving of an artist's drawing of the Benoist Airboat, used to establish the first scheduled airline service, flying between St. Petersburg and Tampa, Florida, in 1914.

Do Not Place on Sale Before April 21, 1990

Issued in coils of 500 only.

Supply. Post offices with authorized philatelic centers will receive an automatic distribution of the coils of 500. The automatic distribution is based on the Bureau of Engraving and Printing's four-position schedule for a 50-subject commemorative stamp. Accordingly, the quantities of coils to be furnished follow:

Offices receiving four-position stock in these quantities	Will receive coils in these quantities

Bulk Quantities. Cag A-G post offices requiring this coil stamp should immediately submit Form 3356, Stamp Requisition—Bulk Quantities, to the Bureau of Engraving and Printing. They must submit orders in quantities of 200 coils per requisition using Item 7703.

Less-Than-Bulk Quantities. All other post offices requiring fewer than the above bulk quantities of this coil stamp should requisition them immediately from their designated stamp distribution office on a separate Form 17-A, Accountable Items Requisition From Stamp Distribution Office.

Pay Changes—Postal Police Officers

The new salary schedules appear on page 34. These instructions apply to employees covered by the 1987–1991 USPS–Federation of Postal Police Officers (FPPO) National Agreement.

General Increase. In accordance with Article 9, section 9.01 of the subject agreement, effective April 7, 1990 (PP 9–90), employees covered by the Postal Police Officers' (PPO) schedule will receive a \$300 per year general increase, applied to all grades and steps.

Implementation. The increase discussed in this Bulletin is effective on April 7, 1990 (PP 9-90), and will appear in paychecks distributed on April 27, 1990.—Employee Relations Dept., 3-22-90.

Handbook F−1 Revision

Personal Check Identification

To address consumer concerns about credit card fraud as it relates to USPS policy on identification requirements for personal checks, section 311.33 of Handbook F-1, *Post Office Accounting Procedures*, is revised as follows:

311.3 Identification for Personal Checks

.33 If the customer is unknown, record the name and identifying number from one of the following photograph-bearing documents on the check in location A, as shown in Exhibit 311.32:

- a. Driver's license
- b. State-issued, nondriver identification
- c. Passport (foreign or domestic)
- d. Military identification card

If none of the above is available, enter the company name from *two* of the following documents on the check in location A as shown in Exhibit 311.32:

- a. Credit card (Do not record credit card numbers.)
- b. Other credential showing a signature.

Social Security cards are not acceptable identification. All posted check cashing requirements must be changed to reflect the above revisions. Postal Bulletin 21708, 1–19–89, updated the check acceptance procedures in Handbook F-1.—Dept. of the Controller, 3–22–90.

FEHB: Temporary Continuation of Health Benefits

POSTAL BULLETIN 21753, 12–28–89, provided preliminary information about new legislation requiring COBRA-like extension of Federal Employees' Health Benefits (FEHB) coverage to certain individuals who lose their coverage on or after January 1, 1990, and stated that supplemental information would be published in a future Bulletin.

Arrangements have been made with the U.S. Department of Agriculture's National Finance Center in New Orleans to process these cases for the Postal Service. Due to the length of the instructions required to administer this program, they will be distributed as a Management Instruction. Pending publication, a draft has been mailed to all regional, field, and management sectional center (MSC) Directors of Human Resources and to all Regional Chief Postal Inspectors and bulk mail centers (BMC), Directors of Support for immediate use.

POSTAL BULLETIN 21753 describes the eligibility criteria for temporary continuation of FEHB coverage. Any personnel office holding an eligible request should obtain a copy of the draft instructions for use in completing the required steps to process and forward the request.

1990 DECENNIAL CENSUS QUESTIONNAIRES

Beginning March 23, 1990, the Postal Service and the Bureau of the Census will collectively distribute some 106 million 1990 Decennial Census Questionnaires nationwide. Considerable effort has gone into developing the methods for successful delivery of these forms. Final reminders on several issues concerning the questionnaires follow:

