Incoming Mail Packages Exceeding \$100.00 in Value.

OFFICE OF SECOND ASS'T P. M. GEN.,
WASHINGTON, Feb. 13, 1915.

Under the customs regulations it is required that regular entry be made of all incoming foreign mail packages containing enclosures exceeding \$100.00 in value.

With a view, therefore, of expediting the delivery of packages which upon a cursory examination by customs officers at the exchange office of receipt, are found to contain articles valued in excess of \$100, the Treasury Department has decided that such packages addressed for delivery at places where customs officers are located may be dispatched by postmasters to the place of delivery for entry there.

In order to make certain that such packages will not be overlooked, postmasters at the exchange post offices of receipt shall have attached to each package designated by customs authorities, a notice reading "Foreign Mail Package. Must be Submitted to Customs Officer," and in the case of packages not registered, they shall be dispatched in a separate sack, the label of which shall bear a notice similar to that herein prescribed.

Forms for Certificates to Be Furnished With Meat and Meat Food Products.

This Department, as well as the Department of Agriculture, frequently receives requests from postmasters for forms on which to make the certificates required to be furnished in connection with parcels containing meat or meat-food products presented for mailing from one State to another, under the provisions of Section 477, Postal Laws and Regulations. The attention of postmasters is particularly invited to paragraph 6 of that section, from which it will be seen that such forms are not supplied by the Government, but must in all cases be prepared and furnished by the sender or shipper. Postmasters will, therefore, refrain from making requests of this Department or the Department of Agriculture for such forms.
