All Postal Installations

4-Cent Nursing Commemorative Postage Stamp

The Department will issue a 4-cent Nursing commemorative stamp through the Washington, D.C., post office, on December 28, 1961.

POSTMASTERS SHALL NOT PLACE THIS STAMP ON SALE BEFORE DECEMBER 29, 1961



Size: 0.84" x 1.44" (vertical)
Color: Blue, red, black and green

ISSUED IN PANES OF 50

Initial printing: 100 million

Featured on the stamp is a young woman lighting the traditional candle, symbolizing her dedication to the profession.

To obtain first-day cancellations, collectors may submit requests to the Postmaster at Washington 13, D.C. See Postal Manual 145.3. Selected mint stamps will be available at the Philatelic Sales Agency, Post Office Department, Washington 25, D.C., on and after December 28, 1961.

1st- and 2d-class offices will receive this stamp automatically. If additional bulk quantities are required, submit a separate requisition to the Bureau of Engraving and Printing (Item 401) with a memorandum stating that the stamps indicated are required in addition to those automatically furnished. Endorse requisitions (Form 17) to RDPO's at top **Additional.** All requisitions not so endorsed will be returned.

All Post Offices

International Parcel Post

It is again necessary to call attention to the importance of properly completing customs declarations to accompany parcels mailed to other countries. Senders must list the contents and show the value of each item. General descriptions such as "Clothing," "Foodstuffs" or "Christmas gifts" are not acceptable.

Window clerks should give this matter attention particularly during the Christmas mailing season when many parcels are being presented by mailers who are not aware of these requirements. It should be explained to senders that if their parcels are dispatched without declarations being properly completed, it may result in delayed delivery and inconvenience to the addressees. Parcels should not be accepted unless the declarations are completed in compliance with 231.612, Postal Manual.—*Bureau of Transportation, 11-16-61.*

All Offices Having Rural Service

Forms 4232 and 4020

Form 4232, *Patron's Name and Address Slip* (Revised Aug. 1961) has been changed to eliminate that portion concerning delivery of parcels outside the mail box. New Form 4020 (Aug. 1961), *Order for Outside Delivery*, is to be used by patrons of rural routes to authorize delivery of ordinary parcels outside of mail boxes when too large to go in the box. These forms are now in stock in supply centers. Postmasters should requisition a sufficient supply of these forms on their next regular requisition order.—*Bureau of Operations, 11-16-61.*

3d- and 4th-class post offices shall immediately submit requisitions, Form 17, to their RDPO. Do not include stamps other than the Nursing on the initial requisition.—*Office of the Special Assistant to the Postmaster General, 11-16-61.*

All Offices With Rural and Star Route Service

Application for Domestic Money Order

Form 6001, *Application for Domestic Money Order*, to be used only by a rural or a star route patron when purchasing a money order through the carrier, has been revised, July 1961, to show the new money order fees. This form is now in supply centers and postmasters should immediately order a sufficient supply on Form 4750, *Special Requisition for Supplies*, to last until the next regular requisitioning date. All copies of the old Form 6001 should be destroyed when the new forms are received.—*Bureau of Operations, 11-16-61.*

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*All Postal Installations***Operation Christmas**

The instruction in paragraph II. F.2, page 6, *POSTAL BULLETIN* of September 22, 1961, is changed by deleting the following sentence:

"Senior qualified annual rate employees, preferably from supervisory eligibility rosters in the order of their standing thereon, where available, shall be detailed to these positions under the provisions of section 756.542a(6)(d) of the *Postal Manual*."

Instructions in section 714.331 of the *Postal Manual* provide for covering short-term supervisory needs by detailing qualified and available employees. In line with this instruction, assignments to Auxiliary Foreman, Christmas, PFS-6 should be made from the occupational group in the work area involved. Compensation for the work in such assignments is authorized by instructions in section 756.542a(6)(d) of the *Postal Manual*.—*Bureau of Personnel, 11-16-61.*

*All Postal Installations***Inauguration of Jet Airmail Service****United Air Lines, Inc.—AM-1**

The announcement in *POSTAL BULLETIN* of November 2 is amended in part as follows:

Jet airmail service to be inaugurated at Des Moines, Iowa, on or about December 1, 1961, will be limited to an eastbound flight only. There will be no opportunity for the dispatch of philatelic mail westbound and patrons should be governed accordingly.—*Bureau of Transportation, 11-16-61*

*All Post Offices***Dedications**

Postmasters at new post offices or post offices nearing completion must clear their dedication programs and their dedication dates with the Assistant to the Regional Director in their respective regions.—*Office of the Deputy Postmaster General, 11-16-61.*

*All Post Offices***Greeting Cards to Canada and Mexico**

POD Notice 15 (July 1961) to Rural Delivery Patrons erroneously stated that the postage rate for unsealed greeting cards to Canada and Mexico is 4 cents this year.

