

All Postal Installations

2½-Cent Ordinary Postage Stamp

The Department will issue a 2½-cent Bunker Hill regular postage stamp, the 23d in the Liberty series, through the Boston, Mass., post office, on June 17, 1959.

POSTMASTERS SHALL NOT PLACE THIS STAMP ON SALE BEFORE JUNE 18, 1959



This stamp is 0.75 by 0.87 of an inch in dimension, arranged vertically, printed by the rotary process, electric-eye perforated and issued in sheets of 100. The color of the stamp will be blue.

The stamp will feature the Bunker Hill Monument and the flag adopted by Massachusetts at the outbreak of the Revolutionary War. The wording "Bunker Hill" is arranged in two lines in the upper right corner and "2½c U.S. Postage" is in one line across the bottom, all of which is shown in white face Gothic.

Collectors desiring first day cancellations of the 2½-cent Bunker Hill stamp may send addressed envelopes, together with remittance to cover the cost of the stamps to be affixed, to the Postmaster at Boston 9, Mass. It should be borne in mind that **covers to receive the first day cancellation must be prepaid at the first-class rate.** Collectors, therefore, are requested to allow for two of the new 2½-cent stamps on each envelope to meet the domestic surface rate.

Armed Forces Day

Armed Forces Day this year will be on May 16th. This is the 10th anniversary of the day on which we pay tribute to all members of our Armed Forces and the vital roles they play in preserving the peace.

Once again "Power for Peace" is to be emphasized as the keynote of our nation's tribute to the men and women of the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps, Coast Guard, and Reserve Forces. During the period, May 9-17 there will be open house at military installations.

I strongly urge all postal people to attend these affairs where they can observe many aspects of our national strength.

Postmaster General

An enclosure of medium weight should be placed in each envelope and the flap either turned in or sealed. Envelopes submitted should be of ordinary letter size and each must be properly addressed. An envelope must not be sent for return of first-day covers. The outside envelope to the Postmaster should be endorsed "First Day Covers Bunker Hill stamp." Orders for covers must not include requests for uncanceled stamps.

For the benefit of collectors desiring stamps of selected quality for philatelic use, the 2½-cent Bunker Hill stamp will be available at the Philatelic Sales Agency, Post Office Department, Washington 25, D.C., on and after June 18, 1959. To insure prompt shipment, mail orders to the Agency should include no other stamp issues. **The Philatelic Sales Agency does not service first day covers.**

All 1st-Class Post Offices

Uniform Allowances for Medical Officers, First Aid Attendants, and Male Nurses

Effective immediately, male employees in the position category of First Aid Attendant or Medical Officer are subject to the requirements of Part 722, Postal Manual. The prescribed uniform is the same as that for Nurse—Male, namely, a surgical shirt. The maximum annual uniform allowance for eligible first aid attendants and medical officers is established at \$30. Appropriate changes in the Postal Manual will be made in the near future to reflect the foregoing.

The maximum uniform allowance for eligible employees in the position category of Nurse—Male, for the uniform year which begins on or after the date of this notice, shall be \$30. The provisions of POSTAL BULLETIN 20136, 4-9-59, are modified accordingly. *Bureau of Personnel, 4-30-59.*

*All Post Offices***Lobby and Truck Display**

Postmasters will be furnished, in the near future, a poster issued by the Maritime Administration pertaining to Maritime Day.

The poster should be displayed in the lobby in a manner as not to mar the walls or woodwork from the date of its receipt through May 31, 1959, or for as long thereafter as it presents a neat appearance.

The above authorization will not apply to post office lobbies located in Government-owned buildings not operated by the Post Office Department.

The Maritime Administration will also distribute "Maritime Day" posters for display on all Government-owned mail trucks. Two of these posters will be displayed on each mail truck from May 1 through May 31.

Postmasters are directed to submit requisitions for each new stamp issue as announced in the Postal Bulletin so that ample quantities will be available at all post offices on the following day after official first day sale.

Postmasters at first- and second-class post offices requiring this issue in a minimum lot of 10,000, or the multiples outlined in Part 422.32 of the Postal Manual, will submit Form 3356, punch card requisition (using Item No. 017) **immediately** to the Tabulating Machine Unit, Office of the Controller, Bureau of Engraving and Printing, Washington 25, D.C. Offices requiring less than 10,000 stamps shall submit a **separate requisition immediately** on Form 017 to their regional distributing office. Requisitions including other stamps will be delayed.

Postmasters shall post a copy of this notice on the bulletin board and give information to the press regarding the issuance of the 2½-cent Bunker Hill regular postage stamp.—*Office of the Special Assistant to the Postmaster General, 4-30-59.*

*All Postal Installations***Insured Parcel Post With Azores, Madeira Islands, and Portugal**

A new parcel post agreement entered into with Portugal, including the Azores and Madeira Islands, becomes effective on May 1, 1959. The new agreement increases the insurance limit of parcels, and provides for payment of indemnity for loss, rifling of or damage to the contents, or a portion thereof, of insured parcels. The new agreement makes no provision for the exchange of registered parcel post.

The maximum amount for which a parcel may be insured is \$165. The following insurance fees, according to the insured value of the parcel, must be prepaid in addition to the parcel-post rates (surface or air) shown on pages Azores (1), Madeira Islands (1), and Portugal (1) in the Directory of International Mail:

Limit of indemnity:	Fee, cents
Not over \$10-----	20
From \$10.01 to \$25-----	25
From \$25.01 to \$50-----	35
From \$50.01 to \$100-----	55
From \$100.01 to \$165-----	60

Accepting employees shall print or stamp on the wrapper of each insured parcel, near the **INSURED** endorsement and number, the amount for which the parcel is insured. The amount shall be shown in U.S. currency and in gold francs. The indication in U.S. currency shall be in both figures and in letters spelled out in full, and the gold franc equivalent in figures only. See 233.522 and 387.211 Postal Manual.

Parcel post packages containing coin, precious metals, jewelry, or other precious articles must be insured.

Insured parcels will be treated in other respects as prescribed in 233 and 387.2 Postal Manual.

Registered parcel post packages are no longer to be accepted for Azores, Madeira Islands, or Portugal on and after May 1, 1959.

The Directory of International Mail and the Postal Manual will be appropriately amended.—*Bureau of Transportation, 4-30-59.*

*All Post Offices***Collection Service Deficiencies**

Visits to various sections of the country in connection with the metropolitan area plans point up serious shortcomings in the collection of mail.

Collection schedules are not coordinated with dispatches, schedule cards are missing from boxes, collection times are not shown on boxes or are not up to date, boxes are skipped, and evening collections are not made even though the volume warrants and important dispatches can be connected.

In some cities the only collection made in residential sections is by the foot carriers while serving their routes. Some smaller offices close out the dispatch when the office closes at noon on Saturdays, although the dispatch does not leave until 5 or 6 p.m.

Every one of these deficiencies contributes to delayed mail or inadequate service in some manner.

Postmasters will immediately review the collection practices and conditions at their offices and take corrective action at once if any of the above defects and deficiencies are found.—*Bureau of Operations, 4-30-59.*

Information has been received from the British Embassy that the prohibition against cut and pressed tobacco to Great Britain and Northern Ireland does not apply to pipe tobacco immediately fit for smoking when sent in gift parcels.