- 1. Mail Reminder Card. The Mail Reminder Card (MRC) is a national mailing by the Census Bureau designed as a final reminder and request to complete the census questionnaire and return it. The MRC is a 41/4 by 515/16 inch, bulk rate, simplified address postcard scheduled for delivery to approximately 90 million addresses in 23,700 ZIP Codes in counties and parishes designated as Mail Out/Mail Back or Update/Leave. (Mail Out/Mail Back means the Postal Service delivers questionnaires and they are mailed back. Update/Leave means bureau personnel deliver questionnaires but they are mailed back.) Affected delivery units will receive MRCs in cartons, bundled by carrier route. The cartons will be plainly marked Census Mail Reminder Card-For Delivery March 30, 1990. Exhibits 1 and 2 below illustrate the front and back of the MRC.
- 2. Questionnaire Packaging and Delivery. Both longand short-form census questionnaires are being shipped to delivery units in cartons. Markings on the outside of the cartons indicate not only the type of form but also the requested delivery date, March 23, 1990. It is expected that delivery units will

make every reasonable effort to deliver the greatest quantity of questionnaires possible on that date. Delivery of all census questionnaires must be completed by no later than close of business, March 27, 1990.

3. Undeliverable-As-Addressed Questionnaires. Census mailpieces determined to be undeliverable-as-addressed (UAA) during the requested delivery window of March 23 through March 27, 1990, are to be handled in accordance with the instructions on page 8 of Special Postal Bulletin 21756A, 2–15–90.

Questionnaires identified as UAA after delivery (primarily Refused or Vacant) are to be handled like any other bulk rate mail and properly disposed of as waste.

At no time are 1990 census questionnaires to be forwarded

4. Questionnaire Return. Census Bureau advertising in late March 1990 will target April 1, 1990, as the official Census Day for the nation. It will encourage citizens to complete and return their questionnaires on that date. All managers responsible for the collection of mail should be alerted to the possibility of very full collection boxes on Sunday, April 1, 1990, and Monday, April 2, 1990, and consider special collections on those dates. In addition, delivery units may wish to locate a receptacle in service lobbies specially marked for census returns.

DMM Notice

Nonmailable Matter

Effective with DOMESTIC MAIL MANUAL Issue 35, 6–17–90, part 124, Nonmailable Matter—Articles and Substances; Special Mailing Rules, is amended to clarify requirements concerning performance testing and absorbent material.

Mailing Bees

Recently, a number of states have notified the Postal Service that they have established quarantines aimed at keeping shipments of diseased bees out of their respective jurisdictions. The scope of these quarantines varies. Some cover shipments originating anywhere in designated states, some cover only shipments originating in designated counties or destined for designated counties, and others cover only shipments affected by designated pests.

Customers presenting bees for shipment by mail should be reminded that pursuant to Domestic Mail Manual 124.121 and 124.63(c)(1) it is their responsibility to ensure that their shipments of bees comply with all applicable laws. Listed below are the states that have notified the Postal Service that they have established quarantines. Customers contemplating shipping bees to any of these states may learn the details of any potentially applicable quarantine by contacting the department of agriculture of each state to which their shipments would be sent.

Handbook M-37 Revision

Rural Carriers—Seatbelt Use

The following revision to Methods Handbook M-37, Rural Delivery Carriers Duties and Responsibilities, sections 161.5 through 161.8 is effective immediately.

161.5 Rural carriers are protected under the Federal Employee's Compensation Act (FECA) in the event they sustain an injury while in the performance of duty. Rural letter carriers are considered to be in "the performance of duty" for FECA purposes when driving their own vehicle between their home and the post office, and between the post office and their home, provided Postal Service records indicate the Postal Service required the carrier to furnish the vehicle. Therefore, seatbelts must be worn when traveling from home to the place of employment and from the place of employment to home.

and from the route and postal units regardless of the type of motor vehicle being used. If a Postal Service-owned right-hand drive (RHD) vehicle is used on the route, seatbelts must be worn at all times the vehicle is in motion. If a privately owned surplus postal vehicle or a manufactured right-hand drive (RHD) vehicle is used on the route, seatbelts must be worn at all times the vehicle is in motion. In a dual control-equipped vehicle, seatbelts should be used whenever possible while seated in the right seat.

Where state seatbelt laws are applicable, rural carriers must comply with the law. Where no law is applicable, and a left-hand drive (LHD) vehicle is being used, seatbelt use is recommended when delivery and collection activities do not unduly encumber, delay, or fatigue the rural carrier.

Unless the law requires the use of seatbelts (when using a LHD vehicle), seatbelt use is a matter of discretion for the individual rural carrier and should be influenced by:

- a. distance between stops,
- b. traffic density and weather conditions,
- c. road design characteristics, such as number of intersections traversed, road shoulder width, and surface conditions.
- d. the carrier's position while performing various tasks in the vehicle.

