Health Benefits Open Season

The 1993 Federal Employees Health Benefits (FEHB) Open Season is scheduled November 8 through December 13, 1993, according to the Office of Personnel Management (OPM). Enrollment changes and new enrollments made during the 1993 open season are effective January 8, 1994 (Pay Period 02–94).

New features that apply to most, but not all, career Postal Service employees are associated with health benefits this year. Career employees have received a direct mailing containing the 1994 FEHB Plan Comparison Chart with a cover letter introducing the new features and defining those employees eligible for coverage. The pretax health benefits feature is explained in the FSA brochure, Flexible Spending Accounts and Pretax Payment of Health Insurance Premiums, mailed to all eligible career employees.

Open Season Materials for Installations

All customer service district offices, processing and distribution centers, airport mail centers, bulk mail centers, and selected Headquarters field units received an automatic distribution coordinated by OPM including:

- RI 70-2, 1994 FEHB Plan Comparison Chart.
- RI 70–5, 1994 FEHB Plan Comparison Chart: For Spouse Equity and Temporary Continuation of Coverage.
 - Most fee-for-service plan brochures.

These same installations received an automatic distribution from the materiel distribution centers (MDCs) including:

■ SF 2809, Health Benefits Registration Form, August 1992. Use only the August 1992 edition of SF 2809 for enrollment elections. Previous editions are not usable.

These installations must requisition from the MDCs:

- RI 70–8, 1994 FEHB Plan Comparison Chart: For Noncareer Employ-
- Individual plan brochures for closed enrollment fee-for-service plans (NAPUS and Rural Carriers).

These installations must order directly from plan sponsors:

Brochures for health maintenance organizations.

All installations may use the bulletin board notice on page 27 to announce general information about open season.

Special Postal Bulletins

As in past years, special *Postal Bulletins* are planned to address open season issues in more detail.

The first Bulletin, published on November 4, will contain:

- Information on distribution of open season materials
- Eligibility requirements for coverage
- A list of participating health plans and their premium rates
- Additional instructions pertaining to open season administration

The second Bulletin, published on November 18, will contain:

- A list of health maintenance organizations
- A list of FEHB health plan withdrawals

Setting Clocks for Standard Time

Correct system time in integrated retail terminals (IRTs) and weighing and rating units (WRUs) is critical because their internal clocks verify Express Mail acceptance times, service commitments, and network status. The IRT system time is also printed on customer receipts and employee reports. Computerized Tracking and Tracing (CTT) scanner clocks record Express Mail arrival times.

Managers must ensure that the clocks in all IRTs, WRUs, and CTT scanners under their control are set *back* 1 hour before opening for business on Monday, November 1, to reflect the change to standard time in most locations. Facilities with Saturday night operations should reset the time as soon as possible after the 2 a.m. Sunday start time.

Use menu item 11, Set System Date and Time, from the Control Menu on the UNISYS Phase III Supervisor Disk. Set System Date and Time is item 12 on the UNISYS Phase II Supervisor Disk Control Menu. Select menu item 5, Change Fees and Tables, from the Main Menu on the MOS IRTs Control Disk, then select item 5, Set Unit Date and Time, from the Change Fees and Tables Menu.

Laser Scanner (CTT)

- Press the control (CTRL) key and press the T key. It displays the current date and time.
- Press the clear (CLR) key and a prompt to enter a date appears. Enter the current date as MMDDYY (example: 103193).
- Press the Enter key. The scanner then prompts the user to enter the time. Enter correct standard time in military format (examples: 8 AM=0800, 1:30 PM=1330).
- Press the Enter key. The scanner returns to the first screen.
- Press the CTRL key and the T key to verify the time and date.
- Press the Enter key, if correct, if not, reenter correct information.

Contact Scanner (CTT)

- Press the function (FUNC) key and then the T key. It displays the current date and time.
- Press the clear (CLR) key and a prompt to enter a date appears. Enter the current date as MMDDYY (example: 103193).
- Press the Enter key. The scanner then prompts the user to enter the time. Enter correct standard time in military format (examples: 8 AM=0800, 1:30 PM=1330).
- 4. Press the Enter key. The scanner then returns to the first screen.
- 5. Press the function (FUNC) key and then the T key to verify the time and date.
- Press the Enter key, if correct; if not, reenter correct information.

