8-Cent Boston Tea Party Bicentennial Commemorative Stamps

The 8-Cent Boston Tea Party Bicentennial commemorative postage stamps will be first placed on sale at Boston, MA 02109, on July 4, 1973.

POSTMASTERS SHALL NOT PLACE THESE STAMPS ON SALE BEFORE JULY 5, 1973



Size: 1.44" x 0.84" image area (horizontal)

ISSUED IN SHEETS OF 50

Colors: Yellow, red, light blue, dark blue, and black

Initial printing: 150 million

Designer: William A. Smith

The issue is unique in U.S. postage production, the four stamps, each a design entity, combine to complete the scene of 1773 when enraged colonists dumped chests of tea from British ships into the harbor in protest of the English-levied tax.

To obtain first-day cancellations, collectors may submit requests to Postmaster, Boston, MA 02109. See Postal Service Manual, section 257.2. Requests must be postmarked no later than July 4. Selected mint stamps will be available at the Philatelic Sales Unit, Washington, DC 20036, beginning July 5, 1973.

All classes of post offices will re-

ceive an initial supply of the stamps under the automatic distribution schedule.

First-class post offices requiring additional **bulk quantities** should immediately submit a separate requisition (form 3356) to the Bureau of Engraving and Printing **using item No. 479.**

First-class post offices requiring **less-than-bulk quantities** in addition to the automatic distribution and all **other post offices** may submit a requisition (form 17) to their designated sectional center facility on their next scheduled requisitioning date.

International Inaugural Service—Iberia Air Lines

On or after June 18, 1973, Iberia Air Lines will inaugurate DC-10 service from Washington, D.C. to Madrid with an intermediate stop at Boston. To send covers by this service, prepare them in the usual manner addressed for delivery in Spain, United States, and Canada, affixing postage at 21 cents per half ounce. Aero-grammes and postal cards will not be accepted. The covers should be enclosed in another envelope addressed as follows and should reach the office applying the cachet no later than 3 days prior to the scheduled flight:

New Money Order Fees on COD Mail

The new Money Order System being phased in across the country over the next 6 months will increase the maximum value for a single money order to \$300. Postmasters at post offices not on the new system will be receiving COD parcels from participating post offices which will show the new money order fees on the COD tags. The reverse situation will also be true. In these cases, the money order fee on the COD tag should be corrected to reflect the appropriate fee in effect at the office of delivery. The postmaster at the office of mailing need not be advised.

Postmasters should encourage their personnel and all large COD mailers to determine the correct money order fee for the office of delivery whenever possible. During the phase in of the new money order system every effort should be made to issue on the same day the money orders for all COD collections made on the last Friday under the old system. This will avoid any necessity for an adjustment in fees.—*Finance Department, 5-24-73.*

In conjunction with the issuance of the Boston Tea Party stamps, the Postal Service will release a limited number (10,000) American Commemorative Series Stamp Panels. These panels, which measure 8½ by 11¼ inches, are printed on a heavy art paper suitable for framing or mounting in an album. The panels sell for \$2 each.

Any sectional center which wishes to make these panels available may requisition a supply on form 17, *Stamp Requisition*, from its accountable paper depository (in units of 10 panels or cartons of 120). Associate offices may requisition any required quantity from the SCF's designated to distribute accountable paper. The panels will be available on a first-come basis from all distributing offices.—*Philatelic Affairs, 5-24-73.*

Red Stamp Pad Ink Container

An employee suggestion for improved use of P.O. Item 660-B, Red Stamp Pad Ink Container, is restated for application wherever this item is utilized. Item 660-B, FSN 7510-057-9305, is issued by the General Services Administration stores stock depots and by the area supply center. The suggestor advises that an easier and cleaner method of inking stamp pads is to make a vertical cut in the dispensing tip with a sharp knife. By so doing, a valvelike opening is created in the dispensing tip to permit a controlled flow of ink.—*Administration Department, 5-24-73.*

Damaged Registered Articles

A recent review of Forms 565, *Application for Indemnity for Registered Mail*, at the St. Louis Postal Data Center indicates that personnel who handle registered mail are not following instructions contained in Part 161, Postal Service Manual. Damaged articles received for delivery or received at intermediate points for onward dispatch are not being endorsed "Received in Damaged Condition at -----." Damaged articles are not being rewrapped. Form 3899, *Registered Matter—Damaged, Unsealed or Without Content*, is not being completed and signed by the clerk and the supervisor.

