INSTRUCTIONS OF THE DEPUTY POSTMASTER GENERAL

PERSONNEL-EXTRA HELP FOR CHRISTMAS

The notice relative to organizing for Christmas appearing in the POSTAL BULLETIN of October 25, 1949, stated under "Personnel—Extra Help for Christmas" that appointees must execute blanket Form P. O. 61X, revised September 1948. This form should be used only at first-class offices where approximately 20 or more temporary substitutes will be employed incident to the Christmas business. At all other offices Form P. O. 61 should be used.

UNNECESSARY DEFACEMENT OF ADDRESSES

It has been reported to the Department that post-office employees have been careless in making hand-stamped endorsements such as, "Return to Sender"; "Returned under Postage Guarantee"; or "Postage Due — Cents" on undeliverable mail. Legible addresses on such mail are important to business concerns for identification of their customers and for the correction of their mailing lists. The purpose of returning such mail is defeated if the addresses are covered, defaced, obscured, or obliterated by the rubber stamp impressions made at the post office.

This is brought to the attention of all postmasters so that the postoffice employees involved may be impressed with the importance of leaving the addresses legible when endorsing undeliverable mail for return to sender. In this connection, attention is invited to section 43.44 (g) of the Postal Laws and Regulations, 1948 edition, which states in part as follows: "The original address shall be canceled, but shall not be obliterated or rendered illegible." See also chapter VIII, article 154, of the Manual of Instructions for Postal Personnel.

MAIL ADDRESSED TO THE UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA SCIENTIFIC LABORATORY PROJECT

Information has been received in the Department that a large amount of mail addressed to the University of California Scientific Laboratory Project or to the University of California Los Alamos Scientific Laboratory, Post Office Box 1663, Los Alamos, N. Mex., has been improperly handled.

It is indicated that in some instances the address of mail intended for this laboratory has been changed by substituting "California" for "New Mexico" and in other instances the mail matter has been returned to the sender without ever having reached Los Alamos, N. Mex. Mail reaching Los Alamos, N. Mex., addressed to this laboratory will be delivered by that office. Therefore, postal personnel should see that such mail is properly handled in the future.

TUBERCULOSIS CHRISTMAS SEAL POSTER LOBBY DISPLAY AUTHORIZED

All postmasters are authorized to display in a prominent location in the public lobby from November 22 to December 25, 1949, posters of the 1949 Christmas Seal which will be furnished them by local associations of the National Tuberculosis Association. The poster should be displayed in such manner as not to mar or deface the walls or woodwork.

INSTRUCTIONS OF ASSISTANT POSTMASTERS GENERAL

MAIL FOR SAAR TERRITORY TO BE ADDRESSED TO FRANCE

Effective at once, the region known as the Saar Territory, heretofore included in Postal District 18 in the French zone of Germany, will be considered for postal purposes as a part of France.

The postage rates and other conditions applicable to continental France will hereafter apply to mail and parcel post for the Saar Territory. Articles and parcels for that territory are to be addressed to Saar, France, as country of destination.

The principal localities in the Saar Territory are the following:

Homburg (Saar). Merzig. Neunkirchen (Saar). Ottweiler. Saarbrücken. Saarlautern. Saarlouis. St. Ingbert. St. Wendel.

MERCHANDISE FOR YUKON TERRITORY RESTRICTED DURING WINTER SEASON

The Canadian Postal Administration advises that the transmission of merchandise to the Yukon Territory over the White Horse-Dawson route during the winter season (from October 1, 1949, to May 31, 1950) will, as in former years, be restricted to articles for post offices at Carcross, Champagne, and White Horse.

Postmasters will, therefore, decline to accept for mailing, until June 1, 1950, merchandise to be transmitted over the White Horse-Dawson route to either United States or Canadian points, except as stated above.

During the winter season of 1949-1950 there will be a weekly or more frequent air-stage service, depending on weather conditions, in operation between White Horse and Dawson via Mayo Landing and Elsa, White Horse, and Fort Selkirk via Carmacks, and fortnightly between Dawson and Stewart River. Watson Lake is served tri-weekly by air the year round. Parcel post is conveyed over this air-stage service to and from those post offices at the special rate of 30 cents for the first pound plus 25 cents for each additional pound or fraction up to 15 pounds. Parcels originating in the United States addressed for delivery at Dawson, Mayo Landing, Fort Selkirk, Carmacks, Elsa, Watson Lake, and Stewart River will be given air transmission to these points in Yukon, provided postage is paid at the abovementioned rate. Such parcels will be sent by ordinary means to White Horse for onward air connection. Air-mail markings must not appear on these parcels.

In addition, Teslin is served approximately weekly in winter by motor vehicle service via the Alaska Highway. Parcels for delivery at Teslin are subject to a special rate of 25 cents per pound or fraction.

CLAIMS FOR POSTAL NOTES MORE THAN 1 YEAR OLD MAY BE FILED IF ACCOMPANIED BY ORIGINAL NOTE

With reference to the notice published in the POSTAL BULLETIN of December 14, 1948, postmasters are instructed that, until further notice, they may accept and transmit to the Department claims for the amount of postal notes more than 1 year old, provided the original note accompanies the claim. However, claims may not be accepted covering lost notes more than 1 year old.

