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

All Postal Installations

4-Cent Arctic Explorations Commemorative Postage Stamp

The Department will issue a special 4-cent stamp to mark the conquest of the Arctic area by surface and by sea through the Cresson, Pa., post office, on April 6, 1959.

POSTMASTERS SHALL NOT PLACE THIS STAMP ON SALE BEFORE APRIL 7, 1959



The stamp will be 0.84 by 1.44 inches in dimension, arranged horizontally, printed by the rotary process, electric-eye perforated, and issued in sheets of 50. The color of the stamp will be blue. An initial printing of 120,000,000 has been authorized.

The design features the upper portion of the globe, with the North Pole area emphasized. The global area is divided horizontally, with the light upper segment indicative of surface transportation, and the dark lower portion representative of underwater exploration. Superimposed on the upper portion of the design is a man and his dog-drawn sled. Below is a view of the nuclear-powered USS "Nautilus". Across the top of the design, against an uncolored background, is the inscription "Arctic Explorations" and directly below, to the right, is "1909," in dark Roman lettering. Above the "Nautilus," to the left, is "1959," and below the submarine is "U.S. Postage," both in white Roman. The value "4¢" appears at the lower right, in dark Roman with white outline.

In actuality the stamp marks the fiftieth anniversary of the arrival of Adm. Robert Edwin Peary at the North Pole. It also notes the history-making feat of the U.S. Navy's "Nautilus" almost 50 years later in making the first under-the-sea crossing at the North Pole.

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All Postal Installations

Inauguration of Airmail Service

(1) Frontier Airlines, Inc.—AM-73

Effective on or about April 1, 1959, airmail service will be inaugurated by Frontier Airlines at Scottsbluff and Alliance, Nebr.; Hot Springs, Rapid City and Lemmon, S. Dak.; and Minot, N. Dak.

Official cachets will be furnished for each of these points. The usual treatment outlined in 145.3 Postal Manual, is authorized.

(2) Trans World Airlines, Inc.—AM-2

Effective on or about March 15, 1959, Trans World Airlines will inaugurate jet airmail service between New York and San Francisco.

Official cachets will be furnished for New York and San Francisco, and for the airport mail facilities at these offices. Covers to receive the cachet may be sent to the postmasters at New York and/or San Francisco. Covers to receive the AMF cachet may be sent to the Superintendent, Airport Mail Facility, San Francisco, Calif., or New York International Airport (Idlewild) Long Island, N.Y.

Official cachet will also be furnished for the United Nations. Covers to receive this cachet must be sent to the Chief, United Nations Postal Administration, United Nations 17, N.Y., with a request that they be sent on the initial flight. Such covers will bear the United Nations post office station postmark. Covers should be accompanied by a money order to cover the cost of stamps that are to be affixed.

The usual philatelic treatment, outlined in 145.3 Postal Manual, is authorized.

(3) American Airlines, Inc.—AM-4 (Postponement of Effective Date).

Reference is made to notice of inauguration of jet airmail service by American Airlines between New York, Chicago, and San Francisco,

Requisitioning Plain Stamped Envelopes

Postmasters requiring 5,000 or more plain stamped envelopes of an item must place their requisitions to reach the U.S. Stamped Envelope Agent, Dayton 2, Ohio, the first week of each accounting period. Requisitions not received in accordance with this schedule will be held until the following accounting period before being processed.

Part 422.7 of the Postal Manual will be amended accordingly.—Bureau of Facilities, 3-5-59.

All Post Offices With Over \$1 Million Receipts

Originating Mail Volume Report, Form 933 (Revised)

All post offices with annual receipts of \$1 million and over will continue to use Form 933 (Nov. 1958), *Originating Mail Volume Report*.

Instructions for use are set forth on reverse side of Form 933.

Form 933-a, *Originating Mail Volume Record*, is provided as an accompanying worksheet for daily outgoing mail volume recordings and periodic summaries.

Part 483, Postal Manual, will be amended accordingly.—Bureau of Finance, 3-5-59.

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4-Cent Arctic Explorations Commemorative Postage Stamp

Collectors desiring first-day cancellations of the 4-cent Arctic Explorations commemorative stamp may send addressed envelopes, together with remittance to cover the cost of the stamps to be affixed, to the Postmaster, Cresson, Pa. A close fitting enclosure of postal card thickness should be placed in each envelope and the flap either turned in or sealed. Envelopes submitted should be of ordinary letter size and each must be properly addressed. An envelope must not be sent for return of first-day covers. The outside envelope to the postmaster should be endorsed "First-Day Covers Arctic Explorations Stamp." Orders for covers must not include requests for uncanceled stamps.