WRU Clocks

- Select item 2, Change System Data, from the Maintenance Menu.
- Select 1, Change System Date and Time, from the Change System Data Menu. The Set System Date and Time screen appears.
- 3. Press the Yes key to accept the current date. The time appears. Press No to clear the time.
- 4. Enter correct standard time in military format (examples: 8 AM=0800, 1:30 PM=1330.
- 5. Press Yes to save the corrected time. The Change System Data Menu appears.
- 6. Verify the time and date and correct any errors.

Retail Consolidation Unit (RCU)

Each RCU system operator must enter the correct time must also be entered to each RCU system. RCU operators must perform a system shutdown on Monday morning, November 1, 1993. Reboot the system and enter the correct date and time.—Marketing Systems, 10-14-93

Perforating Postage Stamps

Effective with *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) Issue 46 (7–1–93), P022 is corrected to restore the standard for marking postage stamps with perforation holes (former DMM 142.13). This section was inadvertently omitted when DMM Issue 46 was printed.

P022.1.5 Perforating. Postage stamps may be marked with perforation holes. The mark may not cover more than $\frac{1}{4}$ square inch ($\frac{1}{2}$ inch by $\frac{1}{2}$ inch) of the stamp, and the diameter of the holes may not exceed $\frac{1}{32}$ inch.

Pictorial Cancellations

As a community service, the Postal Service offers pictorial cancellations to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of upcoming events for which pictorial cancellations are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial cancellation appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those cancellations that were reproducible and available at press time.

People attending these local events may obtain the cancellation in person at the temporary post office station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the cancellation, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial cancellations are available only for the dates indicated and requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial cancellation date.

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail postage (29 cents per envelope or 19 cents per postcard). Items submitted for cancellation may not include postage issued after the date of the requested cancellation. Such items will be returned unserviced.

Customers wishing to obtain a cancellation should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of choice, address the envelope or postcard to one's self or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL CANCELLATIONS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP + 4 CODE, exactly as listed below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP + 4 code).

After applying the pictorial cancellation, the Postal Service returns the envelope or postcard through the mail. Customers who want their serviced item returned under protected cover should include a larger, stamped, self-addressed envelope.

Coding Accuracy Support System

The Coding Accuracy Support System (CASS) is one of the Postal Service's premiere quality processes that provides a common platform to measure the accuracy of address matching software. Using CASS certified software, mailers can improve the quality of addresses in their address lists. The process tests the accuracy of software sold by vendors and used by service bureaus and commercial mailers. The test is evaluated by the Postal Service for accuracy and, if a certain accuracy threshold is achieved, the product is certified. With the test results, the Postal Service also provides a diagnostic tool for correcting deficiencies in the address matching software.

The updated list of CASS certified companies (vendors, service bureaus, commercial mailers, and Postal Service licensed service providers) whose certificate is valid from

August 1, 1993 through May 31, 1994 is available from the National Customer Support Center (NCSC). The *Postal Bulletin* will not publish this list as it has in the past. The NCSC has forwarded copies of the list to Managers, Marketing and Sales (Area); Managers, Customer Service Support (Area and District); Managers, Rates and Classification Service Center; Managers, Business Mail Entry (District); and Managers, Postal Business Center. SAFETY BULLETIN

Hazardous Materials Handling Awareness

Hazardous materials are acceptable in the mails if they meet the two following conditions: (a) they are not outwardly or of their own force dangerous or injurious to life, health, or property; and (b) they are packaged or otherwise prepared for mailing in accordance with Postal Service standards.

Sometimes mailable hazardous materials are put in the mails without proper preparation and packaging. And sometimes hazardous materials that are not lawfully mailable under any circumstances—i.e., they are outwardly or of their own force dangerous or injurious—are mailed. By increasing employee awareness about the proper handling of hazardous materials, we can minimize significantly any risk presented by these items in the mails.

Managers

■ Enhance awareness of all employees and train those designated to clean up incidental spills and leaks.

Use Handbook EL-812, Employee Awareness—Hazardous Materials, to provide periodic awareness training, and Postal Employee Development Training Program No. 21511, Hazardous Materials Slide/ Tape Training Program, Modules 1-7, to enhance awareness and train persons designated to clean up incidental spills and leaks, as required by Management Instruction EL-810-90-6, Hazardous Materials Spill and Leak Standard Operating Procedures.

