#### **CUTTING CORDS OF MAIL SACKS**

SECOND ASSISTANT POSTMASTER GENERAL, Washington, June 4, 1929.

Advice has been received from the mail-equipment shops to the effect that a number of sacks, equipped with locking cord fasteners having locks attached thereto, are being received from time to time with the cords cut. Most of the locks attached to these fasteners, upon examination, are found to be in good order, indicating that the cords are being cut not for the reason that the locks can not be opened but for other reasons.

All postal employees are therefore cautioned that cords on mail sacks positively must not be cut unless the lock is defective and can not be opened, and that report should be made to the department in any cases where sacks are returned to post offices by publishers or others having

the cords cut thereon.

This matter must be given very careful attention by all concerned.

On receipt of this notice the postmaster at every money-order office will carefully examine his records to ascertain whether any of the forms in question have already been paid at his office; and if the coupon of any such order is found in the paid files, that fact should be reported immediately by letter to the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Money Orders.

If any of the forms are presented, the postmaster should refuse payment, wire the post-office inspector in charge of his division, and also the Third Assistant Postmaster General. Similar action must be taken by him in

case of the theft of forms from his office.

To provide against payment of stolen orders, each postmaster should conspicuously post warning notices where they can be readily consulted by the paying clerk. Failure to comply with these instructions is likely to result in personal loss to postmasters.