PROPER CANCELLATION OF STAMPS

There has come to the attention of this office the fact that considerable numbers of parcels are being placed in the mails on which the stamps are not canceled. In a recent mail from one boat alone arriving in Hawaii there were received from three large offices parcels with \$40.33 in uncanceled stamps, not including the many other miscellaneous parcels received bearing uncanceled stamps. The Department is thus subjected to the possible loss of considerable revenue and postmasters are urged to take such measures as may be required to assure that the stamps on parcels mailed at their offices are properly canceled.

INTERNATIONAL AIR PARCEL POST

Effective November 1, 1949, air parcel-post service will be inaugurated to French Morocco, subject to the general conditions stated in section 54, paragraph II, on page 47 of the 1949 Postal Guide, Part II.

The postage rates applicable to air parcels for French Morocco will be \$1.19 for the first 4 ounces or fraction and 54 cents for each additional 4 ounces or fraction.

NINE-PERCENT DISCOUNT TO BE ALLOWED FOR MONEY ORDERS DRAWN FOR PAYMENT IN CANADA

Effective November 1, 1949, an order of the Postmaster General authorizes a discount rate of 9 percent for all money orders issued in this country on and after Tuesday, November 1, 1949, for payment in Canada. In other words, all money orders payable in that country shall be sold on and after that date at the rate of 91 cents United States money to the Canadian dollar.

Postmasters shall use the discount table reprinted in this BULLETIN.

Stamp collectors desiring first-day cancellations of this stamp may send a limited number of addressed envelopes, not in excess of 10, to the Postmaster, Seattle Wash., with postal note or money order remittance to cover the cost of the stamps to be affixed. **Postage stamps and personal checks** will not be accepted in payment. Envelopes submitted should be of ordinary letter size and each must be properly addressed. An enclosure of medium weight should be placed in each envelope and the flap either sealed or turned in. An outside envelope must not be sent for return of first day covers. The envelope to the Postmaster, Seattle, Wash., should be endorsed "First Day Covers." Orders for first-day covers must not include requests for uncanceled stamps.

For the benefit of collectors desiring stamps of selected quality for philatelic use, the 25-cent Universal Postal Union air mail stamp will be available at the Philatelic Agency, Post Office Department, Washington 25, D. C., on and after December 1, 1949. To insure prompt shipment, mail orders to the Agency should include no other stamp issues. The Philatelic Agency does not service first day covers.

Postmasters at direct- and central-accounting post offices will submit requisitions for a limited supply of the new 25-cent air mail stamp based on local mailing and philatelic requirements. Direct- and central-accounting postmasters are furnished commemorative stamps as fast as they can be manufactured. They are, therefore, requested to refrain from reporting the nonreceipt of shipments until a reasonable time has elapsed after the first day of issue.

Postmasters at district-accounting post offices may obtain needed quantities of the 25-cent Universal Postal Union air mail stamps by requisition on the central-accounting postmaster.

Postmasters will please post a copy of this notice on the bulletin board, give information to the press, and notify all local stamp clubs regarding the issuance of the 25-cent Universal Postal Union air mail stamp.

Postmasters are cautioned not to place the stamp herein announced on sale before December 1, 1949.

TWENTY-FIVE CENT UNIVERSAL POSTAL UNION AIR MAIL COMMEMORATIVE STAMP

The Department will issue a 25-cent air-mail stamp through the Seattle, Wash., post office on November 30, 1949, to commemorate the seventyfifth anniversary of the Universal Postal Union.

The stamp will be 0.84 by 1.44 inches in dimensions, arranged horizontally, printed by the rotary process in red, electric-eye perforated, and issued in sheets of 50 subjects. The printing of 10,000,000 25-cent Universal Postal Union air-mail stamps has been authorized.

The border of the stamp is formed by a dark background on which is depicted the world with a modern four-motor plane in flight over the Pacific Ocean. Across the upper portion is the lettering "U. S. Postage * Air Mail" in white Gothic with large denomination numeral " 25ϕ " in the same style directly under the words "Air Mail." The wording "The Universal Postal Union 1874–1949" in dark Gothic on a white ribbon appears in a corresponding position at the bottom.

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INSTRUCTIONS OF THE COMPTROLLER

REVISED PAY TABLES

Under the provisions of Public Law 428, approved October 28, 1949, all annual and hourly rates heretofore published in the official pay tables for the postal field service and in the cashbooks used at certain offices become obsolete at the close of business October 31, 1949.

Pay tables for use in computing compensation payable under the new law are published herein, but the tables should not be placed in use or compensation rates otherwise changed until further instructions authorizing such changes are published. It is contemplated that appropriate and detailed instructions will be published at an early date.

Tables for use in determining the compensation payable to rural carriers version to the new salary rates, the follow have been or will be furnished rural disbursing offices prior to November 15. It is expected that from 60 to 90 days will elapse before the official pay tables, identified by the heading above each table.

Form B/A-10, can be revised, printed and distributed to those offices of the first- and second-class to which they are furnished. Postmasters at first- and second-class offices will be informed through a BULLETIN notice, or otherwise, as soon as the revised tables are available.

The tables published herein were computed to the nearest cent, counting one-half cent and over as a whole cent and disregarding any fraction below one-half cent. When the daily or hourly rates (the five decimal figures) are used for computing base pay, night differential and overtime pay, or deductions for retirement, for a fraction of a pay period or any given number of hours (or days in the case of fourth-class offices) increase the figure in the second decimal place of the final result by one when the figure in the third decimal place is five or more and disregard the fraction when the figure in the third decimal place is less than five.

As soon as the subsequent instructions are published, authorizing conversion to the new salary rates, the following tables will be used in computing the compensation payable to the various groups of employees identified by the heading above each table.