Numerous claims are being paid for partial or complete damage to registered article because articles damaged during USPS handling have been officially sealed are not being opened in the presence of a postal employee. *Articles that have been rewrapped or officially sealed must be opened and inspected by the addressee in the presence of the delivering employee.*

Postmasters are directed to review these procedures with all employees responsible for handling registered mail.—*Finance Department, 5-24-73.*

Post Offices Having Vehicle Fuel Stock

Revised Form 4580

Revised Form 4580, *Summary of Gasoline, Diesel Fuel, and Oil Issued From Stock*, is now available from postal supply centers. Effective date for use of the revised Form 4580 is A/P1, PFY 1974. Post offices concerned may submit a *Special Requisition for Supplies*, Form 4750, to their supply center for an initial supply of Form 4580. Do not include any other items on your special requisition. Additional requirements should be ordered on Form 7380, *Requisition for Supplies*, during regular requisitioning cycles. Revised Form 4580 eliminates the need for Form 4505, *Summary of Gasoline and Oil Issued to Other Post Offices*. The remaining stock of Form 4505 on hand beginning A/P1, PFY 1974 may be destroyed as waste.—*Delivery Services Department, 5-24-73.*

First-Class Offices

Budget Reporting System Fiscal Year 1974

One of the basic controls contained in the new Financial Reporting System fiscal year 1974, is the Functional Activities Code (FAC), which is intended to identify each activity. An additional column is being printed in all financial records and reports to be used in fiscal year 1974.

First-class offices designated as *four-way-break offices* by their regional controller will follow the instructions given below. All other post offices will ignore the FAC column.

The FAC codes are as follows:

Code	Title
E ----	Employee and Labor Relations.
S ----	Support.
G ----	Customer Services.
M ----	Mail Processing.

Accounts 55428, 5B244, 5B255, and 5B266 require identification of the activity in every cashbook and statement of account. This will be done by inserting the appropriate code in the FAC column. When the account represents an expenditure chargeable to only one activity the applicable code E, S, C, or M will be written alongside the account in the FAC column. If the expenditure covers more than one activity, the amount for each activity shall be identified. This will be accomplished by making one or more write-in entries listing the same account number, the amount chargeable to each activity and writing in the FAC column the pertinent code.

The bills forwarded to PDCs for payment shall be encoded in accordance with the system described above. — *Finance Department, 5-24-73.*

International Inaugural Service—Northwest Orient

On or after June 1, 1973, Northwest Orient will inaugurate DC-10 service from Washington, D.C. to Tokyo and Seoul via Cleveland, Chicago, and Anchorage. Official cachet and philatelic treatment are authorized as outlined in section 257.33, Postal Service Manual. To send covers by this service, prepare them in the usual manner addressed for delivery in Japan, Korea, United States, and Canada, affixing postage at 21 cents per half ounce. Aero-grammes and postal cards will not be accepted. The covers should be enclosed in another envelope addressed as follows and should reach the office applying the cachet no later than 3 days prior to the scheduled flight:

COST-OF-LIVING ANNUITY INCREASE

The Civil Service Commission has announced that annuities will be increased by 6.1 percent effective July 1, 1973. This increase is based on the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for the 3-month period from February 1973 through April 1973 (5.1 percent for April) plus an additional 1 percent. This increase is given only on annuities effective on or before July 1, 1973, as provided for under the current retirement law.

Notice to Employees

Installation heads are urged to inform eligible employees considering retiring soon that in order to get the 6.1-percent annuity increase effective July 1, 1973, they must file a retirement application and be in a nonpay status or separated no later than June 30, 1973.

