All Postal Installations

6-Cent Air Mail Postage Stamp

The Department will issue a 6-cent airmail stamp through the Boston, Mass., post office on July 12, 1963. Although this new airmail stamp is being issued primarily for the convenience of patrons desiring to send souvenir post cards by airmail, it will be valid for use in combination with other stamps on any mail intended for transmission by air.

To obtain first-day cancellations, collectors may submit requests to the Postmaster, Boston 9, Mass. See Postal Manual section 145.3. This 6-cent stamp will not be valid for postage on an envelope unless additional postage has been previously affixed to meet the airmail letter rate, or allowance made for the affixment of at least two of the new stamps. Selected mint stamps will be available at the Philatelic Sales Agency, Post Office Department, Washington 25, D.C., on and after July 13, 1963.

NIMS Test Date

The NIMS test date for A/P 13, PFY 1963, is scheduled for Wednesday, June 12, 1963. Counts are to be made of all first- and third-class letters and flats collection mail received during the 24-hour period starting 1 a.m. (local time), June 12, and continuing through 1 a.m., June 13. Separate reports in duplicate (1) for first-class and (2) for third-class mail are to be submitted on Form 2368-A to the regional office by each of the participating NIMS post offices by June 19.—*Bureau of Operations, 6-6-63.*

Mail for West New Guinea

The territory of West New Guinea, formerly known as Netherlands New Guinea, is now incorporated into Indonesia under the name of Irian Barat.

Mail for that territory should be addressed "Irian Barat, Indonesia," or "West New Guinea, Indonesia," and will be subject to the rates and conditions applicable to Indonesia.

The country item "Netherlands New Guinea" will be removed from the Directory of International Mail.—*Bureau of Transportation, 6-6-63.*

First- and second-class offices requiring more than 7,000 stamps of this issue should order minimum lots of 10,000, or the multiples in section 422.321a, Postal Manual, submitting Form 3356 (Use Item 162), to the Bureau of Engraving and Printing, Washington 25, D.C.

Offices requiring 7,000 stamps, or less, shall submit a separate requisition on Form 017 to their RDPO. Do not include stamps other than the 6-cent airmail on the initial requisition.—*Office of the Special Assistant to the Postmaster General, 6-6-63.*

Outstanding Local Bank Checks

Effective April 2, 1960, post offices were instructed to discontinue the use of local bank checks for miscellaneous purchases, refunds to patrons, cashing postal savings certificates and money orders, etc. Local bank checks may be used only for remittances of surplus funds.

Bank statement reconciliations should be watched and payment should be stopped on any checks outstanding over 1 full fiscal year. All such checks should be reported to the regional finance division, and a listing thereof attached to your statement of account showing:

- (1) Date of check
- (2) Number of check
- (3) Name of payee
- (4) Amount of check
- (5) Name of bank

Increase local bank balance (account 11915) by total amount of such checks and show write-in entry to account 16940 under receipts in the cashbook and the statement of account.—*Bureau of Finance, 6-6-63.*

*Second- and Third-Class Post Offices***Submission of Form 1830, Operational Data**

Form 1830 has been developed to assist regional and departmental headquarters in the control of complements and man-hours and to provide a ready reference of service performed at second- and third-class post offices.

An initial supply of Forms 1830 will be furnished all second- and third-class post offices without requisition. Postmasters will complete the form in triplicate reflecting data as of July 1, 1963. The original and one copy will be mailed to the Regional Director, Attention: Director, Local Services Division, no later than July 7, 1963. One copy will be retained in the files of the post office.

After review at the regional level, the Director, Local Services Division, will forward one copy of each Form 1830 to the Director, Installations Management Division, Bureau of Operations, by July 20, 1963.

I. FRONT OF FORM 1830**A. Office Data**

1. Furnish all data called for at the top of the form.

2. Show under "Population" the total number of persons served through the post office, including those outside the corporate limits of the city or town who are served by city delivery, rural or star routes. *Do not use population statistics as reported by the Bureau of the Census unless they reflect the actual population of the entire delivery area.*

3. "Adjusted Receipts" will be completed by the regional office to show the adjusted receipts of the post office for the preceding calendar year and the 4 prior calendar years.

4. Under "No. Offices for Which Mail is Separated" show the number of tributary offices for which mail is received in mixed bundles requiring actual distribution and onward dispatch. Do not include those offices for which direct bundles or pouches only are received.

B. Authorized Complement

1. *Line 1—"Supervisors."*—Show the total number of authorized supervisory positions, including vacancies. This should include the position of Assistant to the Postmaster, PFS-5,

and any position in PFS-6 and above. *Do not include the Postmaster.*

2. *Lines 2 and 3—"Regular Clerks" and "Regular Carriers."*—Show the number of authorized regular (annual rate) positions, including vacancies, on the appropriate line.

3. *Line 4—"Rural Carriers."*—Show the number of authorized regular rural carrier positions, including vacancies. *Do not include temporary rural carriers or star route carriers performing box delivery.*

4. *Line 5—"Regular Maintenance Employees—Annual Rate."*—Show the number of authorized regular annual rate maintenance positions, including vacancies. Do not include hourly rate maintenance positions. *Do not include contract cleaners.*

5. *Line 6—"Regular Maintenance Employees—Hourly Rate."*—Show the number of authorized employees who work less than 40 hours weekly on a regular schedule. *Do not include contract cleaners.*

6. *Lines 8 and 9—"Substitute Clerks" and "Substitute City Carriers."*—Show on the appropriate line the number of authorized career substitute positions, including vacancies.

