The 75-cent Wendell Willkie stamp go specification. February 16 in Bloomington, Indiana. Willkie, who challenged Franklin Roosevelt for the presidency of the United States in 1940, is the 49th addition to the Great American series of stamps.

Supply. Post offices with authorized philatelic centers receive their standard automatic distribution quantities based on a 100-subject stamp issue only. Those post offices should requisition additional stamps for their regular window transactions. All other post offices should order sufficient quantities to meet philatelic demand.

Bulk Quantities. CAG A-G post offices requiring 50,000 or more stamps should immediately submit Forms 3356, Stamp Requisition—Bulk Quantities, to the Bureau of Engraving and Printing, using Item 1075. They must submit requisitions in the standard ordering quantities for a 100-subject stamp to the maximum quantity of 2,500,000 stamps per requisition.

Less-Than-Bulk Quantities. All other post offices requiring fewer than 50,000 stamps immediately should requisition them from their designated stamp distribution offices on separate Forms 17-A, Accountable Items Requisition From Stamp Distribution Office.—Philatelic and Retail Services Dept., 1-9-92

Withholding Taxes for Relocation Expenses

Effective January 1, 1992, all relocation payments require Social Security tax (FICA) withholding and reporting as required by federal law. Offices will continue to submit relocation travel vouchers for audit to the San Mateo PDC. However, the payment of relocation vouchers are being disbursed by the Minneapolis PDC beginning January 1, 1992, due to required interfacing with the payroll system. Payment of relocation advances will continue to be processed and paid by the San Mateo PDC.

There will be no grossing up for Social Security taxes. Future revisions of Handbooks F-11, PCES Relocation Policy, and F-12, Relocation Policy, will reflect these changes.—Dept. of the Controller, 1-9-92

Priced at \$17.95, I Have a Dream contains 18 black-related stamps enhanced by 28 portraits of honored black individuals painted by Thomas Blackshear, designer of four Black Heritage Series stamps and the popular Classic Films block of four stamps of 1989. The 68-page, deluxe hardbound collection includes biographies of the featured 28 black men and women and 28 protective mounts for the 18 included stamps and for the other 10 issues if customers wish to purchase them from stamp dealers.



Promotional posters for the 11 x 14 inch acrylic displays will be sent to all offices that receive promotional stamp posters.

As with previous mint sets, separate contractors will ship the stamp packets, which are accountable, in cartons of 20–100 (bundles of 20 each) and the albums separately in cartons of 20 each to stamp distribution offices (SDOs).

An advance notice of individual quantities allotted to each SDO will be sent to all accountable paper supervisors, in addition to the official Advice of Shipment (AOS), which is sent after all shipments are completed.

SDOs and regional accountable paper depositories (RAPDs) must verify receipt of equal quantities of the stamp packets and albums, as recorded on their Advices of Shipment. Installations should report any differences between quantities shown on the AOS and those actually received, as outlined in Handbook F-1, Post Office Accounting Procedures, section 426.3.

Post offices should immediately assess the sales potential of *I Have a Dream* in their respective areas. If reasonable potential exists, offices then should place appropriate initial orders for *I Have a Dream* with their SDOs. Offices must place orders using a separate Form 17-A, Accountable Items Requisition From Stamp Distribution Office.

Quantities of *I Have a Dream* are limited. Associate offices whose SDOs are unable to fill their orders or provide desired quantities may place orders by calling the new toll-free 1-800-PIC-USPS number, using procedures outlined on page 18 of the December 12, 1991, *Postal Bulletin*.

Offices should report all sales of these mint sets in AIC 092, Philatelic Product Sales, and on Form 1412-A, Daily Financial Form, and include them on the quarterly Form 1079, Philatelic Product Physical Inventory Recap, as required.

