

Supply. All post offices including those with authorized philatelic centers will receive their standard automatic distribution quantities for a 40-subject commemorative stamp rounded to the nearest carton lot size. Since a private company, Stamp Venturers, Inc., is the contractor for this stamp, the Bureau of Engraving and Printing will not honor supplemental requisitions for Item 4419.

Regional accountable paper depositories (RAPDs) have no backup stock for filling supplemental orders. Associate offices requiring additional stamps should requisition them from their stamp distribution offices (SDOs) using Form 17-A, Accountable Items Requisition From Stamp Distribution Office.

Before requisitioning additional stock, post offices should consider that they must deplete the stock in 60 days or before May 30, 1993, except at authorized philatelic centers. (It is Postal Service policy to sell commemorative issues at all regular windows for 60 days from the first day of issue.)

PROCESSING FORM 4314–C, CONSUMER SERVICE CARD

A detailed study of the Consumer Service Card process revealed several problems. Therefore, employees are reminded that the following procedures apply regarding Form 4314-C, Consumer Service Card. (See exhibit below.)

Completing the Form

- 1. The Customer completes Form 4314-C, retains copy 1, and either gives the form to a postal employee or mails it, following the directions on the top of copy 1.
- 2. The Employee completes Form 4314-C when a customer comment is received over the telephone, in person, or by letter. A Consumer Service Card is completed only when followup action must be taken or the comment or complaint must be referred elsewhere for action or resolution.

Processing the Form

Employees follow the procedures below:

- 1. Verifies that information on the card includes card number (upper right-hand corner of card), customer name, state, ZIP Code, and card date, and is legible on all parts.
- 2. Carefully separates and sends copy 2 to the St. Louis Consumer Service Card Unit on the date the completed Form 4314-C is received from a customer or a card is completed by a postal employee. (Note: Do not hold copy 2 waiting for action to be taken).
- 3. Completes necessary action within 14 calendar days, except when a publication watch is required.

- 4. Enters action taken and the date action was completed under USPS Use Only section of copy 3.
- 5. Carefully separates and sends copy 3 to the Consumer Service Card Unit on the date action is completed. (Note: No Consumer Service Card action is completed until copy 3 is sent to the St. Louis Consumer Service Card Unit).
- 6. Sends both copy 2 and 3 to the Consumer Service Card Unit on the same day *only if* followup action is completed on the same day the comment is received.
 - 7. Files copy 4 locally.


Mailing

- 1. Do not staple cards or include attachments, such as letters. Document all relevant information in the appropriate sections of the card.
- 2. Do not fold the card. Use a Postal Service penalty envelope measuring 6½ inches x 9½ inches or larger.
- 3. Divide copies 2 and 3 into separate batches. Mail both batches in one envelope each day to:

DMM Revision

ALTERNATE PREPARATION OPTION FOR FLAT-SIZE ZIP + 4 BARCODED RATE MAILINGS

Current rules for qualification of a flat-size ZIP + 4 barcoded rate mailing require that at least 85 percent of the pieces in the mailing bear the correct ZIP + 4 bar code or delivery point bar code. Some mailers who qualify a significant portion of their flat-size mailings at the carrier route level have said that this creates a problem for them because they are unable to meet the 85 percent requirement on the noncarrier route portion of their flat-size mailings due to the disproportionate number of uncodable addresses in that portion of their mailing job.

To meet the concerns of these mailers, the Postal Service is offering a new optional method for preparing flat-size bar-coded rate mailings. When this new preparation option is used there is no requirement for 85 percent of the pieces in each mailing to bear a ZIP + 4 or delivery point bar code.

Instead, the new optional preparation method will require a finer sort at the five-digit package level by requiring separate preparation of five-digit packages that contain 100 percent ZIP + 4 barcoded or delivery point bar-coded pieces and five-digit packages that do not contain any bar-coded pieces. This preparation option will also require suppression of bar code printing on pieces in non-bar coded five-digit packages—no ZIP + 4, delivery point, or five-digit bar codes may be printed on the mailpieces.

Pieces in nonbar-coded, five-digit packages are not eligible for bar-coded rates, even though those pieces contain addresses that were successfully matched using CASS certified software. Both bar-coded, five-digit packages (that may contain only ZIP + 4 bar codes or delivery point bar codes) and nonbar-coded five-digit packages must contain a minimum of 10 pieces in First- and third-class mailings, and a minimum of six pieces in second-class mailings. All pieces in optional city (second-class only), three-digit, SCF, and residual packages, however, must continue to bear a bar code (ZIP + 4 bar code, delivery point bar code, or five-digit bar code) as required under the 85 percent barcoded preparation option.

Requiring mailers to prepare pure ZIP + 4 barcoded or delivery point bar-coded five-digit packages and pure five-digit packages that do not bear any type of bar code will allow postal personnel to recognize nonbar-coded packages easily and direct them to the appropriate nonautomated incoming secondary sortation operations. This avoids the processing of such pieces on an incoming secondary scheme on the bar-code sorter only to have them rejected and subsequently processed in mechanized or manual operations.

This new preparation method is optional. Mailers may also continue to prepare flat-size barcoded rate mailings under the current 85/15 prep-

aration requirements in DMM 573 without any change.

This notice also revises pallet label requirements for second- and third-class copalletized flat-size bar coded rate and carrier route presort rate mailings. The provisions for such labels are deleted from Domestic Mail Manual (DMM) 445.2 since such second-class mailings must be prepared only under DMM 445.3. The abbreviation for carrier routes is changed from CAR RTS to CR-RTS to make it consistent with previous pallet labeling requirements. Language is added to allow preparation of second-class SDC packages under DMM 445.3 when optional SDC pallets are prepared. The pallet preparation requirements are also revised to specify that residual packages in second- and thirdclass flat-size ZIP + 4 bar coded rate mailings must not be placed on pallets (they must be sacked and may be presented with the palletized portion of the mailing).

The following DMM revisions are effective immediately and the next issue of the DMM will include them.

Chapter 3 First-Class Mail

325 ZIP + 4 Barcoded Rate

325.12 Flat-Size Mailings. Presorted flat-size ZIP + 4 Barcoded rate mailings must meet the requirements in 513 and 516. The rate eligibility criteria for flat-size mailings presorted under 573 are in 571.1. The rate eligibility criteria for flat-size mailings presorted under 578 are in 571.2.