161.6 Remains unchanged.

161.7 When traveling to and from the route, and entering or crossing intersecting roadways, all vehicle doors must be closed. Normally, when operating a RHD vehicle on delivery routes and traveling in intervals of 500 feet (1/10 mile) or less between delivery stops, the sliding door on the driver's side may be left open.

The section currently titled 161.7 becomes 161.8.

DMM/Handbook DM-102 Notice

METERED MAILINGS

Effective with DOMESTIC MAIL MANUAL Issue 35, 6–17–90, sections 144.471, 144.476, 144.534, 144.54, 144.61, and 374.22 will be revised to state procedures for examination and corrective action concerning mailpieces bearing incorrect meter or mailer's precancel postmark dates or illegible or improper meter impressions.

Sections 432.1e and 915.6, Handbook DM-102, Bulk Mail Acceptance, are also amended to reflect the DMM revisions. The Handbook DM-102 changes

follow:

430 Acceptance

432 Acceptance Employee's Responsibilities

432.1 Initial Acceptance Checklist

e. (1) Postage. If the mailing is metered, ensure any additional postage for residual pieces is attached to the back of the Form 3602-PC. The more detailed procedures for postage verification, which are performed during final verification, are contained in 432.234.

(2) Markings and Endorsements. Verify that the mailpiece bears the correct markings and endorsements for the rate claimed.

(3) Meter Impression and Date. Verify that the meter impression is legible and the date is correct and complete for the class of mail claimed. (See DMM 144.47.) Use the procedures described in 432.1e(4-8), below.

- (4) Sample. From each metered mailing, randomly select at least 50 pieces of mail. Alternatively, for presorted mailings, the sample may use the same mailpieces selected for presort verification, or, preferably, may use other pieces taken from any part(s) of the mailing. Sample pieces should be taken from several places in the mailing; avoid concentrating the sample as much as possible. The size of the sample may be increased to ensure it provides a reliable indication of what is contained in the mailing. Examination of the sample for purposes of this section will include the date, place of mailing, and markings or endorsements shown in the meter impression, as well as the completeness, placement, and legibility of the impression. For mailings at other than the single-piece rates, the examination must be made and completed as part of the acceptance process. For single-piece rate mailings, the examination may be made of pieces either awaiting or during distribution; if pieces from individual mailers can be identified, select 50 pieces from each.
 - (5) Postal Error. Do not treat as errors any pieces

that are legibly postmarked the previous date if they are paid at the single-piece rate and were deposited in a collection box after the last collection (see DMM 144.471), or (regardless of rate) were not collected by the Postal Service as scheduled on the date appearing in the meter postmark.

- (6) Sample Results. If the random sample of 50 pieces reveals two or fewer pieces with improperly prepared meter impressions or incorrect or illegible meter dates, accept the mailing. If three to five pieces are found, examine at least 50 additional pieces in the mailing to determine the extent of the problem. If six or more pieces in the first 50-piece sample, or six or more of the 100 total pieces sampled, or more than 5 percent of a larger quantity sampled, are found to have improperly prepared meter impressions or incorrect or illegible meter dates, advise the mailer of the errors in person or by telephone within 30 minutes of the detection of the errors. Provide the mailer with a specific description of the errors, including the meter number(s) appearing on the improperly prepared pieces. (For purposes of this section, the mailer is the party who presents the mailing to the Postal Service.)
- (7) Corrective Action. Contact the mailer in person or by telephone within 30 minutes of the detection of the errors and give the mailer two options: (1) reclaim the mailing and reenvelope the mailpieces; or (2) reclaim the mailing and apply a properly prepared and legible ".00" meter impression with the correct date. The mailer may reclaim only one segment of the mailing (such as all the pieces from one client, if the mailing is presented by a presort bureau), if it is demonstrated, to the satisfaction of the Postal Service, that such action will remove all the pieces with improperly prepared or illegible meter impressions or incorrect dates in the meter postmarks. If removal of some mailpieces will result in remaining portions of the mailing no longer satisfying other applicable volume or presort requirements, additional postage must be paid to represent the difference between the amount originally affixed and the amount now due at the rate for which the pieces qualify.

(8) Resubmitted Carrier Route First-Class, Presorted First-Class, Nonpresorted ZIP + 4, ZIP + 4 Presort, or ZIP + 4 Barcoded Rate Mailings. If a mailer elects to correct the presort or preparation problems in a mailing which had resulted in its disqualification when originally presented for acceptance, but is unable to resubmit that mailing on the same day, the date shown in the meter or mailer's precancel postmark must be corrected by reenveloping or applying a legible ".00" meter impression that includes the correct date of mailing.

