Equal Employment Opportunity and Affirmative Action Policy Statement

The Postal Service is committed to providing equal employment opportunities for all employees. Affirmative action is an essential element of the Postal Service's equal employment opportunity efforts.

Equal Employment Opportunity

Equal employment opportunity (EEO) is required by our nation's laws. It is illegal to discriminate on the basis of race, religion, color, sex, national origin, age (40 and above), physical or mental disabilities, or in reprisal for participating in protected EEO activity. These laws also provide specific remedies for discrimination.

The Postal Service is unequivocal in its opposition to all forms of discrimination, including harassment based upon any of the protected categories listed above. We are committed to following the EEO laws and their application to all employment matters, including, but not limited to, recruitment, hiring, training, assignments, promotions, transfers, benefits, and discipline. We maintain a process of EEO counseling and investigation for addressing and resolving complaints that arise from alleged discriminatory practices. In addition, we offer the dispute resolution process (RE-DRESS) as an alternative to precomplaint EEO counseling. It is our policy to provide reasonable accommodation as necessary where individuals with disabilities are employed or will be employed.

Affirmative Action

The Postal Service's goal under affirmative action is to ensure that our recruitment, retention, development, and promotion practices effectively draw upon and support the diversity of the communities we serve. To help bring that about, the Postal Service operates special emphasis programs (e.g., the Women's Program and the Hispanic Program) and other affirmative action activities to help ensure that women, minorities, and individuals with disabilities are able to compete at all levels of the organization.

Responsibility

The Postal Service expects all postal employees to treat each coworker with respect and appreciation. Each of us, in accordance with the laws of this nation, must refrain from practicing or tolerating discrimination or harassment based upon race, sex, national origin, or any other category protected by the EEO laws.

All executives, managers, and supervisors share in the responsibility for successfully implementing and managing EEO and affirmative action in the Postal Service. Managers are expected to develop and empower employees so that we select the most talented people available for leadership positions and meet both our employment and performance goals.

The vice president of Diversity Development directs the EEO and Affirmative Action Program, and the vice president of Labor Relations oversees EEO complaints processing and compliance.

DMM REVISION

Eligibility for Periodicals SCF and DU Per-Piece Rate Discounts

Effective May 6, 1999, *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) R200.1.3, R200.2.3, R200.3.3, R200.4.3, and R200.5.3 are amended to clarify eligibility for Periodicals Sectional Center Facility (SCF) and Delivery Unit (DU) per-piece rate discounts. Current DMM standards in the R module indicate that the DU and SCF per-piece discounts apply to each addressed piece claimed in the pound rate portion at the applicable DU or SCF zone rate. The outside-county zone rates apply only to the advertising pounds of a publication, and some have interpreted the DMM standards in the R module as meaning that, if no advertising pound rates are claimed for the DU or SCF zones, a DU or SCF per-piece discount may not be claimed.

The presence of advertising or lack of advertising in a publication does not affect a publisher's ability to claim SCF or DU per-piece discounts (lines 27, 28, and 57 of any of the PS Forms 3541). Accordingly, the DMM is amended to clarify that publications with no advertising or nonprofit publications with 10 percent or less advertising may claim the outside-county per-piece rate discounts for SCF and DU on pieces that meet the applicable eligibility criteria in DMM E250, even though there are no advertising pounds entered at the SCF or DU zone rates on lines 1 or 2 of PS Forms 3541. The DU per-piece rate language in DMM R200.2.3 (for in-country rates) is also revised to have wording consistent with the outside-county rates. PS Forms 3541 will also be amended to reflect this clarification.

These changes will be incorporated into the electronic DMM available via Postal Explorer (*http://pe.usps.gov*) and will be printed in DMM Issue 55.

Application Procedures for Qualified Business Reply Mail (QBRM)

Effective May 6, 1999, the *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) is revised to change the application process for customers who want to participate in the Qualified Business Reply Mail (QBRM) program. PS Form 6805, *Qualified Business Reply Mail (QBRM) Application,* is now available for customers to use to request participation in the QBRM program. PS Form 6805 is accessible only through the Postal Service website at *http://www.usps.com/business/formsbus.htm* for customers and *http://www.usps.gov/business/formsbus.htm* for employees. The forms may be reproduced locally as needed.

During the application process, all QBRM is assigned a unique ZIP+4 code that must appear in the address of each piece distributed. The ZIP+4 code on each piece relates to the business reply mail (BRM) permit holder and the applicable rate category of the piece on its return. Customers who are currently approved under the QBRM program and have been assigned a unique ZIP+4 code for their QBRM pieces do not need to reapply using PS Form 6805. Only new BRM permit holders who want to receive the QBRM rates and customers who need additional unique ZIP+4 codes must apply using PS Form 6805. Domestic Mail Manual (DMM)

2.0 AUTHORIZATION

To participate in QBRM, the mailer must submit Form 6805, *Qualified Business Reply Mail (QBRM) Application,* to the postmaster or business mail entry manager at the post office to which the pieces are to be returned. The mailer must have a valid BRM permit and pay the annual accounting fee to participate in QBRM. The USPS reviews preproduction samples for compliance with relevant standards. If the mailer's request is approved, the USPS issues the mailer an authorization on the approved Form 6805. Any BRM approved under the former Business Reply Mail Accounting System (BRMAS) need not make reapplication to qualify for QBRM.

DMM Revision

Revised Specifications for Automation Flats

Effective May 6, 1999, *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) C820.4.3 is revised to add two alternative mailpiece identification endorsements for polywrapped automation flats. Current mailing standards require specific endorsements pertaining to polywrap to appear on the address side of the piece, preferably below the postage area or in another visible location on the outside of the mailpiece.

The USPS is allowing mailers two new, shorter alternatives for identifying their polywrapped flat mailpiece:

- 1. "USPS (product name of polywrap) 881 Approved Poly."
- 2. "USPS (product name of polywrap) 1000 Approved Poly."

Producers of polywrapped flats may use either the current markings or these new markings. Regardless of the marking used, mailers have until October 4, 1999, to comply with the marking requirement. A list of Postal Serviceapproved polywrap manufacturers appears on the Postal Service website at *http://ribbs.usps.gov.*

These changes will be incorporated into the electronic DMM available via Postal Explorer (*http://pe.usps.gov*) and will be printed in DMM Issue 55.

4.3 Mailpiece Identification

[Amend C820.4.3 to incorporate changes to the mailpiece identification endorsement to read as follows:]

Producers of polywrapped flats authorized to claim the automation rates must endorse the flats to show that they are automation-compatible polywrapped flat-size pieces. The mailer may meet this requirement by adding "USPS (product name of polywrap) FSM 881 Approved Automatable Polywrap" or "USPS (product name of polywrap) 881 Approved Poly" or "USPS (product name of polywrap) FSM 1000 Approved Automatable Polywrap" or "USPS (product name of polywrap) 1000 Approved Poly," as applicable, on the address side of the piece, preferably below the postage area or in another visible location on the outside of the mailpiece. The polywrap marking must not interfere with the delivery address or the recognition of the barcode. The polywrap marking may also be printed directly on the polywrap material. Producers of polywrapped flats not using the appropriate mailpiece identification marking will have until October 4, 1999, to comply with this standard. A list of the Postal Service-approved polywrap manufacturers appears on the USPS Web site (http://ribbs.usps.gov).