Chapter 4 Second-Class Mail

424.6 Rate Eligibility ZIP + 4 Barcoded Rates

424.62 Mailings of Flat-Size Pieces. Flat-size ZIP + 4 Barcoded rate mailings must meet the requirements in 513 and 516, including preparation under 570. The rate eligibility criteria for mailings presorted under 573 are in 571.1. The rate eligibility criteria for mailings presorted under 578 are in

571.2.

445.2 Packages and Bundles Presented on Pallets

.

445.223 Sortation

a. Mailers must presort copies and secure them into packages as required in 441.2, 443.2, and

444.2 as applicable for the rate claimed in mailings at nonautomation-based rates. For flat-size barcoded rate mailings mailers must presort copies and secure them into packages as provided in 573.12 through 573.16 or 578.12 through 578.17, as applicable. Mailers are urged to prepare optional SCF packages for palletized mailings at nonautomation-based rates. Preparation of SCF packages is required for flat-size barcoded rate mailings (see 573.152 or 578.162).

e. State and mixed states packages or bundles for nonautomation-based rate mailings and, for flat-size barcoded rate mailings, residual packages or bundles, must not be included in the palletized portion of a mailing. Mailers must sack state and mixed states packages and bundles under 441.316 and 441.317. Mailers must package and sack residual pieces in a flat-size barcoded rate mailing under 573.272, 573.273, or 578.3.

445.224 Labels. (Insert existing 445.224. In the first sentence, revise the references 573.16 and 573.27 to read 573.16 and 573.27 or 578.3.)

445.23 Optional Bundle Preparation

445.233 Sortation. Mailers may consolidate packages into bundles in the same manner as sacks are prepared (see 441.31, 443.31, 444.31, 573.22 through 573.24, or 578.2). Copies for SCF and SDC destinations must be prepared into packages only. Bundles for foreign destinations must not be prepared. Foreign packages must not be placed on pallets and must be sacked. (See International Mail Manual 244.52.) Mailers must not include bundles for state and mixed states destinations in the palletized portion of the mailing. Mailers must sack bundles for state and mixed states destinations in accordance with 441.316 and 441.317 (see also 445.25). Residual pieces in flat-size barcoded rate mailings must not be included in the palletized portion of a mailing, but must be packaged and sacked under 573.272, 573.273, or 578.3.

445.234 Labels. (Revise the references in the first sentence to read as follows: 441.312, 441.313, 443.312, 443.313, 444.31b, 573.23, or 573.244.)

445.24 Pallet Preparation

445.243 Labels

d. Additional Information. (In current 445.243d, delete the next to last sentence.)

445.25 Presentation of Mailings. (Revise the phrase "containing packages for state or mixed states destinations:" to "containing packages for state, mixed states, or residual destinations.")

445.3 Copalletization of Multiple Second-Class Publications

445.32 Package Preparation

445.323 Sortation

a. Mailers must presort copies and secure them into packages as required in 441.2, 443.2, 444.2, (nonautomation-based rates), or 573.1, or 578.1 (flat-size barcoded rates), as applicable for the rates claimed. Flat-size ZIP + 4 barcoded rate mailings prepared under 573.1 or 578.1 may only be copalletized with other flat-size ZIP + 4 barcoded rate mailings, or with carrier route rate mailings as described under 576.4. Mailers are urged to prepare optional SCF packages for palletized mailings at nonautomation-based rates (preparation of SCF packages is required for flat-size barcoded rate mailings—see 573.152 or 578.162). SDC packages are permitted only in nonautomation-based rate mailings and may be included in the copalletized portion of a mailing only if optional SDC pallets are prepared under 445.342f. State and mixed states packages (nonautomated mailings) and residual packages (flat-size ZIP + 4 barcoded rate mailings) not be included in the copalletized portion of a mailing. Mailers must sack state and mixed states packages and bundles under 441.316 and 441.317. Mailers must package and sack residual pieces in a flat-size barcoded rate mailing under 573.272, 573.273, or 578.3. Packages containing fewer than six pieces must also be sacked (see 445.322). Packages that cannot be placed on a permissible level of pallet (5-digit, multicoded city, 3-digit, SCF, or optional SDC) must also be sacked under the requirements for the presort level rate claimed (see 445.342f and 445.35).

445.324 Labels. (In the first sentence, revise the reference 573.27 to read 573.27 or 578.3)

445.33 Optional Bundle Preparation

445.333 Sortation. Mailers may consolidate packages that are to be placed on pallets into bundles in the same manner as sacks are prepared (see 441.31, 443.31, 444.31, 573.22 through 573.24, or 578.2). Pieces for SCF destinations and SDC destinations (if optional SDC pallets are prepared under 445.342e) must be prepared into packages only

Bundles for foreign destinations must not be prepared. Foreign packages must not be placed on pallets and must be sacked. (See *International Mail Manual* 244.52.) Mailers must not prepare bundles for state and mixed states destinations. Mailers must sack packages for state and mixed state destinations under 441.316 and 441.317 (see also 445.35). Bundles of residual pieces in flat-size barcoded rate mailings must not be prepared. Mailers must package and sack residual pieces in a flat-size barcoded rate mailing under 573.272, 573.273, or 578.3.

445.334 Labels. (Revise the references in the first sentence to read as follows: 441.312, 441.313, 443.312, 443.313, 444.31b, 573.23, or 573.244.)

445.34 Pallet Preparation for Copalletized Flat-Size Mail

445.343 Labels

d. Additional Information. (Revise the last two sentences to read as follows: Pallets containing flat-size barcoded rate mailings prepared under 576 must show the word BARCODED on the contents line of the pallet label. Pallets containing copalletized barcoded rate and carrier route presort rate mailings prepared under 576.43 must show the words BARCODED/CARRIER ROUTES (or BARCODED/CR-RTS) on the contents line of the pallet label. The word BARCODED must not be abbreviated on the contents line.)

445.35 Presentation of Mailings. Sacks containing packages for SDC, state, mixed states, or residual destinations, or containing packages remaining after all possible pallets are prepared, may be presented with and included on the same mailing statement as the palletized portion of the mailing if the sacks are physically segregated from the palletized portion of the mailing.

