## All Postal Installations

### 8-Cent Amelia Earhart Commemorative Airmail Postage Stamp

The 8-cent Amelia Earhart commemorative airmail postage stamp will be issued through the Atchison, Kans., post office, on July 24, 1963.

**POSTMASTERS SHALL NOT PLACE THIS STAMP ON SALE BEFORE JULY 25, 1963**



Size: 0.84" x 1.44" (vertical)

ISSUED IN PANES OF 50

Color: Red and deep brown

Initial printing: 40 million

The design is based on a photograph of the pioneer aviatrix in her flying togs, standing before her Lockheed "Electra" plane.

To obtain first-day cancellations, collectors may submit requests to the Postmaster, Atchison, Kans. 66002. See Postal Manual section 145.3. Selected mint stamps will be available at the Philatelic Sales Agency, Post Office Department, Washington, D.C. 20260, on and after July 25, 1963.

First- and second-class offices requiring more than 3,000 stamps of this issue should order minimum lots of 5,000, or the multiples in section 422.322a, Postal Manual, submitting Form 3356 (USE ITEM 423) to the Bureau of Engraving and Printing, Washington, D.C. 20226.

Offices requiring 3,000 stamps, or less, shall submit a separate requisition on Form 017 to the RDPO.

## All Installations Operating Government-Owned Vehicles

### Truck Displays

The Post Office Department ZIP Code permanent adhesive poster is to be displayed on the curb side of all postal vehicles during the months of July, August, September and through October 15, 1963.

The Department of Commerce Travel Service poster is to be displayed on the street side during July 1963.

Posters will be furnished automatically to postmasters without requisition.—Bureau of Operations, 6-20-63.

## All Post Offices With Stations and Branches

### New Rubber Stamp for Labeling Postage Stamp Shipments

All new and commemorative postage stamps have a restricted initial sale date, which the distributing postmaster must show on stock shipped to his stations and branches. A new rubber stamp for labeling these shipments may be requisitioned from your area supply center on regularly scheduled requisitions under Item R-1300-295. This stamp reads: "Positively Not To Be Placed On Sale Before \_\_\_\_\_." In filling in the allotted space with the *restricted sale date*, please use the date for general sale stated in the POSTAL BULLETIN announcing the particular stamp. *Do not confuse that date with the first-day sale at a specified post office.*—Bureau of Facilities, 6-20-63.

Do not include stamps other than the 8-cent Amelia Earhart commemorative airmail on the above requisition. Subsequent requisitions for this issue may be combined with other items.—Office of the Special Assistant to the Postmaster General, 6-20-63.

### Numbering Undocumented Vessels

Effective immediately, all post offices will discontinue accepting Forms CG-3876, Application for Number, from owners who show Wyoming as the State of principal use. Applications should be filed with the Game and Fish Commission, Cheyenne, Wyo.

Effective immediately, all post offices (except those in the States listed below and the District of Columbia which have not assumed the functions of numbering undocumented vessels) should dispose of the unsold boat stamps in accordance with Part 424, Postal Manual. Do not dispose of stamps if you expect a demand for the stamps for vessels used principally in the following States or the District of Columbia.

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*All Post Offices***Veterans Administration  
Burial Flags**

Information received from the Veterans Administration indicates many post offices serving as depositories for burial flags are not properly preparing their correspondence in requesting replacement flags and are not submitting the request promptly.

Veterans Administration Form 2008, Application for United States Flag for Burial Purposes, is to be prepared and addressed to the Veterans Administration Regional Office rather than the Veterans Administration Supply Officer who furnished the flag for issue. Extreme care should be exercised in preparing this form so that all necessary spaces are filled in. It is important that this form be forwarded to the *Veterans Administration Regional Office* as soon as possible.

All post offices designated as flag depository offices should review instructions contained in section 622.95 of Postal Manual.—*Bureau of Facilities, 6-20-63.*

*All Postal Installations***Holiday Service  
July 4, 1963**

Independence Day, July 4, falls on Thursday this year and shall be observed as a legal holiday.

No window service of any type will be provided. No city, village, or rural deliveries will be made. Neither city nor rural carriers shall be scheduled or assigned to case mail for the purpose of window delivery to patrons who wish to call at the post office.

Special delivery matter will be delivered promptly.

Holiday schedules for the collection, receipt, and dispatch of mail shall be observed.

All eligible regular employees who perform service on Thursday, July 4, shall be granted compensatory time for such service. Eligible employees below PFS-8 shall be granted compensatory time within 30 working days. Eligible employees PFS-8 and above shall be granted compensatory time within 13 pay periods.—*Bureau of Operations, 6-20-63.*

*All Post Offices Using Firearms***Handbook Series M-17,  
Use and Care of Revolvers**

Handbook Series M-17, Use and Care of Revolvers, has been reprinted and is now available in the supply centers. The new edition adds a training schedule graded to meet the prescribed initial training of 5 hours. In this period the handbook should be fully explained by an instructor to insure that each trainee correctly understands the prescribed techniques. Thereafter, using his copy of the handbook as a positive guide, any trainee can maintain good practice habits and a high degree of skill with a revolver.