NOTICE

Extension of Limited Test for Periodicals Automation Flats

Postal Bulletin 21991 (2-11-99) announced a test for Periodicals mailers for the purpose of collecting additional data concerning the use of polywrap on mailings made February 8 through April 30, 1999. The Postal Service is extending the time frame for participation in this test through September 30, 1999. The test will continue to be limited to Periodicals publications and will apply to both mailings of single publications and to co-mailings (combined mailings) in which two or more different publications are combined in the same packages and containers for presort. Publications that had authorization to participate in the test during the initial test period need not reapply to participate under the extended time period for the test. Publishers of Periodicals publications that are not now participating in this test may apply to participate as described below.

Pieces of publications that are authorized to participate in this test and that bear correct and properly prepared ZIP+4 codes or delivery point barcodes may be prepared and claimed at the automation flat rates as follows:

 Polywrapped pieces that meet the physical requirements (size, flexibility, and rigidity) for processing on the FSM 881 under *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) C820.2.0 may be prepared in FSM 1000 automation polywrap as described in DMM Exhibit C820.4.1a and Exhibit C820.4.1b and qualify for the automation flat rates.

Both pieces meeting FSM 881 physical requirements under DMM C820.2.0 that are prepared in polywrap meeting the FSM 1000 specifications, and pieces meeting FSM 1000 physical requirements under DMM C820.3.0 that are prepared in polywrap meeting FSM 1000 specifications, may be combined in the same package for presort purposes. The FSM 1000 specifications for polywrap are in DMM Exhibits C820.4.1a and C820.4.1b. The pieces meeting FSM 881 physical criteria and the pieces meeting FSM 1000 physical criteria that are contained in the same package may be counted together toward a single 6-piece minimum per package destination for purposes of qualifying for the 5-digit and 3-digit automation per-piece rates as applicable to the presort level of the package. Properly presorted and barcoded pieces prepared in packages other than 5-digit and 3-digit packages that each contain 6 or more pieces will qualify for the applicable basic per-piece rates.

Test mailings must meet all other standards listed in DMM E240 for the automation flat rates. These revised test preparation and rate criteria expire at the conclusion of this test on September 30, 1999.

Publishers of publications not already participating in the test will be required to request authorization to participate in the test from the applicable rates and classification service center (RCSC). For publications using Centralized Postage Payment (CPP) procedures, the publisher must request authorization for each publication from the New York RCSC. For publications not using CPP, the publisher must request authorization for each publication from the RCSC(s) serving the location(s) of their printer(s). The RCSC will provide a copy of the authorization to the publisher and to the applicable printing/mailing plant(s) used by the publisher. The mailer must present a copy of this authorization to the Postal Service at the time the first mailing prepared under the test is presented for verification.

Participation in the test will require the publisher or the printer to provide spreadsheet information both for a baseline issue that was published and mailed prior to participation in the test, and for each mailing made during the test period.

For publishers of publications that will enter the test for the first time under the extended time frame, the baseline information must include all mailings of an issue (or of combined issues) that were mailed prior to participation in the test. The baseline information must include the mailing of the main file of the baseline issue and all supplemental or other mailings made of that issue prior to authorization in the test. The issue date of the issue used for the baseline information must be one that was published at least two issues prior to the first issue for which a main subscriber file is mailed under the test mailing procedures according to the publication's authorized statement of frequency. For example, if the first issue for which a main file will be mailed under the test for a monthly publication will be the May 1999 issue, the issue used for the baseline information must be the March 1999 issue or an earlier issue. However, except for guarterly publications, the baseline information must not be for an issue with an issue date prior to November 1998.

For both previously authorized publications and those that are entering the test for the first time under this extended time period, the per mailing information must be submitted for each mailing made subsequent to authorization in the test. The detailed per mailing information for each mailing of each issue mailed under the test must be submitted on spreadsheets to the RCSC(s) from which authorization has been obtained no later than 3 days after the mailing date.

Both the baseline information and the information on mailings entered during the test must be reported in a specified spreadsheet format and submitted to the RCSC(s) from which authorization has been obtained. Downloadable samples of the reporting spreadsheets for both the baseline mailing(s) and ongoing test mailings are available at the Postal Service Internet site at *http://www.usps.com/clr.* It is preferred, but not required, that mailers submit the requested data to the applicable RCSC(s) electronically as an Excel spreadsheet.

Both spreadsheets ask for information about the mailpieces in the carrier route and noncarrier route portions of a mailing and whether they meet the criteria for FSM 881 mailpieces or whether the mailpieces do not meet the FSM 881 criteria and qualify as FSM 1000 mailpieces. For each subcategory, mailers are asked to report by edition category and by co-mailing code if applicable, the number of pieces that are mailed with FSM 881 polywrap, with FSM 1000 polywrap, or without polywrap.

Cards Claimed at First-Class Mail Card Rates

Effective May 6, 1999, *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM C100.2) is amended to clarify the format standards for cards eligible for First-Class Mail card rates and the preparation of certain types of cards not mailed at automation or Presorted First-Class Mail rates. These amendments do not change any of the standards for card rate eligibility.

These changes will be included in the online DMM available via Postal Explorer (*http://pe.usps.gov*) and will be included in the printed version of DMM Issue 55.

2.6 Face

[Amend 2.6 by reorganizing and clarifying the section to read as follows:]

For the purposes of 2.0, *face* is the side of a postcard bearing the postage and delivery address. To be eligible for the card rate, a card must meet the applicable eligibility and preparation standards (2.0). In addition, if the card contains a message area on the face of the card, it must be formatted as follows:

- a. The card must be divided vertically into a right side and a left side, with or without a vertical rule.
- b. The right side must be reserved for the delivery address, postage, and any postal marking or endorsement (except as permitted in 2.6d); this side must be at least 2-1/8 inches wide (measured from the right edge of the card, top to bottom inclusive).

- c. The left side must be used for the message; this side may measure more than one-half the length of the face of the card.
- d. If accounting data and instructions to the addressee are shown in the right side, that information must be printed on a shaded background or surrounded by a border. The address (including any required barcode), postage, postal marking, and endorsement must be shown on an unshaded background. In addition, for cards with such information, and not mailed at automation rates, the area reserved for the address must be at least 2-1/8 inches wide and 1 inch high.

2.7 Tearing Guides

[Amend 2.7 by clarifying the section to read as follows:]

A card that meets the applicable standards for the automation or Presorted rate claimed (or for a single-piece rate card, the standards in 2.8) may have vertical tearing guides (such as perforations or slits) if the guides do not eliminate or interfere with any address element, postage, postal marking, or endorsement.

2.8 Special Rules

[Amend 2.8 by revising 2.8a and 2.8d to read as follows:] Single-piece rate cards with the characteristics noted in 2.6d or 2.7 must:

- a. Be prepared in mailings containing cards of identical size and weight.

QBRM NOTICE

Standard Operating Procedures for Handling Qualified Business Reply Mail (QBRM) Applications

The following procedural guidelines are for dissemination to postal employees who accept and process applications from customers who want to participate in the Qualified Business Reply Mail (QBRM) program. These procedures will be incorporated into Publication 25, *Designing Letter Mail*, which is currently under revision. The revised Publication 25 will incorporate and replace existing Publication 353, *Designing Reply Mail*.

