All Postal Installations

4-Cent Dr. Ephraim McDowell "Famous American" Postage Stamp

The Department will issue a special 4-cent stamp in honor of Dr. Ephraim McDowell on December 30, 1959, through the Danville, Ky., post office.

POSTMASTERS SHALL NOT PLACE THIS STAMP ON SALE BEFORE DECEMBER 31, 1959



Size: 0.84" x 0.98". Color: Maroon. ISSUED IN SHEETS OF 70. Initial printing: 120 million.

To obtain first-day cancellations, collectors may submit requests to: Postmaster, Danville, Ky. See Postal Manual, 145.3. Selected mint stamps will be available at the Philatelic Sales Agency, Post Office Department, Washington 25, D.C., on and after December 31, 1959.

Postmasters shall immediately requisition this stamp so ample quantities will be available at all offices on December 31.

1st- and 2d-class offices requiring minimum lots of 7,000 or multiples as in 422.322c, Postal Manual, shall submit Form 3356 (use Item 476) to the Bureau of Engraving and Printing, Washington 25, D.C.

Offices requiring less than 7,000 stamps shall submit a separate requisition on Form 017 to their RDPO.

Do not include stamps other than the McDowell on the above requisitions. Subsequent requisitions for this issue may be combined with other items.—Office of the Special Assistant to the Postmaster General, 10-29-59.

International Mail—Parcels Containing Liquids

Reports reaching the Department indicate that parcels containing liquids with flash points below 150° F. are being improperly mailed to other countries.

Liquids with flash points between 80° and 150° F., classed as combustible, may be mailed to other countries only in quantities not exceeding a quart in any one parcel, except that paints and certain similar substances may be mailed in quantities less than a gallon. The parcels must be marked by the senders to indicate that the flash point is above 80° (see 222.321, Postal Manual). The liquids must be packed as prescribed in 222.212b, Postal Manual.

Liquids with flash point below 80° are classed as inflammable and are excluded from the international mail (222.31h, Postal Manual).

Postmasters will see that parcels containing liquids are not accepted unless they conform to regulations.—Bureau of Transportation, 10-29-59.

Sale of Objectionable Publications in Lobbies of Post Offices

Officials in charge of postal installations and postal inspectors shall regularly check vending stands in lobbies of post offices. The officials in charge shall report significant violations of section 614.41, Postal Manual, to the State licensing agency. Violations of section 614.42, Postal Manual, shall be reported to the Assistant Postmaster General, Bureau of Operations, Postal Services Division, Washington 25, D.C. With the report, submit a copy of the objectionable matter.

The Postal Manual will be amended accordingly.—Deputy Postmaster General 10-29-59.

Distribution of Handbook M-18

Methods Handbook M-18, City Delivery Service Mail Counts and Route Inspections, is currently being distributed to all post offices with city delivery service.

The standard distribution for this handbook is as follows:

First-class post offices with city delivery service	Three copies for the main office and three copies for each classified station and branch.
Second-class post offices with city delivery service	Two copies for the main office and two copies for each classified station and branch.
Third-class post offices with village delivery service	Two copies each.

Through an error in making distribution, some offices have received duplicate shipments. Offices that have received shipments of copies in excess of the above standard distribution

The Department has approved the request of the Muscular Dystrophy Associations of America, Inc., and will again permit the use of the simple form of address, MDAA, c/o Postmaster, during the 1959 national campaign, scheduled to run during the month of November 1959.

All letters addressed to Muscular Dystrophy Associations of America in care of the local postmaster, when received at any post office, in a State, shall be forwarded to the central post office in the city designated opposite the name of that State, as shown below. They will be delivered to the authorized agent of MDAA in accordance with instructions given by letter to the postmaster of that city. Such letters received at any local post office should be forwarded daily to the designated State central post office. When three or more are being forwarded, they should be sent under cover of a penalty envelope or label. Any shortpaid or unpaid letters should be rated with deficient postage.

It is anticipated that during the Christmas mailing season there will be a considerable increase in the number of international parcel post packages mailed at post offices throughout the country.

It is important that care be exercised in accepting international parcels so that they will not be detained at exchange offices due to irregularities which occurred at the time of mailing. Postmasters will see that window clerks are not only familiar with the general mailing instructions in Part 222, Postal Manual, but that they also consult the country items in the Directory of International Mail to assure that each parcel bears proper postage, has the correct forms attached and otherwise conforms to the regulations.—*Bureau of Transportation, 10-29-59.*

*All Post Offices***Argentine Consular Documents Required for Parcel Post**

The customs regulations of Argentina have been amended to require that all parcels for that country, except gifts valued under \$5, must be accompanied by legalized consular documents. A combined consular invoice and certificate of origin (original and 3 copies) and a commercial invoice (original and 2 copies), executed on prescribed forms in Spanish, must be submitted for legalization to the Argentine consular authorities, who charge service fees based on the value of the parcels.

Persons desiring to mail parcels to Argentina, other than gifts under \$5 in value, should be informed of the foregoing, and if they have not complied with the requirements, they should be advised to communicate with an Argentine consulate prior to mailing. The Argentine Consulate General is located at 12 West 56th Street, New York 19, N.Y., and consulates are established in Baltimore, Md.; Boston, Mass.; Chicago, Ill.; Houston, Tex.; New Orleans, La.; and San Francisco, Calif.

The consular fee for legalization of disinfection certificates for used clothing sent to Argentina has been reduced to \$4.29.

butions are directed to dispose of the excess as waste paper.

Form 4570 Government Owned Vehicle Time Record

Form 4570, *Government Owned Vehicle Time Record*, edition date October 1959, has been issued to a few postal installations. This form will not be used until the revised Vehicle Handbook is published.

Postal installations in possession of this form should requisition on Form 4750, *Special Requisition for Supplies*, only a sufficient quantity of Form 4570, *Vehicle Record*, June 1959 edition, for requirements through accounting period 9 ending March 9, 1960.—*Bureau of Finance, 10-29-59.*

All Post Offices Having Rural Routes

Temporary Deviations on Rural Routes

Form 4031, *Temporary Deviation on Rural Route*, has been developed for use by postmasters in reporting to regional offices necessary temporary deviations by rural carriers from the official line of travel of their routes.

The form is to be prepared in triplicate in accordance with the instructions thereon, using a separate set of forms for each carrier. Send original and one copy to the regional office and retain one copy. When approved by the Delivery Services Officer, the copy will be forwarded to the regional controller as authority for payment for the required additional travel during the first 30 calendar days of the deviation. For deviations lasting more than 30 calendar days, the regional office will authorize a temporary increase in the route length and salary, beginning with the 31st day.

Postmasters should requisition immediately, using Form 4750, *Special Requisition for Supplies*, a small supply of the form sufficient to meet their needs until the next regular requisitioning period.

Section 353.454, Postal Manual, will be amended.—*Bureau of Operations, 10-29-59.*

Inauguration of Jet Service by TWA to London-Frankfurt and Rome-Paris

Trans World Airlines will begin jet service from New York to London, England, and Frankfurt, Germany, on or about November 23, and to Paris, France, and Rome, Italy, on or about December 3, 1959. Special cachets will be used and philatelic treatment will be provided as outlined in part 145.5 of the Postal Manual.

Patrons desiring covers carried on this flight should prepare them in the usual manner, address them to the person who is to receive them in the aforementioned countries, the United States or Canada, and prepay them at 15 cents per half ounce (the 10-cent air-letter sheet will also be accepted). Covers should be enclosed in another envelope addressed as follows:
