By request of the Canadian Office, it is hereby Ordered that all post offices and R. P. O. lines making up mails for Australia, China and Japan, shall hereafter make direct letter packages for the following offices, viz: ADELAIDE, BRISBANE, MELBOURNE and SYDNEY, Australia, HONG KONG and SHANGHAI, China, and TOKYO and YOKOHAMA, Japan.

In cases where the number of letters for any of the above destinations is not sufficient to warrant a direct package, the mail should be forwarded in R. P. O. package to connecting line.
