SESQUICENTENNIAL OF NORTHWEST TERRITORY COMMEMORATIVE POSTAGE STAMP

Postmasters and employees of the Postal Service are hereby notified that the Department has authorized the issuance of a special postage stamp in the 3-cent denomination to commemorate the sesquicentennial anniversary of the settlement of the Northwest Territory under the Ordinance of 1787. The stamp will be placed on sale at Marietta, Ohio, where the first civil government in the Northwest Territory was established, on July 15, 1938. The stamp will be available at other post offices as soon after this date as stocks can be printed and distributed.

The new stamp is of the ordinary size, 0.75 by 0.87 inch in dimensions, arranged vertically. The stamp is being printed in purple, by the rotary process, and issued in sheets of 100.

The central design of this stamp depicts the memorial statue by Gutzon Borglum, symbolizing the colonization of the West, which is being erected at Marietta, Ohio. At the base of the statue in raised gothic letters is the wording: "Northwest Territory Sesquicentennial," arranged in two lines. The stamp has a single line frame, and is without background. In the upper left corner in dark gothic is the denomination designation "3e". In a corresponding position in the upper right corner, in dark gothic, is the date "1788," with "1938" underneath. In a narrow panel with dark ground along the base of the stamp is the inscription "U. S. Postage" in white roman.

Stamp collectors desiring first-day cancelations of the new stamp on July 15 may send a limited number of addressed covers, not in excess of 10, to the postmaster at Marietta, Ohio, with a cash or postal money order remittance to cover only the cost of the stamps required for affixing. Postage stamps will positively not be accepted in payment. Each cover should bear a pencil endorsement in the upper right corner to show the number of stamps to be attached thereto. Envelopes for covers should not be smaller than 3 by 6 inches. Compliance cannot be made with unusual requests, such as for the affixing of plate number blocks, etc., and all covers must be fully addressed.

Requests for uncanceled stamps must not be included with orders for first-day covers to the postmaster at the above office.

For the benefit of collectors desiring stamps of selected quality for philatelic use, the new stamp will be placed on sale at the Philatelic Agency on July 16, 1938. To insure prompt shipment, mail orders to the Agency must exclude other varieties of stamps.

Postmasters at direct- and central-accounting post offices may submit requisition for a limited supply only of the new stamp on Form 3201-A, endorsed "N. W. Territory." These initial requisitions shall exclude other varieties of stamps. Postmasters at district-accounting post offices may obtain small quantities of the new postage stamp by requisition on the central-accounting postmaster.

In some cases, postmasters may receive shipments of the new stamp prior to the close of business on July 15. In all such instances, care must be exercised not to allow any of the stamps to be sold before July 16.