Disposition of Annual Leave Balance

Unused current accrued annual leave which exceeds the amount the employee is authorized to carry over from year to year must be used before retirement or it will be forfeited. See (old) Postal Manual 721.34, for complete information on payment for accumulated and current accrued annual leave.

Granting LWOP in Certain Pending Disability Retirement Cases

There will probably be some pending disability retirement cases in which the Civil Service Commission will be unable, by June 30, 1973, to determine and notify interested parties whether the applicant is totally disabled. In such a case, the applicant will not be eligible for the cost-of-living increase if he is carried in a pay status after June 30, 1973.

To avoid loss of the increase, applicants may request, and installation heads may grant, leave without pay from July 1, 1973. If the disability claim is disallowed, sick or annual leave with pay may be retroactively substituted for the leave without pay. If the claim is allowed, the annuity commences July 1, 1973; unused accumulated annual leave which does not exceed the amount the employee is authorized to carry over from year to year is payable in a lump sum; and unused sick leave is included in the

annuity computation as in other retirement cases.

Where a large amount of sick leave is involved, it may be more advantageous for the employee to remain in a pay status on sick leave. In this situation, give the applicant the choice of continuing in pay status or being placed in LWOP so as to receive the cost-of-living increase and retirement credit for unused sick leave.

Retirement Counseling

Form 2411, *Check List for Preretirement Interviews*, provides a guide on information that should be of interest to prospective retirees. Some information of general interest is repeated here for convenience.

1. Federal Income Tax

A Civil Service annuitant does not pay Federal income tax on his annuity until he has received annuity payments equal to the amount he has contributed to the Civil Service Retirement Fund.

2. Federal Employees Group Life Insurance

Regular (basic) life insurance continues free after retirement on an immediate annuity with 12 or more years of service, or for disability.

If the employee has had optional insurance for all service during which it was available to him, it may also be continued into retirement. However, optional insurance premiums are paid (by automatic deductions from monthly annuity) until age 65. After age 65, optional insurance also continues free.

When an employee retires at age 65 or over, or when he reaches 65, if he retires before that age, both regular and optional insurance reduce by 2 percent a month. These reductions continue until the amount of insurance reaches 25 percent of the amount in force at retirement.

3. Health Benefits (Hospitalization and Medical)

An employee who retires on an immediate annuity with 12 or more years of creditable service, or for disability, may continue his health benefits coverage into retirement, if he has been enrolled (or covered as a family member) in a Federal health plan:

(a) During the 5 years of service immediately preceding his retirement, or (b) during all service since his first opportunity to enroll.

4. Election of Survivor Annuity

Retiring employees who are married should be made aware of the small reduction in annuity for providing survivor benefits for spouse. Married employees (male and female) who elect an annuity without survivor benefit should attach a note to their retirement application confirming this election and indicating they understand the monetary difference involved.

Processing Retirement Applications

Installations should accurately process all retirement applications and related documents through appropriate channels to postal data centers as soon as possible.

Documents Required

The following forms (or information) must be completed and sent to respective personnel service centers for forwarding to postal data centers in all retirement cases:

1. SF 2801, *Application for Retirement*.
2. Form 2526, *Request for Personnel Action*, and Form 50, *Notification of Personnel Action*.
3. All copies of SF 2809, *Health Benefits Registration Form*, in the employee's personnel folder, if employee is eligible to continue enrollment into retirement.
4. SF 2810, *Notice of Change in Health Benefits Enrollment*.
5. SF 56, *Agency Certification of Insurance Status*.
6. SF 54, *Designation of Beneficiary*, if one is in the employee's folder.
7. The last day for which the employee was paid, either for work performed or for paid leave. Enter the last day of pay in item 30, *Remarks of Form 50*.
8. Complete copy of *employee's military discharge certificate*, if available, and if his honorable, active military service has not been verified and recorded in his official personnel folder and on his *Individual Retirement Record*, SF 2806.—*Employee Relations Department, 5-24-73.*