The rates to Canada and Mexico for printed greeting cards are the same as the U.S. domestic rate—4 cents in sealed envelopes, and 3 cents in unsealed envelopes.

Current international rates are shown in Part 222 *Postal Manual* and in the *Directory of International Mail*.—*Bureau of Transportation, 11-16-61.*

*All Postal Installations***Inauguration of New S-61 Helicopter Service****Los Angeles Airways, Inc.—AM-84**

On or about December 11, 1961, Los Angeles Airways will inaugurate service with new S-61 Helicopter equipment, over a portion of route AM-84.

Official cachets will be authorized for the post office and Airport Mail Facility at Los Angeles, Calif., and for the post offices at Anaheim, Ontario, and San Bernardino, Calif., for application to covers dispatched on the first flight in each direction.

Covers dispatched on the first eastbound flight, and receiving the cachet at Los Angeles, AMF Los Angeles, Anaheim, and Ontario, will be backstamped at San Bernardino. Westbound covers receiving the cachet and dispatched at San Bernardino and Anaheim will be backstamped at Los Angeles.

The usual philatelic treatment will be provided as outlined in Part 145.5 of the *Postal Manual*. Patrons desiring to receive the cachets should forward their covers to reach addresses shown below at least 5 days prior to flight date:

*All Postal Installations***Policy on Immunization Programs**

Health maintenance is primarily the responsibility of the individual. The Post Office Department, however, has an obligation to provide a safe work environment for its employees and has a valid interest in their general welfare as well as in the prevention of loss of work time and productivity from the employees' ill health.

Certain preventive health measures such as immunization programs may be provided when it has been specifically determined by the Department that such measures are primarily for the benefit of the Government. It is impossible to foresee every situation which might occur locally where the Department may properly make immunization available to postal employees.

The following circumstances will determine when the Department may provide immunization which employees may participate in on a voluntary basis:

1. When certain postal employees by reason of their occupations or job assignments are exposed to significantly increased hazards.

2. When there is an impending epidemic which threatens to disable so large a portion of the employees as to materially interfere with postal operations.

3. The Post Office Department will assume the cost of vaccine and the employment of local physicians (where no postal medical officer is available) used in immunization programs approved by the Department upon the recommendation of the Regional Director.

Immunization programs sponsored or conducted by organizations or associations for the exclusive benefit of their membership are excluded from this authorization.

The following guidelines are furnished regional offices and postal installations for the conduct of immunization programs:

1. Immunization programs authorized by the Department may be done on-the-clock, for employees on duty at the time the immunizations are being administered, with the prior approval of the Regional Director.

All City Delivery Offices

Improper Special Delivery Service

Numerous reports are received that special delivery articles are deposited in post office boxes when they are addressed to a specific street address.

At letter carrier offices, special delivery mail must be delivered as addressed unless written instructions to the contrary are on file from the addressee. Business patrons with lockboxes are not to be solicited for permission to have special delivery mail deposited in boxes instead of delivering as addressed.

Policy on Immunization Programs

Director provided the immunizations are done on postal premises. Employees not on duty may obtain immunizations on their own time.

2. Immunizations accomplished with vaccine purchased by and/or administered by medical personnel paid by the Department shall be given only to post office employees.

3. Postal medical personnel (medical officers and nurses) will assist when requested in immunization programs for postal employees when authorized by the Department.

4. Immunizations (medical fees, material and other related costs) may be financed by welfare funds provided they shall be available to all employees at the installation concerned.

5. Records of immunizations will be kept and reports submitted on all immunization programs conducted by postal medical personnel or performed on-the-clock. These reports shall be submitted to the Bureau of Personnel via the Regional Director.

These instructions will be incorporated in Postal Manual 765.—*Bureau of Personnel, 11-16-61.*

All Postal Installations

Temporary Employees Called to Military Duty

Instructions in Postal Manual 717.231 require the separation of employees who enter military duty for extended periods. An *exception* shall be made for those temporary employees who are eligible for career appointments under Executive Order 10880 or any of the authorities in Postal Manual 716.5.

When an employee eligible for conversion to career appointment cannot be reached for a career opening before his military duty begins, do not separate him but give him no postal work during his military service.

When such an employee is reached for a career opening while he is in military service, process the conversion action and then separate him for military duty, the same as for other career employees. Make the separation effective the day following the conversion date.

Other temporary employees separated for military duty and who apply for postal work promptly after completing military service shall be considered for available work to the extent then eligible for appointment under any Civil Service authority in Postal Manual 712.—*Bureau of Personnel, 11-16-61.*

In Hamilton's portrait several of the fine black lines representing his hair are missing leaving white areas in the top center and to the observer's right.