- Emphasize proper acceptance and handling during safety talks.
- Provide Publication 52, Acceptance of Hazardous, Restricted, or Perishable Matter, to employees as a ready reference.
- Display Poster 76, Hazardous Materials, in your lobby.

Acceptance Follow Postal Service inquiry procedures designed to ensure that, to the greatest extent possible, you accept only mailable items.

ΑII employees

- If you handle hazardous materials, follow proper handling procedures as outlined in EL-812, chapter 7.
- Note these indicators of the potential presence of hazardous materials in the mails:
 - A shifting weight or liquid sound in the parcel.
 - A Department of Transportation label or marking placed on the parcel to comply with the hazardous materials regulations.
 - Address information showing the parcel is being mailed to or from a chemical firm or some type of laboratory.
 - A parcel bearing the International Biohazard Symbol label to comply with the Postal Service standard in the Domestic Mail Manual, Issue 46, CO42.8.5.
 - A parcel or Express Mail shipment with a stain or usual odor. (Some illegal drugs may be mailed with ether as a component.)
- If employees discover a suspected nonmailable or leaking parcel, they should contact their supervisors and/or follow the facility spill and leak plan.



By mutual agreement, the Joint Labor-Management Uniform Committee extended the phase-out date to *April* 1, 1994. Effective then, all delivery personnel required to wear the uniform should wear all components of the new letter carrier uniform as listed below. The head of the installation determines seasonal changes in uniforms.

Parkas—Men's/Women's: Postal navy, with reflective trim, USPS emblem.

Bomber Jacket—Men's/Women's: Postal navy, with reflective trim, emblem, and craft tab.

Restrictions: Craft tabs worn only on bomber jackets. The bomber jacket may be purchased and worn with optional zip-in/out lining. The liner *may not* be worn alone as an outergarment.

Vest—Men's/Women's: Postal navy, with reflective trim, emblem.

Restrictions: Vest may be worn alone or under the jacket/parka; however, it must be worn with the shirt and tie.

Service Cap—Men's: Postal navy blue.

Wave-Style Hat—Women's: Postal navy, with emblem. Baseball Cap—Men's/Women's: Postal blue, with emblem, summer/winter styles.

Sun Visor—Men's/Women's: Postal blue, with emblem.

Sun Helmet—Men's/Women's: White with blue band. Winter Fur Trooper Cap—Men's/Women's: Postal blue, with emblem.

Knit Watch Cap—Men's/Women's: With convertible face mask, postal navy, with emblem.

Shirt—Men's/Women's: Long/short-sleeve, dressstyle woven shirt, postal blue with red and blue pin stripes, with emblem.

Restrictions: Must be worn with tie in the winter except when the neck/chest protector is worn. In warm weather, when the short-sleeve shirt is authorized without the tie and worn with the collar open, only the top button may be unbuttoned. (Undergarment tee shirts should not be visible.)

Shirt—Men's/Women's: Warm weather, finished bottom, shirtjac, postal blue with red and blue pinstripes, with emblem.

Restrictions: For warm weather use only; must be worn outside the belt. This shirt is not worn with the tie. (Undergarment tee shirts should not be visible.)

Shirt—Men's/Women's: Warm weather, short-sleeve knit shirt, postal blue, with emblem.

Restrictions: For warm weather use only; must be

tucked *inside* of belt. After seasonal changes in uniforms are made, during temperature fluctuations, only the authorized sweater or jacket may be worn with the knit shirt. (Undergarment tee shirts should not be visible.) Other outerwear may not be worn with the knit shirt.

Maternity—Women's: Maternity garments are new to the letter carrier uniform. The letter carrier maternity uniform is a long- or short-sleeve uniform blouse and postal blue uniform slacks or jumper.

Restrictions: Vendors handle maternity garments in many cases on a special order basis. Delivery personnel should give the vendor at least 30 days' advance notice.

Jumper: For maternity wear, postal blue, with emblem. Skirt/Culottes/Slacks—Women's: Postal blue with braid stripe. Slacks also available in maternity style.

Restrictions: Hems of skirts, jumpers, culottes should not be more than 3 inches above mid-knee. *Uniform socks may* be worn with the skirt/jumper; otherwise skintone nylon stockings may be worn. Uniform socks must be worn with culottes and walking shorts.

Trouser's—Men's: Postal blue with braid stripe.