445.4 Palletizing Sacks

445.433 Sortation. (Add or 578.2 and 578.3. to the first sentence. Revise the second sentence to read as follows: Mixed states sacks and, for flat-size barcoded rate mailings, residual sacks, must not be included in the palletized portion of a mailing.)

Chapter 5 Automation-Compatible Mail

516 Requirements for Flat-Size ZIP + 4 Barcoded Rate Mailings

516.1 Rate Eligibility. Only mailpieces bearing a correct ZIP + 4 barcode or delivery point barcode and otherwise meeting the eligibility requirements of 516 can qualify for flat-size ZIP + 4 Barcoded rates. Five-digit barcoded pieces can qualify for presort rates or (in the residual portion of First-Class mailings only) single-piece rates. Nonbarcoded pieces in nonbarcoded 5-digit packages prepared under 578 can qualify for presort rates. Eligibility for specific rates differs based on the class of mail, the presort option used (573 or 578) and the level of presort (and for First-Class Mail, whether the nonpresorted flat-size ZIP + 4 Barcoded rate option is used). Specific rate eligibility for presorted flat-size ZIP + 4 Barcoded rate mailings is found in 571.1 for mailings presorted under 573 and in 572.2 for mailings presorted under 578. Specific rate eligibility for First-Class nonpresorted ZIP + 4 Barcoded rate mailings is in 577.1.

516.3 Required Percentage of ZIP + 4 Barcoded or Delivery Point Barcoded Pieces

516.31 Mailings Presorted under 573. (Insert text of current 516.3)

516.32 Mailings Presorted Under 578. There is no required percentage of ZIP + 4 barcoded or delivery point barcoded pieces for the entire mailing. Pieces within 5-digit packages must either be 100% ZIP + 4 barcoded (or delivery point barcoded) or 100% nonbarcoded. In nonbarcoded 5-digit packages barcodes are not permitted (neither delivery point, ZIP + 4, nor 5-digit barcodes). All pieces in other packages must bear either the correct delivery point barcode, ZIP + 4 barcode, or 5digit barcode for the address. Except for pieces within a 100% nonbarcoded 5-digit package as described in 578.13, pieces that do not bear a correct and properly prepared delivery point barcode, ZIP + 4 barcode, or 5-digit barcode, are not permitted in the mailing. The delivery point barcode, ZIP + 4barcode, or 5-digit barcode must be the correct barcode for the delivery address obtained using Coding Accuracy Support System (CASS) certified ZIP + 4 or delivery point address matching software under 530, and must meet the requirements of 551 or 552, as applicable.

516.6 Presort and Documentation

516.61 First-Class Flat-Size ZIP + 4 Barcoded Rate Mailings

516.611 Presorted ZIP + 4 Barcoded Rates. All pieces in each mailing must be presorted together to the finest extent under 572 and either 573 or 578. The documentation requirements in 574 or 575 must also be met.

516.62 Second- and Third-Class Flat-Size ZIP + 4 Barcoded Rate Mailings. All pieces in each mailing must be presorted together to the finest extent under 572 and either 573 or 578. Alternatively, mailings may be palletized under 576. All mailings must be documented under 574 or 575. Additional documentation may be required for palletized mailings.

571.211 5-Digit and 3-Digit Packages. Pieces bearing a ZIP + 4 barcode or delivery point barcode in 5-digit packages prepared under 578.12 (100% ZIP + 4 barcoded or delivery point barcoded) or in 3-digit packages under 578.15 can qualify for the 3/5 flat-size ZIP + 4 Barcoded rate in 313.5 if they are properly sacked under 578.2. Nonbarcoded pieces in 5-digit packages prepared under 578.13 and the 5-digit barcoded pieces in 3-digit packages prepared under 578.15 can qualify for the Presorted First-Class rate in 313.222, if the packages are properly sacked under 578.2.

571.212 SCF Packages. Pieces bearing a ZIP + 4 barcode or a delivery point barcode in SCF packages prepared under 578.16 and properly sacked under 578.2 can qualify for the nonpresorted ZIP + 4 Barcoded flats rate in 312.23. 5-digit barcoded pieces in these packages can qualify for the single-piece First-Class rates in 311.2

piece First-Class rates in 311.2. **571.213 Residual Packages.**

571.213 Residual Packages. Pieces bearing a ZIP + 4 barcode or delivery point barcode in a residual package prepared under 578.3 can qualify for the nonpresorted ZIP + 4 Barcoded flats rate in 312.23. The 5-digit barcoded pieces in these packages can qualify for the single piece First-Class rates in 311.2.

571.22 Second-Class Mailings

571.221 5-Digit Packages of Six or More Pieces. Pieces bearing a ZIP + 4 barcode or a delivery point barcode in a 5-digit package of six or more pieces prepared under 578.12 (100% ZIP + 4 barcoded or delivery point barcoded) that are properly sacked or palletized under 578.2 or 576 can qualify for the level B5/H5/J5 flat-size ZIP + 4 Barcoded rates. Nonbarcoded pieces in 5-digit packages of six or more pieces prepared under 578.13 can qualify for the B5/H5/J5 presort rates. See 411.2 and 411.3. 5-digit packages of less than 6 pieces are not permitted.

571.222 Optional City and Unique 3-digit Packages of Six or More Pieces. Pieces bearing a ZIP + 4 barcode or delivery point barcode in an optional city package of 6 or more pieces prepared under 578.14, or in a unique 3-digit package of six or more pieces prepared under 578.15, and properly sacked or palletized under 578.2 or 576 can qualify for the B3/H3/J3 flat-size ZIP + 4 Barcoded rates. 5-digit barcoded pieces in these optional city or unique 3-digit packages of six or more pieces can qualify for the B3/H3/J3 presort rate. See 411.2 and 411.3.

571.223 Nonunique 3-Digit and SCF Packages. Pieces bearing a ZIP + 4 barcode or delivery point barcode in a nonunique 3-digit package prepared under 578.15 or in an SCF package prepared under 578.16 that are properly sacked or palletized under 578.2 or 576 can qualify for the A/G/J1 flat-size ZIP + 4 Barcoded rates. 5-digit barcoded pieces in these nonunique 3-digit or SCF packages can qualify for the A/G/J1 presort rate. See 411.2 and 411.3.