METERED MAILINGS—Continued

915 Corrective Action

915.6. Metered Postage Mailings. If a mailer elects to correct the presort or preparation problems in a mailing that had resulted in its disqualification when originally presented for acceptance,

but is unable to resubmit that mailing on the same day, the date shown in the meter or mailer's precancel postmark must be corrected by reenveloping or applying a legible ".00" meter impression that includes the correct date of mailing. (See DMM 144.476.)

Post Office Box Application Update

Post office box customers must maintain current address and other information on Form 1093, Application for Post Office Box or Caller Service, as indicated in Domestic Mail Manual (DMM) 951.153. Failing to comply with this requirement or providing false information on the original box application is grounds for the refusal or termination of box service as stated in DMM 951.81 or 951.82. Complaints regarding the infraction of this rule, however, should be called to the box customer's attention before initiating proceedings to terminate service under DMM 951.83.

If the applicant is not known, valid identification must be presented with Form 1093. Social Security cards are not acceptable as identification. The applicant must present one of the following: valid driver's license; military, government, or an established corporate identification card; passport; other credentials showing the applicant's signature, serial number, or other indicia that can be traced to the bearer. An application is considered verified if there are no discrepancies between the information on Form 1093 and the identification presented.

All employees with the responsibility for renting post office boxes or collecting box rents should be aware of DMM 951.153 and Form 1093, part III, item IX. Post office box customers must be advised that they are required to keep information current on Form 1093, and that failure to comply will justify the termination of box service.

Postmasters must submit all exchanged international reply coupons accepted through December 31, 1989, with the Statement of Account for Accounting Period 6, or Postal Quarter II, ending March 9, 1990.

Handbook F-1, *Post Office Accounting Procedures*, part 458, contains specific instructions for collection and proper documentation.

Postmaster: Requested delivery date is the 1st day of the month or the first delivery date thereafter.

The Social Security benefit checks are scheduled for delivery on the normal delivery date, Tuesday, April 3. The envelopes will bear the legend:

Postmaster: Requested delivery date is the 3rd day of the month.

All Offices With City Motorized, Rural, or Contract Delivery Routes


MAILBOX IMPROVEMENT WEEK

Each year the Postal Service designates a week during May to encourage customers on rural, city motorized, and contract delivery routes to examine and, where necessary, improve the appearance of their mailboxes. Mailbox Improvement Week, May 21–26, calls attention to the need for providing mail receptacles that are:

- 1. Designed to protect mail from weather,
- 2. Neat in appearance,
- 3. Conveniently located, and
- 4. Safe to use.

Neat, attractive mailboxes make a significant contribution to the appearance of the countryside and to streets in suburban areas.

Mailboxes that meet these four important requirements contribute to the entire route. The Postal Service approves two styles of boxes: (1) traditional design (see Exhibit A) in three standard sizes, and (2) contemporary design (see Exhibit B), also in three sizes.



Notice 209

Notice 209, USPS Notice to Rural Route Customers, is available by submitting Form 7380, MDC Supply Requisition, to the materiel distribution centers. Postmasters should send the notice to all rural route customers the week before Mailbox Improvement Week to alert them to the event.

Rural Routes

Customers should use only approved traditional or contemporary mailboxes for new installations or to replace an unsuitable receptacle. However, customers may use custom-built rural mailboxes if the postmaster gives prior approval and the box conforms generally to the same requirements as approved manufactured boxes, relative to the flag,

size, strength, and quality of construction. A list of approved manufacturers of traditional rural or suburban-type boxes appears in Domestic Mail Manual (DMM) 156.515.

When customers have assigned box numbers, the numbers must appear on the side of single boxes or on the door of grouped boxes, visible to the approaching carrier. Rural route customers should be encouraged to group boxes whenever practical, especially at or near crossroads, service turnouts, or other places with a considerable number of boxes.

In areas where snow removal is a problem, the Postal Service suggests using a semiarch or extended arm-type support (see Exhibit C on page 10), which allows snowplows to sweep near or under boxes without damaging supports and provides easy access to the boxes by carriers and customers.

If the post office authorizes the use of street names and house numbers, the box should display that number on the side or on the door if the box is in a group. If the box is on a street other than the one on which the customer resides, the street name and house number must be on the box. In all instances, placing the owner's name on the box is optional.