BRM Permit Holder Responsibilities

To participate in the QBRM program, a business reply mail (BRM) permit holder must:

- 1. Pay the annual BRM permit fee plus the annual BRM accounting fee.
- 2. Complete page 1 of PS Form 6805, *Qualified Business Reply Mail (QBRM) Application*, and submit it to the manager, business mail entry (district) or postmaster of the post office(s) where the mail will be returned.
- 3. Choose one of two options to qualify BRM pieces for QBRM rates:
 - a) Option 1: Submit 10 BRM printed samples for review with the completed QBRM application.
 - b) Option 2: Submit 10 paper samples cut to the size of a finished QBRM piece, a pre-production sample, or completed artwork for review (include samples of ink colors with pre-production samples or artwork) with the completed QBRM application.
- Certify that all future QBRM envelopes/cards will be produced with equivalent paper stock and will meet paper thickness dimensions by signing PS Form 6805.
- 5. Provide a finished QBRM sample (after printing) to the mailpiece design analyst (MDA) who approved the pre-production sample and to the post office(s) where the mail is returned.

Note: Although customers are not required to provide samples when QBRM is reprinted, it is recommended that they work with their MDA to ensure pieces meet postal standards.

Post Office Responsibilities

The manager, business mail entry (district) or postmaster at the post office(s) where mail will be returned forwards the application and accompanying samples to the MDA or designee for review.

Mailpiece Design Analyst (MDA) Responsibilities During Approval Process

- Provide the mechanical barcode and facing identification mark (FIM) positive. *Note:* For pieces distributed under QBRM, the address must include a unique ZIP+4 code assigned to the piece. The ZIP+4 code identifies the permit holder and rate category.
- 2. Provide support materials such as:
 - a) Quick Service Guide S922.
 - b) DMM References S922 and E150.
- 3. Review the samples and complete page 2 of PS Form 6805 (use checklist on page 17 for guidance).
- 4. If the sample meets all requirements:
 - a) Provide the customer with the approved PS Form 6805 and pre-production samples marked "Approved."
 - b) If the customer chose Option 1, forward one QBRM sample to the post office(s) where the mail will be returned.
 - c) If the customer chose Option 2, forward one QBRM sample to the post office(s) where the mail will be returned when the customer submits the sample pieces after printing.
 - d) Maintain copy of PS Form 6805 and QBRM sample (paper samples or pre-production artwork) for records.
- 5. If the sample does not meet standards:
 - a) List reasons and applicable DMM references on page 2 of PS Form 6805.
 - b) Provide the customer with a copy of the disapproved PS Form 6805.
 - c) Recommend corrections to meet the standards in DMM S922, E150, C810, and/or C840.
 - d) Maintain a copy of PS Form 6805 and QBRM sample (paper samples or pre-production artwork) for records.
 - e) Return additional samples to the applicant with disapproved PS Form 6805.
 - f) If the customer disputes the disapproval of PS Form 6805, advise the customer of appeal rights under DMM G020.3.0.

Standard Operating Procedures for Testing Paper Thickness for QBRM Rates

When determining whether a piece meets the size standards for eligibility at the QBRM rates, MDAs must measure its height, length, and thickness. The minimum and maximum height and length dimensions are the same dimensions as automation-compatible letters as shown in DMM C810.2.0. QBRM cards that measure 3 1/2 x 5 inches but less than 4 1/4 x 6 inches must be at least .007 inch thick. QBRM cards that measure 4 1/4 x 6 inches or more must be at least .009 inch thick beginning January 10, 2001. Until then, such cards must be at least .007 inch thick.

The MDA or designee must use a TMI digital micrometer to test paper thickness in the following manner:

- Measure the thickness on all 10 QBRM samples submitted by the applicant, three times each, and record all three readings for a total of 30 readings. Start measuring in the lower right corner of the mailpiece and measure diagonally.
 - a) First, measure bottom right corner 1/2 inch from mailpiece leading edge.
 - b) Second, measure middle of mailpiece above address area.
 - c) Third, measure upper left corner 1/2 inch from mailpiece edge.
- If four or more readings fall below the minimum standards, the pieces do not qualify for the QBRM rates. The customer may choose to submit 10 additional samples for testing.
- 3. If submitted, measure the 10 additional samples in the same manner.
- 4. If the second sample fails, the pieces do not qualify for the QBRM rates. If the second sample passes, the pieces qualify for the QBRM rates.

Reporting QBRM Irregularities

If QBRM pieces are found to cause problems during processing, such as jamming automation equipment or damage to the pieces themselves, the problem must be reported on PS Form 6806, *Mailpiece Irregularity/Resolution*. PS Form 6806 was published in *Postal Bulletin* 21995 (4-8-99) and is available through the Postal Service website at *http://www. usps.gov/business/formsbus.htm* for employees. It may be reproduced locally as needed.

Employees who report a processing problem on PS Form 6806 must:

- 1. Make a copy of the piece.
- 2. Send the PS Form 6806 and the copy of the piece to the manager, business mail entry (district) serving the delivery address on the piece.

When PS Form 6806 is received, the manager, business mail entry (district) refers the matter to the appropriate MDA/ designee.

Mailpiece Design Analyst Responsibilities During Irregularity Review Process

- 1. Review the copy of the piece accompanying the PS Form 6806 and compare it to the QBRM samples on file.
- Contact the customer to resolve discrepancies between the samples on file and the piece reported on PS Form 6806.
- 3. If the samples do not meet QBRM standards, request 10 additional samples from the customer for testing.
- 4. If the 10 additional samples do not meet QBRM standards, revoke the QBRM rates and advise the customer that new samples must be submitted under Option 1 or 2 to reapply for the QBRM rates.

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POSTAGE STATEMENTS REVISED

New Periodicals Postage Statements

Effective May 30, 1999, PS Forms 3541-R, Postage Statement — Periodicals – Regular and Science-of-Agriculture Rates; 3541-N, Postage Statement — Periodicals – Nonprofit Rates; and 3541-NC, Postage Statement — Periodicals – Classroom Rates, are revised:

- To reflect a new entry discount available to foreign copies of Periodicals mailings entered at the New Jersey International and Bulk Mail Center (NJI & BMC) starting May 30, 1999.
- To require reporting of international postage under a separate account identifier code (AIC 238) from (domestic) Outside-County postage effective May 30, 1999.

The permit system will automatically report Periodicals postage as appropriate. Post offices not supported by the permit system must report postage separately as indicated on the statements.

Periodicals mailers not claiming foreign copies may continue to use the January 1999 editions of PS Forms 3541 until Friday, September 10, 1999. Effective Saturday, September 11, 1999, *all* Periodicals mailings must be reported on the May 1999 editions. Special Postal Bulletin 21984A (11-12-98) gave mailers until July 1, 1999, to use any software vendors' PS Forms 3541 facsimiles approved from formats published in the October 1998 Mailers Companion. Periodicals mailers not claiming foreign copies may now continue to use those formats through Friday, September 10, 1999.