7. *Lines 12 and 13—"Temporary Substitute Clerks and Temporary Substitute City Carriers."*—Show on the appropriate line the number of temporary substitute positions authorized by the Regional Director.

8. *Line 15—"Grand Total."*—Add lines 11 and 14 to determine the total authorized complement, in all categories, including vacancies.

C. Delivery Data

1. *Lines 6 and 7—"Rural Routes"*—Show only the number of routes assigned to emanate from your office and the number of boxes served by all rural routes.

2. *Lines 8 and 9—"Star Routes with Box Delivery"*—Show only the number of routes with box delivery beginning at your office and the number of boxes served by all star routes with box delivery.

3. *Line 10—"Total Number of Star Routes"*—Show the total number of star routes, with and without box delivery, beginning at your office.

D. Window Service Hours

Show the hours of window service provided by your office for the days indicated. If hours of service on one day of the week varies from

other "weekdays", so indicate in the blank space provided.

E. Lobby Hours

Indicate the hours the box lobby is open to the public.

II. BACK OF FORM 1830**A. Work Schedules**

Show the normal work schedule of all supervisors, clerks, and carriers. In the blank spaces provided for clerks and carriers show whether employee is regular, career substitute, or temporary substitute. Also, for regular clerks and carriers, show the normal compensatory day or days in the space provided under designation title; i.e., Reg. (Comp. Tues.). Do not show names of employees.

B. Receipt and Dispatch of Mail

1. "Time of Each Receipt and Dispatch."—Show the time in hours and minutes of each daily receipt and dispatch of mail.

2. "Percent Received."—Show the approximate percent of the daily total that each separate mail receipt represents.

3. "Percent Dispatched."—Show the approximate percent of the daily total that each separate dispatch represents.

III. If additional information is needed for the completion of Form 1830, contact the Director, Local Services Division, in your regional office.—*Bureau of Operations, 6-6-63.*

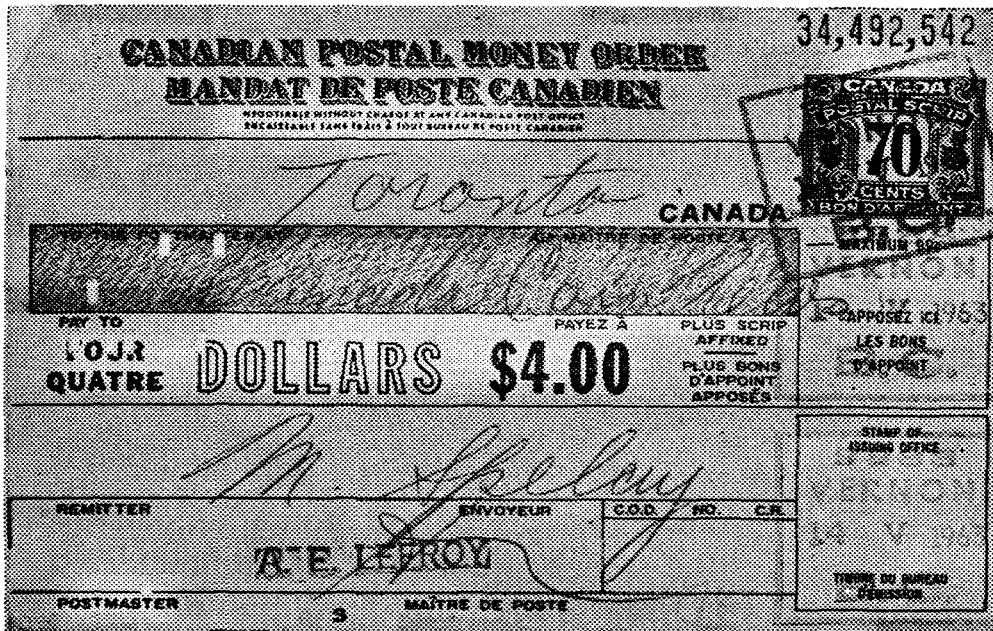

**Public Notice—
Requirements for
Exports by Mail**

Postmasters will soon be furnished a revised Public Notice issued by the Department of Commerce, concerning requirements for parcels mailed abroad under the provisions of the Export Control Act of 1949 (as amended).

The February 1, 1961, notice pertaining to this subject should be removed and the revised notice displayed in a prominent location in the public lobby as outlined in section 612.232 of the Postal Manual from the date of its receipt for so long as it presents a neat appearance or is superseded by a later notice.

Postmasters in buildings operated by the General Services Administration should submit the notices upon their receipt to the superintendent of the building—*Bureau of Facilities, 6-6-63.*

The U.S. Secret Service, Treasury Department, has announced discovery of the following counterfeit notes. The first note listed bears facsimile signatures of Ivy Baker Priest and G. M. Humphrey. The next two notes listed bear facsimile signatures of Ivy Baker Priest and Robert B. Anderson.

(1) The portrait is very well executed. The background is well executed. Very small defect in edge of cross-ruled lines at about 11:30 o'clock. The paper is approximate thickness of genuine. Limited red and blue fibers have been affixed to the surface of paper. This is a very deceptive note.

(2) In the portrait the shading lines forming eyebrows, hair, cheeks, and outline of chin are very heavy and ragged. The serial number is printed in a heavy, dark green. This note is printed on genuine paper, obtained by removing the printing from a genuine \$1 SC, and fibers are visible throughout. This is a deceptive note.

(3) The portrait and background are exceptionally well executed. The paper is same approximate thickness as distinctive paper with no attempt made to simulate red and blue fibers. This is a very deceptive note.—*Bureau of Finance, 6-6-63.*