Restrictions: The authorized uniform blue-gray or black socks are worn with the trousers. The white uniform socks should not be worn with the trousers.

Walking Shorts—Men's/Women's: Postal blue with braid stripe.

Restrictions: Hems of walking shorts should not be more than 3 inches above mid-knee. Shorts are worn only with the authorized uniform socks.

Neckwear—Women's: Regular or pretied four-in-hand necktie, or crossover necktab, navy blue with alternating red and white pin-dot stripes.

Restrictions: The neckwear is worn only with the woven long- or short-sleeve shirts.

Neckwear—Men's: Regular or pretied four-in-hand necktie, navy blue with alternating red and white pin-dot stripes.

Restrictions: The neckwear is worn only with the woven long- or short-sleeve shirts.

Sweater—Men's/Women's: Zippered closing, flat or bulky knit, postal navy, with emblem.

Restrictions: Delivery personnel are not authorized to purchase or wear the window service sweater.

Belt—Men's/Women's: Black smooth leather with nickel buckle. Basket-weave leather belts are not certified for postal uniform wear.

Gloves-Men's/Women's: Black leather or knit.

Neck/Chest Protector—Men's/Women's: Flat or shaker knit, Postal navy.

Restrictions: Employees authorized to wear the neck/ chest protector as part of the cold weather uniform are not required to wear a necktie when wearing the neck/

chest protector to protect them from cold weather. However, employees must replace the protector with a tie if they work inside a postal facility and are in the public view.

Face Masks—Men's/Women's: Dark blue, no ornamentation.

Restrictions: In extremely cold climates uniformed employees assigned to outdoor duties more than one-half the time may be authorized to purchase this face mask as an optional item by the installation head. (This restriction does not apply to the face masks that are part of the watch cap with face mask.)

Socks—Men's/Women's: Authorized reimbursable socks: Uniform blue/gray with two navy rings, calf-length or crew-style. Uniform white with two navy rings, calf-length or crew-style. Uniform black, calf-length or crew-style. Authorized combinations: Trousers/slacks with uniform blue/gray or uniform black socks. Shorts/culottes with uniform blue/gray, uniform white, or uniform black socks. Skirts/jumpers with uniform blue/gray, uniform white, or uniform black socks. Employees may also wear skin-tone nylon stockings (not reimbursable) with skirts and jumpers.

Restrictions: White socks are not to be worn with trousers or slacks.

Footwear—Men's/Women's: Black leather, USPS approved, with visible SR/USA tag.

Rainwear—Men's/Women's: Wet weather parka and trousers, raincoat, rain cape, postal blue, with emblem and reflective trim. Leggings, cap cover with or without cape, postal blue. Rubbers, overboots, and galoshes, black.

Restrictions: Rubbers, overboots, and galoshes do not have to be certified items. Overboots are worn *over* the existing shoes/boots.

Coveralls: Authorized for and may be worn over the uniform by motor vehicle and tractor trailer operators during periods when the employee is exposed to dirty or toxic materials.

Employee and Labor Relations Manual (ELM) 930 outlines detailed provisions and regulations pertaining to administration of the uniform program. The foregoing changes/additions to the authorized uniform apparel and combinations will appear in a future revision of ELM 930.

HANDBOOK F-10 REVISION

Use of GTS by Postal Contractual Employees

The most recent General Services Administration (GSA) contract for commercial airline government rate fares prohibits issuing government rate fares to contractor personnel and further prohibits the use of Government Travel System (GTS) for tickets purchased for contractor personnel.

Effective immediately, Handbook F-10, *Travel Policy*, is revised as follows:

630 Travel by Persons Who Are Not Postal Service Employees

631 Approving Expenses. Travel expenses of persons who are not Postal Service employees may be allowed while they are away from their homes or regular places of business. These expenses will be paid according to the policy and procedures prescribed in this handbook. GTS may be used for this travel *except* for contractors (as noted in section 632). If payment for travel expenses is charged to the contract, the expenses will be paid as the contract stipulates.

632 Approving Expenses of Contractors to the Postal Service. The Postal Service allows payments to contractors for travel expenses. These payments will be made according to the contract or as instructed by the contracting officer, with guidance from the policy and procedures in this handbook. Postal Service contractors may not use GTS to purchase tickets for this travel; nor may the Postal Service use GTS to purchase tickets for contractors.