The May 1999 editions of PS Forms 3541 appear on pages 20–25 of this *Postal Bulletin*. They will also be available in the Business Section of the Postal Service website at *http://www.usps.com* as print-only (PDF format) and fill-in (JAVA format) forms. Print-only forms are printed locally and filled in manually. Fill-in forms provide on-screen data entry, automatic postage calculations, and the ability to save data.

Distribution

A limited quantity of revised PS Forms 3541 will be distributed to managers of Business Mail Entry (BME) at district offices. BME managers will be responsible for distribution of appropriate forms and quantities throughout their district. Wherever possible, postmasters should encourage their customers and staff to use the Postal Service website to obtain forms. A future *Postal Bulletin* will announce when these revised postage statements are available at the material distribution centers.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

B. Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more. **Exceptions:** Mailers must properly complete required customs documentation when mailing any potentially dutiable international mail or military mail addressed to an APO or FPO regardless of weight. Non-dutiable international and military mail that weighs 16 ounces or more requires customs documentation with the following exceptions:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters, letter packages, and printed matter weighing 16 ounces or more unless required by the destination country. (A known mailer is anyone who legally applies for a permit imprint to a mailpiece. International or military mail with meter postage is not considered to be from a known mailer.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies are exempt from providing customs documentation on international mail and mail addressed to an APO or FPO unless required by the destination country.
- Official Mail going to, between, and from APO or FPO addresses is exempt from providing customs documentation unless required by the destination country.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

B1. Form 2976 or 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents. **Exceptions:** All other exceptions listed in restriction B above are applicable to this restriction.

C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

C1. Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

D. Coffee is prohibited.

E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

E2. Any matter containing religious materials contrary to Islamic faith or depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and hand-held transmitters are prohibited.

F. Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM C022.1.1. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies.

F1. Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

F2. Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.

 $\ensuremath{\textbf{G.}}$ Only First-Class letters, Periodicals, and Standard Mail (A) are authorized.

H. Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

I. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

K. Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

L. All official mail is prohibited.

M. Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

N. Registered mail is prohibited.

O. Personal mail addressed to vessels using this number is limited to unregistered First-Class Mail and certified mail. Other classes of mail are prohibited.

P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

Q. Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

R. All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM C021, are prohibited.

R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

T. Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

U. Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

U2. Mail is limited to First-Class letters only when addressed to Box R.

U3. Mail is limited to First-Class correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

W. Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail (A), and Standard Mail (B) (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).

Z1. The Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O818-A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

HANDBOOK DM-103 REVISION

Revision to Handbook DM-103, Official Mail

A new Appendix to Handbook DM-103, *Official Mail*, appears in the back of this *Postal Bulletin* (see pages 123–142). It is an updated listing of Federal Government Authorization Codes. Please remove the original Appendix (dated February 1998) from DM-103 (pages 149–164) and replace it with the new Appendix published in this *Postal Bulletin*.

This new Appendix should also be retained by employees handling Official Mail (window clerks, mailing requirements personnel, OMAS coordinators, etc.) since it no longer appears in the *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM).

This revision includes the following changes:

- 1. The Advisory Commission on Intergovernmental Relations, the U.S. Enrichment Corporation, and the Bonneville Power Administration have elected to convert to commercial mailing systems.
- 2. The deletion of the Commission on Immigration Reform, which has ceased operations.
- 3. The deletion of Express Mail authorizations for the Consumer Product Safety Commission and the Department of Veterans Affairs.

- 4. The addition of 23 new National Institutes of Health (NIH) agencies.
- 5. The addition of four Merchandise Return account number authorizations to the U.S. Geological Survey.
- 6. The addition of one new Permit Imprint account number to the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission.
- 7. The addition of the Medicare Payment Advisory Commission, which is a consolidation of the Physician Payment Review Commission and the Prospective Payment Assessment Commission.

Subsequent revisions to this Appendix will be published periodically in the *Postal Bulletin.*

Postage Payments

I'd like to advise you of an effort by the U.S. Postal Service (USPS) to enhance and expand EFT payment options to its Federal agency customers for postage payments. When implemented, the Postal Electronic Payment Platform (PEPP) will provide agencies with a number of electronic payment options. In addition to facilitating ACH credits and debits, PEPP will offer Federal agencies a plastic card to make postage payments which will provide a link to the OPAC accounting system. We are also exploring the application of the PrimePay ACH debit program as an EFT payment mechanism for postage payments.

The new system will be rolled out in two phases. Phase one will involve converting existing ACH customers and starting new ACH customers on the system. This phase should be completed by the fall of 1999. Phase two will focus on developing new payment capabilities and a comprehensive reporting system. The estimated completion date for this phase is April 2000.

Until the system is available, the USPS is requesting agencies currently making postage payments to the USPS by check to suspend any efforts to convert these payments to EFT payments until the new system is ready. Agencies currently paying the Postal Service via EFT may continue to do so.

IMM REVISION

International Mail — New International Postage Rates Are Effective on May 30, 1999

Pursuant to its authority under 39 U.S.C. 407, the U.S. Postal Service hereby announces a series of international rate changes, and related changes to the *International Mail Manual* (IMM), which are effective at **12:01 a.m., May 30**, **1999**. Postal installations will be receiving updated software for their integrated retail terminals (IRTs) or point-of-service (POS) terminals prior to the effective date.

See pages 57–68 for the new postage rate tables for all classes of international mail that will be undergoing a pricing change. Post the notice on page 69 on bulletin boards. Readers should be aware that the following categories of rates are not reflected in those tables because they are **not changing** on May 30:

- Air rates for Letters and Letter Packages to all countries, except Canada.
- Air rates for Printed Matter, Matter for the Blind, and Small Packets to all countries, except Canada and Mexico.
- Surface rates for Regular Printed Matter to Canada.
- Surface rates for Books and Sheet Music to Canada.
- Publishers' Periodicals rates to Canada.
- Surface rates for Small Packets to Canada.
- International Surface Air Lift (ISAL) rates to all countries.

Readers should also be aware that certain international special services fees were changed on January 10, 1999, concurrent with the implementation of new domestic postage rates and fees (see *Postal Bulletin* 21984A, 11-12-98). Subsequently, the Postal Service implemented new postage rates for Global Direct — Canada Admail on March 1, 1999 (see *Postal Bulletin* 21993, 3-11-99). And finally, on April 4, 1999, new postage rates and mail preparation requirements were implemented for business customers who utilize International Priority Airmail (IPA) service (see *Postal Bulletin* 21993, 3-11-99).

Concurrent with the scheduled change in international postage rates, the following regulatory changes will take effect on May 30, 1999:

242.321 Standard Entry

Surface mail that is entered at publishers' periodical rates must be prepared in accordance with the provisions of 244.5 and tendered at a post office or other location that has been designated by the local postmaster.

242.322 Drop Shipment

A publisher or registered news agent who deposits publishers' periodicals directly at the New Jersey International & Bulk Mail Center (NJI & BMC), under a drop shipment authorization, is eligible for a \$0.25 per pound postage rate discount, when the following conditions of entry are met:

- a. The mailer must obtain a drop shipment authorization (i.e., PS Form 8125, *Plant-Verified Drop Shipment* (*PVDS*) Verification and Clearance) from the post office of original/additional entry, the business mail entry unit (BMEU), or the detached mail unit (DMU) where their mailing records are maintained.
- b. The mailer must bring their sorted publishers' periodicals to the postal location referenced in 244.322a, where USPS acceptance employees will check the statement of mailing to ensure proper application of the \$0.25 per pound drop ship discount; confirm funds availability; and verify compliance with the prescribed mail makeup requirements.

c. Publishers' periodicals that are to be drop shipped at the NJI & BMC are subject to the mail makeup requirements contained in 244.51 and 244.52, except as specified below.