MAIL CLASSIFICATION POSITIONS: EXAMINATION/EVALUATION

January 13, 1992, marks the introduction of the new Mail Classification Qualifying Examination (Examination O/N 480 Series 013 and 014) and the new Mail Classification On-the-Job Training (OJT) Evaluation (Form 2529). The examination and OJT form supersede the existing Examination O/N 480 Series 011 and 012 and the existing on-the-job evaluation form, respectively. The examination and OJT evaluation are used in conjunction with the new Standard Mail Classification Training Program to qualify employees who bid for mail classification positions, including bulk mail clerk, bulk mail technician, mailing requirements clerk (PS-5, PS-6, and PS-7), and mail classification clerk (PS-6 and PS-7). Employees who begin new mail classifi-

cation training on or after January 13, 1992, must take the new examination and OJT evaluation.

DMM Notice

Special Delivery and Postage-Due Stamps

Effective with *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) Issue 42 (3-15-92), DMM 142.13, 146.224c, 163.32, 163.346b(1), and 917.342c are revised to eliminate references to special delivery and postage-due stamps. The Postal Service withdrew the sale of special delivery stamps in July 1981 and discontinued the use of postage-due stamps in October 1986.

Domestic Mail Manual

142.13 Perforating. Postage stamps may be identified with a mark composed of perforation holes. The mark may not cover more than ¼ square inch (½ inch by ½ inch) of the stamp, and the diameter of the holes may not exceed ⅓2 inch.

146.224 Request for Payment

c. If the firm or individual pays the postage with cash, check, or money order, a postage-due meter strip for the amount collected is affixed to a sheet of paper as a receipt. If payment is by uncanceled stamps or postage meter strips, the stamps or meter strips are affixed to a sheet, canceled, and returned as a receipt. No other receipt is issued.

163.32 Philatelic Centers. Philatelic centers are units separate from retail service windows. These centers display and sell all current postage stamps, postal stationery, and related philatelic products. Some philatelic centers are called Postiques, a registered Postal Service trademark. The Philatelic Sales Division, which handles mail order requests from collectors for stamps, stationery, and related products, is also a philatelic center.

163.346 Arrangements

b. Stamp Stock

(1) The postmaster should obtain a wide range of philatelic products and current postage, using Form 3300 as a guide. The postmaster should prepackage sets of regular issues for sale to collectors. (Rest of section remains unchanged.)

917.342 Cash or Postage-Due Account

c. Affixing Meter Strips. Postage meter strips for the amount are affixed to the mail or Form 3582-A. These meter strips are delivered to the addressee with the mail when the amount due is paid (Exception at end of section remains unchanged.)

For the first shipment, all post offices receive two times their standard automatic distribution quantities for a 50-subject commemorative stamp. For the second shipment, post offices receiving direct shipments of commemorative stamps from the Bureau of Engraving and Printing receive two times their standard automatic distributions. SDOs will not make an automatic distribution for the second shipment. The first shipment will be completed by January 24, 1992. The second shipment begins on or about February 7 and is completed by March 20, 1992.

This issue is the same size as the 1991 Love stamp. Each pane of the Love stamps contains 50 stamps, packaged in a master carton of 150,000 stamps rather than the normal 125,000 stamps per carton.

Since a private company, American Bank Note Co., is the contractor for this stamp, the Bureau of Engraving and Printing will not honor supplemental requisitions for Item 5592. SDOs requiring additional stamps may order them from their RAPD using separate Forms 17-A, Accountable Items Requisition From Stamp Distribution Office. All other post offices requiring additional stamps should immediately requisition them from their SDOs on separate Forms 17-A.

The love stamps are available from RAPDs in sheet form throughout calendar year 1992. Postmasters must make this stamp available to their customers during calendar year 1992.—Philatelic and Retail Services Dept., 1–9–92

REQUISITION SCHEDULE: POSTAGE STAMPS/POSTAL CARDS

Beginning January 1, 1992, postmasters at all CAG A-G post offices will submit Form 3356, Stamp Requisition—Bulk Quantities, to the Bureau of Engraving and Printing and Form 3216, Requisition for Postal Cards—Bulk Quantities to the Government Printing Office according to the schedule that follows. Offices should mail requisitions for postage stamps in the preaddressed envelope, EP-10-A, and requisitions for postal cards in the preaddressed envelope, EP-10-C. These envelopes are available from material distribution centers.