571.224 5-Digit, Optional City, and Unique 3-Digit Packages of Less Than Six Pieces. 5-digit packages of less than six pieces are not permitted (see 578.12 and 578.13). Pieces bearing a ZIP + 4 barcode or delivery point barcode in an optional city or unique 3-digit package of less than six pieces prepared under 578.14 or 578.15 and properly sacked or palletized under 573.2 or 576 can qualify for the A/G/J1 flat-size ZIP + 4 Barcoded rates. 5-digit barcoded pieces in these optional city or unique 3-digit packages can qualify for the A/G/J1 presort rate (see 411.2 and 411.3).

571.225 Residual Packages. Pieces bearing a ZIP + 4 barcode or delivery point barcode in a residual package prepared under 578.3 can qualiff for the A/G/J1 flat-size ZIP + 4 barcoded rates. 5 digit barcoded pieces in these pacakges can qualiff for the A/G/J1 presort rate (see 411.2 and 411.3)

571.23 Third-Class Mailings

571.231 5-Digit and 3-Digit Packages. Pieces bearing a ZIP + 4 barcode or delivery point barcode in 5-digit packages prepared under 578.12 (100% ZIP + 4 barcoded or delivery point barcoded) or prepared in 3-digit packages under 578.15 that are properly sacked or palletized under 578.2 or 576 can qualify for the 3/5 flat-size ZIP + 4 Barcoded rate. Nonbarcoded pieces in 5-digit packages prepared under 578.13 and 5-digit barcoded pieces in 3-digit packages prepared under 578.15 can qualify for the 3/5 presort rate.

571.232 SCF Packages. Pieces bearing a ZIP + 4 barcode or a delivery point barcode in SCF packages prepared under 578.16 that are properly sacked or palletized under 578.2 or 576 can qualify for the basic flat-size ZIP + 4 Barcoded rate. 5-digit barcoded pieces in these packages can qualify for the basic presort rate.

571.233 Residual Packages. Pieces bearing a ZIP + 4 barcode or delivery point barcode in a residual package prepared under 578.3 can qualify for the basic flat-size ZIP + 4 barcoded rate. 5-digit barcoded pieces in these packages can qualify for the basic presort rate.

571.3 Nonpresorted First-Class Mailings. *See 577.1*.

572.14 Labeling Packages

572.141 Standard Package Labeling. Except when optional endorsement lines are used under 572.142, the correct pressure-sensitive label required by 573.1 or 578.1, or a facing slip required by 573.16 and 573.27, or 578.17 and 578.3, or 577, must be firmly affixed on the address side of the top piece in each package next to the address label.

576.2 Pallet Preparation

576.22 Residual Mail. Residual packages (see 573.16, 573.27, or 578.3) must not be placed on pallets. This mail must be packaged and sacked under 573.27 or 578.3 and presented with the palletized portion of the mailings.

rate mailings are palletized, the contents line of the pallet label must include the class and category (2C FLATS, NEWS FLATS, or 3C FLATS) followed by the word "BARCODED." See Exhibit 576.43. For more information concerning pallet labels, see 445.24 and 664.14 as applicable. 576.3 Package Preparation. Packages presented on pallets must be prepared under 572.1 and either 573.1 or 578.1.

576.4 Copalletizing

576.41 General. Flat-size ZIP+4 Barcoded rate mailings may only be copalletized with other flat-size ZIP+4 Barcoded rate mailings or with carrier route mailings (including walk-sequence).

576.42 Copalletizing Multiple Flat-Sized Barcoded Rate Mailings

576.421 General. Second-class mailers may copalletize multiple flat-size barcoded rate mailings as provided in 424.86, 445.3, 576.2 and 576.3. Third-class mailers may copalletize multiple flat-size barcoded rate mailings as provided in 576.2, 576.3, and 644.18.

576.43 Copalletizing ZIP+4 Barcoded Rate and Carrier Route Presort Rate Mailings

576.431 General. Flat-size barcoded rate mailings may be copalletized with carrier route presort rate mailings (including walk-sequence rate mailings) only when they are generated as part of the same mailings job as defined in 575.22. Second-class mailings must be prepared under the requirements for copalletized mailings under 424.86 and 445.3. Third-class mailings must be prepared under the requirements of 644.17 and 644.18. For both second- and third-class mailings, the requirements for 5-digit pallets in 576.432 and pallet labeling in 576.433 must be met.

576.432 5-Digit Pallet Preparation

576.433 Pallet Labels. 578.1 Package Sortation 578.11 General Requirements

578.111 Sequence. All pieces in the same presorted flat-size ZIP + 4 Barcoded rate mailing must be presorted together to the finest extent in the sequence and manner required by 578.12, 578.13, 578.14 (second-class only), 578.15, and 578.16. Firm packages are prohibited in a flat-size ZIP + 4 Barcoded rate mailing.

578.112 Package Size. (Copy section 573.112. Change the reference 573.12 through 573.15 to 578.12 through 578.16.)

578.12 Required 100% ZIP + 4 Barcoded or Delivery Point Barcoded 5-Digit Packages

578.121 First-Class Mail. When there are 10 or more ZIP + 4 barcoded or delivery point barcoded pieces for the same five-digit ZIP Code destination, they must be prepared in a five-digit package (or packages under 572.12 and 578.112) for that destination. Pieces that do not bear a ZIP + 4 barcode or a delivery point barcode are not permitted in these packages. A red D label must be placed on the top piece in the package or the correct five-digit optional endorsement line must be used (see 572.142). Groups of fewer than 10 ZIP + 4 barcoded or delivery point barcoded pieces must not be prepared as 100 percent barcoded five-digit packages.

578.122 Second-Class Mail. When there are six or more ZIP + 4 barcoded or delivery point barcoded pieces for the same five-digit ZIP Code destination, they must be prepared in a five-digit package (or packages as provided in 572.12 and 578.112) for that destination. Pieces that do not bear a ZIP + 4 barcode or a delivery point barcode are not permitted in these packages. A red D label must be placed on the top piece in the package or the correct five-digit optional endorsement line must be used (see 572.142). Groups of fewer than 6 ZIP + 4 barcoded or delivery point barcoded

pieces must not be prepared as 100% barcoded five-digit packages.

