New 15-Cent Certified Mail Stamp

The Department will issue a 15cent stamp, to be used in connection with the new certified mail service being inaugurated by the Post Office Department, through the Washington, D. C., post office, on June 6,



The stamp will be 0.84 by 1.44 inches in dimension, arranged vertically with a simple picture frame effect, printed by the rotary process, electric-eye perforated and issued in sheets of 50. The color of the stamp will be red.

The overall design of the stamp portrays a uniformed letter carrier on a light graduated background. The wording Certified Mail in dark gothic, is displayed across the top of the stamp and U. S. Postage 15¢ across the bottom in white-face gothic.

Stamp collectors desiring first-day cancellations of this stamp may send a reasonable number of addressed envelopes, with money order remittance to cover the cost of the stamps to be affixed, to the postmaster at Washington 13, D. C. Postage stamps and personal checks will not be accepted in payment.

Each cover must have a 3-cent stamp affixed, or if airmail service is desired a 6-cent stamp, when submitted, as the new 15-cent Certified

Mail stamp is not valid for prepayment of postage.

A horizontal space, approximately 2½ by 1½ inches on the left side of the envelope will be required for the certified mail sticker which will be affixed to all covers mailed to the postmaster at Washington, D. C. Collectors should also bear in mind when addressing covers that the new stamp to be affixed, in addition to the previously applied postage, is vertically arranged.

The covers should not be sealed when mailed to the postmaster at Washington, D. C. This will permit him to enclose that portion of the certified mail form which the mailer ordinarily retains when the envelope sticker is detached. The mailer's

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Postal Manual Revision Notices

In the future, Postal Manual revision notices will be called transmittal letters instead of circulars.

These letters covering material under the new manual outline will be preceded by the chapter title, as Post Office Services Transmittal Letter, for chapter 1; International Mail Transmittal Letter, for chapter 2; etc. Letters covering changes in the old manual material will be called Old Manual Transmittal Letters.

This is a change in title only and will not involve any break in numbering.

Retention of COD Packages

Effective at once, the maximum retention period for undelivered COD packages at post offices of address is increased from 15 days to 30 days. Sections 158.272 and 163.51a, Postal Manual, will be amended later.

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portion is numbered serially to correspond with a serial number on the sticker on the face of the envelope.

Envelopes submitted should be of ordinary letter size and each must be properly addressed. An outside envelope must not be sent for return of first-day covers. The envelope to the postmaster, Washington, D. C., should be endorsed First Day Covers. Collectors should refrain from requesting hand cancellations since covers will be machine canceled so far as practicable. Orders for first-day covers must not include requests for uncanceled stamps.

For the benefit of collectors desiring stamps of selected quality for philatelic use, the 15-cent Certified Mail stamp will be available at the Philatelic Agency, Post Office Department, Washington 25, D. C., on and after June 6, 1955. To insure prompt shipment, mail orders to the agency should include no other stamp issues. The Philatelic Agency does not service first-day covers.

Postmasters at first-class post offices requiring this stamp in lots of 25,000 or more will requisition it from the Department in the usual manner. Those offices requiring less than 25,-000 may obtain this stamp by submitting requisitions to their Regional Office. Postmasters Distributing should keep their requisitions to a minimum until local requirements can be more accurately determined.

Postmasters ordering stamps from Regional Distributing Offices should submit requisitions about June 1, 1955. Regional Distributing Office postmasters should submit requisitions to the Department promptly upon the receipt of this notice.

Postmasters will please post a copy of this notice on the bulletin board, give information to the press, and notify all local stamp clubs regarding the issuance of the 15-cent Certified Mail stamp.

Postmasters are cautioned not to place the stamp herein announced on sale before June 7, 1955.
