10-Cent Veterans Commemorative Stamp

The 10-cent veterans commemorative stamp will be first placed on sale at Washington, DC 20013, on March 11, 1974.

POSTMASTERS SHALL NOT PLACE THIS STAMP ON SALE BEFORE MARCH 12, 1974.

To obtain first-day cancellations, collectors may submit requests to Postmaster, Washington, DC 20013. See Postal Service Manual, section 257.2. Requests must be postmarked no later than March 11. Selected mint stamps will be available at the Philatelic Sales Division, Washington, DC 20036, beginning March 11, 1974.

All classes of post offices will receive an initial supply of the stamps under the automatic distribution schedule.

First-class post offices requiring additional bulk quantities should immediately submit a separate requisition (Form 3356) to the Bureau of Engraving and Printing using Item No. 491.

First-class post offices requiring less-than-bulk-quantities in addition to the automatic distribution and all other post offices may submit a requisition (Form 17) to their designated

Registered Envelope Containers (P-399)

Many registered envelope containers (P-399) are being received at destination offices in an open condition. Most of these containers received in open condition contained boxes or bulky items. Registry envelope containers were not designed to accommodate these types of items.

Effective immediately the contents of registry envelope containers will be restricted to letter mail of minimum value only. Registers of high value and bulky items must be contained in rotary locked pouches. Dispatches shall be made in compliance with section 161.521, Postal Service Manual.—Finance Department, 1-31-74.

sectional center facility on their next scheduled requisitioning date.

Before requisitioning additional stamps postmasters should give particular attention to the recent change in policy relative to stocking commemorative issues for only 60 days as announced in POSTAL BULLETIN of August 16, 1973.

In conjunction with the issuance of the veterans stamp, the Postal Service will release a limited number of American Commemorative Series Stamp Panels. These panels, which measure 8½ by 11¼ inches, are printed on a heavy art paper suitable for framing or mounting in an album. The panels sell for \$2 each.

Any sectional center which wishes to make these panels available may requisition a supply on Form 17, Stamp Requisition, from its accountable paper depository (in units of 10 panels or cartons of 100). Associate offices may requisition any required quantity from the SCF's designated to distribute accountable paper. The panels will be available on a first-come basis from all distributing offices.—Office of Stamps, 1-31-74.

International—Sri Lanka

Postmasters are requested to remind their employees engaged in the handling of international mail that Ceylon changed its name to the Republic of Sri Lanka (short form Sri Lanka). A write-in change in the appendix of Publication 42, International Mail, should be made. Publication 42 will be changed in the near future.—Finance Department, 1-31-74.

To All Post Offices with Retail Sales

Nonpostage Items

Distribution of retail items by sectional centers to associate offices participating in the retail sales program is controlled on a memo receipt basis.

Therefore, postmasters are reminded that it is not necessary to assign the retail items to window clerks as a part of their fixed credit accountability.—Finance Department, 1-31-74.

COLLECTION TESTS

POSTAL BULLETIN 20965, January 17, 1974, contained detailed instructions regarding collection test procedures and described label 161, a large (10" by 13"), red and white, plastic reusable card which is to be used as the test item in most collection tests. This notice advised post offices that label 161 was now available in the supply centers for requisitioning through normal procedures.

Information received from both supply centers indicates that many offices, particularly small first-class offices, have requisitioned quantities of label 161 far in excess of normal requirements. Example: An office

having only 56 collection boxes and 10 mail receiving chutes requisitioned 200 labels 161. An initial supply of about 10 test cards would be sufficient for this office, provided testing is done in accordance with procedures outlined in POSTAL BULLETIN 20965.

It is emphasized that it is not necessary to test every collection point on a route selected for testing. Nor is it necessary that testing be conducted on all routes at the same time, or within 2-3 days during a quarter. Normally, quarterly collection tests can be spaced out during the full period of a quarter.

As a result of over-ordering, and in an effort to avoid stock depletion before all city delivery offices have received an initial supply of label 161, the supply centers will cut back on most requisitions for this item. Offices receiving fewer labels 161 than requisitioned, should reevaluate their requirements and, if a legitimate need exists for more test cards, should prepare a followup requisition. Do not submit a second requisition until after March 1, 1974, to allow time for supply centers to partially satisfy initial requisitions for label 161.— Delivery Services Department, 1-31-74.

Post Offices Authorized to Issue International Money Orders

International (Outgoing) Money Orders

All post offices which are authorized to sell international money orders (see Postal Service Manual 171.2) will convert to the new system on March 30, 1974. Postal Bulletins 20947 and 20960 describe instructions relating to the domestic money order system. Most of the instructions are also applicable to the international money order system but additional specific instructions will be included in a later Postal Bulletin.

The new international money order system will require the use of a revised Form 6701, Application for International Money Order, and a form set titled "Authorization to Issue an International Money Order." The form set is similar in construction to a domestic money order form set and will be imprinted using a money order imprinter.

The initial supply of both of these

items will be furnished by the accountable paper depositories. Each post office authorized to sell international money orders must send a memorandum requisition to its accountable paper depository before February 15, 1974. It is necessary to show the ZIP Code as well as the finance number of your post office and the estimated number of items needed. The estimate should be based on the projected sales in the first 6 months. Requisitions should be for minimum quantities of 100 and multiples thereof.

Subsequent requisitions for replenishment of Form 6701 should be sent to your supply center. Continue to requisition the form sets "Authorization to Issue an International Money Order" from your accountable paper depository.—Finance Group, 1-31-74.

International Mail—Special Delivery (EXPRÈS)

Please refer to POSTAL BULLETIN 20963, January 3, 1974. A few post offices have reported that some incoming mail from Mexico is properly endorsed "EXPRES" but the endorsement is in blue ink. This mail may be accorded special delivery service.—Finance Department, 1-31-74.

Minimum Size for Postal and Post Cards Mailed to Canada and Mexico

Postal and post cards which measure at least 5½ by 3¼ inches, may be accepted for mailing to Canada and Mexico. This exception to the instructions on minimum dimensions for international mail issued in Postal Bulletin Notice No. 20948, dated September 27, 1973, is applicable to Canada and Mexico only.—Finance Department, 1-31-74.

Postmasters must forward all foreign-issue international reply coupons redeemed through December 31, 1973, with Form 2961, Statement of Foreign-Issue Reply Coupons Exchanged, to their postal data center with their statement of account for A/P 10 (Postal Quarter III). See section 224.5, F-1, Financial and Cost Controls. Form 2961 should be the November 1973 issue. All previous issues of Form 2961 should be destroyed.—Finance Department, 1-31-74.