Generally, customers should install boxes with the bottom of the box at a vertical height of between 3½ to 4 feet from the road surface. However, because of varying road and curb conditions and other factors, the USPS recommends that customers contact the postmaster or carrier before erecting or replacing their mailboxes and supports.

City Motorized Routes

On city motorized routes with curbline delivery, the USPS recommends that customers have the approved traditional rural-type box or an approved suburban box of contemporary design.

Boxes designed primarily for use by customers receiving door delivery are difficult to serve efficiently from a vehicle, and the USPS does not encourage their use as curbline receptacles (see Exhibit D on page 10). However, any box that gives protection to the mail and allows safe, convenient delivery from the city delivery carrier's vehicle is acceptable. Customers should install boxes with the bottom of the box at a vertical height of between 3½ to 4 feet from the road surface. Where boxes are not directly in front of the customer's residence, the box must display the house number.

MAILBOX IMPROVEMENT WEEK—Continued



Contract Delivery Routes

Contract delivery route customers must use an approved traditional rural-type or contemporary design box as new or replacement boxes.

General Requirements

The placement of mailboxes on both rural and contract routes must be safe and convenient for carriers. The boxes must be on the right-hand side of the road in the carrier's travel direction so they can deliver mail without leaving their conveyance. This rule especially applies where traffic conditions make it dangerous for the carrier to drive to the left in order to reach the boxes, or when doing so would constitute a violation of traffic laws and regulations (apartment house or other multiple dwellings can be exempted from this rule as described in DMM 156.312).

On new rural routes, all boxes must be on the right-hand side of the road in the direction of the route line of travel. Box placement must conform with state laws and highway regulations. Rural carriers are subject to the same traffic laws and regulations as other motorists. Customers must remove obstructions, including vehicles, trash cans, and snow, that impede efficient delivery. Except when a box is temporarily blocked, carriers must have access to the box without leaving the vehicle unless authorized to dismount.

Mailbox Supports

Supports for mailboxes should be of adequate strength and size to support the box properly. However, customers should avoid using massive mailbox supports that, when struck, could damage vehicles and cause serious injury to vehicle occupants. Heavy metal posts, concrete posts, and miscellaneous items of farm equipment, such as milk cans filled with concrete, are examples of potentially dangerous supports. The ideal support is an assembly that bends or falls away from a striking vehicle. DMM sections 156.531, 156.54, 157.32c, and 157.4 specify postal regulations regarding construction and placement of mailboxes and supports on rural and highway contract routes.

The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) has determined that mailbox supports no larger than 4 inches by 4 inches or a 4½-inch diameter wood post or a 2-inch diameter standard steel or aluminum pipe, buried no more than 24 inches, should safely break away if struck by a vehicle. The mailbox must also be securely attached to its post to prevent separation when struck. Exhibits E and F on page 12 are detailed examples of mailbox mountings and supports suggested by the FHWA. Boxes and supports should also be painted and free from rust.

NDCBUs and All-Weather Parcel Lockers at

During Mailbox Improvement Week, postmasters/managers or their designees should also review Neighborhood Delivery and Collection Box Units (NDCBUs) and All-Weather Parcel Lockers in their delivery area to identify any hazards or irregularities. Exhibit G on page 13 is a suggested format for use in conducting the review. Results of the review should be recorded.

Employees conducting the review must complete Form 1624, Delivery and Collection Equipment Work Request, for any equipment that poses a safety hazard to postal customers or employees. Use Form 7380, MDC Supply Requisition, to request Form 1624 from the materiel distribution centers.

Equipment Review Procedure

Employees should use the NDCBU and parcel locker Equipment Checklist and Followup Review Procedure, Exhibit G, when examining the condition of NDCBU and parcel locker equipment. This exhibit may be reproduced locally. They should:

- 1. List the unit location, type, and manufacturer in the left-hand column (omit manufacturer if all items are in order).
- 2. Assign each checklist item one of the following ratings:
 - OK—Equipment does not need attention for this item.
 - X—Equipment needs attention for this item. NA—Item does not apply to this particular piece of equipment.
- 3. Examine the following items and annotate Exhibit G:
- a. Equipment should be straight, vertical, and firmly mounted. Attempt to shake the unit; it should not move. If equipment is not firmly mounted, note whether it is the connection at ground level that is loose or the pedestal to customer compartments connection that needs attention.
- b. Check visible welds. Make note of cracked, broken, or rusted welds.
- c. Observe whether the carrier access door is locked and secure. Open it and observe that it is not bowed or warped and that the door and locking bar operate smoothly. With carrier access door(s) open, notice if restraining devices prevent the door

MAILBOX IMPROVEMENT WEEK—Continued

from blowing closed. These devices, which may have to be set manually, should be serviceable.