Exception: A drop shipment customer who has fewer than 11 pounds of publishers' periodicals for a particular country or country separation is required to place those residual mailpieces into a country specific "skin sack" rather than aggregating them into a "mixed working foreign sack," as specified in 244.522. Residual bundles or packages that are placed into a "skin sack" are subject to the sorting, sacking, and labeling requirements for country sacks that are contained in 244.51 (except 244.51c) and 244.521, for all countries, except Canada, and in 244.53, for Canada only.

- d. A publisher or agent who has a minimum of 250 pounds of mail for a single destination country may dispense with the use of sacks by placing the requisite presorted bundles or packages onto a strapped or shrink wrapped pallet. In order to be admissible, a palletized load of discounted publishers' periodicals must conform to the mailing standards contained in DMM M041; adhere to the mail preparation requirements referenced in DMM M045, and be placarded (labeled) in accordance with the provisions of DMM M031.4.0.
- e. Once the acceptance process is completed, the verified mailpieces and accompanying paperwork will be turned back to the publisher or agent who will transport the sacks or pallets to the NJI & BMC. Prior to bringing their mail to that postal facility, the publisher or agent must schedule a drop shipment appointment through the appropriate appointment control center as specified in DMM E652.3.4. The relevant statement of mailing and drop shipment authorization (i.e., PS Form 8125) must be presented at the time of entry.
- f. Publishers' periodicals that are enclosed in direct sacks of printed matter to one addressee (M-bags) are not subject to the \$0.25 per pound postage discount that is referenced in this section. See 245.222 for the postage payment procedures governing M-bags.

Changes to Individual Country Listings

Although the following changes in the country conditions for mailing are not related to the forthcoming international rate change, they will also take effect on May 30, 1999:

Bosnia-Herzegovina—The Return Receipt entry, under the Special Services header, is being amended to show service availability in combination with Registered Mail and Insured Parcels.

Cambodia — The weight limit for Regular Printed Matter, Books & Sheet Music, Publishers' Periodicals, and Air Printed Matter (All Classes) is being increased to 11 pounds.

Tuvalu — The Return Receipt entry, under the Special Services header, is being amended to show service availability in combination with Insured Parcels, as well as Registered and Recorded Delivery Mail.

International Statements of Mailing

The statements of mailing that will be impacted by either the postage rate changes or the new \$0.25 per pound drop shipment discount for publishers' periodicals are currently in the process of being revised. When the updated version of each goes into use on May 30, 1999, all prior versions should be regarded as being *obsolete* and, therefore, subject to disposal. 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IMM REVISION

Global Priority Mail to China

Effective April 22, 1999, International Mail Manual (IMM) 226 is revised to incorporate new destination cities for Global Priority Mail (GPM) to China. Previously, GPM service to China was limited to the following cities: Beijing, Dalian, Guangzhou, Qingdao, Shanghai, Shenzhen, Suzhou, Tianjin, Wuxi, Xiamen, and Zhuhai. Effective immediately, GPM service is expanded to include the following cities in China: Chongqing, Nanjing, Shenyang, Wuhan, and Xian. This revision will be incorporated into the online IMM, which can be accessed via Postal Explorer (http://pe.usps.gov) and a future printed version of the IMM.

The chart on this page includes all countries that accept GPM from the United States. This chart replaces the GPM chart published in *Postal Bulletin* 21964 (1-29-98). Post this chart to aid window clerks and postal customers.

IMM REVISION

International Mail — Suspension of Mail Service to Serbia-Montenegro (Yugoslavia)

On April 7, 1999, the Postal Service suspended all international air and surface mail service to Serbia-Montenegro (Yugoslavia) due to the current hostilities in that country. Any mail on hand that is for dispatch to that country must be promptly returned to sender bearing the endorsement "Service Temporarily Suspended." Postage may be refunded in full for returned mail (see *Domestic Mail Manual* PO14.2.4), or the mail may be reentered by the customer, when service is resumed, by obliterating the "Service Temporarily Suspended" endorsement. Information pertaining to international mail service disruptions can be obtained via the Rapid Information Bulletin Board System (RIBBS) page on the USPS Intranet at http://ribbs.usps.gov.

The suspension of all mail service to Serbia-Montenegro (Yugoslavia) will be incorporated into the online *International Mail Manual* (IMM), which can be accessed via Postal Explorer (*http://pe.usps.gov*). It will also be reflected in the next printed version of the IMM (Issue 21).

ICM UPDATE

International Customized Mail

On January 12, 1999, the Postal Service entered into an International Customized Mail (ICM) service agreement with a qualifying mailer. In accordance with *International Mail Manual* (IMM) 294, the Postal Service hereby makes public the following information concerning the agreement:

- a. Term: January 24, 1999, through December 31, 2001.
- b. Type of Mail: Catalogs, parcels, and small packets.
- **c. Destination countries:** Parcels to Japan and catalogs worldwide.
- **d. Service provided by the Postal Service:** The Postal Service has agreed to:
 - 1. Furnish the mailer with the letter trays and other supplies that the mailer is required to use for qualifying mail.
 - 2. Provide the mailer or mailing agent with the training necessary for them to prepare ICM mail in conformity with the requirements for qualifying mail.
 - 3. Arrange with air and surface carriers, as appropriate, for qualifying mail to be transported internationally for delivery by foreign postal authority.
 - 4. Establish a prearranged address where items returned from Japan will be consolidated and returned to the mailer.
- e. Minimum volume commitments: The mailer has agreed to tender a minimum of 100,000 Global Package Link (GPL) pieces annually and to tender a combined minimum of 3 million pieces of other international mail to the Postal Service annually, either directly or indirectly through their mailing agent.

- f. Worksharing: The mailer has agreed to:
 - 1. Package mail in accordance with the applicable Postal Service requirements set forth in the IMM.
 - Pay postage for qualifying mail in accordance with IMM using a system approved by the appropriate Rates and Classification Service Center (RCSC).
 - 3. Tender qualifying mail to the Postal Service at designated Postal Service facilities.
 - 4. Coordinate a schedule of mailings and provide notifications as specified in the service agreement.
 - 5. Mutually review the volumes and services provided December 31 of each year with a view towards making improvements.

g. Rates:

- 1. GPL: GPL rates will be calculated as follows:
 - a. The discounts that are to be applied to the published GPL base rates to Japan are set forth in Table 1 (see page 73). As long as the indicated volume thresholds are met during any agreement calendar year, the associated discount will apply to all GPL mail for the succeeding year. The published base rates are set forth in Table 2 (see page 73). The ICM rates for 1999, as calculated by applying the appropriate discount in Table 1 (4.25 percent) to the published base rates in Table 2, are set forth in Table 3 (see page 74).