Requisitions to the Bureau of Engraving and Printing and the Government Printing Office must be mailed at least 7 days before the due date in the schedule to allow time for processing. Shipments begin approximately 10 days after the scheduled due date.

Those requisitions for postage stamps received after the scheduled date are processed out-of-cycle, increasing processing and handling costs and delaying stamp shipments for the ordering post office. Requisitions for postal cards received after the scheduled date are processed during the next ordering cycle for that area.

Requisitions for precanceled stamps do not apply to this schedule. Shipments of emergency and precanceled orders are made 10 days after receipt at the Bureau. Insert a copy of this updated schedule in Handbook F-48, Bulk Requisitioning and MSC Accountable Paper Functions, as Exhibit 241.2.

DMM Notice

CURBSIDE MAILBOXES—SPECIFICATIONS, INSTALLATION, AND USE

Effective with *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) Issue 42 (3-15-92), sections of DMM 151, 155, 156, and 157 are revised to require customers in all delivery areas to use approved mailboxes for curbside delivery service. These revisions apply the same standards to all curbside receptacles and transfer mailbox specifications from DMM 156 to DMM 151.

150 Collection and Delivery

151 Mail Receptacles

151.2 Use for Mail Only

(Revise the first two sentences of 151.2 to read as follows:) Except as provided in 151.528, the receptacles described in 151.1 may be used only for matter which bears postage. Therefore, other than as permitted in 151.528, no part of a mail receptacle may be used to deliver any matter not bearing postage.

(Add 151.5 after 151.4 as follows:)

151.5 Curbside Mailboxes

151.51 Specifications for Manufacturers

151.511 Policy. Manufacturers of all mailboxes designed and manufactured to be erected at the edge of a roadway or curbside of a street and to be served by a carrier from a vehicle on any city, rural, or highway contract route must obtain approval of their products in accordance with U.S. Postal Service Standard 7 (USPS STD-7), Mailboxes, City, and Rural Curbside. Construction standards and drawings (USPS-STD-7) for guidance in the manufacture of curbside mailboxes may be obtained by writing to the

151.512 Dimensions and Styles

a. Approved Sizes and Styles. Three standard sizes and two styles of mailboxes are approved for use in city, rural, and highway contract routes:

b. Variances. Curbside mailboxes may be constructed in any size between the maximum and minimum outside dimensions specified on ap-

proved drawings, provided that the general shape and the proportions of height, width, and length are maintained.

151.513 Application for Approval. To secure approval of a curbside mailbox, manufacturers must submit the following to:

Manufacturers must also notify the Delivery Management Division by letter that mailboxes are being submitted for approval.

- a. Sample Mailboxes. No fewer than two complete mailboxes with markings required in paragraph 3.7 of USPS-STD-7 of each style made of exact materials, construction, coating, paint, etc., including the panels required by paragraph 3.14.8 of USPS-STD-7, and otherwise identical in every way with the boxes intended to be marketed.
- b. Instructions. A copy of the instructions required by paragraph 3.11 of USPS-STD-7.
- c. Color Samples. Color samples showing all color schemes to be used.
- d. Proposed Packaging. Boxes or packaging of the type proposed for shipping production units.
- e. Documentation. Two complete sets of manufacturing drawings and installation instructions, showing that the units submitted meet the requirements of USPS-STD-7. The drawings must be dated, signed, and certified to represent the production units exactly as submitted. The drawings must include sufficient details to allow the Postal Service to document and inspect all materials, construction methods, processes, coatings, treatments, finishes, control specifications, parts, and assemblies used in the construction of the units. The Postal Service may request individual piece parts to verify drawings.

151.514 Modifications During Application Process. No changes may be made by the manufacturer to its products or drawings without written notification of and approval from the Postal Service. Any changes must be submitted with an explanation of the reasons in writing and also documented in the revision block of the affected drawings. Two units of each type with the changes incorporated must be submitted for testing and approval. All changes are subject to written approval by the Postal Service.