For the benefit of collectors desiring stamps of selected quality for philatelic use, the 4-cent Arctic Explorations commemorative stamp will be available at the Philatelic Sales Agency, Post Office Department, Washington 25, D.C., on and after April 7, 1959. To insure prompt shipment, mail orders to the Agency should include no other stamp issues. **The Philatelic Sales Agency does not service first-day covers.**

Postmasters are reminded of the notice by the Postmaster General in the September 11, 1958, issue of the Postal Bulletin requiring postmasters to submit requisitions for each new stamp issue as announced in the POSTAL BULLETIN so that ample quantities will be available at all post offices on the following day after official first-day sale.

Postmasters at first- and second-class post offices requiring this issue in lots of 5,000, or the multiples outlined in Part 422.322 of the Postal Manual, will submit Form 3356, punch card requisition (using Item No. 412) **immediately** to the Tabulating Machine Unit, Office of the Controller, Bureau of Engraving and Printing, Washington 25, D.C. Offices requiring less than 5,000 stamps shall submit a **separate requisition immediately** on Form 017 to their regional distributing office. Requisitions including other stamps will be delayed.

If any of these forms is presented, the postmaster will refuse payment and notify the postal inspector of his district.—*Bureau of Finance, 3-5-59.*

Customs Collections

Information received from Bureau of Customs and from regional controller offices indicates that some postmasters are submitting improperly prepared Forms 2932, *Register of Customs Collections*, and are not giving proper treatment to uncollected items. These discrepancies occur most often on reports submitted by smaller offices having infrequent custom items. The following paragraphs deal with types of discrepancies and provide further clarification for reporting customs items.

1. Types of Discrepancies

A. Delay in Submission of Registers. Collections made during a reporting period must be reported on Form 2932 for that period. However, collected items inadvertently omitted from Form 2932 for the period in which the collection was made, will be entered on Form 2932 for the current period. Postmasters at all except million-dollar offices will report customs collections on the 28-day accounting period basis and must submit original (white) copies of Forms 2932 to regional controller promptly at the end of that period. The *pink* and *blue* copies must also be forwarded promptly at that time to issuing port of entry.

B. Forms 2932 Forwarded to Wrong Port of Entry. Dutiable articles received from a port of entry must be entered on Form 2932 for that port of entry. Use the *name of the port of entry*, as shown on face of TD Form 3419, *Entry of Merchandise Imported Through the Mails*, as a guide in determining the proper register on which to enter the collected item.

C. Money Forwarded to Collector of Customs. Under no circumstances should postmasters forward to Collector of Customs, money collected for dutiable parcels.

D. Submission of Form 3437, Receipt to Postmaster, to Collector of Customs. This form is obsolete. *Do not use. Destroy all copies on hand.*

E. Improper Treatment of TD Forms 3419 When Parcel Is Released Free of Duty. Do not give addressee either copy of TD Form 3419 when parcel is released free of duty. Return both copies to Collector of Customs with proper related copy of Form 2933, Register of Uncollected Customs Charges.

F. Failure To Retain Original Copy of TD Form 3419 When Duty Is Collected. When duty is collected retain the original copy of TD Form 3419 as a permanent record. Do not forward this copy to Collector of Customs or regional controller.

2. Daily Posting of TD Forms 3419

At the close of each day, arrange the collected Forms 3419 in ascending serial number order for each port of entry. Then post in this order to appropriate registers.

3. Previous Instruction.

Detailed instructions on reporting and accounting for customs duties have been furnished in POSTAL BULLETINS Nos. 20111, 20114, and 20123. For further information needed, address inquiries to your regional controller.

4. Action by Regional Director

The Bureau of Customs has been requested to furnish list of Forms 2932 where discrepancies have been noted, so corrective action may be taken by the regional director.—Bureau of Operations, 3-5-59.

International Money Order Offices

Issuance of Money Orders in Foreign Currency

Postmasters are reminded that the issuing employee is required to convert and enter the foreign equivalent as well as the United States amount on orders drawn for payment in the countries listed in the following schedule whenever the patron specifically requests an order expressed in the foreign currency. Current conversion tables should be kept readily available for this purpose. In all other instances the amount of orders drawn on these countries should be expressed in United States money only and the conversion into the foreign equivalent will be made by the exchange office.