- b. In addition to the ICM discounted rate, a 3 percent incentive discount will be applied to GPL mail sent to any other GPL country to which it was not previously mailed. This additional 3 percent "promotional" discount will be in effect for the balance of the first calendar year the mailer ships to a new country. At the end of the first calendar year, the "promotional" discount will revert to the ICM discount as set forth in Table 1.
- c. At the end of each calendar year, the Postal Service will consolidate all volume figures for GPL parcels shipped by the mailer for that calendar year and determine the discount off published base rates for the following year.
- d. Quantity Rates. In view of mutually beneficial expansion, if the mailer increases GPL volume tendered to the Postal Service to reach the thresholds listed in Table 1, the corresponding rate from the schedule displayed in Table 1 will become effective on January 1 of each year.
- 2. Other Parcels: Postage for all other parcels mailed at a Mixed Parcel rate will be \$3.37 per pound.
- 3. International Surface Air Lift (ISAL): Postage for qualifying ISAL mail will be at 9 percent off published rates applicable at the time of mailing. The rates for ISAL under this agreement are set forth in Table 4 (see page 74). In the event that Postal Service ISAL costs increase in excess of 15 percent, the Postal Service shall notify the mailer in writing and renegotiate rates or terminate the agreement within 60 days after receipt of the written notification.
- 4. International Priority Airmail (IPA): IPA mail will be at \$4.50 per pound.
 - a. Average weight of IPA mail shall be 8-10 ounces.
 - b. If the annual average drops below 4 ounces, postage for IPA will be at 9 percent off published rates applicable at the time of the mailing.
 - c. In the event that Postal Service IPA costs increase in excess of 15 percent, the Postal Service shall notify the mailer in writing and renegotiate rates or terminate the agreement within 60 days after receipt of the written notification.
- Postage for Return Service from Japan will be at the published rates.

- 6. The Postal Service will harmonize the first 2,500 new SKU items each year of the agreement at no cost to the mailer. For any additional SKUs over 2,500, harmonization fees will be at the published rates.
- 7. Postage rates paid by the mailer may be increased by no more than 5 percent per calendar year.

The stamp was designed by Phil Jordan of Falls Church, VA, and is based on an illustration by William Bartram. The stamps go on sale nationwide May 19, 1999.

This year marks the 300th anniversary of the birth of John Bartram, the American botanist who established the oldest existing botanical garden in America. John, with the help of his son William, introduced approximately 200 native American plants and propagated innumerable native and exotic plants. 

Daffy Duck and other Looney Tunes characters, names, and related indicia are the property of Warner Bros. To ensure the correct use of Daffy Duck in cancellations, the Postal Service and Warner Bros. have authorized one pictorial cancellation design for field use.

The Daffy Duck station pictorial cancellation art was developed exclusively for commemorating Daffy Duck stamp events and may not be altered in any way, except as instructed in the guidelines.

As a reminder, the Postal Service must endeavor to make all unusual postmarking widely known to collectors through advance national publicity to avoid such postmarks being available only to small groups of people. Therefore, all pictorial cancellations for local events must be reported to Stamp Development so that national publicity may be arranged.

Mail-back service will be honored by participating post offices for 30 days following the event.



Pictorial Cancellations Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service offers pictorial cancellations to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial cancellations are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial cancellation appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those cancellations that were reproducible and available at press time.

People attending these local events may obtain the cancellation in person at the temporary post office station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the cancellation, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial cancellations are available only for the dates indicated, and requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial cancellation date.

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail postage (33 cents per envelope or 20 cents per postcard). Items



submitted for cancellation may not include postage issued after the date of the requested cancellation. Such items will be returned unserviced.

Customers wishing to obtain a cancellation should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL CANCELLATIONS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP + 4 CODE, exactly as listed below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP + 4 code).

After applying the pictorial cancellation, the Postal Service returns the envelope or postcard through the mail. Customers who want their serviced item returned under protected cover should include a larger, stamped, self addressed envelope.







Ordering Procedures for Rubber Stamps and Steel Hand Canceling Stamps

Effective May 1, 1999, this article supersedes the article published in *Postal Bulletin* 21957 (10-23-97).

Ordering Procedures

- A. Form Number, Title, and Edition: PS Form 1567, *Requisition for Rubber and Steel Hand Canceling Stamps* (August 1998).
- B. Use a separate PS Form 1567 for each supplier. Note: If using an impression on PS Form 1567, be very careful to use the correct PSIN. Suppliers have been instructed to use the impression rather than the PSIN if the two do not match.
- C. Complete all Requester Information (Items 4 through 10).
- D. Method of Payment:
 - Place a check mark in the appropriate box.
 - If paying by USPS credit card, include the expiration date and number.
 - If paying by check or money order, make payable to the appropriate supplier.
- E. Send the completed forms to suppliers at the addresses shown below.
- F. Expect delivery of requested stamps in approximately 30 days (note the exception for Hanley Postal Supply Co.). Note: Delivery charges are included in the cost of the stamps.

PS Form 1567 (August 1998, NSN 7530-01-000-9360, Quick Pick Number 132) is available in F3Fill, may be ordered from the material distribution centers (MDCs) on PS Form 7380, *MDC Supply Requisition,* or via Touch Tone Order Entry (TTOE), or may be copied from Publication 247, *Supply and Equipment Catalog,* which is also available through the Postal Service website at *http://blue.usps.gov/ cpim/ftp/pubs/pub247/247tc.pdf.*

OSHA Guidance: Handbook EL-802, Executive's and Manager's Safety Compliance Guide, Now Available

Handbook EL-802, *Executive's and Manager's Safety Compliance Guide*, has been printed and distributed and is available in the material distribution centers (MDCs). A "Safety and Health Program Evaluation Guide," based on Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) guidance, is contained in the handbook.

Handbook EL-802 also provides essential guidance to managers on complying with OSHA regulations, dealing with OSHA compliance activities, and managing safety and health programs. This is part of an ongoing effort to address the requirements of the Postal Employees' Safety Enhancement Act.

The guide is introduced with a message from the postmaster general. He stresses his commitment to providing a safe and healthful working environment. He further tasks all managers to be committed, involved, and accountable.

The chief operating officer continues the theme. He calls for managers to make a commitment to safety as part of good business practices, to get involved in promoting safety programs and correcting unsafe practices and conditions, and to continue to perform program evaluations that ensure accountability. Y2K UPDATE

End-User Computing

Postal Service efforts to meet the Year 2000 (Y2K) computer challenge involve a number of initiatives throughout the organization, including end-user computing (desktop workstations).

For the most part, Postal Service end-users should not concern themselves with Y2K desktop computer issues. The business applications critical to the Postal Service, along with the hardware, networks, and standard software products (collectively, "the infrastructure"), are being addressed by Headquarters and Field Information Systems staffs. As a result, users should not be taking independent action that might conflict with critical programs.

What is left over is "End-User Computing," the collection of documents, spreadsheets, and other personally created data and software on each desktop workstation. In general, these are not critical to the movement of the mail, the collection or payment of money, or the safety of our employees or customers. Therefore, end-users should not expend significant time or money to address them.

We recognize that some end-users or managers may have documents, spreadsheets, or other end-user components that they believe are critical to their work. By June 1, after we have remediated the Postal Service-critical applications, users and managers will receive instructions about how, and if, they need to address their own components. Until then, no Y2K actions should be taken on end-user computing. This will avoid any conflicts with business-critical national applications and infrastructure as we work to maintain focus on the most critical Y2K issues.