578.123 Third-Class Mail. When there are 10 or more ZIP + 4 barcoded or delivery point barcoded pieces for the same five-digit ZIP Code destination, they must be prepared in a five-digit package (or packages as provided in 572.12 and 578.112) for that destination. Pieces that do not bear a ZIP + 4 barcode or a delivery point barcode are not permitted in these packages. A red D label must be placed on the top piece in the package or the correct five-digit optional endorsement line must be used (see 572.142). Groups of fewer than 10 ZIP + 4 barcoded or delivery point barcoded pieces must not be prepared as 100% barcoded five-digit packages.

578.13 100% Nonbarcoded 5-Digit Packages

578.131 First-Class Mail. After preparing all possible five-digit packages of ZIP + 4 or delivery point barcoded pieces under 578.12, if there are 10 or more pieces remaining for the same five-digit ZIP Code destination, they must be prepared in a five-digit package (or packages as provided in 572.12 and 578.112) for that destination. All pieces in such packages must not bear a barcode (neither delivery point, ZIP + 4, nor five-digit barcodes are permitted). Barcode printing must be suppressed for all pieces in these packages even though the addresses were successfully matched using a CASS certified matching process. A red D label must be placed on the top piece in the package or the correct five-digit optional endorsement line must be used (see 572.142). Groups of fewer than 10 pieces for the same five-digit ZIP Code must not be prepared as nonbarcoded five-digit packages.

578.132 Second-Class Mail. After preparing all possible five-digit packages under 578.12, if there are 6 or more pieces remaining for the same fivedigit ZIP Code destination, they must be prepared in a five-digit package (or packages as provided in 572.12 and 578.112) for that destination. All pieces in such packages must not bear a barcode (neither delivery point, ZIP + 4, nor five-digit barcodes are permitted). Barcode printing must be suppressed for all pieces in these packages even though the addresses were successfully matched using a CASS certified matching process. A red D label must be placed on the top piece in the package or the correct five-digit optional endorsement line must be used (see 572.142). Groups of fewer than 6 pieces for the same five-digit ZIP Code must not be prepared as nonbarcoded five-digit packages.

578.133 Third-Class Mail. After preparing all possible 5-digit packages under 578.12, if there are 10 or more pieces remaining for the same 5-digit ZIP Code destination, they must be prepared in a five-digit package (or packages as provided in 572.12 and 578.112) for that destination. All pieces

in such packages must not bear a barcode (neither delivery point, ZIP + 4, nor 5-digit barcodes are permitted). Barcode printing must be suppressed for all pieces in these packages even though the addresses were successfully matched using a CASS certified matching process. A red "D" label must be placed on the top piece in the package or the correct five-digit optional endorsement line must be used (see 572.142). Groups of fewer than 10 pieces for the same five-digit ZIP Code must not be prepared as nonbarcoded five-digit packages.

578.14 Optional Multicoded City Packages (Second-Class Mail Only). After preparing packages under 578.12 and 578.13, if there are six or more addressed pieces for one of the multicoded cities listed in Exhibit 122.63a, they may be prepared in a multicoded city package (or packages as provided in 572.12 and 578.112) for that destination. A yellow "C" label must be placed on the top piece in the package or the correct multicoded city optional endorsement line must be used (see 572.142). Multicoded city packages may be prepared by the mailer on a selected basis. Groups of fewer than six pieces for a particular multicoded city destination may be prepared in optional multicoded city packages but do not qualify for level B3/H3/J3 flat-size ZIP — 4 Barcoded rates.

578.15 Required 3-Digit Packages

578.151 First-Class Mail. After preparing packages under 578.12 and 578.13, if there are 50 or more addressed pieces for the same 3-digit ZIP Code area, they must be prepared in a 3-digit package (or packages as provided in 572.12 and 578.112) for that destination. The destination facilities associated with all assigned 3-digit ZIP Code prefixes are in Exhibit 122.63b through Exhibit 122.63d. A green "3" label must be placed on the top piece in the package or the correct 3-digit optional endorsement line must be used (see 572.142). Groups of fewer than 50 pieces for a particular 3-digit ZIP Code destination in a mailing must not be prepared as 3-digit packages.

578.152 Second-Class Mail. After preparing packages under 578.12, 578.13, and 578.14, if there are six or more addressed pieces for the same 3-digit ZIP Code area, they must be prepared in a 3-digit package (or packages as provided in 572.12 and 578.112) for that destination. The destination facilities associated with all assigned 3-digit ZIP Code prefixes are in Exhibit 122.63b through Exhibit 122.63d. A green 3 label must be placed on the top piece in the package or the correct optional endorsement line must be used (see 572.142). Groups of fewer than six pieces for a particular 3-digit ZIP Code destination may be prepared in 3-digit packages, however, only pieces in packages of six or more addressed pieces for unique 3-digit ZIP

Codes qualify for level B3/H3/J3 ZIP + 4 Barcoded rates for flats.

578.153 Third-Class Mail. After preparing packages under 572.12 and 572.13, if there are 10 or more addressed pieces for the same 3-digit ZIP COde area, they must be prepared in a 3-digit package (or packages as provided in 572.12 and 578.112) for that destination. The destination facilities associated with all assigned 3-digit ZIP Code prefixes are in Exhibit 122.63b through Exhibit 122.63d. A green "3" label must be placed on the top piece in the package or the correct 3-digit optional endorsement line must be used (see 572.142). Groups of fewer than 10 pieces for a particular 3-digit ZIP Code destination must not be prepared as 3-digit packages.

578.16 Required SCF Packages

578.161 First-Class Mail. After preparing packages under 578.12, 578.13, and 578.15, if there are 10 or more addressed pieces for the same SCF destination, they must be prepared in an SCF package (or packages as provided in 572.12 and 578.112) for that destination. SCF destinations, for purposes of this section, and the ZIP Code ranges each serves, are in Exhibit 122.63d. A green "3" label must be placed on the top piece in the package or the correct SCF optional endorsement line must be used (see 572.142). Groups of fewer than 10 pieces for a particular SCF destination must not be prepared as SCF packages.

578.162 Second-Class. After preparing packages under 578.12 through 578.15, if there are six or more addressed pieces for the same SCF destination, they must be prepared in an SCF package (or packages as provided in 572.12 and 578.112) for that destination. SCF destinations, for purposes of this section, and the ZIP Code ranges each serves, are in Exhibit 122.63d. A green "3" label must be placed on the top piece in the package or the correct SCF optional endorsement line must be used (see 572.142). Groups of fewer than six pieces for a particular SCF destination may be prepared in SCF packages.

