All Postal Installations

4¹/₂-Cent Hermitage Stamp To Be Issued in Coils

The Department will issue the $4\frac{1}{2}$ cent "The Hermitage" ordinary postage stamp, in coils, perforated at the top and bottom of the stamp, on May 1, 1959, through the Denver, Colo., post office, on the occasion of the 10th annual Rocky Mountain Philatelic Exhibition.

POSTMASTERS SHALL NOT PLACE THIS STAMP ON SALE BEFORE MAY 2, 1959

The stamp features "The Hermitage," home of President Andrew Jackson, and the design is identical to the $4\frac{1}{2}$ -cent issue of the regular series currently in use.

Collectors desiring first-day cancellations of this stamp may send addressed envelopes, together with remittance to cover the cost of the stamps to be affixed to the Postmaster, Denver 2, Colo. A close-fitting enclosure of postal card thickness should be placed in each envelope and the flap either turned in or sealed. Envelopes submitted should be of ordinary letter size and each must be properly addressed. An envelope must not be sent for return of firstday covers. Orders for covers must not include requests for uncanceled stamps. It is recommended that no more than two stamps be requested for affixment to each cover as it is practically impossible to attractively cancel a longer strip. The outside envelope to the postmaster should be endorsed "First-Day Covers 41/2cent Coil Stamp."

For the benefit of collectors desiring stamps of selected quality for philatelic use, the 4½-cent Hermitage coiled stamp will be available at the Philatelic Sales Agency, Post Office Department, Washington 25, D.C., on and after May 2, 1959. To insure prompt shipment, mail orders to the Agency should include no other

All City Delivery Offices

Delivery of Mail Order Catalogs

Complaints have been received that mail order catalogs are being thrown from delivery vehicles and left on porches, driveways, and other unprotected places. Numerous cases have been reported where the mishandling of these catalogs has resulted in damage and sometimes complete loss. Postmasters will caution all concerned that failure to properly deliver mail order catalogs may result in disciplinary action.—Bureau of Operations, 4-2-59.

stamp issues. The Philatelic Agency does not service first day covers.

Attention is called to the instructions of the Postmaster General requiring postmasters to submit requisitions for each new stamp issue as announced in the POSTAL BULLETIN so that ample quantities will be available at all post offices on the following day after official firstday sale.

Postmasters at first- and secondclass post offices requiring this issue in minimum lots of 50 coils of 500 or 8 coils of 3,000, or the multiples outlined in Part 422.324 of the Postal Manual, will submit Form 3356, punch card requisition (using item No. 733 for coils of 500 and item No. 734 for coils of 3,000) immediately to the Tabulating Machine Unit, Office of the Controller, Bureau of Engraving and Printing, Washington 25, D.C. Offices requiring less than the above quantities shall submit a separate requisition immediately on Form 017 to their regional distributing office. Requisitions including other stamps will be delayed.

Postmasters shall post a copy of this notice on the bulletin board and give information to the press regarding the issuance of the $4\frac{1}{2}$ -cent "The Hermitage" regular postage stamp in coils.—Office of the Special Assistant to the Postmaster General, 4-2-59. All Post Offices

Reporting Outside Sales

The standards for reporting an outside sale now set forth in 321.74, Postal Manual, are revised as follows:

Fourth-class post office \$6.00

Third-class post office_____ 10.00 Second-class post office_____ 50.00

First-class post office____ 200.00

These revised standards apply to sales since December 31, 1958.

The reporting periods in 321.751, Postal Manual, are also being changed to coincide with the postal quarterly accounting periods to facilitate regional computation of gross postal receipts. Accordingly, the report for the period since December 31, 1958, is extended to cover through April 3, 1959. Thereafter, Form 1568, *Outside Sales Report*, will be submitted on a postal quarter basis (see inside front cover of cash book for dates).

Sections 321.74 and 321.751, Postal Manual, are being amended.—Bureau of Operations, 4-2-59.

If any of these forms is presented, the postmaster will refuse payment and notify the postal inspector of his district.—Bureau of Finance, 4-2-59.

Effective on or about April 26, 1959, airmail service will be inaugurated by North Central Airlines at Appleton, Wis.

Official cachet will be furnished for the first flight at Appleton. The usual treatment, outlined in 145.3 Postal Manual, is authorized.—Bureau of Transportation, 4-2-59.

Revised Overprint on SF's 33 and 36

Revised overprint on bid forms will be available in area supply centers on or about April 1, 1959. At installations where maintenance contracts are necessary, contracts for the 1960 fiscal year must be secured on the new forms.

An initial supply of the revised 4page forms should be requisitioned from area supply centers on Form 4750, Special Requisition for Supplies, using the title listed below:

> Standard Forms 33 and 36, Invitation, Bid and Award—Overprinted for Servicing and Maintenance Government - Owned Trucks.

Advertisements should be issued as soon as the new forms are received in accordance with the instructions contained in 672.212, 672.231, and 672.232, Postal Manual.

All stocks of the old 7-page bid forms should be destroyed.

In connection with the lubrication service under the revised maintenance contract, engine oil changes will be made at 4,000-mile intervals and oil filter cartridges will be changed every 2,000 miles. This will be incorporated in Facilities Handbook, Series S-11, part 370.