The following points should be communicated to all end users:

- The Postal Service is currently addressing priority Y2K problems within hardware components, local and national applications, Gold Tape, and other Postal Service standard software.
- Managers will receive official instructions prior to June 1, 1999, on how to address Y2K issues for end-user computing.
- No action should be taken by end-users at this time to fix Y2K problems on individual workstations.

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INSURANCE PROGRAM UPDATE

Federal Employees' Group Life Insurance Program — 1999 Open Enrollment Period

The Federal Employees' Life Insurance Improvement Act (Public Law 105-311), enacted on October 30, 1998, stipulated several changes to the provisions of the Federal Employees' Group Life Insurance (FEGLI) Program, including an expansion of coverage options to be elected during an open enrollment period. To offer eligible employees an opportunity to elect new coverage options, the Office of Personnel Management (OPM), a separate government agency that sponsors the FEGLI Program, has scheduled an open enrollment period from Saturday, April 24, 1999, through Wednesday, June 30, 1999. However, the Postal Service will accept employees' elections through Friday, July 30, 1999. This extension is being authorized under belated election procedures due to a delay in distributing materials caused by recent program changes.

The information below should assist personnel office employees who will be involved with administering the upcoming open enrollment period. This article includes the following contents:

- Direct Mailings To Employees. While the Postal Service planned to mail enrollment materials directly to employees by April 24, the beginning of the open enrollment period, OPM has experienced a delay in supplying the required election materials to agencies. Therefore, the current plans are for two mailings from the national level directly to each career employee's

address of record. The first mailing, to occur by the end of April, will contain two items:

- A letter that explains the delay, the plan for the enrollment package mailing described below, and the extension for submitting open enrollment elections to July 31.
- b. FEGLI '99 Open Enrollment Period Pamphlet (FE 74B for Postal Service Inspectors (IS) and Office of Inspector General (OIG) employees and FE 74A for other career employees) that features an overview of the coverage options available for employees to elect during the open enrollment period.

The second mailing, a package of enrollment information to be mailed for receipt no later than May 24, will contain the following election materials:

- a. A fact sheet, with answers to expected questions about making open enrollment elections.
- b. The April 1999 version of the FEGLI Booklet (RI 76-21 for Postal Service IS and OIG employees or RI 76-20 for other career employees).
- c. A special FEGLI '99 Open Enrollment Period Election Form (RI 76-27).

Election materials also will be available on the Postal Service's Intranet website at http://blue.usps.gov/ hrisp/comp and OPM's Internet website at http://www. opm.gov/insure/life/feg/1999/postal.htm. Election materials are available at either website. The Postal Service Intranet site will also contain instructions for personnel offices issued only by the Postal Service.

The special FEGLI '99 Open Enrollment Period Election Form (RI 76-27) is the **ONLY** form that can be used to make open enrollment period elections. *Caution:* **Standard Form 2817**, *Life Insurance Election,* cannot be used for 1999 open enrollment elections.

Undeliverable packages will be returned to the employing office of record. While the disposition of returned packages is at the discretion of the employing office, this is an opportunity to have the employee submit a correct PS Form 1216, *Employee's Current Mailing Address*.

 Automatic Distribution to Major Installations. In an automatic distribution, customer service district offices, processing and distribution centers, airport mail centers, bulk mail centers, the Employee Service Center, the OIG, selected Postal Inspection Service divisions, and selected Headquarters field units will receive a residual supply of the open enrollment materials sent to employees as described in section 1 above. A limited supply of large-print versions of the FEGLI booklets and pamphlets will be provided for visually impaired employees. Field locations will also receive a supply of the following FEGLI publicity materials:

- a. Posters and tent cards announcing the FEGLI '99 open enrollment period.
- b. 10-minute videotapes explaining the FEGLI '99 open enrollment period.
- c. 60-minute videotapes explaining the entire FEGLI Program.

Personnel office employees who administer FEGLI or process elections should familiarize themselves with the instructions in the booklet, brochure, and election form, in addition to the information in this article and other related instructions posted on the Postal Service Intranet and OPM Internet websites.

- 3. Publicity. All offices must post the FEGLI Open Enrollment Period notice (see page 111) on bulletin boards through July 31. Installations that receive the FEGLI posters and tent cards must widely distribute and display them in appropriate locations through July 31.
- 4. Election Opportunities. During the open enrollment period, career employees have an opportunity to enroll for the first time or increase life insurance coverage.
 - Basic Life. The Postal Service pays the entire cost of Basic Life, and career employees are automatically covered for it (unless coverage was waived). Employees who previously waived Basic Life may elect the coverage during the open enrollment period. Employees must have Basic Life to elect any optional coverage.
 - b. Optional Coverage. During the open enrollment period, career employees may elect to purchase Option A — Standard (\$10,000), Option B — Additional (up to five multiples of basic salary), Option C — Family (up to five multiples of \$5,000 coverage for a spouse and \$2,500 coverage for each child), or any combination of the three options. Employees who already have Option B - Additional and Option C — Family may increase coverage up to the five-multiple maximum. The ability to elect up to five multiples of Option C coverage for eligible family members is being offered for the first time during the 1999 Open Enrollment Period. Employees must have Basic Life to elect any optional coverage. Employees pay the cost of any optional insurance they elect.

- 5. Current Coverage. Employees satisfied with their current coverage need take no action. They should not submit an election form and will keep the same coverage they had before the open enrollment period. Only employees who want to make a change to existing coverage must complete the special open enrollment election form.
- 6. Changing Coverage. Employees who wish to change their coverage must complete RI 76-27, the special FEGLI '99 Open Enrollment Election Form, AND indicate ALL insurance coverages that they wish to maintain - not just coverages being elected for the first time. Any coverage not elected on the RI 76-27 will be considered to have been waived. An employee's local personnel office must receive the properly completed election form no later than close of business on Saturday, July 31, 1999. Each employee is solely responsible for ensuring that the election form is correct, that the election made reflects his or her intentions, and that the form is received in the local personnel office by the deadline. Anytime during the open enrollment period (through July 31) an employee can change a previous election simply by submitting a new RI 76-27 election form that reflects the desired coverages. After the open enrollment period is over (August 1 or later), an employee can notify the local personnel office in writing that he or she wishes to void an election made during the open enrollment period. By voiding the open enrollment election, coverage will revert back to the coverage held prior to the open enrollment period — a new election cannot be made at the time.
- 7. Eligibility. All career employees are eligible to make an open enrollment period election (except for those who are newly hired or who become newly eligible on or after April 24, 1999). Eligible employees include career employees in the following circumstances:
 - a. Employees on paid leave (e.g., sick or annual leave).
 - Individuals carried on Postal Service rolls in leave without pay (LWOP) status (including union officials who elected to continue FEGLI coverage by paying premiums).
 - c. Employees in receipt of benefits from the Office of Workers' Compensation who are insured under FEGLI as employees, not as compensationers.
 - d. Reemployed annuitants not otherwise excluded from coverage. Newly elected coverage does not become effective until employees meet the pay and duty status requirements.