151.515 Application Approval

a. Authorizing Organization. The decision to approve or disapprove mailboxes is issued by the Office of Delivery and Retail Management, U.S. Postal Service (for address, see Address List in Appendices). All correspondence and inquiries must be directed to that office.

b. Retention of Drawings and Sample Mailboxes. The

Postal Service returns one set of manufacturing drawings to the manufacturer, together with written notification of approval or disapproval, including reasons for disapproval. The drawings are stamped and identified as representing the production unit type if the mailbox is approved. After testing, the Postal Service (1) retains approved boxes and (2) disposes of disapproved boxes unless the manufacturer requests their return and pays the shipping costs.

151.516 Production Units

a. Construction. Manufacturers must construct production units in accordance with identified (stamped) drawings and USPS-STD-7. These units must be of the exact materials, construction, coating, workmanship, finish, etc., as the approved units. The Postal Service reserves the right at any time to examine and retest production units obtained either in the general marketplace or from the manufacturer, and may require the manufacturer to provide units for examination and testing. Failure of these production units to be manufactured in strict accordance with the approved units, the identified drawings, and the provisions of USPS-STD-7 may result in the rejection of units and the suspension or revocation of the manufacturer's authorization as an approved manufacturer through a decision issued by the Office of Delivery and Retail Management.

b. Packaging. Mailboxes and accessories must be packaged in a manner to ensure arrival at destination in satisfactory condition. Boxes must be shipped fully assembled except that the following parts may be removed if necessary to protect them from damage: protruding portions, such as door latching hardware, mounting adapters, and mounting posts or stands. Containers and packaging must comply with the National Motor Freight Classification Rule 222, sections 2 and 3. Boxes must be suitably wrapped or protected and packaged in separate containers to prevent damage to painted surfaces by rubbing against other parts or the internal surfaces of the container.

c. Changes. Manufacturers must receive written approval from the Postal Service before making any change to the production unit or the identified design drawings. Approval for thanges requires resubmission of units for testing and updated drawings for review.

151.517 Marking. All curbside mailboxes must have the following legible inscriptions on the carrier service door:

U.S. MAIL and APPROVED BY THE FOSTMASTER GENERAL.

Manufacturers must mark these inscriptions by embossing on sheet metal, using raised lettering on plastic, or engraving on wood or other materials not suitable for embossing. The name and address of the manufacturer and the month and year of manufacture must also be marked on the box. Manufacturers must either emboss this marking on the rear wall or affix a permanent decal on the inside near the front opening of the box.

151.52 Installation and Use

151.521 Custom-Built Curbside Mailboxes. Postmasters are authorized to approve curbside mailboxes constructed by individuals who, for aesthetic or other reasons, do not wish to use an approved manufactured box. The custom-built box must conform generally to the same requirements as approved manufactured boxes relative to the flag, size, strength, and quality of construction.

151.522 Painting and Identification. The Postal Service prefers that curbside mailboxes and posts or supports be painted white, although other colors may be used if desired. Where box numbers are

used, the numbers must be inscribed in contrasting color in neat letters and numerals not less than I inch high on the side of the box visible to the carrier's regular approach, or on the door if boxes are grouped. Where street names and house numbers have been assigned by local authorities, and the postmaster has authorized use of a street name and house number as a postal address, the house number must be shown on the box. If the box is located on a different street from the customer's residence, the street name and house number must be inscribed on the box. Placement of the owner's name on the box is optional. Advertising on boxes or supports is prohibited.

151.523 Posts and Supports. Posts or other supports for curbside mailboxes must be neat and of adequate strength and size. They may not be designed to represent effigies or caricatures that tend to disparage or ridicule any person. The box may be attached to a fixed or movable arm.

151.524 Location. Curbside mailboxes must be placed so that they may be safely and conveniently served by carriers without leaving their conveyances, and must be located on the right-hand side of the road in the direction of travel of the carriers in all cases where traffic conditions are such that it would be dangerous for the carriers to drive to the left to reach the boxes, or where their doing so would constitute a violation of traffic laws and regulations. (For exception, see 156.312). On new rural or highway contract routes, all boxes must be located on the right side of the road in the direction of travel by the carrier. Boxes must be placed to conform to state laws and highway regulations. Carriers are subject to the same traffic laws and regulations as are other motorists. Customers must remove obstructions, including vehicles, trash cans, and snow, which make delivery difficult. Generally, customers should install boxes with the bottom of the box at a vertical height of between 3½ and 4 feet from the road surface. However, because of varying road and curb conditions and other factors, the Postal Service recommends that customers contact the postmaster or carrier before erecting or replacing their mailboxes and supports.

