#### R. P. O. THROUGH REGISTERED POUCHES.

Omaha & Ogden RPO (E. Div.) Trains 3 and 10, and Pocatello & Portland RPO Trains 5 and 6.

Daily exchange, to commence the 19th instant, from train 3 to train 5, via Cheyenne & Pocatello train 5 for delivery to train addressed, with return dispatch by train 6 to train 10 via the Cheyenne & Pocatello train 6. Supply-offices, Portland, Oregon, and Omaha, Nebr. This supersedes the temporary exchange between the trains mentioned.

#### THROUGH REGISTERED POUCHES.

Washington, D. C., to Indianapolis, Ind.

The postmaster at Washington has been authorized to make not-regular dispatches of through registered pouches to Indianapolis, when occasion requires, such pouches to be forwarded via the New York & Grafton train 1 or via the Baltimore & Pittsburg train 11, for delivery at destination via the Chicago & Cincinnati train 15 and Pittsburg & St. Louis train 11, respectively.

### ORDER OF THE POSTMASTER GENERAL.

OFFICE OF THE POSTMASTER GENERAL,  
WASHINGTON, D. C., Apr. 7, 1908.

ORDER No. 1251.

ORDERED, That the Postal Laws and Regulations be amended as indicated below. Amend Section 562, paragraph 4, to read as follows:

"United States postage stamps, to be acceptable for postage, must be absolutely without defacement: *Provided*, That for the purpose of identification only, and not for advertising, it shall be permissible to puncture or perforate letters, numerals or other marks or devices in United States postage and special-delivery stamps. The punctures or perforations shall not exceed one sixty-fourth of an inch in diameter, and the whole space occupied by the identifying device shall not exceed one-third inch square. The puncturing or perforating must be done in such manner as to leave the stamp easily recognizable as genuine and not previously used. The use of ink or other coloring matter in connection with such puncturing or perforating is prohibited."

Amend Section 562 by adding the following as paragraph 5:

"5. When postage or special-delivery stamps are so affixed to mailable matter that one overlies another, concealing part of its surface, the stamp thus covered will not be taken into account in prepayment."