578.163 Third-Class. After preparing packages under 578.12, 578.13, and 578.15, if there are 10 or more addressed pieces for the same SCF destination, they must be prepared in an SCF package (or packages as provided in 572.12 and 578.112) for that destination. SCF destinations, for purposes of this section, and the ZIP Code ranges each serves, are in Exhibit 122.63d. A green "3" label must be placed on the top piece in the package or the correct SCF optional endorsement line must be used (see 572.142). Groups of fewer than 10 pieces for a particular SCF destination must not be prepared as SCF packages.

578.17 Required Residual Packages. After preparing packages under 578.12 through 578.16, all remaining pieces are residual and must be prepared under 578.27.

578.2 Sack Sortation. Packages prepared under 578.11 through 578.16 must be sacked under 573.21 through 573.26.

578.3 Required Residual Packaging and Sacking. Pieces remaining after preparing packages under 578.12 through 578.16 are residual. Residual pieces must be packaged and sacked under 573.272 or 573.273. Sacks must be labeled under 573.27. The physical separation option in 573.273 may be used only within mailings of identical-weight pieces.

Chapter 6 Third Class Mail

628.22 Mailings of Flat-Size Pieces. Flat-size ZIP + 4 Barcoded rate mailings must meet the requirements in 513 and 516. The rate eligibility criteria for mailings presorted under 573 are in 571.13. The rate eligibility criteria for mailings presorted under 578 are in 571.23.

644 Palletization

644.12 Package Preparation

644.123 Sortation

a. Packaging

(1) Automation Rate Mailings. Mailers must presort pieces and secure them into packages as required in 573.1 or 578.1, as applicable.

(2) Nonautomation Rate Mailings. Mailers must presort pieces and secure them into packages as required in 641.122a through 641.122e and 641.41. Although SCF packages are optional sacked mailings, it is strongly recommended that mailers prepare SCF packages for palletized mailings.

d. SDC, State, Mixed States and Residual Packages. State distribution center (SDC), state, and mixed states packages or bundles must not be included in the palletized portion of a nonautomation rate mailing. Residual packages must not be included in the palletized portion of a flat-size ZIP + 4 Barcoded rate mailing.

644.124 Package Labels. (Revise the first sentence to read as follows: Mailers must label packages with either pressure-sensitive labels under 572.141, 573.1 or 578.1 (flat-size ZIP + 4 Barcoded rate mailings) 641.122 a

through e, and 641.41 (nonautomation rate mailings), or the optional endorsement line under 572.142 or 642.)

644.13 Optional Bundle Preparation

Emergency Opening of Rotary Lock Pouches

The procedure for the emergency opening of rotary lock pouches follows. (See Handbook DM-901, Registered Mail, part 538.)

If the post office or other unit to which the pouch is addressed has no rotary lock key or a defective key, or if the rotary lock is damaged and cannot be opened, do not cut the leather strap. Instead, cut the side seam of the pouch, beginning about 6 inches from the bottom and extend upward only as far as necessary to remove the registers, but not closer than 6 inches from the top hem. Remove the pouch from service immediately if the pouch seam is cut or the leather strap is accidentally broken, cut, or otherwise damaged in opening. Endorse the coupon of the bill to show the action taken for every pouch removed from service under the above conditions, and return the coupon to the dispatching office. Send the empty pouch, and an explanatory note containing the lock number and the reason for opening, to the nearest mailbag depository. Immediately forward a copy of the explanatory note to the nearest Inspector-in-Charge.

Statement of Support for the Guard and Reserve

A Statement of Support for the Guard and Reserve appeared in *Postal Bulletin* 21826, 10-15-92 (page 21). Questions have arisen regarding the intent of Item 3 in the fourth paragraph, which states: Employees will be granted leaves of absence for military training in the Guard or Reserve, consistent with existing laws, without sacrifice of vacation.

Existing laws referenced in the statement are contained in the Veteran's Reemployment Rights Statute, Title 38, U.S. Code, Chapter 43. The laws protect veterans against loss of vacation benefits earned, but not received, before departure for military service. They do not entitle employees to earn leave during military leaves of absences.

Under the Postal Service leave policy, full-time career employees are credited at the beginning of the leave year with the annual leave they are expected to earn during the year. Leave is then earned each pay period based on an employee's leave category and the hours in a pay status. If 80 hours of nonpay status is accumulated during the year, leave credits are reduced by the amount of leave that would otherwise be earned in one pay period. No earned leave is lost; only the annual leave which had been advanced is reduced. Postal policy mirrors federal regulations in that an employee earns no leave while in a nonpay status.

Postal employees may choose to remain in a pay status during a period of military training by taking military leave if it is available or by taking annual leave already earned.—Employee Relations, 1-21-93

Counterfeit Currency Detectors

Various companies are attempting to sell marking pens to detect counterfeit currency. Prices for these pens range from \$2 to \$10 each. The pens apply a chemical to the suspect bill that leaves a color-coded mark indicating whether it is legitimate or counterfeit.

Postal managers should know that the pens are not foolproof and do not identify all forms of counterfeit currency. Counterfeit currency takes many forms including color photocopies; press-printed, altered bills; and bills made from pieces of other legitimate bills (cut/paste).

The best prevention is to know money. Employees should be familiar with the portraits on the different denominations and remember that a bill may portray no living person. If in doubt, compare the suspect bill to other bills. The paper should contain visible, interspersed red and blue fibers. The details of the printing should be clear and sharp.

Employees who receive counterfeit bills should not return them to the passer. They should delay the passer, if possible, without *jeopardizing their* safety, then:

- 1. Call the Inspection Service, police, or Secret Service.
- 2. Make a note of the passer's description, the description of any companion, and the licensee number of the vehicle used.
 - 3. Initial and date the bill.
- 4. Handle the bill as little as possible to preserve fingerprints and place it in a protective cover.
- 5. Surrender it only to a postal inspector, Secret Service agent, or the police.

DMM Revision

Secondary Address Designators

Effective immediately, *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) 534.233 is revised to allow adequate time to evaluate several methods of obtaining and matching secondary address designators required to achieve a match with the finest level of ZIP + 4 code. This notice removes the September 1993 date in DMM 534.233.

The Postal Service plans to require secondary address designators at a future date. In the interim, mailers should obtain secondary address designators for their address files.

