PARCEL-POST PACKAGES FOR ABROAD DURING THE HOLIDAY SEASON

The overseas holiday period of mailing commences about the middle of November and in anticipation of an increased number of international parcel-post packages being mailed from that time up to the end of the holiday season, postmasters will observe particularly the parcel-post tables printed on pages 61 to 312, inclusive, of Part II of the Postal Guide for 1938. These tables furnish information concerning the weight limits and dimensions applicable to parcels for each foreign country, show whether the parcels may be registered, insured or sent c. o. d., the charges required to be prepaid, the number and kind of customs declarations to be employed in each case, what other forms (if any) are necessary and the articles which are prohibited transmission by parcel post. Poster form 2999 also shows the countries to which the insurance or registry feature, or both, is applicable. The tables must be kept corrected so that they may be immediately available when needed.

In instances where parcel post packages are presented simply for mailing, postmasters will please see to it that accepting employees make it a uniform practice to inform patrons of the availability of the insurance or registry service and to encourage the patronage thereof. This is particularly essential in the case of employees temporarily assigned to parcel-post windows during the Christmas season. Attention is also invited to the general information appearing on pages 40 to 60, inclusive, of Part II of the Postal Guide for 1938.

Due to failure of mailing post offices to see that the proper number or the correct forms (Nos. 2966 and 2967) are securely attached to parcels when mailed, the dispatching exchange offices find it necessary to prepare and affix customs declarations to a great many parcels. The same is true in regard to parcels for those countries which require the preparation of dispatch notes (Form 2972). In this connection, attention is directed to sections 77 and 78 on pages 43 and 44 of the Postal Guide (Part II). When accepting parcel-post packages for foreign countries, the aforementioned tables on pages 61 to 312 of Part II should be consulted. Every effort should be made to have international parcel-post packages properly prepared for mailing and dispatch. Articles of china, crockery, glass, hats, radios, or other articles of a fragile or easily breakable nature should be packed in a strong (preferably wooden) box. Strong double-faced corrugated cardboard boxes enclosed in strong wooden crates are also preferred. There should be a space of at least  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inches between the article and the top, bottom, and sides of the box. This space may be utilized with excelsior or other effective cushioning material, or, with air-cushioned corrugated riders. If a parcel tendered for mailing is not, in the opinion of the accepting employee, adequately packed for the length of the journey and for the protection of the contents, it shall be refused. Also, it should be called to the attention of mailers by accepting clerks that no responsibility will, as a general rule, by assumed when the addressee or, in case of return, the sender, or authorized representative of either, makes no reservations as to the condition of the parcel in taking delivery thereof, the contents of which have been abstracted or damaged. Particular attention is called to the increased rates recently put into effect on parcel post for Brazil, Dominican Republic, Haiti, Panama, Peru, El Salvador, and Venezuela, and to the fact that provision is now also made for insured parcel-post service with Argentina, Barbados, British

Letters, post cards, newspapers, etc.—As stated above, the list shows the latest dates articles should reach Atlantic and Pacific coast ports in order to be delivered by Christmas in foreign countries and United States possessions indicated, but if mail is ready it should not be held lest changes in steamship schedules or congestion prevent delivery until after Christmas.

Parcel post.---It is not possible to state when parcel post packages will be delivered, due to customs formalities that must, in most cases, be complied with before actual delivery is made to addressees. ALL PARCELS Guiana, and Iceland. Registered parcel-post service to Argentina, Barbados, British SHOULD BE MAILED AS EARLY AS POSSIBLE. Guiana, and Iceland has been discontinued.

# SEPARATION IN POST OFFICES AND RAILWAY POST OFFICES OF MAIL FOR FOREIGN COUNTRIES

Post offices and railway post offices will continue the separation of mail for foreign countries (especially during the period from November 15 to December 15, when the foreign mail is exceptionally heavy) to avoid con-gestion at the exchange post offices of New York, San Francisco, Seattle, and New Orleans. See page 21 of Part II of the Postal Guide for 1938.

Long letters should not be included with the short (ordinary size) letters in "country" packages, particularly during the period mentioned. If there is not a sufficient amount of long letters for a "country" package such long letters should be included with those for other countries in a mixed package. Furthermore, circulars (including Christmas cards in open envelopes, not paid letter rate, also picture post cards, paid printed matter rate) must not be included in letter packages; they should be tied out separately and the facing slips endorsed "circulars," as steamships are paid a lower rate for the transportation of such mail.

Packages of books, miscellaneous printed matter, samples, and small packets, while classified as parcel post in the United States domestic service, are classified in the international mails as "prints" (books and miscellaneous printed matter), "samples," and "small packets," and are usually despatched in the same sacks under the single designation "prints" ("other articles"). This class of articles (unless they have customs declarations attached and are prepaid as parcel post) should therefore be included

with newspapers in the prints sacks, which are not locked. Parcel post sacks should be labeled, for example, "New York foreign parcel post" when containing parcels intended for despatch from New York. When the size or number of parcels warrants, they should be placed in separate sacks labeled "New York foreign parcel post (Germany)," "New York foreign parcel post (Poland)," etc., as the case may be. Inter-national parcel-post packages will be despatched as indicated in the tables national parcel-post packages will be despatched as indicated in the tables on pages 61 to 312 of Part II of the Postal Guide for 1938.

#### WEIGHT LIMIT FOR PRINTED MATTER IN GENERAL FOR SALVADOR (EL)

Effective at once, the weight limit for printed matter in general addressed for delivery in Salvador (El) is increased from 11 to 22 pounds.

#### NEW ISSUES OF 19-CENT AND 20-CENT ORDINARY POSTAGE STAMPS

Postmasters are hereby advised that the 19-cent stamp bearing the likeness of Rutherford B. Hayes, and the 20-cent denomination containing the portrait of James A. Garfield, will be the next stamps to be made available in the new regular series.

The 19-cent stamp will conform in general design to the preceding denominations of this series having single-line borders. It will be printed in lilac by the rotary process and issued in sheets of 100. The 20-cent stamp will also conform in general design to the preceding denominations, but will have a double-line border. The latter stamp will be printed in green by the rotary process and issued in sheets of 100.

The stamps will be first placed on sale at Washington, D. C., on November 10, 1938, and at other post offices as soon thereafter as practicable.

Stamp collectors desiring first-day cancelations of the new stamps on November 10 may send a limited number of addressed covers, not in excess of 10 for each denomination, to the Postmaster, Washington, D. C., with a cash or postal money order remittance to cover only the cost of the stamps required for affixing. Postage stamps will positively not be accepted in payment. Each cover should bear a pencil endorsement in the upper right corner to show the number of stamps to be attached thereto. Envelopes for covers should not be smaller than 3 by 6 inches. Compliance cannot be made with unusual requests, such as for the affixing of plate number blocks, etc., and all covers must be fully addressed.

Requests for uncanceled stamps must not be included with orders for first-day covers to the postmaster at the above office.

For the benefit of collectors desiring stamps of selected quality for philatelic use, the 19-cent and 20-cent stamps will be placed on sale at the Philatelic Agency, Washington, D. C., on November 10, 1938. To insure prompt shipment, mail orders to the Agency must be limited to the 19-cent and
