

All Postal Installations

8-Cent Regular Postage Stamp

The Department will issue an 8cent regular postage stamp, portraying General of the Armies John J. Pershing, on November 17, 1961, through the New York, N.Y., post office. This stamp will ultimately replace the 8-cent Statue of Liberty design, which now appears also on the 3-cent and 11-cent regular denominations.

Postmasters shall not place this stamp on sale before November 18, 1961

General Pershing is portrayed in full uniform with four stars on the shoulder. Though permitted to wear five stars, he never wore more than four.

To obtain first-day cancellations, collectors may submit requests to the Postmaster, New York 1, N.Y. See Postal Manual 145.3. Due to the short notice, the 5-day-in-advance provision will be waived on the 8-cent General Pershing stamp. Requests postmarked through November 17 will be accepted. Selected mint stamps will be available at the Philatelic Sales Agency, Post Office Department, Washington 25, D.C., on and after November 18, 1961.

Manual, submitting form 3356 (USE ITEM 044), to the Bureau of Engraving and Printing, Washington 25, D.C. Requisitions received at the Bureau of Engraving and Printing by November 17 will be filled with the General Pershing stamp. Orders received after the first-day sale date will be filled with a previous 8-cent issue.

Offices requiring 7,000 stamps, or less, shall submit a separate requisition on Form 017 to their RDPO. Do not include stamps other than the General John J. Pershing on the initial requisition.

Initial requisitions should be limited to such quantities as are required to meet the philatelic demands.—Office of the Special Assistant to the Postmaster General, 10-26-61.

Canada Parcel Post

We have been informed by the Canadian postal administration that to assure delivery by Christmas Day, parcels should reach the Boston Region gateway by November 26 for Newfoundland and December 12 for the other Atlantic Provinces of Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, and Prince Edward Island.—Bureau of Transportation, 10-26-61.

Identification of Domestic Claim Payment

Form 3812, Request for Payment of Postal Insurance, has a detachable portion at the bottom intended for completion by the patron who may need identification when the Treasury check in payment of the claim is received.

Postmasters should encourage patrons, particularly business concerns, to complete this identification slip, since the payment check itself will not identify the claim.—Bureau of Operations, 10-26-61.

Mail for Muscular Dystrophy Associations of America, Inc.

The Department has approved the use of the simple form of address "MDAA, Inc., c/o Postmaster" during the 1961 national fund-raising campaign scheduled from November 1 through November 30, 1961.

All letters addressed to the Muscular Dystrophy Associations, Inc., in care of the local postmaster, when received at any post office in a State, shall be forwarded daily to the central post office in the city designated opposite the name of that State, as shown below. When three or more are being forwarded, they should be sent under cover of a penalty envelope or label. Any shortpaid or unpaid letters should be rated with deficient postage.

When the letters are received at the central post office, they will be delivered to the authorized agent of the Muscular Dystrophy Associations of America, Inc., in accordance with written instructions given by the Associations' headquarters to the postmasters at the central post offices.

All Post Offices With Special Muscular Dystrophy Die Hubs

Special Cancellation Muscular Dystrophy

Postmasters who have special cancelling machine die hubs reading "D E F E A T MUSCULAR DYS-TROPHY—SUPPORT M D A A" shall use them during the month of November 1961. After that time they shall be withdrawn and retained for future use.

These special hubs were bought by the sponsors and furnished to post offices designated by them. Postmaster at offices which do not have the hubs shall not submit requisitions or All 1st Class Post Offices and Area Supply Centers

Form 3206, Patron's Order for Plain Stamped Envelopes (Precanceled or Window)

Area supply center managers, and postmasters at first-class post offices having these forms in their possession are authorized to destroy all remaining stocks.—Bureau of Facilities, 10-26-61.

Service on Friday, November 10, 1961

While normal postal service is to be provided on Friday, November 10, 1961, as directed in the Postal BULLETIN of October 12, 1961, it is nevertheless intended that many employees, who can be spared on Friday without detriment to necessary service, be given the day off as a holiday.

Arrangements shall be made, insofar as practicable, to release on Friday, November 10, without replacement employees working in such units as Personnel sections, Chief Accountant's offices, Label Printing Units, Administrative Services, including claims payment clerks, supply clerks, Dead Letter and Dead Parcel Post Units, office clerical staffs, scheme examining units, route examiners, Executive Sections (except for a skeleton staff wherever necessary to receive public callers or answer telephones), etc.

It is desired to maintain normal city and rural delivery, and window service, as well as normal Friday schedules for collections, receipts, and dispatches of mail. However, any employee who can be spared particularly in the above-mentioned support and office clerical staff duties—without replacement shall be released from duty on Friday, November 10, 1961.—Bureau of Operations, 10-26-61.

Indemnity Limits for Registered Postal Union Mail

In recent cases where the indemnity claimed exceeded the limit payable for loss of registered postal union mail addressed to other countries, it was revealed that the senders were improperly informed as to indemnity coverage.

The limits of indemnity payable for this category of registered mail are stated in section 272.21 of the Postal Manual and under each country item in the Directory of International Mail.

Postmasters are requested to take the necessary measures to assure that the public is correctly informed by the accepting employees.—Bureau of Transportation, 10-26-61.

Changes in Certain Bureau of Employees' **Compensation Forms**

The Bureau of Employees' Compensation has informed us that changes have been made in the following forms:

- CA-2-Official Superior's Report of Injury.
- CA-4-Claim for Compensation on Account of Injury.
- CA-16-Request for Treatment of Injury under U.S. Employees' Compensation Act.
- CA-17—Request for Treatment of Injury under U.S. Employees' Compensation Act when Cause of Injury is in Doubt.

The Department of Labor letter of October 5, 1961, states that:

"It appears that some establishments have on hand and are using old issues of certain of these forms which identify the race or color of the injured person (CA-2, item 9; CA-4, item 6; CA-16 and CA-17). The use of these obsolete forms should be discontinued . . . It is respectfully requested that all persons in your agency responsible for issuance or use of such forms or the preparation of reports of injuries be instructed accordingly."

Therefore, all stocks of the above listed B.E.C. forms should immediately be destroyed and stock replenished. First-class post offices should requisition approximately a 3-month supply of the new revised CA forms from the appropriate Bureau of Employees' Compensation Office. (See Postal Manual 7261.) Other postal installations should obtain necessary forms from the nearest 1st-class post office.

All persons responsible for the issuance or preparation of these forms should make sure they are using these new forms.-Bureau of Personnel, 10-26-61.

All Post Offices With Special Retarded Children Die Hubs

Special Cancellation **Retarded Children**

Postmasters who have special cancelling machine die hubs reading "HELP RETARDED CHILDREN" shall use them during the period November 12 through November 23, 1961. After that time they shall be withdrawn and retained for future use.

These special hubs were bought by the sponsors and furnished to post offices designated by them. Postmasters at offices which do not have the hubs shall not submit requisitions or requests for them unless they have been received from the sponsors.-Bureau of Operations, 10-26-61.

All Post Offices

Undeliverable Registered, **Certified, and Insured Mail**

Section 158.271, Postal Manual, specifies that when registered, certified, or insured mail is undeliverable as addressed, a Form 3858, Notice of Undeliverable or Abandoned Mail is to be sent to the mailer stating the reason for nondelivery. This permits the mailer to furnish instructions to the postmaster as to the disposition of this mail.

Some post offices are not complying with these instructions. Also some mail restricted in delivery is being returned when the addressee will not or is unable to sign in person.

All post offices are instructed to review the complete instructions as set forth in 158.271 to insure proper handling of this type of mail.—Bureau of Operations, 10-26-61.