In order to minimize the filling of duplicate requests, all *back orders* for this item on hand at the supply centers are hereby canceled. Postmasters shall order on their regularly scheduled requisition a sufficient number to furnish one to each employee who carries or maintains firearms. An equal number of Form 5149, Firearms Permit, should also be obtained and issued to qualified personnel.—*Bureau of the Chief Inspector, 6-20-63.*

*All Post Offices***Cashbooks and Statements  
of Account**

The Cashbooks, Forms 1550, 1551, and 1552, Statements of Account, Forms 1553, 1554 and 1555, and Daily Financial Statement, Form 1558, for use during Postal Fiscal Year 1964 are now being distributed by area supply centers. Post offices which have not received the appropriate forms by the date of this notice should immediately contact the supply center serving their area.

First-class offices should use Form 1555 with the edition date of March 1962 for the special statement for the 14th Accounting Period (June 22-30, 1963). However, the statement of account for the full first accounting period of PFY 1964 (June 22-July 19, 1963) and all subsequent accounting periods must be made on the Form 1555 dated March 1963. All other classes of offices must use statements of account with the March 1963 date for their reports for the first and subsequent postal quarters of PFY 1964. *Do not*

*All Post Offices***Requests for Photostats  
of Paid Money Orders**

An inquiry to determine whether a money order has been cashed should be initiated on Form 6401. In replying the Money Order Audit Division will indicate to whom the order has been paid—whether the purchaser, payee, or endorsee. If the order is not in the paid files, a duplicate is issued.

If additional information or a record as to the cashing of a money order is desired, a photostat will be furnished at a charge of 30 cents. Form 6065 should be completed to show the money order serial number, date issued, and the name and address of the person or firm making the request so that the photostat can be mailed directly to the patron involved. The 30-cent charge for this service will be accounted for by affixing and canceling 30 cents in postage stamps on the back of Form 6065 to the left of the Money Order Audit Division address.

Should the payee of a money order allege wrong payment through forged endorsement of his signature, the postmaster will obtain the photostat of the paid order for examination and if the claimant denies proper payment he must complete Form 6337 in duplicate. No fee for the photostat of the money order is required in such case. The photostat should not be surrendered to the person filing the complaint but should be sent with the two copies of Form 6337 to the postal inspector in charge.

While postmasters may assist a patron in completing Forms 6401 and 6065, they shall not keep any record of the filing of these forms.

**Business Reply Mail**

Abuses of the business reply mail privilege are still being reported. Some patrons receiving unwanted advertising material, attempt to return the printed matter to the sender with a business reply card or envelope pasted, stapled, or taped on as an address label.

When observed in the mails these improperly prepared pieces should be treated as nonmailable. If the sender can be identified, return the piece for postage. If not identified, the matter should be disposed of as waste; or if sealed, as dead mail.

Other abuses of some mailers include marking the business reply piece for return by air when the card or envelope was not prepared for air service by the permit holder, or marking it for special delivery or registry service. No provision is made for special services for business reply mail. Anyone desiring to convert business reply mail to a special service such as special delivery or registered mail must prepay the fee and applicable postage.

Postmasters are requested to be governed accordingly.—*Bureau of Operations, 6-20-63.*

**Safety Floor Matting**

Safety floor matting, now being delivered to offices that have submitted requisitions, is for interior floor use only. Under no circumstances should it be used on porches or other exterior areas.

Matting may absorb extreme moisture from patrons' shoes during a heavy rain. It is then desirable to hang it up to dry in the furnace room. If, after drying, the matting is wrinkled or otherwise will not lay flat on the floor, it should be rolled up tightly, *carpet-side-out*, and tied with twine. The matting should be ready for use within an hour.—*Bureau of Facilities, 6-20-63.*

### **Deposit Discrepancies**

Whenever the local bank reports a discrepancy in a deposit which the remitting unit is unable to reconcile promptly, have the person who prepared the remittance and the person who acted as witness to the prepara-

tion and sealing of the remittance submit to the postmaster separate statements containing a detailed description of the preparation, witnessing, and sealing of the deposit. Any other pertinent facts may also be included in the statements.

The statements should be prepared while the details concerning the specific deposit are still fresh in the minds of those who prepared and witnessed

it. Statements should be worded in such a way as to give specific details of the particular deposit rather than a general description of the usual manner of preparing and witnessing deposits.

If a claim is to be filed as a result of the discrepancy, the postmaster should submit the statements to the office of the Inspector in Charge.—
