## DIRECT EXCHANGE OF MONEY ORDERS WITH THE FREE CITY OF DANZIG.

THIRD ASSISTANT POSTMASTER GENERAL,  
Washington, August 19, 1924.

A convention for the direct exchange of international postal money orders between the United States and the free city of Danzig has been concluded and will become effective September 1, 1924.

Payment will be made in Danzig on a card order, Form 6309a, similar to the one now in use for money orders on Germany, and the third paragraph of the "Instructions" printed on every international money order apply to Danzig as well as to Germany, of which country it was formerly a part. Hence both order and advice should be left blank and stamped "Canceled," and a card order should be properly filled out by issuing postmaster and sent to the New York exchange office with filled-out coupon and canceled order and advice.

A supply of "Danzig" card orders will be furnished to all international money-order offices at an early date. In the meantime postmasters may make use, if necessary, of the card orders now on hand (Form 6309), being careful to strike out "German" or "Germany" wherever the word occurs and to substitute "Danzig."

The amount is to be stated in dollars and cents only on the card order, the spaces for the equivalent in foreign money to be left blank for the use of the Danzig exchange office, which will arrange for payment at the rate prevailing on the date of the arrival of the money-order advice list in which the card orders are certified.

Payment in this country is made on the usual reissued money orders.

## POSTMASTERS TO GIVE DATE OF INVOICE IN LETTERS TO DEPARTMENT

THIRD ASSISTANT POSTMASTER GENERAL,

Many postmasters fail to state the date of invoice when submitting reports to the department having reference to stamp stock supplied on a given requisition. This omission is noted particularly in connection with special-request orders. The lack of information concerning date of charge often prevents the complete investigation of the matter until further details are received from the postmaster, causing delay and unnecessary correspondence.

Therefore, postmasters at direct and central accounting post offices are requested to give date of invoice in all letters to the department where the quantity, quality, or value of stock supplied on a previous order is involved.