- d. Ensure that the Arrow lock operates smoothly and that the mounting screws are tight. The device that protects the Arrow lock from customer tampering must also be serviceable.
- e. Ensure that all customer access doors are closed and locked and that there is no visible damage or signs of forced entry.
- f. Is the exterior surface of the unit free from rust and graffiti?
- g. Does the unit appear defective or damaged in any other way? Does it reflect a proper postal image?
- h. Does the unit and/or any protecting structure appear watertight and in good repair? Are there any noticeable watermarks inside the unit or any wet mail?
- i. Note any other conditions important to report.
- .4. Record the results of the inspection on the checklist.
- 5. Submit completed Form 1624 to maintenance for each unit rated.

Carriers must note equipment deficiencies and report them to the postmaster, supervisor, or designee. The postmaster or designee must then submit Form 1624 to maintenance reporting the equipment defects. In addition, carriers should complete Form 1767, Report of Hazard, Unsafe Condi-

tion, or Practice, for items that pose an immediate threat to safety such as an insecure or leaning NDCBU.

The postmaster or supervisor must immediately notify maintenance control of reported hazards by telephone and follow up in writing with copies of Form 1767 (completion instructions are on the back of the form). Supervisors must also follow up to ensure that the work is satisfactorily completed and documented. Maintenance control should immediately dispatch the appropriate repair person. If repair by postal maintenance employees is not available, postmasters should use their local contracting authority to accomplish the repairs.

Publicity

Postmasters should give these guidelines and suggestions maximum local publicity. Rural, motorized city, and contract route carriers must cooperate to ensure the success of this endeavor and later report the results to the postmaster. They should use the most up-to-date list of approved manufacturers and mailbox suppliers when providing rural or highway contract route customers with information about what type of box to install. This list is in DMM section 156.515.

Obsolete Handbook EL-302

Handbook EL-302, Qualification Standards—Non-bargaining Unit Positions, is obsolete as of March 10, 1990. This handbook is replaced by a data base of requirements in the Automated Vacancy Announcement System and by Handbook EL-350, Establishing Nonbargaining Requirements. Handbook EL-350, which was distributed in December 1989, sets policies and procedures for establishing job requirements and posting vacancy announcements for Executive Administrative Schedule (EAS) positions other than postmaster and initial-level supervisor.

Vacancy announcements for EAS positions should no longer refer applicants to a qualification standard in Handbook EL-302 to determine the position's requirements. Instead, all job requirements should be listed on the vacancy announcement itself.—*Employee Relations Dept.*, 3-22-90.

DMM Correction

Maximum Size Standards

Domestic Mail Manual subsection 629.221d(3) contains an error. Please change it to read: Not more than $\frac{1}{4}$ of an inch thick, and. . . .

Migratory Bird Stamp Disposition

Postmasters must return all unsold bird stamps to the main stock as specified in Handbook F-1, Post Office Accounting Procedures, subchapter 460.

The amount recorded in AIC 806, Ending Inventory—Bird Stamps, on the statement of account submitted at the close of the second quarter (A/P 06) March 9, 1990, must accurately reflect the value of bird stamps on hand in the post office. Except for post offices with philatelic outlets, the only bird stamps post offices should have on hand are the current 1989–1990 series, which sell for \$12.50.

Postmasters must destroy unsold migratory bird stamps during the third quarter as instructed in Handbook F-1, part 453. Management sectional centers must establish a schedule for returning properly certified Forms 3238, Stamps and Stamped Paper Destruction Certificate, to post offices for inclusion with the statements of account for the period ending June 1, 1990.

Those offices designated as philatelic outlets are the only offices that should have an entry in AIC 806 on the statement of account for the period ending June 1, 1990. Offices should list these bird stamps by year of issue and face value in the Remarks section of the statement of account.

Cantilever Mailbox Supports





The card depicts a globe atop the pages of an open book, a literal reflection of the words below. Procedures for ordering first-day cancellations follow:



Classic Films Commemorative Stamps

Four commemorative stamps honoring classic films from Hollywood's golden era will be dedicated on March 23 in Hollywood as a prelude to the 62nd Annual Academy Awards on March 26. This year marks the 50th anniversary of each film's having received nominations in 1939 for the 1940 Academy Awards.