151.525 Grouping. Boxes should be grouped wherever possible, especially at or near crossroads, at service turnouts, or at other places where a considerable number of boxes are presently located.

151.526 More Than One Family. More than one family, but not more than five families, on rural or highway contract routes, may use the same box, provided a written notice of agreement, signed by the heads of the families, or by the individuals who desire to join in the use of such box, is filed with the postmaster at the distributing office.

151.527 Locks. The use of locks on mailboxes on rural and highway contract routes is not re-

quired. If, however, a box is equipped with a lock, the box must have a slot large enough to accommodate the customer's normal daily mail volume. The Postal Service does not open locked boxes and does not accept keys for this purpose.

151.528 Unstamped Newspapers. Curbside mailboxes are to be used for mail only, except that publishers of newspapers regularly mailed as second-class mail may, on Sundays and national holidays only, place copies of the Sunday or holiday issues in the rural and highway contract route boxes of subscribers, with the understanding that copies are removed from the boxes before the next day on which mail deliveries are scheduled.

151.529 Newspaper Receptacles. A receptacle for the delivery of newspapers may be attached to the post of a curbside mailbox used by the Postal Service, provided: no part of the receptacle touches or is attached to or is supported by any part of the mailbox, interferes with the delivery of mail, obstructs the view of the flag, or presents a hazard to the carrier or his vehicle. The receptacle must not extend beyond the front of the box when the box door is closed. No advertising may be displayed on the outside of the receptacle, except the name of the publication.

151.53 Nonconforming Mailboxes. Carriers must report to the postmaster any mailboxes not conforming to postal regulations. The postmaster sends Form 4056 to the owners of these boxes, requesting that they remedy the irregularities or defects.

155 City Delivery

155.41 Obligation of Customer

(Revise the first sentence in 155.41a as follows:)

a. Customers of the carrier delivery service must provide authorized receptacles (see 151.5) or door slots, except for mail receptacles authorized by the Postal Service to be owned and maintained by the Postal Service.

156 Rural Service

(Revise 156.26 and replace 156.5 as follows:)

156.26 Highway Contract Delivery. Persons residing on roads traveled by both rural and highway contract carriers may qualify as customers of either or both routes. If one curbside mailbox is used for both routes, it must be an approved receptacle (see 151.5).

156.5 Rural Mailboxes. Rules setting specifications for rural mailboxes and other provisions concerning the installation, location, and use of boxes are set forth in 151.5.

157 Highway Contract Service

(Revise 157.32c and 157.4 as follows:)

157.32 Availability

(c) either erect a curbside mailbox approved under 151.5 on the highway contract route carrier's existing line of travel or are authorized to receive delivery through neighborhood delivery and collection box units and parcel lockers owned and maintained by the Postal Service.

157.4 Location of Receptacles. Approved curbside mailboxes (see 151.5) must be placed where they protect mail and may be conveniently served by carriers without leaving their vehicles. These receptacles must be located on the right side of the road in the direction of travel, when required by traffic conditions, or when driving to the left to reach the boxes would constitute a violation of traffic laws by the carrier.

FEDERAL TAX WITHHOLDING: EXEMPTION

Internal Revenue Service (IRS) regulations permit employees who anticipate no federal tax liability for 1992 to claim total exemption from federal tax withholding, provided they owe no federal income tax for 1991. However, employees who claimed this exemption for 1991 must submit a new Form W-4 for 1992, to renew the exempt status or to claim allowances consistent with the expected tax liability for 1992.

If a new Form W-4 (claiming exempt status) is not submitted, the status automatically converts to taxable status effective Pay Period (PP) 04-92. Fed-

eral tax in these instances will be withheld at the rate applicable to a single employee with no dependent allowances. Employees with a current exempt status (as of PP 26-91) will receive a message on their earning statements for PPs 03-92 and 04-92 telling them a new Form W-4 is required.

Both first-time exemptions and renewals of 1991 are processed as employees submit Forms W-4. Employees should submit their Forms W-4 as soon as possible to avoid processing delays. If exemption renewals are not processed by PP 04-92, retroactive federal tax adjustments will not be made.

1992 PAY DATES, ORGANIZATION DUES, AND LEAVE YEAR

The following chart lists the pay periods for 1992. Asterisks indicate the pay period in which union and employee organization dues are deducted. National Association of Letter Carriers (NALC), American Postal Workers Union (APWU), Postal Police and Nurses' dues are withheld each pay period.

For the convenience of timekeepers, the biweekly pay periods are divided into 2 weeks and indicate the beginning and ending dates for each week.

The leave year always begins with the first day of the first full pay period in the calendar year. The chart below indicates that the 1992 leave year begins Pay Period 3, January 11, 1992, and extends for 1 year or 26 full pay periods, ending January 8, 1993 (Pay Period 1, 1993).

- Determine normal biweekly gross wages from earnings statement.
- Determine normal biweekly Thrift Savings Plan (TSP) deduction from earnings statement.

- 3. Multiply the number of exemptions claimed by the new exemption value, \$88.46. (The federal tax line on the earnings statement shows the number of exemptions claimed. Examples: \$1=single with one exemption, M2=married with two exemptions.)
- 4. Subtract the amount in (2) and (3) from the amount of gross biweekly wages in (1). This figure is the amount subject to withholding tax.

Example

A Federal Employees Retirement System (FERS) employee with a 10 percent Thrift Savings Plan (TSP) contribution is paid \$1,600 gross biweekly wages. The earnings statement shows M3 on the federal tax line. Using the table, the employee can check the amount for federal tax as follows:

LETTER CARRIER/MOTOR VEHICLE UNIFORM

The following new apparel items have been added to the letter carrier and motor vehicle service uniform redesign program and will be available for purchase by those eligible employees covered under the regular uniform program (ELM 932.11).

Items for Women

Maternity Blouse—Long sleeve, short sleeve, postal blue with red and blue pinstripes, logo.

Maternity Slack—All season weight, postal blue.

Maternity Jumper—Princess style, V-neckline,
postal blue with U.S. Mail logo, to be worn with
authorized blouse and neckwear.

Items for Men and Women

Jacket—Bomber style, postal navy, nylon, cordura/taslan coated fabric, with zip-in and zip-out liner, reflective trim, logo. The jacket replaces the traditional Ike-style jacket and windbreaker.

Craft Tabs—Craft tabs for letter carrier, motor vehicle, and special delivery will be worn only on the uniform jacket.

Eligible employees may purchase the above items as reimbursable authorized items, effective February 3, 1992. They may place orders before February 3. However, they may not be delivered as authorized items or reimbursement for purchase claimed until the effective date.

Window Clerk Uniform

The following new apparel items complete the window clerk uniform redesign project. The items are available for purchase by those eligible employees covered under the regular uniform program (ELM 932.11).

Items for Women

Jumper—Princess style, V-neckline, all-season weight, worn with or without coordinated fabric belt, postal navy with logo, to be worn with authorized blouse and neckwear.

Maternity Jumper—Princess style, V-neckline, all season weight, postal navy with logo, to be worn with authorized blouse and neckwear.

LETTER CARRIER/MOTOR VEHICLE UNIFORM—Continued

Maternity Blouse—Long sleeve, short sleeve, postal white with navy blue pinstripes, logo.

Maternity Slack—All-season weight, postal navy. Eligible employees may purchase the above items as reimbursable authorized items, effective February 3, 1992. However, they may not be delivered as authorized items or reimbursement for purchase claimed until the effective date.

Old Uniform Wearout Periods

Window Clerk. As previously announced, employees authorized to wear the window service uniform must be fully outfitted in the new uniform by November 1, 1992. The old uniform items may not be worn after that date.

