

First-Class Permit Imprints

Section 144.31, Postal Manual, has been changed as follows to allow permit holders the option of showing in the imprint the amount of postage paid or the ounces for which postage is paid:

144.3 CONTENT OF PERMIT IMPRINTS

.31 First-Class Mail. Permit imprints must show city and State; date (may be omitted); First-Class Mail; U.S. Postage Paid; followed by either the amount of postage paid or the number of ounces for which postage is paid; and permit number. The ZIP Code of the permit holder may be shown immediately following the name of the State or in a separate inscription reading "ZIP Code 00000" when it is possible to include the ZIP Code without creating uncertainty as to permit holder's correct address or permit number.

The change in the Postal Manual will be shown in an issuance at a later date.—Bureau of Finance and Administration, 7-23-70.

All classes of post offices will receive an initial supply of the stamps under the automatic distribution schedule.

First- and second-class post offices requiring additional bulk quantities should immediately submit a separate requisition (Form 3356) to the Bureau of Engraving and Printing (Use Item 427).

All post offices requiring less than bulk quantities in addition to the automatic distribution may submit a separate requisition (Form 17) to their accountable paper depository and endorse at top "Additional." Office of the Special Assistant to the Postmaster General, 7-23-70.

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

Selected mint stamps will be available at the Philatelic Sales Unit, City Post Office, Washington, DC 20013, on and after August 8, 1970. All of this issue will be tagged.

The new 6-cent American Flag sheet stamp produced on the Huck press will be furnished on postmasters' requisitions for (Item 560), upon depletion of the Flag stamps manufactured on the Giori press. It is anticipated that the Giori produced Flag stamps will be depleted at the Bureau of Engraving and Printing by about August 10. Stocks at the Accountable Paper Depositories may take longer to deplete.—Office of the Special Assistant to the Postmaster General, 7-23-70.



Earnings and Deductions Statements

Form 1223, Earnings and Deductions Statement, has been revised (see exhibit below) to provide space below the data printed by the postal data center for employees at PSDS post offices to describe the adjustment, if any, to which they believe they are properly entitled. Above, the PDC printed data, work and leave hour blocks are provided where the adjustment claimed by the employee can be certified to the PDC (Postal Data Center) by the PSDS (Postal Source Data System) post office if justified after review of time and attendance records.

Postal Data Centers are instructed to use old Form 1223 until depleted and then use Form 1223 (Rev. April 1970) for all postal installations. Only PSDS post offices will use these forms to process employee adjustments; all other postal installations will continue using Form 2240 for processing prior period payroll adjustments.

It is estimated that the old Form 1223 supply will be depleted during July and that Form 1223 (Rev. April 1970) will be used by all postal data centers thereafter.

Availability of Water Emulsion Floor Finish

Water emulsion floor finish, Item C-1840, is available from Federal Supply Service Depots and area supply centers. Local procurement authority for water emulsion floor finish is rescinded.

Fed-Strip ordering offices shall requisition requirements from Federal Supply Depots using the following reference: "Floor Finish, Water Emulsion" FSN 7930-782-3874 (Can, 1 gal.), Std. pk. 6, \$1.35 per can; and FSN 7930-782-3875 (Can, 5 gal.), \$5.70 per can.

All other offices shall order from supply centers on Form 1580, Requisition for Supplies, during normal requisitioning cycles, using the designation C-1840-A for one (1) gallon cans or C-1840-B for five (5) gallon cans.—Bureau of Operations, 7-23-70

Fund Raising Activities

Chairman Robert E. Hampton, U.S. Civil Service Commission, announced a significant change in Federal fund-raising policy on June 4, 1970. On that date he stated that the Combined Federal Campaign would be the uniform fund-raising method for the Federal Service, beginning this fall. This means that local community fund raising organizations must obtain approval from the Civil Service Commission to form a CFC to be eligible to solicit funds in Federal agencies. Local community organizations no longer will be allowed to conduct spring and fall on-the-job collections. Rather, a once-a-year solicitation allowing for payroll deductions must be conducted.

Because of the lateness of the date, the fall 1970 period necessarily will be a transitional one leading to complete implementation of the single campaign in the Federal service by fall 1971. As part of the transition, local coordinating groups have responsibility for determining whether a CFC will be conducted in their localities. In any area which heretofore has had a separate united fund fall campaign and spring NHA-ISA campaign, Federal officials should begin working with representatives of the voluntary groups to arrange for a CFC where it is practicable to install one. In areas where local Federal officials have made substantial efforts with the united fund in the past to organize a CFC and where the fund is fully cognizant of the CFC plan, we believe it should be possible to implement a combined campaign this fall and Federal officials should negotiate with local united funds and other voluntary groups to this end. In reaching their decision, Federal officials should recognize the position of the local united fund and shall not require a first-time CFC where the local united fund believes it cannot properly implement such a decision this fall.

Installation heads are encouraged to assist local community officials in setting up CFC procedures as outlined in the Manual on Fund-Raising within the Federal Service issued by the Civil Service Commission.—Bureau of Personnel, 7-23-70.

Duplicate Form 3579

Reports received indicate some failures to observe existing instructions in sections 158.221, .222 and .223, Postal Manual, concerning the treatment of undeliverable-as-addressed second-class mail. Strict adherence to the procedures contained in these sections will result in materially reducing the large number of duplicate Forms 3579, Undeliverable 2d, 3d, 4th or Controlled Circulation matter, sent to publishers.

Postmasters and supervisors are requested to give particular attention to this matter and to familiarize all responsible employees with the provisions of these regulations. Every effort should be made to reduce or eliminate duplicate 3579 forms.—

Revision to F-36 Handbook

Pending formal publication of necessary revisions to the F-36 Handbook, Transmittal Letter 4 is being amended as follows:

Federal Government Mail

When the piece of mail is Federal Government Mail, enter in Line M of the Tally Sheet the *name* of the Government agency, according to the return address. For example:

Internal Revenue Service

This entry will take the place of the following notations previously required for Government mail in part 4.5, Handbook F-36:

Postage and Fees Paid, or Penalty For Private Use

This amendment strengthens the editing of Tally Sheets (Form 2615–B) for erroneous mail codes when Government mail is involved.

These instructions are effective at once.—Bureau of Finance and Administration, 7-23-70.
