All Postal Installations

15-Cent Air Mail Postage Stamp

The Department will issue a new 15-cent international air mail stamp, on November 20, 1959, through the New York, N.Y., post office.

POSTMASTERS SHALL NOT PLACE THIS STAMP ON SALE BEFORE NOVEMBER 21, 1959



This stamp, 0.84 by 1.44 inches in dimension, issued in sheets of 50, will be printed in black and orange.

Collectors may obtain first-day cancellations by submitting requests to the Postmaster, New York 1, N.Y., in accordance with the instructions outlined in Section 145.3 of the Postal Manual. Mint stamps of selected quality will be available at the Philatelic Sales Agency, Post Office Department, Washington 25, D.C., on and after November 21, 1959.

Postmasters are directed to submit requisitions for each new stamp issue as announced in the Postal Bulletin so that ample quantities will be available at post offices on the following day after official first-day sale.

Postmasters at first- and secondclass post offices requiring this issue in minimum lots of 5,000, or the multiples outlined in Part 422.321b of the Postal Manual, will submit Form 3356, punch card requisition (using Item No. 175) immediately to the Bureau of Engraving and Printing, Washington 25, D.C. Offices requiring less than 5,000 stamps shall submit a separate requisition immediately on Form 017 to their regional distributing post office. Procurement of Electric Lamps

Post Offices Currently Submitting "Monthly Heating Charts"

Change in Submission of Form 4853, Heating Chart

Postmasters at certain designated offices are currently submitting Form 4853, Heating Chart to the Property Management Branch of the Division of Real Estate, Bureau of Facilities. This submission is to be discontinued effective immediately. In the future these designated offices shall prepare only two copies of the monthly chart, one to be submitted to the Regional Real Estate Manager and the other to be retained at the post office. A supply of Form 4853, Heating Chart and Form 4809, Summary of Monthly Heating Charts will continue to be available at supply centers.

In preparing the monthly charts, postmasters will continue to use the heating factor used last year unless otherwise advised.

These instructions will be included in the Postal Manual as soon as possible.—Bureau of Facilities, 10-1-59.

All Post Offices having Rural or Star Routes

Agriculture Census **Questionnaires**

The Bureau of the Census, U.S. Department of Commerce, is mailing Agriculture Census questionnaire forms to each boxholder on all rural and star routes in the country. The mail will be addressed and prepared in accordance with the provisions of section 123.4, Postal Manual.

The mailings are scheduled so that the questionnaires should reach farm operators at the beginning of an enumeration period. The questionnaires will reach the delivery offices between now and November 6, depending upon the enumeration starting date for the area.

Postmasters are requested to see that delivery of these questionnaires is not delayed.—Bureau of Operations, 10-1-59.

Christmas Packages for Abroad

In anticipation of the increased mailing of parcel post packages to other countries during the holiday season, postmasters must see that accepting employees thoroughly familiarize themselves with applicable regulations. General information concerning the mailing of international parcels appears in part 222 and section 384.1 of the Postal Manual. Specific regulations concerning each individual country are shown under the caption Parcel Post of the country item in the Directory of International Mail.

Accepting employees must in every case see that the correct number of Forms 2922, Instructions Given by Sender; 2966, Customs Declarations; and 2972, Dispatch Note, as indicated under the parcel post caption of the appropriate country items in the Directory of International Mail, are attached to parcels for other countries. Require mailers to describe the contents of parcels in detail on the customs declaration tag, Form 2966, showing the exact nature, quantity and value of each kind of article enclosed. General description such

as Christmas gifts, clothing, merchan-

dise, are not acceptable.

Accepting employees must particularly familiarize themselves with the packing requirements for international parcels set forth in section 222.21, Postal Manual. If a parcel tendered for mailing is not packed adequately for the length of the journey and the protection of the contents, the mailer should be informed that it cannot be accepted until properly prepared.

Special attention should also be given to the current export license regulations in subchapter 270 and in part 385 of the Postal Manual.

The long sea transit frequently involved in the transmission of parcels by surface means, and customs inspection and other formalities that parcels may be subjected to in the countries of destination, require that mailings be made as early as practicable to assure delivery by Christmas Day. Surface parcels mailed not later than the dates shown below will normally reach their destination before Christmas.

Air service is available to practically all countries of the world. Recommend to senders that airmail packages be mailed during the early part of December in order to reach the addressees before Christmas.

Postmasters should give as much publicity as possible to this subject without expense to the Department.—Bureau of Transportation, 10-1-59.

Snow and Ice Melting Materials

Rock salt, flake calcium chloride, and calcium chloride pellets may be used for the melting of snow and ice to facilitate their removal and to overcome slippery conditions where necessary.

Calcium chloride, either flake or pellets will melt ice faster than rock salt, particularly at temperatures below 25 degrees Fahrenheit. Flake calcium chloride melts from the top down but the pellets will cut through and undercut the ice. Rock salt also cuts through the ice and undercuts in a similar manner but more slowly than calcium chloride.

In some instances it may be desirable to mix calcium chloride pellets and rock salt in equal parts. The calcium chloride will give quick penetration and the slower acting salt will continue to melt the ice after the action of the calcium chloride has stopped.

These materials should be procured locally under local purchase procedures and limitations.

Eastern Germany— Prohibitions

The postal administration of Eastern Germany has given notice that the following articles are prohibited in the mail for that country:

Invisible ink. Illegible or incom-

prehensible designs.

Postcards or envelopes bearing illustrations constituting pro-Fascist or subversive propaganda.

Militaristic literature.

Butane gas lighters.

Means of payment issued by the Deutsche Notenbank (coins, banknotes, letters of exchange, checks, letters of credit, payment orders, etc.); also, values, securities, deposit books of banks and postal savings, etc., issued in Eastern Germany. Currency and other values issued in other countries are admitted, provided the addressee offers them to the Deutsche Notenbank for purchase within 15 days.

Postage stamps, cancelled or not, stamped paper and stamps in bulk, unless addressed to the *Deutsche Buch-Export und -Import GmbH*, Leipzig C 1, or sent as exchange material to members of the East German philatelic organization under special conditions prescribed by the customs authorities.

Advertising material, unless addressed to organizations of the East German government or representatives of foreign commercial interests.

Newspapers and periodicals, unless approved for sale in Eastern Germany, even if sent by individuals and not for sale. Mailers should ascertain in advance from the addressees that the publications which they desire to mail will be admitted.

Gift shipments are not admitted as letter packages, but must be mailed as small packets or parcel post.

The present restrictions on gift shipments to Eastern Germany shown on page Germany (3) of the Directory of International Mail are unchanged.

Such covers will bear the United Nations Post Office Station postmark. Covers should be accompanied by a money order to cover the cost of stamps that are to be affixed.