Letter Carrier/Motor Vehicle. The wearout period for components of the old delivery/motor vehicle uniform will be phased out effective December 1, 1993. Effective that date, employees must be fully outfitted in the new uniform.

- -Hours of service (window and post office box).
- -Letter drops and dispatch times.
- -Services offered at window positions.
- -Emergency contacts when office is closed.
- —Manager on duty.

The above are available from the materiel distribution centers (MDCs).

*These items are not available from the MDCs for the reasons indicated: Poster 75 is available through field directors, marketing and communications; Notice 100-ABC is currently out of stock; Notice 72 and Olympic decals for lobby doors were shipped on automatic distribution and are not currently available. Signs indicating hours and other services must be procured locally.

Note: Poster 105, Express Mail Acceptance Office, is obsolete.

Rotating Displays. The January schedule of lobby displays, shipped on automatic distribution, follows. Some offices may have insufficient space or fixtures to display all postings. To avoid a cluttered appearance, post only a few at a time, rotating them more frequently. Consider featuring two posters each week.

Postal Bulletin 21795, 8-8-91, announced changes to the required depth of ZIP + 4 code for automation-based rates. This article clarifies the required level of ZIP + 4 coding in that Bulletin article.

The examples provided illustrate the required levels of coding for apartment or suite numbers, firm names (in multitenant buildings), rural routes or highway contract routes being tested in the Coding Accuracy Support System (CASS) address matching software certification program. It also contains examples of standardized address formats.

Apartment or Suite Numbers and Firm Names

Use of Apartment or Suite Numbers. Mailpieces containing addresses without apartment or suite numbers will continue to be eligible for automationbased rates provided the ZIP + 4 code or barcode represents the building code when available. Mandatory use of apartment or suite numbers is postponed until new corrective approaches have been tested. To allow a thorough review of the effectiveness of those approaches, the Postal Service has postponed implementation of mandatory apartment number usage until at least September 1993. However, it is recommended that apartment or suite numbers be used, when available, to facilitate the carrier's delivery. For those addresses where apartment or suite numbers are not available, only building ZIP + 4 codes are acceptable (see Figure I, Example 1).

Mailpieces containing addresses with apartment or suite numbers must be ZIP + 4 coded or barcoded to the finest level of ZIP + 4 code representing the secondary address information (see Figure I, Examples 2 and 3) in order to qualify for automation-based rates.

Use of Firm Names. If an input address contains a firm name assigned a unique ZIP + 4 code in the ZIP + 4 file and no more than one record for the firm exists at that address, the unique ZIP + 4 code for the firm must be used to qualify for automation-based rates (see Figure II, Example 4).

If the input firm name has not been assigned a unique ZIP + 4 code in the ZIP + 4 file and the apartment or suite number is included in the address, the ZIP + 4 code for the range in which the apartment or suite number appears must be used to qualify for automation-based rates (see Figure II, Example 5).

If the input firm name has not been assigned a unique ZIP + 4 code in the ZIP + 4 file and the apartment or suite number is not included in the address, the ZIP + 4 code assigned to the building must be used to qualify for automation compatible rates (see Figure II, Example 6).

Rural Route/Highway Contract Route and Box Number

Mailpieces with rural route or highway contract route addresses, containing a rural or highway contract route number but no box number, is eligible for automation-based rates if they contain the ZIP + 4 code or ZIP + 4 barcode for the rural or highway contract route (see Figure III, Example 7).

Mailpieces with rural route or highway contract route addresses containing box number information is eligible for automation-based rates, only if they contain the ZIP + 4 code or ZIP + 4 barcode representing the range for that box number contained in the ZIP + 4 file (see Figure III, Example 8).

Address Standardization

There are two components of address standardization—standardization of address elements and standardization of address format for output addresses on mailpieces. Address format standardization is recommended for ZIP + 4 barcode rates and required for ZIP + 4 rates. Standardization of address elements is recommended but not required for any automation-based rate.