633 Approving Travel of Advisory Counsels and Boards. The Postmaster General; Deputy Postmaster General; Manager, Administration, Office of the CEO/PMG; and the Chief Operating Officer/Executive Vice President are authorized to approve and sign vouchers for travel by members of boards, councils, or other groups which function as advisers to the Postmaster General.

634 Approving Travel of Expert Consultants. Persons who are authorized to approve the expenses of expert consultants are also authorized to approve their travel. The Postal Service may allow the travel expenses of expert consultants when they are away from their homes or regular places of business.

635 Approving Travel of Potential Postal Service Employees. Only officers of the Postal Service may approve reimbursing potential employees for expenses of travel to Postal Service employment interviews.

636 Approving Travel of Spouse

636.1 Obtaining Approval for Spouse's Travel

636.11 When Your Spouse Accompanies You. If you are on extended duty or training assignment and wish to have your spouse accompany you—rather than you taking intermediate trips home, the Postal Service will pay the cost of the round-trip fare for your spouse. Your request must be approved by the appropriate official before the assignment begins. You must justify the cost on your request and attach both the justification and the appropri-

Use of GTS by Postal Contractual Employees—Continued

ate official's approval to a travel voucher. If you are a bargaining employee, you may use the GTS for your spouse's transportation (with prior approval). For accompanied travel during the extended duty or training assignment, you may claim full per diem expenses for yourself and transportation expenses only for your spouse.

636.12 When Your Spouse Visits You. If you wish to have your spouse visit you instead of your making an intermediate trip home, the Postal Service will pay the cost of your spouse's round-trip fare. Your request must be approved by the appropriate official before your spouse's visit. You must justify the cost on your request and attach both the justification and the appropriate official's approval to a travel voucher. If you are a bargaining employee, you may use the GTS for your spouse's transportation (with prior approval). You cannot claim per diem expenses during your spouse's weekend visit, and except for those instances where leased lodging agreements are entered into (see section 216.2), you cannot claim costs.

Alaska, Hawaii, Puerto Rico, or U.S. Possessions. If you are from Alaska, Hawaii, Puerto Rico, or U.S. Possessions. If you are from Alaska, Hawaii, Puerto Rico, or United States possessions and must attend Technical Training Center courses in Norman, OK, you may be authorized to bring your spouse to Norman or to an intermediate point. However, total costs for both you and your spouse may not exceed round-trip transportation and applicable per diem for one person from the training site to your permanent duty station, based on the least costly transportation normally used. Cases of this sort must be approved in advance by the appropriate official. Travel vouchers you subsequently submit must have the documentation attached showing this official's approval.

636.3 Additional Expenses. In either of the above cases 636.1 and 636.2, you must pay additional expenses, such as meals and lodging, for your spouse.

The following items were submitted to the responsible organizations (proponents) for review with a recommendation they change from Forecasted Annually Shipped Timely (FAST) items to Commercially Available Decentralized Acquisition (CADA) items. This recommendation resulted from researching commercial sources of supply.

The proponents concurred with the recommendations, and these items may now be purchased from federal supply schedules or commercial sources on an asneeded basis. In addition, many of the items are still available from excess and may be located in the EXSEL system. Publication 247, *Materiel Management Equipment and Supply Catalog*, includes full descriptions of the items below. The next edition of Publication 247 will reflect these changes; however, make pen and ink changes to the text in the interim.

Determine commercial sources of supply by checking

materials handling catalogs and/or through supporting material management specialists.

Rotary Locks on CON-CON Containers

CON-CON points—postal facilities authorized to receive CON-CON mail—must secure all CON-CON containers with rotary locks. Only use Item 0-817C numbered tin-band seals for Registered Mail (6 inch) when rotary locks are unavailable. Do not use Item 0-817A numbered tin-band seals for truck doors (8% inch) on CON-CON containers.

Obtain rotary locks from the local facility mail transport equipment (MTE) coordinator. Coordinators obtain sup-

plies from the distribution networks (DN) office if sufficient supplies are unavailable locally. The area mail transport equipment specialist/distribution network specialist at the DN office assists the MTE coordinator in locating rotary locks and CON-CON containers. Contact the Headquarters mail transport equipment group only if the MTE coordinator and the DN office cannot obtain the necessary equipment.—Inspection Service, 10-14-93