This change will appear in the next issue of the DMM.

Note:

(Revise last sentence to read:) Following the evaluation of these efforts, the Postal Service will implement mandatory use of secondary address designators (apartment/suite numbers, etc.) at a later date.

NOTICE TO EMPLOYEES

Advance Earned Income Credit Payments

- 1. Do you expect your income to be less than \$22,370 for this year?
- 2. Do you expect to have a child living with you this year?
- 3. Did you have a job last year?

If you answer YES to both questions, ask your personnel office for Form W-5, Earned Income Credit Advance
Payment Certificate.

This form will let you know if you are eligible for the Earned Income Credit (EIC). If you want to get the EIC in advance, fill out the certificate at the bottom of Form W-5 and give it to your personnel office.

Unless you fill out Form W-5 and give it to your personnel office, you will not get any advance payment of the EIC. However, if you are eligible for the EIC and choose not to get advance payment, you can still claim the EIC on your annual income tax return.

Acceptance clerks: Use this table in conjunction with the integrated retail terminal (IRT) to determine

whether an APO/FPO ZIP Code is active and what conditions of mailing apply. For Express Mail Military Service availability, refer to Handbook PO-514, *Express Mail Military Service*, and the local EMMS directory.

The entire table appears in the second regularly scheduled *Postal Bulletin* of each month. Changes occurring between issues, as well as those that take effect with the monthly issuance, are highlighted in bold print.

Official mail from government agencies does not require a customs declaration or an exemption endorsement.
- B1. Form 2966-B is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents.
- B2. Form 2966-A is required except on official mail, which does not require customs declaration or exemption endorsement. The AAFES will furnish a computer listing of all items mailed from its activities to Philippine APOs. Other mail order companies must either use Form 2966-A on each item or provide computer lists. Computer listings must include a description of the items, the dollar value of the items, a complete address including the PSC box number and APO of the addressee, the date of mailing, the insurance or registry number, if applicable, and the serial number of any item over \$25 in value and any electrical item with a plug over \$15 in value.
- B3. Form 2966-A is required for mailing between MPOs. Prepaid mail from contractors addressed to a military organization for official use need not bear customs declaration, but must be endorsed, "Contents for Official Use-Exempt from Customs Requirement." Official mail from government agencies does not require customs declaration or exemption endorsement.
 - C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.
- C1. Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.
 - D. Coffee is prohibited.
- E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.
- E2. Any matter containing religious materials contrary to Islamic faith or depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited.
 - E3. Radio transceivers or cordless telephones are prohibited.
- F. Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definition of firearms in DMM 124.5. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies.
- F1. Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.
- F2. Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.
 - G. Only First-Class letters, second- and third-class mail is authorized.
- H. Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

- H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.
- L. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

- I1. This restriction does not apply to registered mail.
- 12. This restriction does not apply to official government mail marked MOM.
- K. Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail Section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."
 - L. All official mail is prohibited.
 - M. Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.
 - N. Registered mail is prohibited.
- O. Personal mail addressed to vessels using this number is limited to unregistered First-Class Mail and certified mail. Other classes of mail are prohibited.
 - P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.
- Q. Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.
- R. All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM part 124.42, are prohibited.
- T. Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.
- U. Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."
- U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 12 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Video tapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R regardless of weight.
- U2. Mail is limited to First-Class letters only when addressed to Box R.
- U3. Mail is limited to First-Class correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.
- W. Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, homs or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.
- X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 11 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.
- Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail only. All secondclass, third-class, and fourth-class mail (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

BAR CODE LOCATION

Correct placement of five-digit bar codes on letter-sized mail is necessary to allow Postal Service multiline optical character reader (MLOCR) and remote bar coding system (RBCS) equipment to append the bar code with the correct add-ons. Mailers must place the leftmost bar of the five-digit bar code between 4 1/8 and 4 1/4 inches from the right edge of the mailpiece. The location of the leftmost bar of a ZIP + 4 and a delivery point bar code placed in the lower right corner is more flexible since no field additions are necessary. The following Domestic Mail Manual (DMM) sections 551.23 and 552.31 printed below are reprinted as a further reminder of bar code location requirements.

551 ZIP + 4 or Delivery Point Barcode 551.23 Barcode Placement on Letter-Size Mail (Lower Right Corner)

551.231 a. First Bar Location. Within the barcode clear zone, the leftmost bar of the bar code must be located between 3½ inches and 4¼ inches from the right edge of the mailpiece (the horizontal

position of the bar code). The preferred start location is between 41/8 and 41/4 inches from the right edge of the mailpiece if printed directly on the mailpiece.

552 Five Digit Bar Code

552.3 Location on Letter-Size Mail

552.31 Printed Directly on Mailpieces. The fivedigit bar code printed directly on a mailpiece must be located on the mailpiece as required by 551.2. For bar codes located within the bar code clear zone, however, the leftmost bar of the bar code must be located between 41/8 and 41/4 inches from the right edge of the mailpiece (see exhibit 552.31).

Mailers and postal facilities should frequently check the location of bar code printing. This procedure requires immediate implementation.

AVAILABILITY OF TRAYS FOR LETTER-SIZE AUTOMATION RATE MAILINGS

Effective March 21, 1993, mailers must use one of the presort options in *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) 560 to prepare ZIP + 4, and ZIP + 4 barcoded rate mailings. All DMM 560 preparation options require the preparation of automation rate First-, second-, and third-class letter-size mail in trays. The new extended mail trays entering the system are to be provided exclusively to customers preparing letter-size automation rate mailings containing pieces larger than 4½ inches high or 10½ inches long.

Sufficient standard MM trays and extended MM trays should be in the system to satisfy customer traying needs. However, to cover the possibility of local tray shortages, the following provisions allowing the use of sacks instead of trays for presorted automation rate mailings are added to DMM 561.21 and 561.22. Mailers may also tray pieces exceeding 4½ inches high or 10½ inches long in standard MM trays when extended MM trays are not available, as provided in revised DMM 561.232 and 561.242. These provisions are effective immediately.

561.2 Trays 561.21 Use of Trays

561.211 Requirement. All letter-size mailings prepared under chapter 5 must be prepared in trays.

561.212 Limited Exception. When there are tray shortages, mailers may prepare automation rate mailings in sacks under the following conditions:

a. Mailers must provide a written statement with the sacked mailing certifying that trays were not available when the mailing was prepared.

- b. Mail must be placed in sacks on the same basis as mail would have been placed in trays under one of the package-based sortation options in 563, 565, 566, and 567, or under one of the First-Class non-presorted ZIP + 4 and ZIP + 4 Barcoded rate options in 569. For example, where tray breaks are indicated in presort software, the mail delineated by each tray break must be placed in a separate sack.
- c. All groups of 10 or more pieces to a five-digit ZIP Code and all groups of 50 or more pieces to a three-digit ZIP Code prefix must be packaged under 561.11. Use of separator cards is not permitted.
- d. Pieces in the residual/basic presort tier or mailed at nonpresorted First-Class automation-based rates under 569 that are prepared under the ZIP Code sequencing option must be placed in three-digit ZIP Code sequence and packaged under

561.11. Each package must measure as close to 4 inches in thickness as possible. Use of separator cards is not permitted.

e. Pieces in the residual/basic presort tier or mailed at nonpresorted First-Class automation-based rates under 569 that are prepared under the physical separation option must be prepared in packages under 561.11 that each measure as close to 4 inches in thickness as possible, and if the pieces are not of identical weight, each package except the last package must contain the same number of pieces. Use of separator cards is not permitted.

f. Pieces in nonpresorted First-Class automation-based rate mailings that are 100 percent ZIP + 4 coded or 100 percent ZIP + 4 or delivery point barcoded, and consist of either identical weight pieces or pieces having the exact postage affixed, must be prepared in packages measuring as close to 4 inches in thickness as possible under 561.11. Use of separator cards is not permitted.

561.22 Tray Size and Availability

561.221 Size. Only 2-foot standard MM letter trays or 2-foot extended MM trays may be used to prepare mailings under chapter 5. Extended MM trays may be used only for letter-size automation rate mailings of pieces larger than 4½ inches high or 10½ inches long.

561.222 Availability

- a. General. The USPS will provide the appropriate 2-foot trays and sleeves. Mailers may only use trays provided by the Postal Service.
- b. When Trays Are Not Available. If the USPS cannot provide enough trays for a mailing, mailers may place mail in sacks under 561.212. If there is a shortage of only extended MM trays, mailers may prepare the mailing of larger letter-size pieces in sacks under 561.212, or prepare the mailing in standard MM trays under the provisions in 561.23 and 561.24 for pieces exceeding the width or height of standard MM trays.

561.23 Placement of Pieces in Trays

561.231 Trays Containing Only Pieces Not Exceeding the Width of the Trays. (Insert current 561.231. Replace the last two sentences with the following:) Mailings containing pieces exceeding the height of standard MM trays must be placed in extended MM trays. If extended MM trays are not available, mailers must either sack the pieces under 561.212, or place the pieces in standard MM trays at an angle (tilted toward the unlabeled back end of the tray) so that the tray may be sleeved. See Exhibit 561.231a for pieces that fit standard MM or extended MM trays. See Exhibit 561.231b for pieces that exceed the height of standard MM trays, but are trayed in standard MM trays.

AVAILABILITY OF TRAYS FOR LETTER-SIZE AUTOMATION RATE MAILINGS— Continued

561.232 Standard MM Trays Containing Pieces Exceeding 10 1/2 Inches in Length.

- a. Use. Mailings containing pieces that exceed 10½ inches in length must be prepared in extended MM trays. If the extended MM trays are not available, mailers must either sack the mailing in accordance with 561.212, or tray the mailing in standard MM trays under 561.232b through 561.232d.
 - b. Placement of Pieces. (Insert current 561.232a.)
 - c. Full Trays. (Insert current 561.232b.)
- d. Pieces Exceeding Standard Tray Height. (Insert current 561.232c.)

561.24 Definition of Full Tray

561.241 Standard and Extended MM Trays Containing Pieces Not Exceeding Height or Width of Trays. (Insert existing text of 561.241.)

561.242 Standard MM Trays Containing Pieces Exceeding 4 1/2 Inches High or 10 1/2 Inches Long

- a. Use. Mailings containing pieces exceeding 10½ inches in length must be prepared in extended MM trays. If the extended MM trays are not available, mailers must either sack the mailing under 561.212, or tray the mailing in standard MM trays as provided in 561.232b through 561.232d. When pieces exceeding 4½ inches high or 10½ inches long are placed in standard MM trays, these trays are considered to be full under 561.24b through 561.24d.
- b. Pieces Exceeding Width of Standard MM Trays But Not Height. (Insert text of current 561.242.)
- c. Pieces Exceeding Height of Standard MM Trays But Not Width. (Insert text of current 561.243.)
- d. Pieces Exceeding Both Height and Width of Standard MM Trays. (Insert text of current 561.244.)

The Bureau of Engraving and Printing manufactured this pane of 50 stamps. Customers have 30 days to obtain the first day of issue postmark by mail. The easiest way is to purchase the new stamps

at the local post office, affix the stamps to envelopes of choice, address the envelopes (to one's self or others), insert a card of postcard thickness, tuck in the flap, and place the envelopes in a larger envelope addressed to:

Once the first day of issue postmark is applied, the envelopes will be returned through the mail. There is no charge for the postmark.

Customers who wish the Postal Service to affix stamps (to a maximum of 50 envelopes) should send self-addressed envelopes and 29 cents per stamp, in check or money order to:

All orders must be postmarked by March 10.

Supply. Post offices with authorized philatelic centers will receive their standard automatic distributions. All other post offices will receive half their standard automatic distribution quantities for a 50-subject commemorative stamp furnished on their standard distributions, rounded to the nearest carton lot size. The Bureau of Engraving and Printing (BEP) will not honor supplemental requisitions for **Item 4416**.

Accountable paper depositories (APDs) will receive limited quantities of this stamp for filling supplemental orders. Stamp distribution offices (SDOs) requiring additional stamps must order them from their APDs using separate Forms 17-A, Accountable Items Requisition From Stamp Distribution Office. All other post offices requiring additional stamps should immediately requisition them from their SDOs on separate Forms 17-A.

Before requisitioning additional stamps, post offices should consider that they must deplete the stock in 60 days or before April 12, 1993, except at authorized philatelic centers. (It is Postal Service policy to sell commemorative issues at all regular windows for 60 days from the first day of issue.)
