

All Postal Installations

New 6-Cent Postage Stamp

The Department will issue a 6-cent air mail stamp to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the United States Air Force as part of the National Defense System, through the Washington, D. C., post office, on August 1, 1957.



The stamp will be 0.84 by 1.44 inches in dimension, arranged horizontally, printed by the rotary process, electric-eye perforated, and issued in sheets of 50. The color of the stamp will be Air Force blue. An initial printing of 40 million of these stamps has been authorized.

The stamp has for its central subject a B-52 Stratofortress in a banking position with three F-104 Starfighters in the background. The Air Force eagle and thunderbolt shield appear in the upper left corner of the stamp superimposed over a portion of the wing of the Stratofortress. The wording Fiftieth Anniversary United States Air Force is arranged in one line across the top of the stamp and to the right of the design. The wording U. S. Air Mail Postage and the denomination 6¢ appear in the lower right portion of the stamp. All lettering is in white face gothic.

Stamp collectors desiring first-day cancellations of this stamp may send addressed envelopes to the Post-master, Washington 13, D. C., with money order remittance to cover the cost of the stamps to be affixed. Postage stamps and personal checks will not be accepted in payment. Envelopes submitted should be of ordinary letter size and each must be properly addressed. An enclosure of medium weight should be placed in each envelope and the flap either turned in or sealed. Change in Notice of Stolen Money Order Forms

Hereafter the listing of stolen money order forms will appear as published on the last page of this Bulletin. Detach this list each time it is published and post at windows where money order business is conducted. Destroy all previous lists.

The former practice of publishing a list every 6 months covering money order forms stolen during the previous 2 years is discontinued.—Bureau of Finance.

D. C., should be endorsed FIRST-DAY COVERS 64 AIR FORCE STAMP. Collectors should refrain from requesting hand cancellations since covers will be machine canceled so far as practicable. Orders for first-day covers must not include requests for uncanceled stamps.

For the benefit of collectors desiring stamps of selected quality for philatelic use, the 6-cent Air Force commemorative air mail stamp will be available at the Philatelic Agency, Post Office Department, Washington 25, D. C., on and after August 1, 1957. To insure prompt shipment, mail orders to the Agency should include no other stamp issues.

The Philatelic Agency does not service first-day covers.

Postmasters at first-class post offices requiring this issue in lots of 25,000, or multiples thereof, will requisition it in the usual manner. Those offices requiring less than 25,000 may obtain this stamp by submitting requisitions to their regional distributing office. Postmasters should restrict requisitions for this stamp to such quantities as will be required to meet the immediate philatelic demand.

Postmasters ordering stamps from regional distributing offices should submit requisitions about July 26, 1957. Regional distributing office postmasters should submit requisi-

New Air Service

Philatelic treatment will be given covers on the first flight from New Orleans to Mexico City, Mexico, by Eastern Air Lines, Inc., expected to depart on or about July 23, 1957. The airmail postage rate of 6 cents per ounce will be applicable to the covers sent via this service.

A special cachet will be applied to covers bearing the required postage and accompanied by request that they be forwarded by the first flight. Covers should be sent to the following:

Covers may be for delivery in the United States, Canada, or Mexico, and should be addressed in the usual manner to persons who are to receive them. It is anticipated that the covers will be backstamped upon receipt in Mexico and those addressed for delivery in the United States and Canada returned in the usual manner.

Covers for the first flight must reach New Orleans not later than July 21. Covers already postmarked or articles mailed in the usual manner will not receive a cachet.—Bureau of Transportation.

tions promptly upon the receipt of this notice.

Postmasters shall post a copy of this notice on the bulletin board, give information to the press, and notify all local stamp clubs regarding the issuance of the 6-cent Air Force commemorative air mail stamp.

Postmasters shall not place this stamp on sale before August 2, 1957.—Bureau of Finance.

Salary Adjustments of Certain Employees

The Department has obtained a ruling from the Comptroller General, dated May 2, 1957, making possible a retroactive adjustment in the salaries of certain employees whose salaries were not converted to the next higher step for their levels on December 3, 1955. Employees now on the rolls who were serving on December 2, 1955 under temporary appointments limited to one year or less at salaries above step one for the level of the position to which they were converted on December 3, 1955, shall now be retroactively converted to the first step in the level which exceeds the previous salary. Employees now on the rolls who were serving at PTS substitutes in the maximum automatic grade on December 2, 1955, shall have their salaries adjusted to PFS-5, step 5 effective December 3, 1955.

Postmasters and district transportation managers should review the service records of employees now on the rolls to ascertain whether any are entitled to salary adjustments under this decision. Where a salary adjustment is in order, a Notification of Personnel Action, POD Form 50 will be prepared. The Nature of Action, Item 9, will be shown as Pay Adjustment; the Effective Date, Item 3, as December 3, 1955; the Authority, Item 10, as C G decision B 128701. Under Remarks, Item 34, should be entered a statement as follows: "This corrects the step and compensation of this employee effective December 3, 1955, the date that salary schedules provided by P. L. 68, 84th Congress,

All Postal Installations Having Government-Owned Vehicles

Truck Display

Postal installations operating Government-owned mail trucks will receive posters from the Department of Defense for display on both sides of the mail trucks during the months of August and September.

Navy posters will be displayed from August 1 through August 20; Air Force posters from August 21 through September 9, and Army posters from September 10 through September 30, 1957.—Bureau of Facilities.

Floors—Care and Maintenance

Copies of Floors—Care and Maintenance, Facilities Handbook, Series S-3 are available in supply centers.

Postmasters in 1st- and 2d-class offices, and officials-in-charge of PTS and MVS facilities should requisition sufficient copies of S-3 to provide one copy for each custodial employee engaged in the cleaning of floors and those responsible for the supervision of such employees.

Requisitions should be submitted on Form 4750, Special Requisition for Supplies.—Bureau of Facilities.

were placed in effect." The "From" side of Items 11, 12, 13, and 14 should be completed to show the status of the employee on December 2, 1955. The "To" side should reflect his status upon conversion as of December 3, 1955, under the provision of P. L. 68. "27" should be entered in the Code column in item 32 on the Form 50.

For all employees for whom such an adjustment is made it will also be necessary to review the personnel and pay actions effected since December 3, 1955, to determine if additional adjustments are warranted. If so Forms 50 must also be issued for such corrections.

Questions pertaining to individual actions should be referred to the regional personnel manager.—Bureau of Personnel.

Section 134.9, Postal Manual, prohibits the acceptance of circulars mailed at third-class rates to such destinations.

Postmasters are requested to give this matter careful attention and wherever possible call to the attention of mailers the prohibition against acceptance of these mailings at third-class rates of postage.—Bureau of Operations.
