4-Cent American Credo Postage Stamp

The Department will issue the first of the American Credo stamps, featuring George Washington's famous statement made in his Farewell Address in 1796, on January 20, 1960, through the Mount Vernon, Va., post office.

To obtain first-day cancellations, collectors may submit requests to: Postmaster, Mount Vernon, Va. See Postal Manual, 145.3. Selected mint stamps will be available at the Philatelic Sales Agency, Post Office Department, Washington 25, D.C., on and after January 21, 1960.

Postmasters shall immediately requisition this stamp so ample quantities will be available at all offices on January 21.

1st- and 2d-class offices requiring minimum lots of 5,000, or multiples as in 422.322, Postal Manual, shall submit Form 3356 (use Item 426) to the Bureau of Engraving and Printing, Washington 25, D.C.

Offices requiring less than 5,000 stamps shall submit a separate requisition on Form 017 to their RDPO.

Do not include stamps other than the Washington Credo on the above requisitions. Subsequent requisitions for this issue may be combined with other items.—Office of the Special Assistant to the Postmaster General, 12-3-59.

COD Money Orders

The Money Order Center, Kansas City, Mo., has reported that frequent errors are being made by postmasters in preparing money orders in payment for COD shipments of Fashion Frocks, Inc., Cincinnati, Ohio, and Florida Fashions, Orlando, Fla. The irregularities, which caused considerable confusion when not detected by the firms, are:

- 1. Money orders, while drawn in favor of the proper firm, are sent to the other mailer.
- 2. Money orders are improperly drawn in favor of the firm which is not the mailer of the COD package, but are sent to the mailer.

Particular care must be taken to assure that all COD money orders are correctly drawn and sent to the proper payees. In addition to the two firms named above, there may be other instances where COD mailers' names are somewhat similar, a condition which could lead to the type of irregularity described unless the employees concerned exercise caution.—Bureau of Operations, 12-3-59.

Christmas Manpower Utilization

The condition of our appropriated funds makes it imperative that we operate as economically as possible.

Unless absolutely necessary to avoid delays to mail, seasonal assistants or overtime should not be used prior to **Monday**, **December 14**, and thereafter only when fully justified. Also, care should be exercised not to extend window service until public need is fully demonstrated.

It is hoped that increased effort and close supervision will result in at least a 2 percent efficiency gain over last year in all man-hour expenditures for the month of December.—Bureau of Operations 12-3-59.

Gross Postal Receipts for Calendar Year 1959

I. Introduction

Postmasters will submit again this year a special statement of account using Form 1555, Statement of Account—First-Class Post Office (RS-FI-12), or Form 1553, Statement of Account—2d-, 3d-, and 4th-Class Offices (RS-FI-24), as applicable, showing the actual cumulative amounts in their cash books for all accounts as of the close of business December 31, 1959. Regional controllers will use these amounts together with authorized deductions for outside sales in adjusting gross postal receipts for calendar year 1959 to exclude the effect of rate increases as required by Public Law 85-426.

II. Special Statement of Account for Computing Gross Postal Receipts

A. Prepare special statement of account as indicated and mail to reach regional controller not later than January 6, 1960.

Complete front of statement of account and sign certification on reverse. Do not attach any supporting papers to the special statement; these will be submitted as usual with the regular statement of account covering the full period (1st-class offices) or quarters (2d-, 3-, and 4th-class offices) ending January 8, 1960. Follow instructions in Postal Manual 425.3 regarding inventory of stamp stock. First class offices that have taken an inventory within 5 days of December 31, may determine total stamp stock by running totals of Forms 3295 and 3367 instead of actually counting the main stock.

B. Postmasters are also reminded to prepare Form 1568, Outside Sales Report (RS-OP-30) where required and submit to regional postal installations manager as prescribed in Postal Manual 321.75.

III. Adjustment to Gross Postal Receipts

A. For information of postmasters, the basis on which gross postal receipts for calendar year 1959 will be adjusted by regional controllers to eliminate the effect of rate increases is as follows:

Class of office	Adjusted receipts will be:
First	82% of actual receipts.
Second and third	81% of actual receipts.
Fourth	82% of actual receipts.

B. The above adjustment factors that will be used to exclude the effect of the new postal rates in computing 1959 gross receipts, are averages developed on a national basis for the groups of offices. Where the revenue at an office is derived predominantly from a class or type of mail which would produce more or less than the