Standardization of Address Elements

Standardization of address elements (e.g., directionals, suffixes, etc.) is recommended but not required for mailpieces to qualify for automation-based rates (see Figure IV, Example 9).

Address elements can be fully spelled out or abbreviated. If abbreviated, it is recommended (not required) that abbreviations be standardized as in the ZIP + 4 file (see Figure IV, Example 9).

If an input address is missing address elements (e.g., directionals, suffixes, etc.) but can be matched with only one record in the ZIP + 4 file, the address (with the ZIP + 4 code appended) can be used to qualify for automation based-rates (see Figure IV, Examples 10 and 11).

If an address contains a city or place name (spelled out or abbreviated) that can be matched with a city or place name listed in the Postal Service's current city/state file, the city or place name is acceptable on mailpieces for automation-based rate qualification. However, for CASS certification, the address matching software must return the standardized city or place name as found in the Postal Services city/state file. The mailer has the option of using the city name of the input address record in the mailpiece or the standardized city name returned by the address matching software. Use of the standardized name is preferred (see Figure IV, Example 12).

Standardization of Address Format for Output Addresses on Mailpieces

Standardization of address format for output addresses is required for mailpieces claimed at ZIP + 4 automation-based rates (see Example 13). This standardization is recommended but not required for mailpieces claimed at ZIP + 4 Barcode rates.

Address File Update With CASS Certified Software

Effective November 1, 1991, addresses on mailings submitted at automation-based (ZIP + 4 or ZIP + 4 barcoded) rates must have been produced from an address list ZIP + 4 coded using current CASS-certified address matching software and the current ZIP + 4 file on or after March 1, 1991. Having met this initial requirement, all lists must then be reprocessed using the current ZIP + 4 file, within 6 weeks of the quarterly release date, and current CASS-certified address matching software at least once each year thereafter.

CASS Certification Requirements

The requirement that all users of CASS-certified software must obtain individual CASS certification has changed. Users of vendor-supplied commercial software, with current CASS certification, may continue to use that software without obtaining individual CASS certification until at least March 1, 1992. This allows the Postal Service and the software vendor community time to develop new CASS certification methods for specific parameter settings (known as configurations) used in processing an address list. The new methods allow users of CASS-certified vendor supplied address matching software continued coverage under the blanket CASS certification of the software vendor when the software is used in configurations for which the vendor has obtained CASS certification. If the software is used in other configurations, for which the vendor has not obtained CASS certification, the user must obtain individual CASS certification for those configurations.

CASS-certified software is required to return a standardized address (based on the ZIP + 4 record to which the original address was matched) to ensure ZIP + 4 codes represent the proper depth of code. Original input addresses may also be returned at the customer's discretion.

Figure I—Use of Apartment or Suite Numbers

The examples of the required levels of coding for apartment or suite numbers use the following sample records from the ZIP + 4 national file. S indicates a street or blockface record. H a building record, F a firm record, and RR a rural route record. Refer to these sample records when examining Examples 1-3.

Figure II—Use of Firm Names

S indicates a street or blockface record, H a building record, F a firm record, and RR a rural route record. Refer to these sample records when examining Examples 4-6.

WRONG, OR STALE, METER DATES

When postage meter dates are not advanced to the next, or current, business date before the start of that day's business, the result is a wrong date, or stale meter date, on originating mail. Stale meter dates contribute to customer complaints about poor service and reflect adversely on USPS operations performance measurement (ODIS).

Most mail identified as bearing stale meter dates can be traced to private postage meter holders. All divisions and management sectional centers (MSCs) should have an ongoing program to spot check for stale date meter mail and to initiate corrective followup action with the mailer.

Such quality assurance programs to identify wrong meter dates have also determined that some

stale meter dates originate from postal-owned postage meters. At times, postal employees (usually window clerks) do forget and neglect to advance the date on USPS postage meters to the next (or current) business date. As a service-oriented organization, all postal employees (supervisory and clerical) must be more alert to this problem and assist in preventing postal-caused stale meter dates.

Before post offices and retail windows open for business, a supervisor or designated clerk should check all postage meters and round date stamps to ensure that personnel have changed dates to the current date.




