ORDER No. 5874.

Postmasters are authorized to deliver all letters arriving at their respective post offices between December 16, 1911, and January 1, 1912, inclusive, which are addressed plainly and unmistakably to "Santa Claus," without any other terms or expressions identifying the person for whom such letters are intended, to responsible institutions or individuals in the town or city of address who may desire to use them exclusively for philanthropic purposes. In the event that these letters are requested by more than one such institution or individual the postmaster shall distribute them in such proportion as he may deem proper.

ORDER No. 5873.

The Department has prepared a special registry stamp of 10-cent denomination, which will be recognized by postmasters and employees of the postal service for prepayment of the fee on registered matter, domestic or foreign; but ordinary postage stamps may be used to prepay the registry fee when registry stamps are not available. Section 803 of the Postal Laws and Regulations, edition of 1902, is amended accordingly.

REGISTRY STAMPS.

OFFICE OF THIRD ASST. P. M. GEN., WASHINGTON, Nov. 1, 1911.

1. A new 10-cent stamp of special design, intended to identify mail matter to which it is affixed as being registered, has been prepared, and the Postmaster General's Order No. 5873, of November 1, 1911, directs its use for that purpose, still permitting the use of ordinary stamps for the purpose when registry stamps are not available.

DESCRIPTION.

The new registry stamp is a rectangle on end, the size of the design being approximately 1 by 1 inch, and the color light blue. The design shows an eagle with extended wings, perched upon a rock, within a circle set in a panel of plain lines. Above the circle, and following its curve, the words "United States Registry" appear in two lines, and in the two lower corners the denomination, "10," appears within small circles, with the word "Cents" between.

2. Postmasters will keep a supply of these new registry stamps on hand, and encourage their use by patrons of the registry service. The stamps will be issued to postmasters in lots of ten or multiples of ten. Postmasters will include a supply in their next requisition on Form 3201, writing the word "Registry" plainly opposite the item. Requisition should not be made for registry stamps alone, unless accompanied with a satisfactory explanation as to why ordinary stamps, due stamps, stamp books, postal cards and plain stamped envelopes are not included. When any variety of stamp supplies is needed, the postmaster should inventory his stock and include in the requisition all varieties likely to be needed in the ensuing three to nine months, depending upon his storage facilities, and not exceeding the number of stamps that can be adequately protected. This will avoid the necessity for frequent requisitions and will be advantageous to the postmaster as well as to the Department. See paragraphs 4, 10, 11, 13 and 14, pages 36, 37 and 38, and paragraph 11, page 51, of the July, 1911, Postal Guide; also Section 356, P. L. and R.

3. The registry stamps will be offered for sale to the public beginning December 1, 1911. Postmasters who receive supplies earlier will not place them on sale before that date.

4. The registry stamps are not good for postage or special delivery.