- 8. Ineligibility. Among Postal Service employees ineligible for FEGLI coverage and participation in the open enrollment period are all noncareer employees including substitute rural carriers, auxiliary rural carriers, rural carrier associates, rural carrier reliefs, casual, transitional, and temporary employees. However, excluded employees who previously served in positions covered by FEGLI and who did not receive a break in service of at least 4 days may continue FEGLI coverage even in an excluded position, and therefore are eligible to make a FEGLI open enrollment period election.
- 9. Newly Hired and Newly Eligible Employees. Open enrollment period procedures do not apply to employees who first become eligible for FEGLI coverage during the open enrollment period (e.g., newly hired career employees). These individuals are eligible to elect any level or option of FEGLI coverage within 31 days of eligibility. Such employees must complete Standard Form 2817, *Life Insurance Election*, and will have the effective date of coverage determined in accordance with the FEGLI procedures for newly eligible employees.
- **10. Effective Date.** Subject to meeting pay and duty status requirements, the effective date for coverage elected during the 1999 Open Enrollment Period is April 23, 2000 (pay period 10-2000). If an employee makes an open enrollment election but retires or dies before April 23, 2000, or before pay and duty status requirements are met, the newly elected coverage never becomes effective.
- 11. Pay and Duty Status. FEGLI requires that, before coverage becomes effective, a full-time employee must be in a pay and duty status for at least 32 hours during the pay period before the effective date. Being on annual or sick leave, for example, represents pay status only, not pay and duty status. A part-time employee with a regularly scheduled tour of duty must be in pay and duty status for one-half the regularly scheduled tour of duty during the pay period prior to the effective date for an election to become effective. An employee who is without a regularly scheduled tour of duty or who is employed on an intermittent basis (e.g., a part-time flexible employee) must be in a pay and duty status for one-half the number of hours customarily worked, during the pay period prior to the effective date, for an election to become effective. Given the pay and duty status requirements, an open enrollment period election cannot become effective until these requirements are met.

- 12. Belated Elections. The local personnel office must receive open enrollment elections by close of business on Saturday, July 31, 1999. However, through December 31, 1999, local personnel offices have the authority to determine that an employee was unable to file an open enrollment election for a cause beyond his or her control. Upon making such a determination, the office gives the employee 31 days to file a belated open enrollment period election the employee's failure to file a belated election within 31 days is considered a declination of the opportunity to file. Belated elections, and therefore coverage and premium withholdings, become effective retroactive to the first pay period meeting the requirements described in sections 10 and 11 above.
- 13. Elections Due to Life Event or Cancellation of Waiver. Current employees who experience a qualifying life event (marriage, acquisition of children, divorce, or death of a spouse) on or after April 24, 1999, can elect or increase Option B and/or Option C within 60 days of the event occurring. The coverage becomes effective the day the local personnel office receives the election or the date of the event, whichever is later, subject to satisfying pay and duty status requirements. Employees who experienced a qualifying life event between October 30, 1998, and April 23, 1999, can elect additional multiples of Option C within 60 days after April 24, 1999. The increased coverage becomes effective retroactive to April 24, 1999.

Employees who have a physical examination and are approved to cancel a prior waiver of insurance during the open enrollment period can elect Basic Life, Option A, and Option B. These "regular" elections are made on Standard Form 2817, which distinguishes them from open enrollment elections. The coverage becomes effective within the same time frames that these types of elections always do. Only open enrollment elections have the April 23, 2000, effective date. If an employee experiences a life event or cancels a waiver by having a physical examination and wishes to make a "regular" election after he or she has submitted an open enrollment election, but before the election becomes effective, the employee can elect the appropriate coverage on Standard Form 2817, which is to be processed in the normal way.

14. Eligibility for Continuation of FEGLI During Retirement. In order to continue FEGLI coverage into retirement, it must have been in effect for the 5 years of service immediately preceding the effective date of retirement or for the entire period available, if less than 5 years. If an employee elects Option B — Additional

during the open enrollment period, at retirement he or she must have the coverage 5 years in order to continue it. The open enrollment period would not be the first opportunity to elect Option B — Additional. However, since two to five multiples of Option C — Family coverage were never available before, the open enrollment period is the first opportunity to elect that coverage. An employee who elects two to five multiples of Option C — Family and retires anytime after these additional multiples go into effect in 2000 will be eligible to continue the coverage at retirement, as long as the 5-year requirement for previous Option C — Family coverage is met. Employees who cannot carry coverage into retirement may convert such coverage to nongroup insurance.

- **15. Other Changes to the FEGLI Program.** In addition to mandating that an open enrollment period be held, the enactment of the Federal Employees' Life Insurance Improvement Act provided for other changes to the FEGLI Program. Following are highlights of how the new law changes existing FEGLI provisions:
 - Reduces premium rates.
 - Allows up to five multiples of Option C Family coverage.

- Covers foster children under Option C Family.
- Allows election of unreduced Option B Additional and Option C — Family coverage at retirement.
- Allows portability of Option B Additional coverage at separation or after 12 months in non-pay status.
- Eliminates maximums on Basic Life and Option B — Additional coverages.

Some of the new changes were effective on October 30, 1998, others become effective on April 24, 1999, and the new elections for two to five multiples of Option C — Family become effective April 23, 2000, subject to meeting pay and duty status requirements. For more detailed information about these FEGLI changes, employees should refer to the April 1999 version of the FEGLI booklet or contact the local personnel office.

1999 Open Enrollment Period

April 24 through July 30, 1999

WHAT: The Office of Personnel Management (OPM) has scheduled a Federal Employees' Group Life Insurance (FEGLI) Program open enrollment period. Employees may elect new coverage as provided under the Federal Employees' Life Insurance Improvement Act (Public Law 105-311), enacted on October 30, 1998.

WHEN: Employees who wish to make an election must submit the special FEGLI '99 Open Enrollment Period Election Form to the local personnel office no later than close of business on Saturday, July 31, 1999. *Note:* OPM is publicizing the open enrollment period as April 24 through June 30, 1999. However, the Postal Service is authorizing an extension through July 31 under belated election procedures due to a delay in receiving enrollment materials from OPM.

ELIGIBILITY: All career employees.

MAILINGS TO EMPLOYEES: Career employees will receive two mailings at their addresses of record, containing the following items:

- By April 30, a letter and FEGLI '99 Open Enrollment Period Pamphlet with an overview of available coverage options.
- By May 24, an information package with the April 1999 FEGLI Booklet and the special FEGLI '99 Open Enrollment Period Election Form.

CHOOSING COVERAGE: Employees satisfied with current coverage should do nothing. Only employees who wish to change existing coverage must complete and submit the special FEGLI '99 Open Enrollment Period Election Form to the local personnel office by close of business on Friday, July 30, 1999. *Note:* Career postal employees are covered for Basic Life automatically (unless coverage is waived).

Eligible employees may elect to purchase:

- Option A Standard (\$10,000).
- Option B Additional (up to five multiples of basic salary).
- Option C Family (up to five multiples of \$5,000 for spouse and \$2,500 for each child).
- Any combination of the three options.

EFFECTIVE DATE: Subject to meeting pay and duty status requirements, the effective date for coverage elected during the 1999 Open Enrollment Period is April 23, 2000.