Postal installations normally serviced by the Topeka Supply Center (formerly Kansas City) will requisition the revised bid forms from the Chicago Supply Center during the period April 1 through April 30, 1959.—Bureau of Facilities, 4-2-59.

Revised Form 3543

Form 3543, Record of Second-Class Postage, has been revised and is now stocked in supply centers. Requisitions should be submitted immediately on Form 4750, Special Requisition for Supplies, for a supply of the form in keeping with the number of second-class and controlled circulation entries which are now in effect (126.16, Postal Manual). DO NOT **OVERORDER** and do not include any other items on this requisition. Dispose of as waste paper all copies of previous editions remaining on hand after a supply of the revised form has been received.

The revised form is $8 \times 10\frac{1}{2}$ inches in size and is designed for filing in a standard three-ring binder. The form is intended to provide a monetary reflection of each publication's deposits, charges and credit balance. Detailed information as to subscribers' copies, sample copies, zone mailings, special rates, etc., will be obtained, when necessary, from the original mailing records (Form 3541, *Computation of Second-Class Postage*, and Form 3542, *Statement Showing Number of Second-Class Publications Mailed*).

The items designated "Account No." and the first column of the revised form designated "A-Previous Balance" are for use only by those offices where posting operations are done by machine. At those offices where posting operations are done manually only columns "B" through "F" need be completed.

All second-class accounts must be converted to the revised form no later than June 26, 1959, the end of the current postal fiscal year.—Bureau of Operations, 4-2-59.


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All Offices Having Street Letter Box Equipment

Anchoring of Street Letter Box Equipment

Drawing No. 14-261, showing approved methods of anchoring boxes, was revised February 18, 1959, to include type "H", and is reproduced below to assist postmasters in completing the project of anchoring all street letter box equipment.

Section 652.57 of the Postal Manual will be amended accordingly.-Bureau of Facilities, 4-2-59.

Preparation of Remittance Card Forms 1901 and 1901-A

Form 1901, Remittance Card, and Form 1901–A, office copy, replaced CX-1, Remittance Card, and CX-2, office copy, in March 1958. All post offices previously using card punch remittance Forms CX-1 and CX-2 should now have a supply of the new Forms 1901 and 1901-A.

In completing this new form, postmasters making cash remittances to their regional depositary must complete the portion on the reverse side, showing number of pieces of currency of each denomination, dollar value and total. The total must agree with the figure on line 1 on the face of the form.—Bureau of Finance, 4-2-59.

Volume of **COD** Transactions

This notice is particularly directed to the attention of postmasters at those offices where a special method of accepting COD mailings has been authorized during the last several This method involves the years. acceptance of COD shipments without maintenance of the usual post office record of the mailings.

There is reason to believe that the steady decline in the number of COD mailings reported over the last several years may have resulted in part from the failure of postmasters to take into account the number of COD packages accepted without maintenance of a post office record.

Postmasters at offices of the first and second classes where firms using the COD service extensively are located will immediately determine whether or not there have been included in past reports on Form 835, Quarterly Report of Domestic Registered and COD Transactions, those COD mailings for which post office records have not been maintained under the special procedure.

If these mailings have not been included in volume reports submitted for previous quarters, take the following action:

1. Establish a method by which the number of COD packages mailed All Offices With Rural Routes

Overburdened Rural Routes

Despite instructions in 353.14, Postal Manual, and repeated notices in the POSTAL BULLETIN, postmasters are not giving prompt attention to overburdened rural routes.

Forms 4240, Rural Carrier's Trip Report, must be examined by postmasters at least quarterly to determine whether the average daily time required to serve the route indicates relief is needed or whether heavy duty allowance should be authorized or adjusted. Field services officers on visits to offices with rural routes, similarly will review Forms 4240.

Postmasters must thoroughly familiarize themselves with the instructions set forth in 353.14, Postal Manual, in connection with heavily patronized and overburdened rural routes and comply with same. No carrier should be required to work more than 48 hours weekly. Heavy duty compensation should be authorized when such compensation is warranted.

When a carrier fails to meet the time standards in 353.143, Postal Manual, heavy duty compensation will not be authorized or increased beyond the amount he would have been entitled to had he met the time standards.

Immediate and continuing attention is to be given to prevent rural routes from becoming overburdened and to make certain that the compensation received by the carrier is in compliance with the law and the service rendered.-Bureau of Operations, 4-2-59.

2. Determine as nearly as possible the number of these COD mailings that have not been included in reports for the two previous quarters of postal fiscal year 1959.

3. Show as a footnote on Form 835 for postal quarter III the number of COD mailings under the special procedure that were not included in the two previous quarterly reports for postal fiscal year 1959.—Bureaus of Operations and Finance, 4-2-59.



Issuance of Money Orders

Information has been received that on some of the money orders being cleared for payment the issuing employee failed to enter the dollar amount in the dollars and cents block.

It is of the utmost importance that the whole dollar amount be written in words on the *Pay* line but it is also necessary that the entire amount (dollars as well as cents) be entered in figures in the amount block. Also, the rubber *amount control* stamp must be affixed in the blank space following the words Not Valid for More Than.

For the information of all concerned a specimen order is illustrated below and postmasters should see that employees exercise care to properly complete the form.—Bureau of Finance, 4-2-59.
